Install the TV in a horizontal, stable location. Install a steady tie to ensure that the TV is secure.

If the TV is not installed securely, it may lean or fall over and cause an injury.

NOTICE OF POSSIBLE TV STAND INSTABILITY

Use this TV with the TOSHIBA TV stand recommended in the "Specifications" section only. Use with other stands may result in instability, causing possible injury or death.



Precautions for moving the TV

- When moving the TV, be sure to remove the power plug from the wall outlet and disconnect the antenna cable and audio/video cables, any steady ties. Fire or electric shock may result if the power cord is damaged.
- When carrying the TV, at least two people are needed. Be sure to carry it upright.
- Never carry the TV with the screen facing up or down.

Precautions for installing on outdoor antenna

An outside antenna system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines, or other electric light or power circuits. If the antenna falls down or drops, it may cause injury or electric shock accidents.

1)The light source for this TV is a projection lamp unit with a limited service life. When the lamp wears out, the picture may become dark or black, or the lamp may fail, at which time you must replace the lamp unit.

The length of service life varies depending on product use and user settings. See "Selecting the lamp mode" on page 25 for information on switching the lamp mode.

To replace the lamp unit

Please contact the nearest Toshiba Authorized Service Center or dealer:

- if the picture darkens and/or colors fade;
- if the screen (lamp) does not light (LED indication #3, page 45); or
- if you hear a loud noise and the picture goes black, which may indicate a lamp rupture (LED indication #3, page 45).

Only the replacement lamp unit model listed below can be used with this TV. Using any other lamp may cause damage to the TV and/or lamp. <u>Model No.: D95-LMA (Stock No. 23311168)</u>

2)Each time you turn on the TV, it may take several minutes to go from no picture to full picture brightness.

3)The display of this TV is manufactured using an extremely high level of precision technology; however, an occasional pixel (dot of light) may show constantly on the screen.

This is a structural property of DLPTM (Digital Light ProcessingTM) technology in the TV, and is not a sign of malfunction. Such pixels are not visible when the picture is viewed from a normal viewing distance.

- 4)Depending on the media you are viewing, it is possible, although unlikely, that a limited number of viewers may see a "rainbow effect" on the screen, which can, in rare instances, result in eye fatigue. This is a rare occurrence related to technology of this type, and is not a sign of TV malfunction.
- 5)Always sit approximately 3-8 m away from the TV and as directly in front of it as possible. The picture quality may be affected by your viewing position and length of viewing time. If you sit too closely to the TV for too long, you may suffer from eye fatigue.
- 6)This TV contains several cooling fans to moderate the internal temperature. You may be able to hear the fans for several minutes after the TV is turned off. This is a function of the Quick restart feature and is not a sign of TV malfunction. You can set the Quick restart feature to stop the fans as soon as the TV is turned off. See "Setting the Quick restart feature" on page 33.
- 7)The orange and blue LED lights at the bottom center of the TV front indicate your TV's current status. If either light flashes, see "LED indications" on page 45 for details.

8)Review all safety and operating information in this owner's manual before you use your TV.

About insecticide spray

• Never spray volatile compounds such as insecticide on the cabinet. This may cause a discoloration or damage the cabinet.

Moisture Condensation

• If the room temperature suddenly rises (or if the TV is moved from a cool place to a hot place), condensation may occur on the lenses resulting in picture distortion or color fading. In such a case, simply wait a while (with the power on) and the condensation will evaporate.

Connecting an antenna

Optimum reception of color requires a good signal and will generally mean that an outdoor antenna must be used. The exact type and positioning of the antenna will depend upon your particular area. Your Toshiba dealer or service personnel can best advise you on which antenna to use in your area. Do not plug the power cord until you have finished connecting the antenna.



Installing the remote control batteries

Remove the battery cover.

Insert two R03 (\overrightarrow{AAA}) batteries matching the -/+ polarities of the battery to the -/+ marks inside the battery compartment.



Caution:

- Dispose of batteries in a designated disposal area. Do not throw batteries into a fire.
- Attention should be drawn to the environmental aspects of battery disposal.
- Do not mix battery types or combine used batteries with new ones.

Notes:

- If the remote control does not operate correctly, or if the operating range becomes reduced, replace both batteries with new ones.
- If the batteries are dead or if you will not use the remote control for a long time, remove the batteries to prevent battery acid from leaking into the battery compartment.

Turning the TV on

• Plug the power cord into a wall outlet.

Switching on the TV



Note:

If you watch black and white programs when the color system mode is set to Auto, color noise may appear on the screen. In this case, select the appropriate Color system (For the system of each country or region, refer to pages 17 and 48). After you plug in the TV power cord, make sure the blue LED on the TV front is lit.

Press the *U*/I Power button on the TV control panel or press the *U* button on the remote control.
The orange LED will blink for several seconds until the picture appears.

Note:

The Quick restart setting will affect the amount of time it takes for the picture to appear when you turn on the TV. See page 33 for details.

Switching off the TV

Press the \bigcirc Power button on the TV control panel or press the \bigcirc button on the remote control to switch to the standby mode.

Notes:

- When the TV will not be used for a long period of time, such as during vacation or travel, remove the power plug from the wall outlet.
- The TV will automatically turn off after approximately 15 minutes if it is tuned to a vacant channel or a station that completes its broadcast for the day. This function does not work in external input mode or blue screen off mode.
- If power is cut off while you are viewing the TV, the Last Mode Memory function turns on the TV automatically when power is applied again. If power is going to be off for a long time and you are going to be away from your TV, unplug the power cord to prevent the TV from turning on in your absence.

Learning about the menu system

- We suggest you familiarize yourself with the display chart before using the menu system:
 - Press the **MENU** button to display menu, then press the < or > button to select main menu headings.
 - Press the \checkmark or \land button to select an item.
 - Press the < or > button to select or adjust setting.
 - Press the **OK** button to display the next menu.

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Using the TV's features Viewing the wide-screen picture format

• This TV is capable of showing broadcasts in a number of formats. Depending on the type of broadcast being transmitted, you may select between Super live, Cinema, Subtitle, 14:9, Wide and 4:3.

Picture size selection



Notes:

- Using the special functions to change the size of the displayed image (e.g. changing the height/width ratio) for the purpose of public display or commercial gain may infringe on copyright laws.
- The picture size selection is not available for 720p and 1080i input signals (fixed to Wide).
- If the aspect ratio of the selected format is different from the one of the TV transmission or video program, it can cause a difference in vision. Change to the correct aspect ratio picture size.
- When the PC input mode (see page 31) is selected, the picture size selection is wide or 4:3 only.

Press the 🕀 button repeatedly to view the options available.

Super live

This setting will enlarge the 4:3 image to fit the screen by stretching the image vertically and horizontally, holding the correct proportions at the center of the image.

Cinema

When watching "letterbox format" films/video tapes, this setting will eliminate or reduce the black bars at the top and bottom of the screen by zooming in and selecting the image without distortion.

Subtitle

When subtitles are included on a letterbox format broadcast, this setting will raise the picture so that the most of text is displayed.

14:9

Use this setting when watching a 14:9 broadcast.

Wide

Use this setting when watching a wide-screen DVD, wide-screen video tape or a 16:9 broadcast (when available). Due to the range of wide-screen formats (16:9, 14:9, 20:9 etc.), you may see bars on the top and bottom of the screen.

4:3

Use this setting to view a true 4:3 broadcast.

- The picture position adjustment is not available for 720p and 1080i input signals.

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Adjustment to the position of the picture may be made to suit your viewing preferences.

To adjust the picture position:

- Press the **MENU** button, then 1 press the < or > button to display the SET UP menu.
- 2 Press the \checkmark or \land button to select Picture position.
- 3 Press the **OK** button to display the Picture position menu.

The menu will vary depending upon the widescreen format you have previously chosen.

To use the cinema mode

A movie film's picture runs at 24 frames a second, whereas movie software such as DVD, etc., that you enjoy watching on television at home runs at 30 (NTSC) or 25 (PAL) frames a second. To convert this signal to reproduce a smooth motion and picture quality, select the On mode.

Effective signal and setup conditions

- When the Video input mode is selected.
- When the input signal format is 480i and 576i.

Press the **MENU** button, then press the < or > button to display the PICTURE menu.

Press the v or v button to select Cinema mode, then press the v or button to select On or Off.

If you experience noise or poor reception of any stereo/bilingual program, set the MTS mode to Mono. Noise will be reduced and reception may improve.

Note:

If you experience noise with a particular program on whose channel reception is usually good, try setting MTS mode to Auto, then switch the OI/II button to O Mono (monaural) (see page 27).

Selecting the Dual 1 or Dual 2 mode

You can hear only Dual 1 or Dual 2 sound selected, whenever bilingual programs are received.

\equiv / \Box button:

Pressing the I/ button once will bring up the teletext screen. Press again to superimpose the teletext over a normal broadcast picture. Press again to return to normal TV mode. You need to return to normal viewing if you wish to change channels.

When you first press the \equiv / \Box button to access the text service, the first page you see will be the initial page.

In **FAST** mode, this displays the main subjects available and their relevant page numbers.

Sub-pages:

Once in this chosen page, if there are sub-pages they will automatically load into memory without changing the one you are reading. If there are many sub-pages, it will take a long time for them all to load and this will depend on the speed with which the broadcaster transmits them.

DO NOT CONNECT A PC USING THE HDMI PORT. ALWAYS use the VGA port provided to connect a PC.

Lamp unit replacement

The light source for this TV is a projection lamp unit with a limited service life. When the lamp wears out, the picture may become dark or black, or the lamp may fail, at which time you must replace the lamp unit. The length of service life varies depending on product use and user settings. See "Selecting the lamp mode" on page 25 for information on switching the lamp mode.

Replacing the lamp unit

When to replace the lamp unit

If you try to replace the lamp unit by yourself, read these instructions carefully.

You should replace the lamp unit:

- if the picture darkens and/or colors fade;
- if the screen (lamp) does not light (LED indication #3, page 45); or
- if you hear a loud noise and the picture goes black, which may indicate a lamp rupture (LED indication #3, page 45).

Only the replacement lamp unit model listed below can be used with this TV. Using any other lamp may cause damage to the TV

and/or lamp. Model No.: D95-LMA (Stock No. 23311168)

Important information

• NEVER look directly at the lamp when lit as eye damage could result. ALWAYS turn off the TV by unplugging the power cord before opening the lamp unit door and DO NOT remove the back cover of the TV.



• The temperature of the lamp immediately after use exceeds 200°C. Allow the lamp to cool for at least 1

Allow the lamp to cool for at least 1 hour before replacing it, touching it before it has cooled will result in severe burns.

- When replacing the lamp unit ALWAYS wear gloves to reduce the risk of burns.
- The lamp unit door is provided with an interlock to reduce the risk of electric shock and excessive ultraviolet radiation.
- DO NOT attempt to replace the lamp unit without removing the lamp unit door completely, failure to do so could result in serious injury or death.
- If the lamp unit glass is accidentally touched or gets dirt on it, it can be gently wiped clean with a lint-free cleaning cloth such as a camera lens cloth or spectacles cloth.

NEVER clean the lamp with any type of flammable or aerosol cleaning liquid. Most household cleaning agents contain chemicals that are flammable at high temperatures.

• The lamp unit contains mercury. Disposal of mercury may be regulated due to environmental considerations. Dispose of the used lamp unit by the approved method for your area. For disposal or recycling information, please contact your local authorities.

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How to replace the lamp unit

Turn off the TV and remove the power plug from the wall outlet.

Allow the lamp to cool for at least 1 hour before replacing it.

On the lamp unit door on the side of the TV, loosen 2 the screw using a manual screwdriver, and then remove the lamp unit door.



Loosen screw using manual screwdriver

Using a manual screwdriver, loosen the two screws 3 on the lamp unit.



Grasp the lamp unit handle and gently pull the lamp 4 unit straight out of the TV. Set the old lamp unit aside.

Remember to wear lint-free gloves when replacing the lamp unit.



Carefully insert the new lamp unit straight into the TV until it is fully seated.

Notes:

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- Never subject the lamp unit to excessive shock.
- Never touch the lamp unit glass or otherwise get it dirty. Doing so may affect the image quality and reduce the service life of the lamp.

Using the manual screwdriver tighten the two screws. Make sure that the screws are hand-tight only, do not use an electric screwdriver to avoid over-tightening.

Reattach the lamp unit door, making sure to insert the hooks on the left side of the lamp unit door inside the opening in the TV cabinet.

Replace the screw and hand-tighten using a manual screwdriver.

Plug in the power cord and turn on the TV. After the initial warm up period (which may take several seconds for full picture brightness), the TV should now operate normally.

If there is no picture, the picture is very dark or the TV does not turn on, turn it back off and remove the power plug from the wall outlet. Repeat steps 1 to 7 to ensure that the lamp unit has been installed correctly.

Put the old lamp into the now empty lamp unit box and dispose of it according to local Government guidelines. Make sure it is out of reach of children and animals.
