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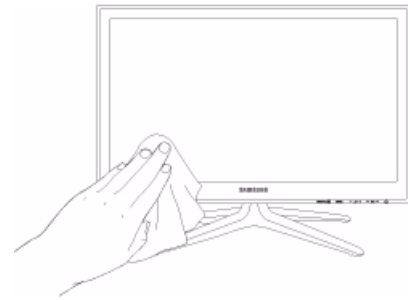
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## 1-2 Care and Maintenance

### External Surface and Screen Maintenance

Clean the product with a soft dry cloth.

- Avoid cleaning the product with an inflammable substance such as benzene or thinner or with a wet cloth. This may result in a problem with the product.
- Avoid scratching the screen with your fingernails or a sharp object.
- Avoid cleaning the product by spraying water onto it. If water enters the product, it may result in fire, electric shock or a problem with the product.
- A white stain may be generated on the surface of the model if a supersonic humidifier is used near it.



 The appearance and the color may differ depending on models.

### Securing the Installation Space

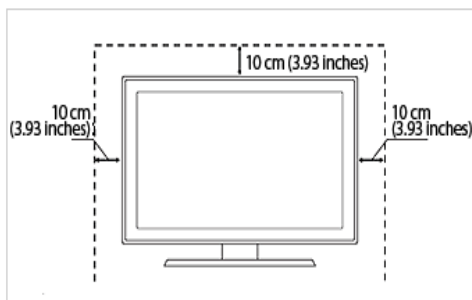
- Keep the required distances between the product and other objects (e.g. walls) to ensure proper ventilation. Failing to do so may result in fire or a problem with the product due to an increase in the internal temperature of the product.

 When using a stand or wall-mount, use parts provided by Samsung Electronics only.

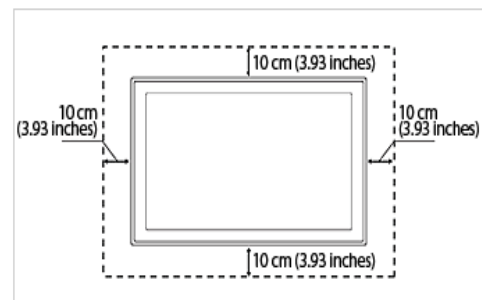
- If you use parts provided by another manufacturer, it may result in a problem with the product or an injury due to the product falling.

### About persistent images



- Displaying a still image for a long time may create a persistent image or stain on the screen. If you do not use the product for a long time, set the power-saving mode or screen saver.
- Due to technological constraints of the Panel manufacturer, the images generated by this product may appear either brighter or darker than normal by appr. 1ppm (parts per million) pixel.

The number of sub-pixels of an panel by size: The number of Sub-Pixels = Max. Horizontal Resolution x Max. Vertical Resolution x 3

Example) If the maximum resolution is 1920 x 1080, the number of sub-pixels is 1920 x 1080 x 3 = 6,220,800.

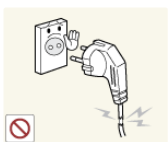

#### Warning



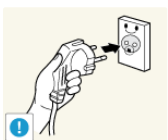
Avoid using a damaged power cord or plug or a loose power outlet.

- Otherwise, it may result in electric shock or fire.



Avoid plugging in or unplugging the power supply with wet hands.

- Otherwise, it may result in electric shock.



Make sure to connect the power cord to a grounded wall outlet (for insulation class 1 equipment only).

- Otherwise, it may result in electric shock or injury.



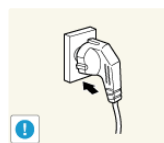
Keep the power cord and the product away from a heater.

- Otherwise, it may result in electric shock or fire.



Avoid connecting multiple electric appliances to a single wall outlet.

- Otherwise, it may result in fire due to overheating of the wall outlet.



Plug the power plug in firmly.

- Otherwise, it may result in fire.



Avoid bending or twisting the power cord excessively and avoid placing heavy objects on the cord.

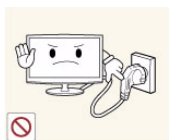
- Otherwise, it may result in electric shock or fire due to a damaged power cord.



If the pins of the power plug or the wall outlet are covered in dust, clean it using a dry cloth.

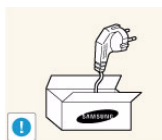

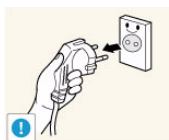
Avoid unplugging the power plug while the product is operating.

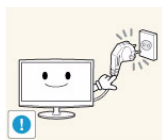
Make sure to use only the power cord supplied by our company. In addition, do not use the power cord of another electric appliance.

When unplugging the power plug from the wall outlet, make sure to hold it by the plug and not by the cord.

- Otherwise, it may result in electric shock or fire.



Connect the power plug to a wall outlet that can be easily reached.

- When a problem occurs with the product, you must unplug the power plug to cut the power off completely. You cannot cut the power off completely using only the power button on the product.

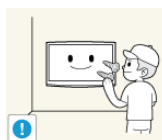
## Installation Related

### Warning



Avoid placing burning candles, mosquito-repellent or cigarettes on the product.

- Otherwise, it may result in fire.



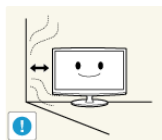
Ask an installation engineer or relevant company to install the product onto the wall.

- Otherwise, it may result in injury.
- Make sure to use the specified wall mount.



Avoid installing the product in a badly-ventilated location such as inside a bookshelf or closet.

- Otherwise, it may result in fire due to internal over-heating.



Keep a distance of at least 10 cm(3.93 inches) from the wall when installing the product for ventilation.

- Otherwise, it may result in fire due to internal over-heating.



Keep the plastic bags used to pack the product away from children.

- If children place the plastic bags over their heads, they may suffocate.



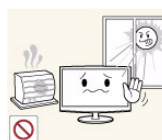
Avoid installing the product in a location that is unstable or exposed to excessive vibrations such as on an unstable or slanted shelf.

- The product may fall and this may result in damage to the product or injury.
- If you use the product in a location exposed to excessive vibration, it may result in a problem with the product or fire.



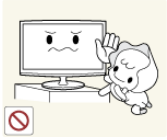
Avoid installing the product in a location exposed to dust, moisture (sauna), oil, smoke or water (rain drops) and installing it within a vehicle.

- This may result in electric shock or fire.



Avoid installing the product in a location exposed to direct sunlight and installing the product near a heat source such as a fire-place or heater.

- This may shorten the product life cycle or cause fire.



Avoid installing the product where children may reach it.

- If a child touches the product, the product may fall and this may result in injury.
- Since the front part is heavier, install the product on a flat and stable surface.



Bend the outdoor antenna cable downwards at the location where it comes in the house so that rainwater does not flow in.

- If rainwater enters the product, it may result in electric shock or fire.



Install the antenna far away from any high voltage cables.

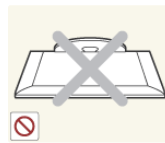
- If the antenna touches or falls onto a high voltage cable, it may result in electric shock or fire.

## **Caution**



Do not let the product drop while moving it.

- This may result in a problem with the product or injury.



Do not place the product face down on the floor.

- This may damage the panel of the product.



When installing the product on a console or shelf, make sure that the front of the product does not protrude out of the console or shelf.

- Otherwise, this may cause the product to fall off and result in a malfunction or injury.
- Make sure to use a cabinet or shelf suitable to the size of the product.



When putting the product down, handle it gently.

- Otherwise, it may result in a problem with the product or injury.



If the product is installed in a location where the operating conditions vary considerably, a serious quality problem may occur due to the surrounding environment. In this case, install the product only after consulting one of our service engineers about the matter.

- Places exposed to microscopic dust, chemicals, too high or low temperature, high humidity, airports or stations where the product is continuously used.

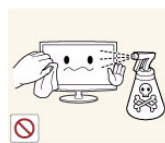
## **Cleaning Related**

### **Warning**



Before cleaning the product, unplug the power cord.

- Otherwise, it may result in electric shock or fire.



When cleaning the product, do not spray water directly over the product parts.

- Make sure that water does not enter the product.
- Otherwise, it may result in fire, electric shock or a problem with the product.

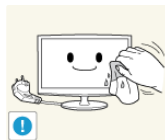


## Caution



Avoid spraying cleansing agent directly onto the product.

- This may result in discoloration or cracking of the exterior of the product or the panel coming off.



When cleaning the product, disconnect the power cord and clean the product with the supplied cleaning cloth.

- Avoid using chemicals such as wax, benzene, alcohol, thinner, mosquito-repellent, fragrance, lubrication or cleansing agent when cleaning the product.

This may result in the exterior being deformed or the print being removed.



If you can't get the product clean with just the supplied cloth, use a soft, damp cloth with a "monitor-exclusive cleansing agent" and wipe the product with it.

- If no monitor-exclusive cleansing agent is available, dilute a cleansing agent with water at a ratio of 1:10 before cleaning the product.



Since the exterior of the product is easily scratched, be sure to use the supplied cleansing cloth.

## Usage Related

### Warning



Since a high voltage runs through the product, never disassemble, repair or modify the product yourself.

- Otherwise, it may result in fire or electric shock.
- If the product needs to be fixed, contact a service center.



To move the product, turn the power off and unplug the power cord, the antenna cable and any other wires connected to the product.

- Otherwise, it may result in electric shock or fire due to the damaged power cord.



If the product generates a strange noise, a burning smell, or smoke, unplug the power plug immediately and contact a service center.

- Otherwise, it may result in electric shock or fire.



Avoid letting children hang or climb onto the product.

- Otherwise, it may result in the product falling and this may result in injury or death.



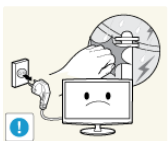
If you drop the product or the case is damaged, turn the power off and unplug the power cord. Contact a Service Center.

- Otherwise, it may result in fire or electric shock.



Avoid placing objects such as toys and cookies on top of the product.

- If a child hangs over the product to grab an object, the object or the product may fall and this may result in injury or even death.



When thunder or lighting occurs, unplug the power cord and under no circumstance touch the antenna cable as this is dangerous.

- Otherwise, it may result in electric shock or fire.



Avoid dropping an object over the product or cause impact to the product.

- Otherwise, it may result in electric shock or fire.



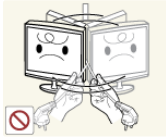
Avoid moving the product by pulling the power cord or antenna cable.

- Otherwise, it may result in electric shock, fire or a problem with the product due to damage to the cable.



When a gas leak occurs, do not touch the product or the power plug and ventilate immediately.

- A spark may result in an explosion or fire.
- During a thunder or lighting storm, do not touch the power cord or antenna cable.



Avoid lifting up or moving the product by holding only the power cord or signal cable.

- Otherwise, it may result in electric shock, fire or a problem with the product due to damage to the cable.



Avoid using or placing inflammable spray or objects near the product.

- This may result in an explosion or fire.



Take care not to block the vent by a table cloth or curtain.

- Otherwise, it may result in fire due to internal overheating.



Avoid inserting metal objects such as a chopsticks, coins or hairpins, or inflammable objects into the product (the vents, ports, etc).

- If water or substances enter the product, turn the power off, unplug the power cord and contact a service center.
- Otherwise, it may result in a problem with the product, electric shock or fire.



Avoid placing a liquid container such as a vase, flowerpot, beverage, cosmetics or drugs, or a metal object over the product.

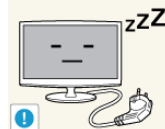
- If water or substances enter the product, turn the power off, unplug the power cord and contact a service center.
- Otherwise, it may result in a problem with the product, electric shock or fire.

## **Caution**



Displaying a still image for a long time may create a persistent image or stain on the screen.

- If you do not use the product for a long time, use the power-saving mode or set the screensaver to the moving picture mode.



When not using the product for a long time such as leaving your home, unplug the power cord from the wall outlet.

- Otherwise, it may cause dust accumulation and result in fire caused by overheating or short circuit or result in an electric shock.



Set the appropriate resolution and frequency for the product.

- Otherwise, it may result in eye strain.



Avoid turning the product upside down or move the product holding only the stand.

- This may cause the product to fall, resulting in damage to the product or injury.



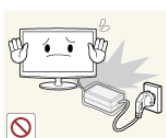
Do not place the adapter on top of another adapter.

- Otherwise, it may result in fire.



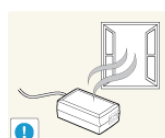
Keep power adaptor away from any other heat source.

- Otherwise, it may result in fire.



Remove the vinyl cover of the adapter before using the adaptor.

- Otherwise, it may result in fire.

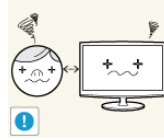


Always keep power adaptor in well-ventilated area.



Be careful that adaptor should not be in contact with water and therefore not be wet.

- This may cause a malfunction, electric shock or fire. Do not use adaptor by the waterside or outside particularly when it rains or snows. Be careful that adaptor should not be wet while cleaning floor with water.

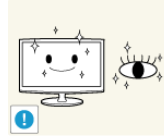


Watching the product from too close a distance continuously may damage your eyesight.



Avoid using a humidifier or cooker near the product.

- Otherwise, it may result in electric shock or fire.

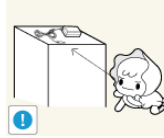


It is important to give your eyes some rest (5 minutes every hour) when viewing the product screen for long periods of time.

- This will alleviate any eye strain.



Since the display panel is hot after using it for a long time, do not touch the product.



Keep the small accessories in a location out of the reach of children.



Take care when adjusting the angle of the product or the height of the stand.

- If your hand or finger is caught, you may be injured.
- If the product is tilted excessively, the product may fall and this may result in injury.



Avoid placing a heavy object over the product.

- Otherwise, it may result in a problem with the product or injury.



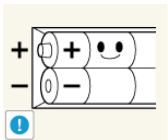
When using headphones or earphones, do not turn the volume too high.

- Having the sound too loud may damage your hearing.



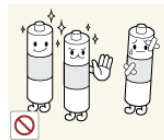
Be careful that children do not place the batteries in their mouths when removed from the remote control. Place the battery in a location that children or infants cannot reach.

- If children have had the battery in their mouths, consult your doctor immediately.



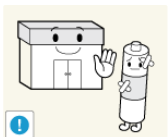
When replacing the batteries, insert them with right polarity (+, -).

Use only specified standard batteries. Do not use new and used batteries together.

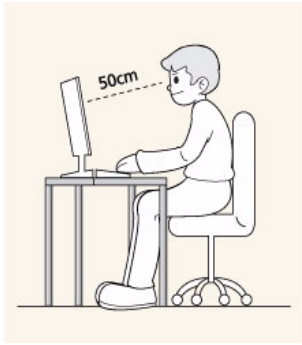
- This may cause a battery to break or leak and may cause fire, injury, or contamination (damage).

## Maintaining the Correct Posture when Using this Product
















Maintain the correct posture when using this product.

- Straighten your back.
- Keep a distance of 45~50 cm (18~19 inches) from your eyes to the screen. Look down at the screen and face the screen forwards.
- Adjust the angle of the product so that light is not reflected onto the screen.
- Keep your elbow at a right angle and keep your arm level with the back of your hand.
- Keep your elbow at a right angle.
- Place your heels flat on the ground while keeping your knees at an angle of 90 degrees or higher and maintain the position of your arm so that your arm is below your heart.

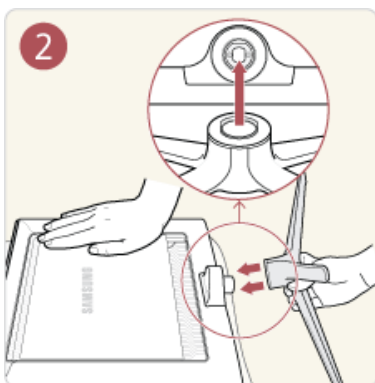

## 2-2 Installing the Stand

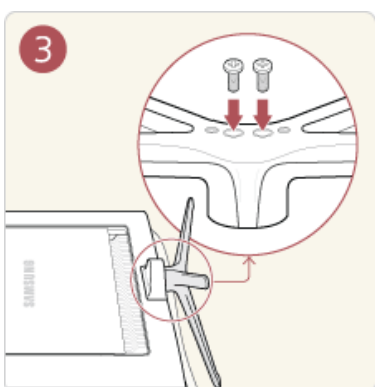
Before assembling the product, place the product down on a flat and stable surface so that the screen is facing downwards.



Place a soft cloth over the table to protect the product and place the product onto the cloth face down.



Insert the stand base into the stand as shown in the figure.



Firmly fasten the stand using the screws.



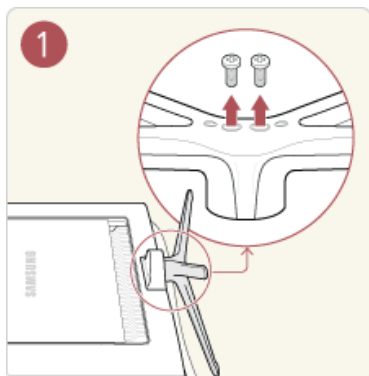
- Caution

Do not lift the product by only its stand.

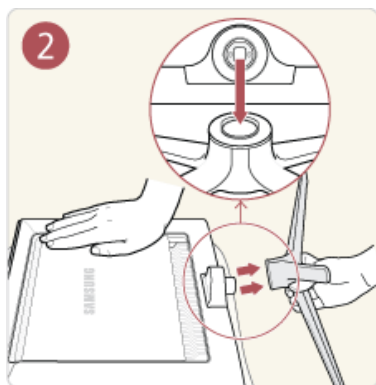

## 2-3 Removing the Stand

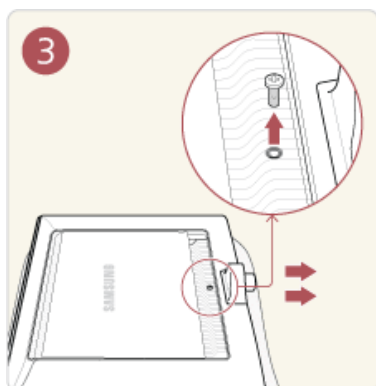
Before removing the stand, place the product down on a flat and stable surface so that the screen faces downwards.



Place a soft cloth over the table to protect the product and place the product face down.  
Remove the screws from the bottom of the stand.



Pull the stand from the stand base to remove.



Before you attach the bracket, unfasten the screw and remove the stand base.



The stand base is now removed.

- The Wall mount of this model is only supported as WMN-2490.
- The wall mount kit is not supplied, but sold separately.
- If you want to purchase this Wall Mount, contact an authorized dealer.

## 2-4 Connecting to a Computer

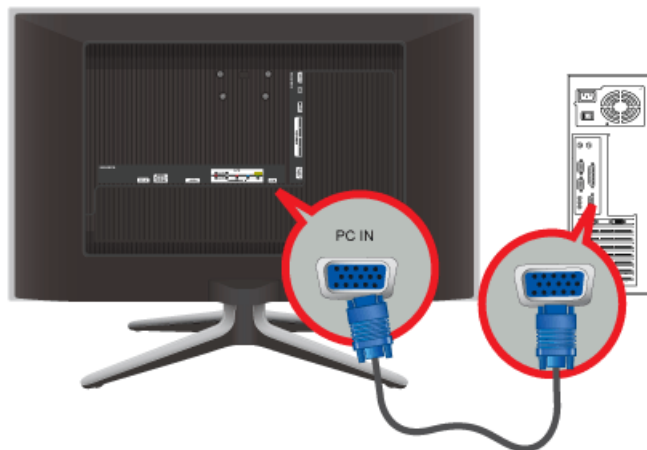
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 The connecting part may differ depending on the product model.

1. Connect the product to a PC depending on the video output supported by the PC.

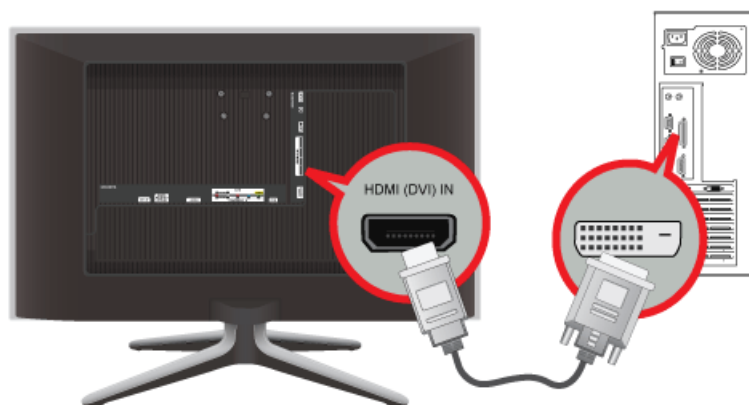
When the graphics card provides a D-Sub (<analog>) output

- Connect the [PC IN] port of the product to the D-Sub port of the PC with the D-Sub cable.



When the graphics card provides a DVI (<digital>) output

- Connect the [HDMI (DVI) IN] port of the product to the DVI port of the PC with the HDMI to DVI cable.

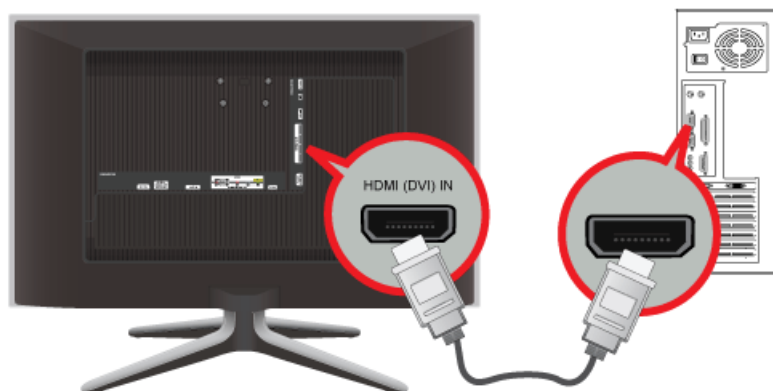


When the graphics card provides a HDMI output

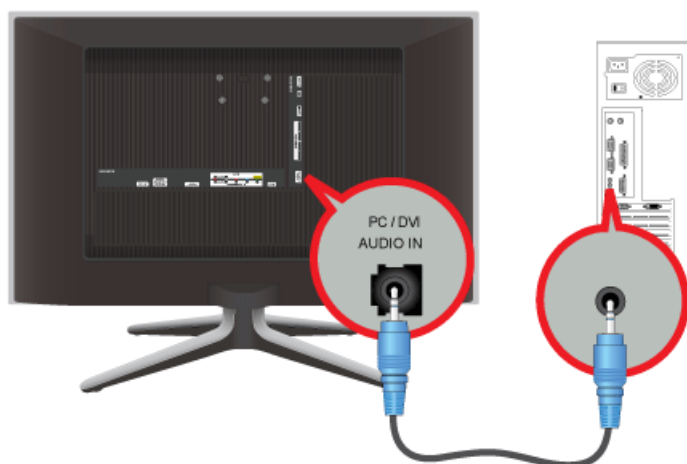
- Connect the [HDMI (DVI) IN] port of the product to the HDMI port of the PC with the HDMI cable.



- When a PC with a resolution of 1920 x 1080 @ 60 Hz is connected to the [HDMI (DVI) IN] port, you should set the <HDMI> mode to <DVI PC> in the <Edit Name> of the <Input> mode. In this case, a separate sound connection is required.



2. Connect the [PC/DVI AUDIO IN] port on the rear side of the product to the sound card of the PC.



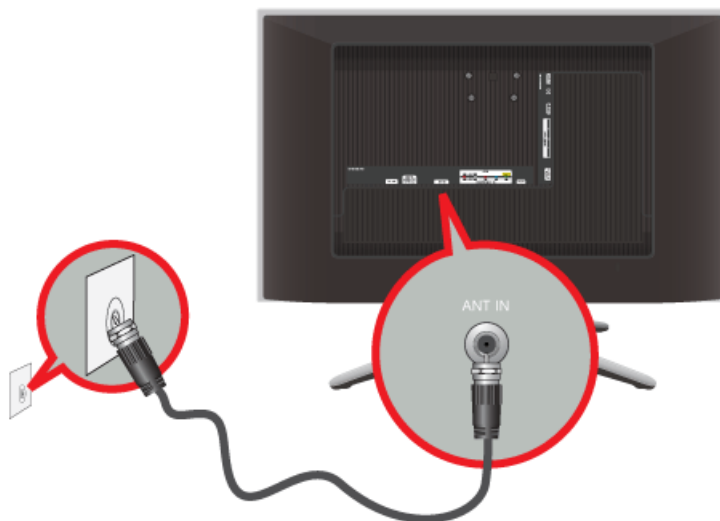
3. Connect the power adapter to [DC14V] on the rear of the product. Connect the power cord to the adapter and wall socket.  
(The input voltage is switched automatically.)



- You may enjoy clear and quality sound from the computer sound card using the product's speakers. (You don't need to install separate speakers for your computer.)

## 2-5 Using it as a TV

You may view television programs on the product if it is connected to an antenna or cable system without installing any separate TV reception hardware or software on your computer.



1. Connect the cable or TV antenna cable to the [ANT IN] port on the rear side of the product.
  - When using an indoor antenna/cable terminal:  
Check the antenna terminal on the wall and then connect the antenna/cable/satellite TV cable.
  - When using an outdoor antenna:  
When using an outdoor antenna, we strongly suggest using a qualified technician to install it.
2. When the connections are completed, connect the TV power.
3. When the product is turned on for the first time after it was purchased, the initial setup operations <Plug&Play> begin.

 Be careful that the coaxial cable is not bent when connecting it to the antenna input terminal [ANT IN].

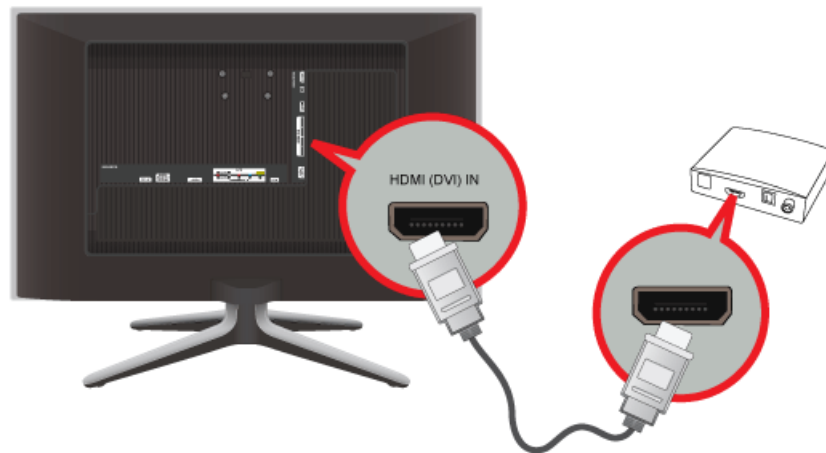
### Standby mode

Do not leave your TV in standby mode for long periods of time (when you are away on a holiday, for example). A small amount of electric power is still consumed even when the power button is turned off. It is best to unplug the power cord.

## 2-6 Connecting an HDMI cable

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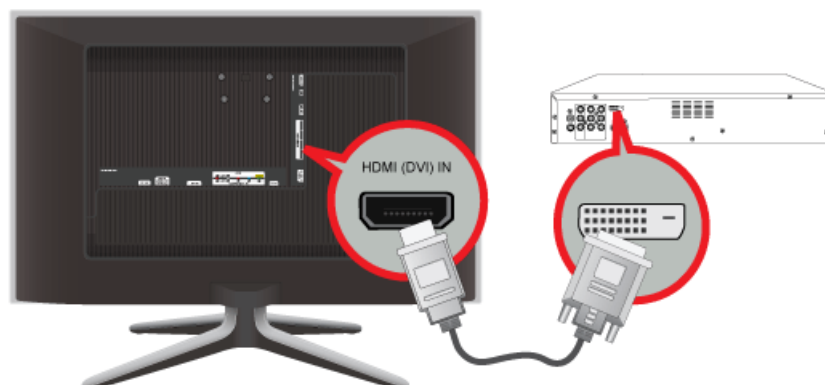
1. Connect the HDMI OUT port of the AV device (Blu-ray/DVD/Cable/Satellite box) to the [HDMI (DVI) IN] terminal of the product using the HDMI cable.
2. Press the [SOURCE] button at the front of the product or on the remote control to select <HDMI> mode.



 You do not need to make a separate audio connection when connecting via HDMI.

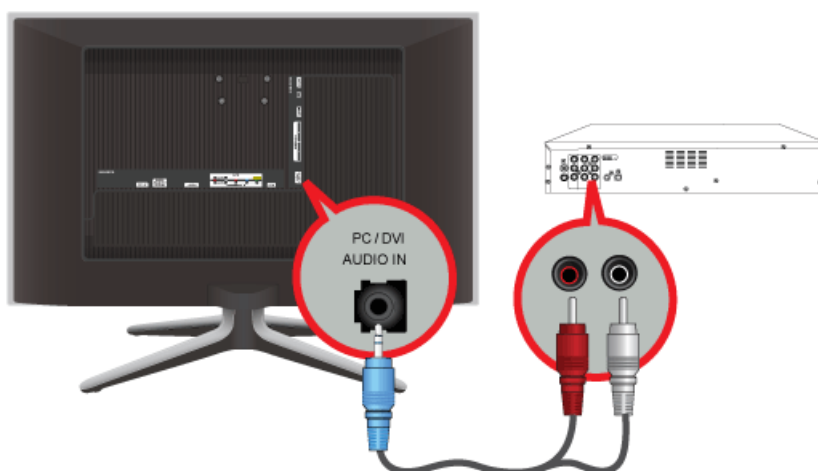
## 2-7 Connecting Using a DVI to HDMI Cable

1. Connect the DVI output terminal of an external device to the [HDMI (DVI) IN] terminal of the product using a DVI to HDMI cable.



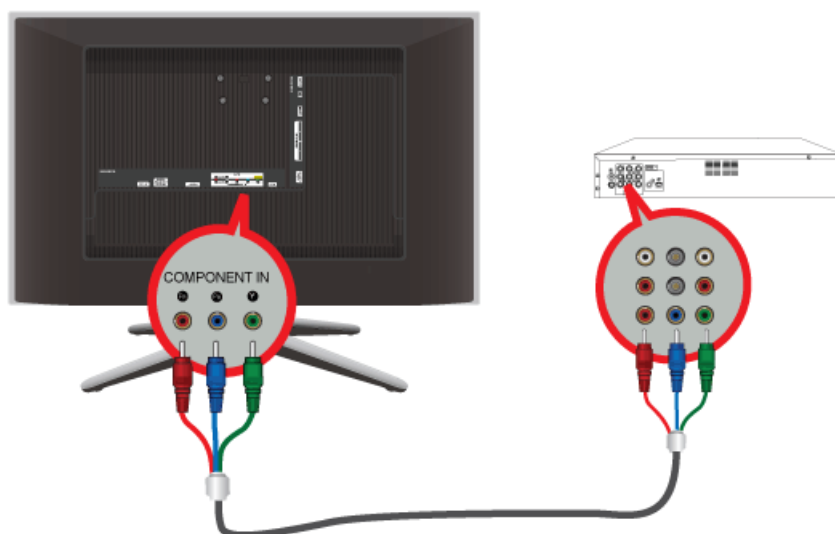
2. Connect the red and white plugs of an RCA to stereo (for PC) cable to the same colored audio output terminals of the digital output device, and connect the opposite plug to the [PC/DVI AUDIO IN] terminal of the product.

Press the [SOURCE] button at the front of the product or on the remote control to select <HDMI> mode.

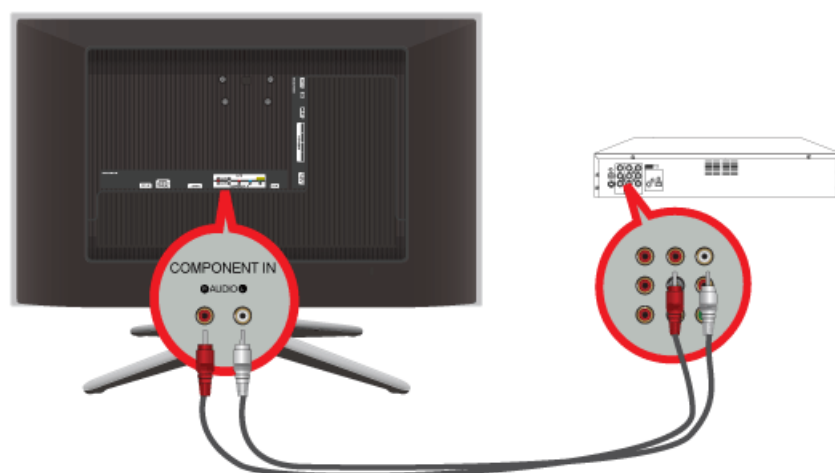


## 2-8 Connecting a Component cable

1. Connect the VIDEO OUT port of the AV device (DVD/VCR/Cable/Satellite box) to the [COMPONENT IN / AV IN] input ports using a component video cable [P<sub>R</sub>, P<sub>B</sub>, Y].



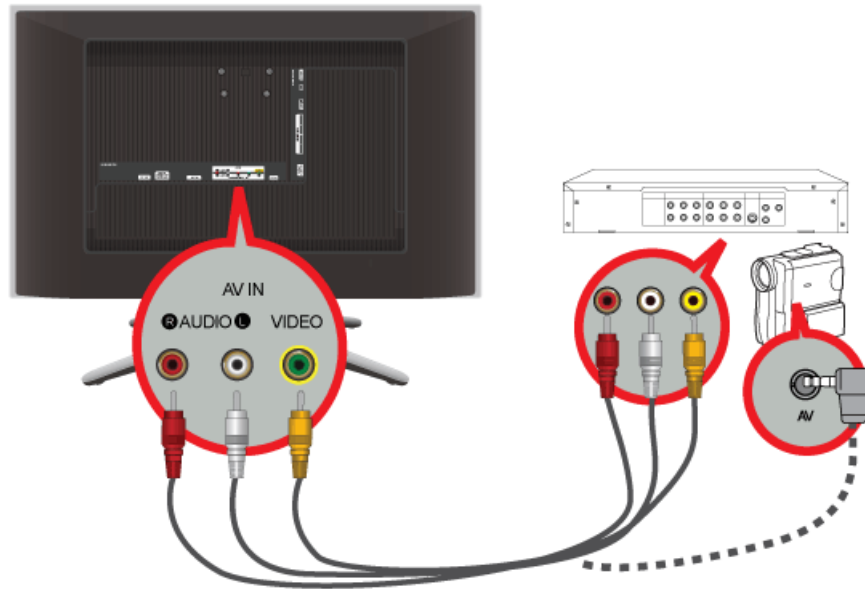
2. Connect the audio port of the AV device (DVD/VCR/Cable/Satellite box) to the [AUDIO (R-AUDIO-L)] port of the product. Press the [SOURCE] button at the front of the product or on the remote control to select the <Component> mode.



 For an explanation of Component video, consult your DVD/VCR/Cable/Satellite box manual.

## 2-9 Connecting AV Devices

1. Connect the port of the AV device (DVD/VCR/Cable/Satellite box/Camcorder) to the [AUDIO IN (R-AUDIO-L)] port of the product.
2. Connect the video output terminal of the AV device and the [COMPONENT IN / AV IN] of the product using a video cable.
3. Select <AV> using the [SOURCE] button on the remote.

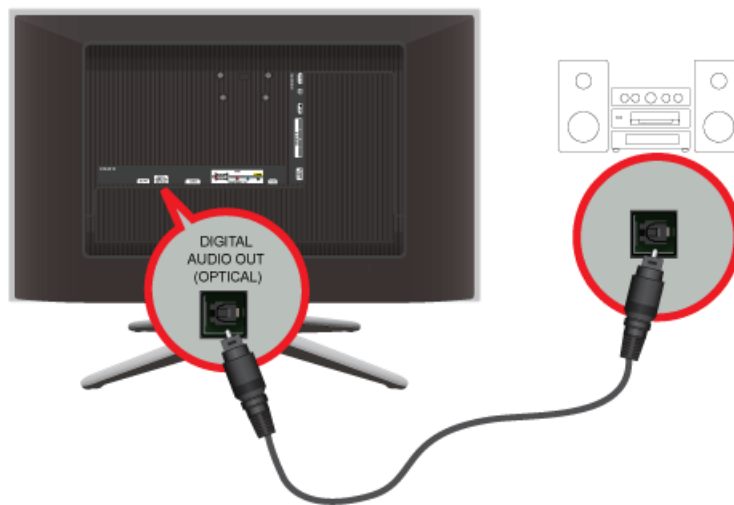


 The audio-video cables shown here are usually included with a Camcorder. (If not, check your local electronics store.)

## 2-10 Connecting to an Amplifier

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Connect the [DIGITAL AUDIO OUT (OPTICAL)] terminal of your product to the optical input of your amplifier using an optical cable.



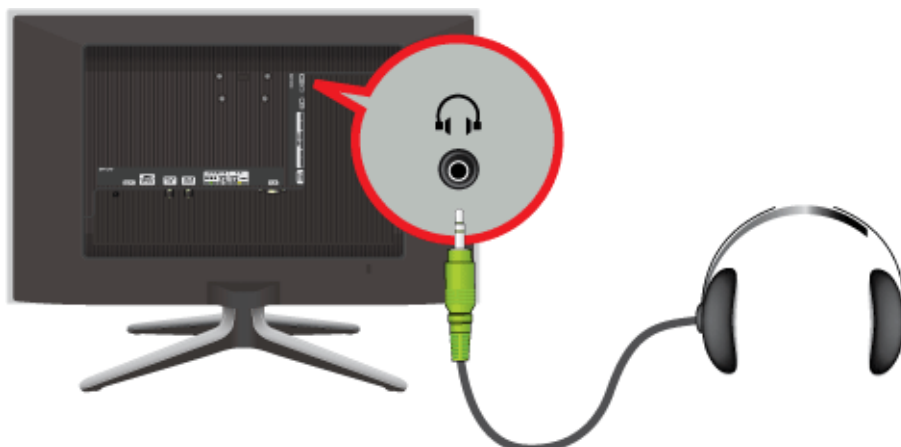
- If no sound is emitted from the product, you need to use an amplifier.
- For information on how to connect a speaker and amplifier, refer to the respective user manuals provided by their manufacturers.



## 2-11 Connecting Headphones

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Connect your headphones to the Headphone connection terminal.



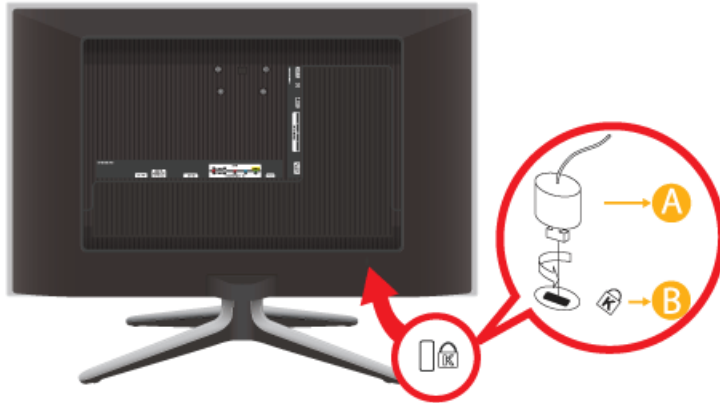

## 2-12 Kensington Lock

A Kensington Lock is an anti-theft device that enables users to lock the product so that they can safely use it in public locations. Since the shape and usage of the locking device may differ depending on the model and the manufacturer, refer to the User Manual supplied with the locking device for more information.

 You must purchase the Kensington Lock separately.



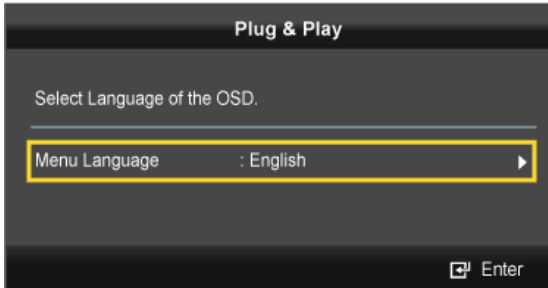
**To lock the product, follow these steps:**

1. Wrap the Kensington lock cable around a large, stationary object such as a desk or chair.
2. Slide the end of the cable with the lock attached through the looped end of the Kensington lock cable.
3. Insert the locking device into the Kensington slot on the product ( **B** ) .
4. Lock the lock ( **A** ).


-  • These are general instructions. For exact instructions, see the User Manual supplied with the locking device.
- You can purchase the locking device from an electronics store, an online shop, or our service center.


## 3 Using the Product



### 3-1 Plug & Play Feature



When the TV is initially powered on, basic settings proceed automatically and subsequently.


 To return to the previous step, press the Red button.

1. Press the [POWER ] button on the remote control.



-  • You can also use the [] button on the TV.
- The message <Select Language of the OSD.> is displayed.

2. Press the [] button. Select the appropriate language by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button. Press the [] button to confirm your choice.




3. Press the ◀ or ▶ button to select <Store Demo> or <Home Use>, then the [] button.

-  • We recommend setting the TV to <Home Use> mode for the best picture in your home environment.
- <Store Demo> mode is only intended for use in retail environments. If the unit is accidentally set to <Store Demo> mode and you want to return to <Home Use> (Standard): Press the volume button on the TV. When the volume OSD is displayed, press and hold the [ MENU ] button on the TV for 5 seconds.


4. Press the [] button. Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select <Air>, <Cable> or <Auto>, then press the [] button.


-  • <Air>: <Air> antenna signal. / <Cable>: <Cable> antenna signal.
- In Cable mode, you can select the correct signal source among <STD>, <HRC>, and <IRC> by pressing the ▲, ▼, ◀ or ▶ button, then press the [] button. If you have Digital cable, select the cable system signal source for both Analog and Digital. Contact your local cable company to identify the type of cable system that exists in your particular area.

5. Press the ▼ button to select <Search>, then press the [] button.

-  • To stop the search before it has finished, press the [] button with <Stop> selected.
- After all the available channels are stored, it starts to remove scrambled channels. The Auto program menu then reappears. Press the [] button when channel memorization is complete. The message <Set the Clock Mode.> is displayed.


6. Press the [] button.


Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select <Auto>, then press the [] button. The message <Set to daylight saving time.> is displayed. If you select <Manual>, <Set current date and time> is displayed.

7. Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select <Off>, <On>, then press the [] button.



8. Press the ▲ or ▼ button to highlight the time zone for your local area.


Press the [] button. If you have received a digital signal, the time will be set automatically.

9. The connection method to provide the best quality HD is offered. After confirming the method, press the [] button.

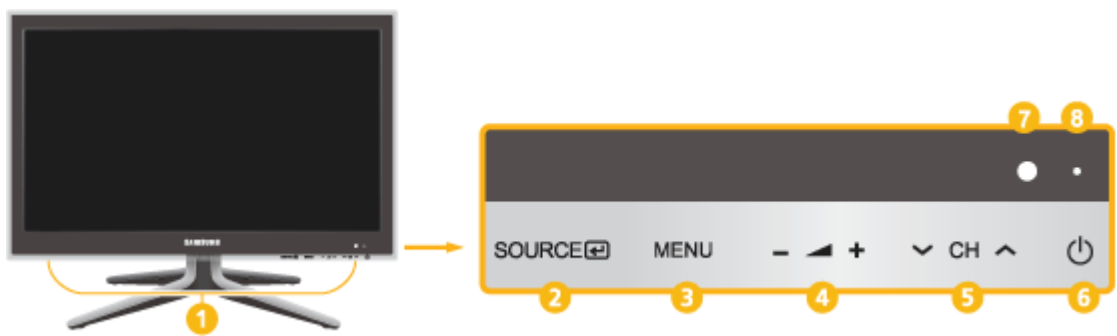
10. The message <Enjoy your TV.> is displayed. When you have finished, press the [] button.








**If you want to reset this feature...**

 The <Plug & Play> feature is only available in the <TV> mode.















### 3-2 Viewing the Control panel

3	[MENU]	Press this button to view the On Screen Display (OSD). This button is also used to exit the OSD or to return to a higher-level OSD menu.
4	[   +]	Moves from one menu item to another horizontally or adjusts selected menu values. Adjusts the audio volume.
5	[  CH 	Use these buttons to navigate the menu or to adjust a value in the OSD. Press to change channels in TV mode.
6	[ 	Press this button to turn the product on or off.
7	Remote control sensor	Aim the remote control towards this spot on the TV.

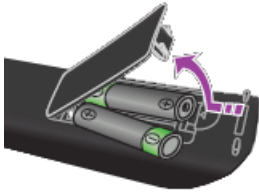
### 3-3 Remote Control

 The performance of the remote control may be affected by a TV or other electronic device operating near the product, causing a malfunction due to interference with the frequency.

- 1** POWER (  ) button  
Turns the product On/Off.
  - 2** Number Buttons  
Press to change the channel.
  - 3** (-) button  
Press to select additional channels(digital) being broadcast by the same station. For example, to select channel '54-3', press '54', then press '-' and '3'.
  - 4** - VOL+ button  
Press to increase or decrease the volume.
  - 5** MEDIA.P button  
Displays <Media Play>
  - 6** MENU (  ) button  
Opens the on-screen menu and exits from the menu or closes the adjustment menu.
  - 7** TOOLS (  ) button  
Use to quickly select frequently used functions.
  - 8** Move (     ) / (  ) buttons  
Use to select on-screen menu items and change menu values.
  - 9** RETURN (  ) button  
Returns to the previous menu.
  - 10** Color buttons  
Buttons used in the <Channel List>, <Media Play> menu, etc.
  - 11** S.MODE button  
Press to select the sound mode.
  - 12** SLEEP button  
Automatically shuts off the TV.

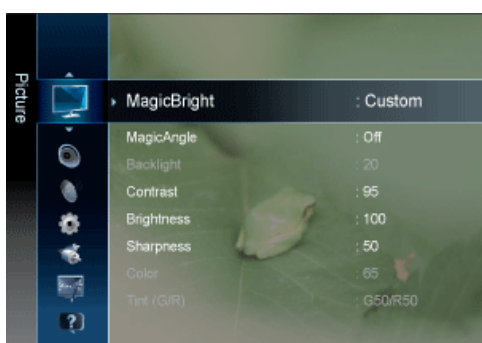

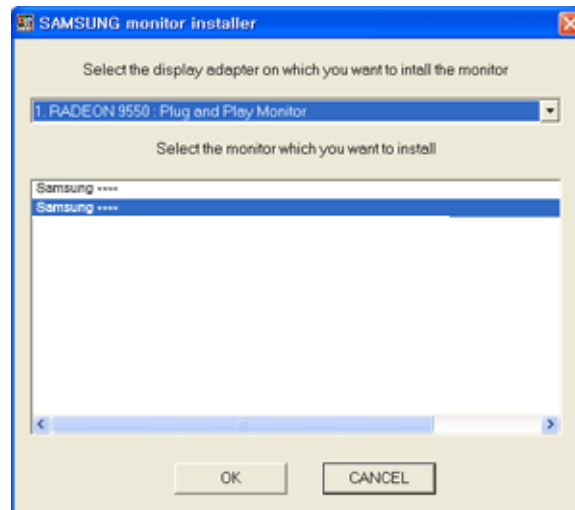


## 3-7 Installing the Device Driver

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-  If you install the device driver, you can set up the appropriate resolution and frequency for the product. The device driver is included on the CD supplied with the product. If the supplied drive file is corrupted, please visit the Samsung Electronics website ([www.samsung.com](http://www.samsung.com)), and download the driver.

1. Insert the driver installation CD into the CD-ROM drive.
2. Click on Windows Driver.
3. Complete the remaining installation steps according to the instructions displayed on the screen.
4. Select the model of your product from the model list.



5. Check if the appropriate resolution and screen refresh rate are displayed in the Control Panel settings. For more information, refer to the document about the Windows operating system.

## 3-8 Standard Signal Mode Table

 This product delivers the best picture quality when viewed under the optimal resolution setting. The optimal resolution setting is dependent on the screen size.

Therefore, the visual quality will be degraded if the optimal resolution is not set for the panel size. It is recommended setting the resolution to the optimal resolution of the product.

### Horizontal Frequency

The time taken to scan one line from the left-most position to the right-most position on the screen is called the horizontal cycle and the reciprocal of the horizontal cycle is called the horizontal frequency. The horizontal frequency is represented in kHz.

### Vertical Frequency

A panel must display the same picture on the screen tens of times every second so that humans can see the picture. This frequency is called the vertical frequency. The vertical frequency is represented in Hz.

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### 4-1 Natural Color

MultiScreen enables you to partition multiple sections on the product.

### Installing the Software

1. Insert the installation CD into the CD-ROM drive.
2. Select the MultiScreen setup program.
  -  If the pop-up screen for the software installation does not appear on the main screen, find and double-click the MultiScreen setup file on the CD-ROM.
3. When the Installation Wizard appears, click [Next].
4. Complete the remaining software installation steps according to the instructions displayed on the screen.
  - 
    - The software may not work properly if you do not restart the computer after the installation.
    - The MultiScreen icon may not appear depending on the computer system and the product specifications.
    - If the shortcut icon does not appear, press the F5 key.

Select MultiScreen from the program list and click the [Add/Delete] button.

# 5 Troubleshooting


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## 5-1 Product Self-Diagnosis

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-  • You can check if the product is working properly using the Self-Diagnosis function.
  - If a blank screen is displayed and the Power LED blinks even if the product and the PC are properly connected, perform the self-diagnosis function according to the procedures below.
1. Turn the product and the PC off.
  2. Remove the D-Sub cable from the product.
  3. Turn the product on.
  4. If the product is working properly, the <Check Signal Cable.> message appears.  
In this case, if a blank screen is displayed again, make sure that there is no problem with the PC and the connection.

## 5-2 Before Requesting Service

 Please check the following before requesting After-Sales service. If the problem continues, please contact your nearest Samsung Electronics Service Center.

PROBLEMS RELATED TO INSTALLATION (PC MODE)	
The monitor screen flickers.	Check if the signal cable between the computer and the monitor is securely connected and tightened. (Refer to Connecting to a Computer)
Blank spaces are found at the top and bottom of the screen when an HDMI or HDMI-DVI cable is connected to the monitor and PC.	Blank spaces on the screen are not caused by the monitor. The cause of the problem is the PC or graphics card, and can be fixed by adjusting the screen size in the HDMI or DVI option of the graphics card settings menu. If the graphics card settings menu has no option to adjust the screen size, update the graphics card driver to the latest version. (Please contact the graphics card or computer manufacturer for details on how to adjust the screen settings.)
