INSTALLATION and OPERATION of the Network Board

This Network Board is an optional product to control and set up a projector via a network. Mount this product to the projector and connect a network cable. By accessing the connected projector using the web browser on your computer, the projector can be controlled and set up remotely.

This product is only used for our projectors that have a terminal for the Network Board. This manual explains the installation of the Network Board and its operation.

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Features

Web Management function

With this function, you can monitor projector functions such as power status, lamp status, input mode, signal condition, lamp-use time, etc. through the network by using the web browser installed on your computer.



E-Mail Alert function

Projector (Network Board) sends messages to the registered e-mail addresses when a lamp abnormality or power failure occurs with the projector. In this message, it describes how to solve the cause of the problems. You can take efficient action for quick recovery.



Multi-control function

A single computer can control and set up the multiple computers at the same time.



Automatic On/Off using Timer function

Automatically turn on or off the projectors at specified date/day and time by using the clock function.



Control port ready for external equipment via network

This product provides a serial port (RS-232C) for controlling external equipment. By connecting the equipment which has a serial port, it can be controlled by a computer via the network. * This product does not provide the interface driver software to control external equipment.

To perform the management and setting up the projector using this product, the environment described below is required.

Installation

Installation

Flow of installation

The following are instructions for attaching this product to the projector and connecting it to the network. Please review the entire procedure to become familiar with it.

Check package (p.11)

Please check the contents of a package. This product contains a network board, an owner's manual (this manual), a ferrite core and 2 screws. Also please check the name and function of each part.

2 Installation (p.12-14)

- 1. Mount this product to the projector.
- 2. Connect the LAN cable and join it to the network.
- 3. Confirm that the network menus are activated on the setting menu of the projector.

3 Network configuration (p.15-24)

Configure the network of the projector. Separate configurations must be set up for each network to which the projector will be connected.

- Configure the network with the projector.
- Configure the network with the computer.

Setting up is completed.

The preparation is completed to control the projector connected to the network. At next step, set up and control the projector via the network by using the web browser installed on your computer. Please see chapter "2: Basic setting and operation" on page 25.

Name and function of each part



Caution

✓ Do not touch the connector. It may damage the product.

(1) Mounting

1 Turn the Mains switch off.



- **2** Remove 2 screws on a board from any of the slots 1 to 4*, and then pull the board out from the projector.
 - * The number of the slots may differ from the actual depending on type of the projector.
- **3** Put the Board into the board slot along the guide. Mount the board connector into the socket in the slot firmly.
- 4 Secure the board with two screws (supplied).

* Mounting example of the 4 slots model.

ACaution

- Mains switch must be turned off when mounting or removing this product otherwise it may damage the product.
- $\scriptstyle \checkmark$ Do not install multiple network boards into a projector otherwise it may damage the product.
- $\scriptstyle \checkmark$ Do not connect the AC cord until after connecting the LAN cable and computer.

(2) Connection of LAN cable

To connect to the network, it is required to use the UTP (Unshielded Twisted Pair) straight cable with RJ-45 plug. There are two different types of cables depending on whether the network is constructed with 10Base-T or 100Base-TX. Prepare the Hub (10Base-T or 100Base-TX) to distribute the network cable if required.

1 Turn the Mains switch off.
 2 Wind the UTP straight cable once around the ferrite core (supplied) as the illustrated below.
 Ferrite Core

3 Connect the UTP straight cable to the LAN port on the network board.

4 Connect the UTP straight cable to the hub.



- Use the UTP cross cable when you connect the computer and projector directly not using the hub.
- ✓ When you connect the projector into the 10Base-T network, use cable with category 3 or 5. When you connect the projector into the 100Base-TX network, use cable with category 5.
- ✓ The length of cable between hub and projector should be less than 100m.

(3) Confirmation of network menu activity

When installing this product to the projector, the network on-screen menu items for this product are activated automatically. If not activated, the product may not have been installed correctly. Please check chapter "Mounting" on page 12.

Turn on the projector and display the menu on the screen.

Confirmation of network setting menu (Network)

Using the pointers on the remote control handset or on the projector, select the **Network** icon from the **Setting** sub menu, and then press the **SELECT** button once. Check if the setting is **On**. If not, switch to **On** by using the pointer $\blacktriangleleft/\triangleright$. The power indicator on this product will illuminate red.

Press the **SELECT** button again, the network setting menu appears on the screen as follows. For further information about network setting, please see chapter "Network configuration" on the next page.

Using the pointers on the remote control handset or on the projector, select the **Display** icon from the **Setting** sub menu, and then press the **SELECT** button twice. The password setting menu appears on the screen. If not, please check if the function of Network is **On** as explained on previous item "Confirmation of network setting menu". For further information about password setting, please see "Password setting menu" on page 17.

(4) Network configuration

When you connect a projector to a network, the network number of projector must be the same as the network you intend to connect. You should configure projector's network first. Make sure that the projector is connected to the network correctly. There are 2 ways to configure the network, by using the projector's menu **[A]**, or by using the computer **[B]**. Refer to the chart below and use the method you prefer.





Configure the network with the projector

This example explains how to set the following configuration.

1 Selection of network menu [Network]

Turn on the projector and display the menu on the screen. Select the **Network** icon from the **Setting** sub menu using the pointers, and then press the **SELECT** button on the remote control or on the projector. Confirm that its mode is set **On**. If not, change mode to **On** using the pointer $\triangleleft / \triangleright$.



2 Configuration for IP Address/ Subnet mask/Default Gateway*/DNS*

Press the **SELECT** button again, the following network setting menu appears on the screen. Enter the specified network address with $\blacktriangle/\bigtriangledown/\checkmark/\checkmark$ keys. The following is an example of a network configuration.

^{*} In the network environments not using a Gateway or Router, the Default Gateway address should be set to [0.0.0.0]. If you do not use the functions E-mail or DNS server, it should also be set to [0.0.0.0] for the DNS address.

How to enter the numbers

To move the selection and change the values, use the pointers A/V/4/ > on the projector or on the remote control handset.

The \blacktriangleleft / \blacktriangleright keys are used to move the selection item.

The \blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown keys are used to change the number value.

3 Restart the Network board

Select the **SET** with $\triangleleft/\triangleright$ keys and press the **SELECT** button again. The network configuration display disappears and the network board begins restarting^{*1}. It takes about 60 seconds. Do not turn off the mains switch during this period.

Completing of installation

Now the installation is completed. The IP address of this projector was set to "192.200.1.201". Next, please see chapter "Basic setting and operation" on page 25. It describes basic setup and operation of the projector.

Password setting menu [Display]

A password can be set to restrict access to the setting pages of the projector using the web browser. The default password is set "0000" as no password.

Use the projector's menu and select the **Display** icon on the **Setting** sub menu, and then press the **SELECT** button on the projector twice. The following setting display appears on the screen. The numbers on the display indicate the current password. To change the password, enter your desired number by using the pointers on the projector or remote control handset, and then Select the **SET** with \blacktriangleleft / \blacktriangleright keys and press the **SELECT** button. The password setting display disappears and the network board begins restarting^{*1}. It takes about 60 seconds. Do not turn off the mains switch during this period.



*1 The network board begins restarting automatically when the network configuration or password setting is changed and then the **SELECT** button is pressed.

- Password setting must be done when you connect the projector to the network. This setting is carried out through the projector's menu and also it can be set through the network using the web browser. For further information please refer to chapter "Initial Setting/Password setting" on page 30.
- ✓ Valid characters for password are 4 digits numeric numbers 0 to 9.
- This password is not to restrict the use of the projector. This password is to set the security against the use of the projector through the network.

Make sure that the projector is connected to the network and then turn the projector on.

^{*1} Change your computer's network configuration temporarily. After completing the set up for the projector, you must set up again to the original network configuration for your computer. It is recommended to make a note of those network settings.

Completing of installation

Now the installation is completed. The IP address of this projector has been set to "192.168.1.201". You must reset the network configuration of the computer to the original and restart the computer.

Next, please see chapter "Basic Setting and Operation" on page 25. It describes how to operate and set up the projector .

ENGLISH

- If you use a cable to connect the projector and computer directly, without using a hub, you must use a UTP cross cable. In this case, you cannot access the login page if the setting of web browser is set to "Use proxy server". It must be changed to the "Not use proxy server". For further information, please see the "Web browser setting" on page 72.
- When you set up the network of projector which has a default setting by using the computer, it must be carried out in the network which does not provide any gateways (routers). If it has the gateways (routers), you must carry out the configuration by using the projector's menu.



Configure the network of computer

When you use the projector through the network, the IP address of the proiector must be the same IP network number of the existing network. Also it

is required to use the same IP network number of the computer to set up the projector. In the network included with the gateway (router), it must be used with the IP network number specified by the gateway (router).

Notice about system construction

For installation of multiple projectors into the same network with Network Board.

Do not install multiple projectors with Network Boards that have their default network settings to the same network. The use of the Network Boards which have the default IP address set to the same network settings will cause IP addresses to collide and create a malfunction. When you install multiple projectors into the same network, configure the network with the following steps.

- 1. Change the IP address from the default IP address. To change the IP address, use the network setting menu on the projector. Please see chapter "Network Configuration" on page 15 for further information.
- 2. Make sure that there is no network equipment set with the same IP address in the network, and then connect to the network.
- 3. When installing other projectors, follow the above steps to change the IP address and connect to the network.

In case of installing the projector with Network Board into the network constructed with the DHCP/BOOTP server.

This Network Board does not support the DHCP/BOOTP server. The static IP address must be configured by the manual. To use this product in this network environment, set it up so that the DHCP/BOOTP server does not assign the IP address configured to this product for another device on the network. Please consult your network administrator for further information.

Basic Setting and Operation

Basic Setting and Operation

This chapter describes basic operations and settings for controlling the projector via a network using this product. It is required that computer and projector are connected to the network and the network address be properly configured.

Login the setting page of the projector

1 Enter the IP address

Launch the web browser installed in your computer, enter the IP address into the "Address" on the browser and the press the "Enter" key.

Enter the IP address that you configured in chapter "Network Configuration" on page 15. The default IP address is [192.168.0.2].

2 Select a display mode and login

This product provides 2 types of control mode, Graphic Mode and Text Mode as the below. Select a proper mode to match your PC and network environment by clicking on the text link.

Initial Settings

After installing this product to the projector, perform the following basic initial setting.

Click on the **Initial** linked text on the main menu to display the initial setting page. The Languages, Date/Time and Password can be set in this page. The model name of the projector on which this product is mounted is displayed on the page.

This setting is to select the display language of the web page. Select your language with the pull-down menu button and then press the **Set** button. The selectable language is English or Japanese. You may find the unrecognized character text in the menu if the computer does not provide Japanese fonts.

[Note]

This language selection is realized by using the JavaScript function of the web browser. If the preference of the browser is set not to use the JavaScript, the "Set" linked text appears on the page as the below. Click on its text to change the language display. There are various kind of ways to change this preference depending on the web browser's version and application. Please refer to chapter "Appendix: Web browser setting/Active Script (JavaScript enable)" on page 72.



2 Password Setting

This page is to set the password to restrict the access from an unauthorized person through the network.

Enter the password onto the text box and press the Set button.



The Network Board begins restarting and it takes about 40 seconds. Close (Quit) the web browser and access to the login page again in 40 seconds. This is to perform the login authentication firmly.

The default password [0000] means no password. You should change password from the default in normal use. When you connect the projector with this product to the network, you should set a password. Only a four-digit numeric number is valid characters for the password.

* If you forget the password to the projector, you can check it by selecting the "Display" sub menu from the "Setting" menu on the projector. For further information, please see chapter "Password Setting" on page 17.

3 Date/Time Setting

Click on the page number "2" to display the Time Setting page.



Type present date onto the date text area with (Year/Month/Date) format and type present time onto the time text area with (Hour:Minute) format in 24 hours indication. Press the **Set** button and confirm that the data and time are set correctly. The displayed date and time are not updated automatically, press the **Refresh** button to get the present date and time.

ACaution

This product provides a lithium battery. When the battery runs down, the clock and timer functions do not operate properly. Contact your local dealer for the replacement of battery. The replacement must be carried out by a qualified service personnel.



Network Configuration

Getting the current time

The displayed time is the value set when the setting page was displayed. This time value is not updated automatically. To update the display time press the **Refresh** button.

Notes on timer setting

Up to 10 timer events can be registered. Timer events always operate according to the next valid event depending on the projector's power status. In the example below, event 3 turns on the projector so next event 4 (also turning on projector) will not be effective because the projector is already turned on. Similarly, when the projector is turned off by event 5, event 6 OFF will not be effective in turning it off again. But these secondary events (event 4 and event 6) will become effective if a person turns off the projector (after event 3 and before event 4) or turns on the projector (after event 5 and before event 6).



- When the timer events are set at the same time, the last event set will override the previous events. For example, if there is an event like "On at 8:00 everyday" and then new event is set like "Off at 8:00 everyday", only the last setting event is effective.
- When the timer event ON occurs during cooling down period, this is invalid event because the projector cannot be turned on during this cooling down period.

This function allows external equipment to be controlled by the computer through the network and the projector can be controlled by the external serial controller. Installation/Access

Why doesn't the setting page appear in my web browser?



Following causes are possible. Please check them.

- 1. The projector is not connected to the network. Check LED indicators status (p.11).
 - Check the connection of LAN cable if the LINK indicator does not illuminate orange.
 - Check the network configuration of the projector if ACT indicator does not illuminate green.
 - Function "Network" in the projector is not set to "ON". Set up by using the projector's on-screen menu (p.14/16).
 - 3. Wrong network configuration of the projector Check the network configuration of the projector by using the projector's onscreen menu (p.14/16).
 - Wrong network configuration of the computer. Check the network configuration of the computer. See chapter "Configure the network of computer" on page 20.
 - 5. The Network Board is used with the default setting. (p.14).
 - 6. The proxy setting of the web browser is not set correctly (p.72).
 - 7. The computer does not provide TCP/IP protocol.
- No setting page in my web browser? Is the problem in the network or in the projector? I would like to find out the problem whether it is in the network or in the projector
- A Check it by the following steps
 - 1. Disconnect the projector from the network and connect the projector and computer with the UTP cross cable directly.
 - 2. Change network configuration of the computer and projector as shown in the example below.

If the login page does not appear, please check for proper mounting of this product onto the projector by referring to the "Installation" chapter on pages 9 to 14.

How can I restrict access from the computer.

Please use the password authentication function on the login page (p.30).
 Please use the IP filtering function provided with the gateway (router) to restrict the accessing from the computer. For further information please con-

sult your network administrator.

Q Can I access the projector installed on the company's local area network from a remote location?

- There are some ways to access to the projector in the LAN, but you must consult your network administrator.

Q We use the DHCP/BOOTP server to assign the IP address. Is it possible to use the Network Board in this network environment?

A Possible. As the Network Board does not support the DHCP/BOOTP server, the fixed IP address must be configured manually. Please consult your network administrator. (p.24)



How can I install several projectors equipped with the Network Board?

A Install and configure network one by one to avoid the IP address collision each other. (p.24)

To configure the IP address please see chapter "Network configuration" on page 15.



How many projectors can I control with multi-control function?

A It has been designed to control up to 100 sets but it depends on the network environment.

Password/Login

- What should I do when I forget the password?
- A Select the **Display** icon from the **Setting** menu by using control keys on the projector and then press the **SELECT** button. The current password will appear on the screeen. (p.14/17)

Q Can I register the setting page as a web browser "Favorites" or "Bookmarks"?

A Please add the "Login" page to your "Favorites" or "Bookmarks". Do not add the specified setting page because it will not be able to perform the password authentication correctly.

Why can't I change the controls in the setting page with web browser?

A Please make sure the projector is turned on. If it is in the standby mode, the setting is not effective to the projector. To control the projector with a web browser, the projector must be in the powered-on condition. Also, projectors registered for multi-control cannot have any controls changed if they are in standby mode. But timer and clock settings are always effective, even for projectors in standby mode.

Q Why does it sometimes take a lot of time to complete the page display?

A The display speed of the page depends on the network environment in which both the projector and computer are placed. It may take much time to complete the page display if network traffic is heavy. Please consult your network administrator. By changing the preference of your web browser to "not show pictures", you may have page display more quickly at the heavy network traffic. Please see the browser's on-line help for further information. Also you can select the Text mode for displaying pages quickly (p.26)

Q I use many of the projectors in the network. How can I use names of the projectors to recognize each projector instead of IP addresses?

A You can manage the projectors with nicknames instead of the IP address. Please see chapter "Control the Multi-Projectors" for further information. (p.49) By registering the projector name and IP address with the DNS server, it can be accessed with the nickname from the any computer referred to the DNS server. Please consult your network administrator. (p.31, 57)

A How many numbers of the E-mail addresses can I register in the E-mail setting page.

You can register up to 10 addresses.

Why am I not receiving E-mail alert messages?

A Make sure that the registered E-mail address and SMTP server address are correct. If the SMTP server is located in your LAN (Local Area network), the address should be set to the SMTP server in your LAN. The SMTP server located outside of your LAN may not be available for security reason. For further information please contact your network administrator. (p.32)

It may be required for the authentication depending on the SMTP server. This product does not support this kind of SMTP server.

Can I develop a driver to control external serial equipment?

- A This product does not provide any driver software. To control the external equipment connected to the extra serial port, it should be required to clarify the commands and communication condition defined by each equipment. If they are clarified, it can be controlled by using the Telnet application installed on your computer. Please see chapter "Use of telnet" on page 66.

Can I control the projector by using the telnet application?

A Possible. Please refer to the chapter "Control the projector with telnet" on page 68.

Q Can I update the firmware of the Network Board.

A It is possible to update the firmware through the network. It is required to have a special tool for the updating. For further information please consult your local dealer. The version number of the firmware is indicated on the lower part of the "Initial Setting" page.

What are the rules for IP address assignment?

A If the network is constructed with TCP/IP protocol, a unique IP address is required for each piece of network equipment. The following are basic rules of the assignment.

Rule1

Do not configure the same IP address to the network equipment in the same network group. Each piece of equipment must be assigned a unique IP address.

If the IP address is set [192.168.x.x], the Subnet Mask should be set [255.255.255.0] for example.

Rule2

The start address [xxx.xxx.0] and the last address [xxx.xxx.255] of the IP address must not be assigned to any other equipment. These address numbers are reserved.

Rule3

The IP address must correlate to a network number. If network numbers are different between the equipment, they cannot establish communications each other. In this case, the router is placed in the networks to make the routing.

What is the MAC address assigned to the Network Board?

The MAC address is indicated on the printed board as the below.



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
