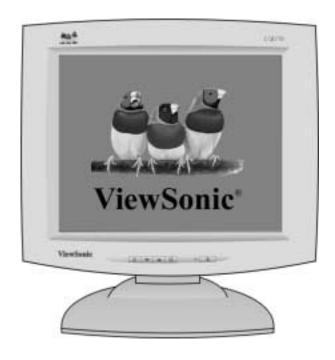

*NOTE: The supplied INF file assures compatibility with Windows operating systems, and the ICM file (Image Color Matching) ensures accurate on-screen colors. ViewSonic® recommends that you install both files as shown in the Quick Installation section.

Before Using the ViewPanel®

- Read Precautions on this page and Power Cord Safety Guidelines in the Appendix.
- Read **Setting the Timing Mode** on page 6 before you adjust the ViewPanel. This will prevent you from making adjustments unnecessarily.

Precautions

- For best viewing conditions sit at least 18" from the ViewPanel.
- AVOID TOUCHING THE SCREEN WITH YOUR FINGERS. Oils from the skin are difficult to remove.
- NEVER REMOVE THE REAR COVER. The ViewPanel contains high-voltage parts. You may suffer serious injury if you touch these parts.
- Avoid exposing the ViewPanel to direct sunlight or another heat source.
 The ViewPanel should be facing away from direct sunlight to reduce glare.
- Always handle your ViewPanel with care when moving it.

- Place your ViewPanel in a well ventilated area. Do not place anything on the ViewPanel that prevents adequate dissipation of heat.
- Ensure the area around the ViewPanel is clean and free of moisture.
- Do not place heavy objects on the ViewPanel, video cable, or power cord.
- If smoke, abnormal noise, or strange odor is present, immediately switch the ViewPanel off and call your dealer or ViewSonic. It is dangerous to continue using the ViewPanel.

Quick Installation

1 Connect video cable

Make sure that both the ViewPanel® and the computer are powered OFF. Connect the video cable from the back of your computer to the video input on the back of the display.

Macintosh® users: Connect a Macintosh adapter (part No. VMAC-1) to the video cable, then to the ViewPanel. To order an adapter for older Macintosh systems contact ViewSonic Customer Support. You will need to provide your ViewPanel's serial number.

2 Connect AC/DC adapter and power cord

Connect the power cord to a properly grounded AC (i.e., wall) outlet, then to the AC/DC adapter and to the ViewPanel as shown below.

3 Power-ON ViewPanel and computer

Power-ON the ViewPanel, **THEN** power-ON the computer.

NOTE:

- This sequence (ViewPanel before computer) is very important.
- At this point Windows® 98 users may receive a message asking them to install the Viewpanel's INF file.

4 Install Display Optimization files (INF and ICM files)

(1) Insert the ViewSonic Wizard CD-ROM into your computer's CD-ROM drive.

NOTE: If your computer does not have a CD-ROM drive, see Customer Support in this manual.

(2) Wait for the CD-ROM to auto-start.

NOTE: If your computer does not autostart: double-click on the CD-ROM icon in the Windows Explorer, then double-click on **viewsonic.exe**

(3) Follow the on-screen instructions.

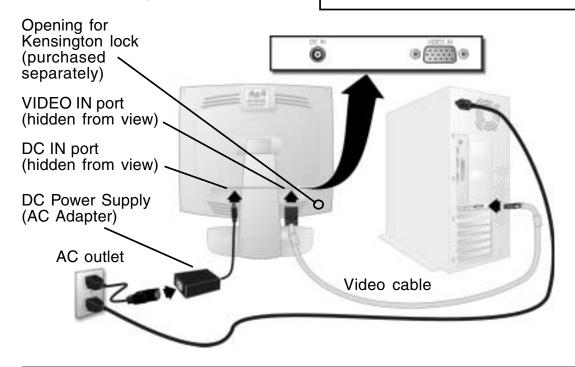

Using the ViewPanel

Setting the Timing Mode

The <u>timing mode</u> consists of the <u>resolution</u> and <u>refresh rate</u> (vertical frequency). After setting the timing mode, use the ViewSonic OnView® controls in this section to make adjustments. The recommended timing mode for this ViewPanel® is: 1280 x 1024 @ 60Hz.

To set the Timing Mode:

- 1 <u>Set the resolution</u>: Right-click on the Windows® desktop > **Properties** > **Settings** > **Desktop Area** > set the resolution (example 1280 x 1024 @ 60Hz).
- 2 <u>Set the refresh rate</u>: See your graphic card's user guide for instructions.

NOTE: To minimize the adjustments required for an optimal screen image, select a timing mode from the **Preset Timing Modes** table below.

NOTE: For best image quality, activate AUTO TUNE from the IMAGE ADJUST menu.

If necessary, from the IMAGE ADJUST menu, make small adjustments using H POSITION and V POSITION, then PHASE, until the screen image is completely visible. (The black border around the edge of the screen should barely "touch" the illuminated "active area" of the ViewPanel.)

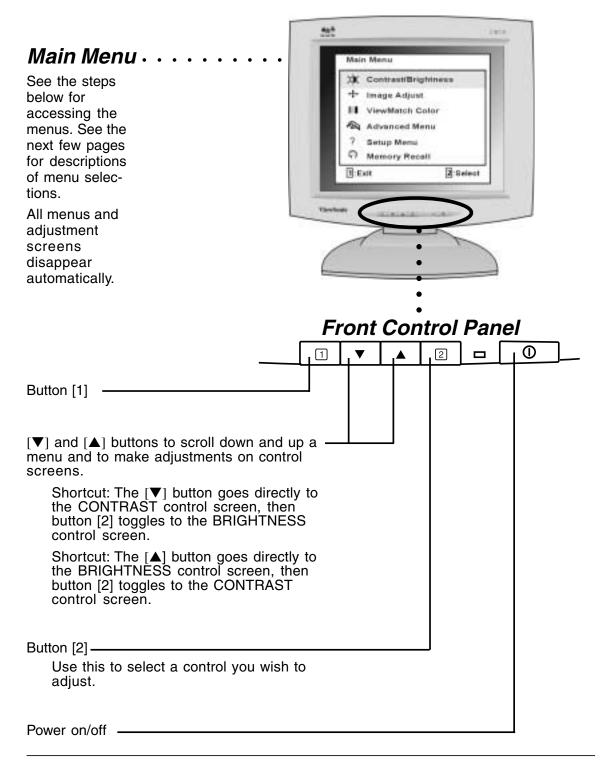

Adjusting the Screen Image

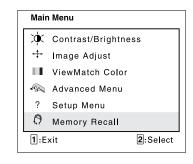
Adjust the screen image using the buttons on the **Front Control Panel** to select from the menus and make adjustments. For descriptions of each control see the next few pages.

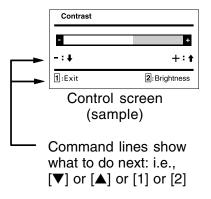


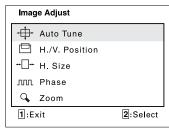
Adjusting the Screen Image..continued

The following steps show an example of how to access the OnView[®] **Main Menu** and sub-menus in order to make adjustments to your screen image. For more information on each control see the next few pages.

- Press the [1] button on the Front Control Panel to display the Main Menu shown on the right.
- Press the [▼] or [▲] button to scroll down or up the menu to the desired option.
- Press the [2] button to select a menu option. A control screen like the sample shown below appears (see Step 4A).
 Or, another menu appears with more options (see Step 4B).
- 4 Do one of the following:
 - A With a control screen displayed like the one shown above in Step 3, press the [▼] or [▲] button to make adjustments.
 - B With another menu displayed like the sample shown on the right, press [▼] or [▲] to select an option. Then, press the [2] button to go to the control screen. Press [▼] or [▲] to make adjustments.
- 5 After making adjustments, press the [1] button to save changes and exit the screen.







Submenu (sample)

OSD Lock and Power Button Lock modes

OSD Lock This mode locks all current control settings and prevents access to the control menus until this mode is unlocked.

- To lock all OSD menus, press and hold both the [1] button and the ▲ (up-arrow) button for 10 seconds. While in this mode, when any button is pushed, *OSD Locked* will display for five seconds.
- To unlock the OSD menus, press and hold both the [1] button and the ▲ (up-arrow) button for 10 seconds.

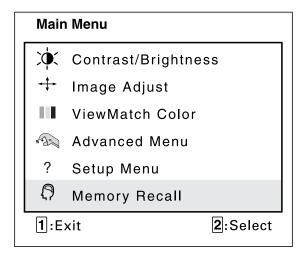
Power Button Lock This mode locks the power of the ViewPanel in the ON position.

• To lock the power of the ViewPanel ON, press and hold both the [1] button and the ▼ (down-arrow) button for 10 seconds. While in this mode, when the Power button is pushed, *Power Button Locked* will display for five seconds

NOTE: After a power failure, whether or not the Power Button Lock mode was active, the ViewPanel's power will automatically turn on when power is restored.

• To unlock this mode, press and hold both the [1] button and the ▼ (down-arrow) button for 10 seconds.

Main Menu





ViewSonic VE170/VE170b

CONTRAST adjusts the difference between the image background (black level) and the foreground (white level).

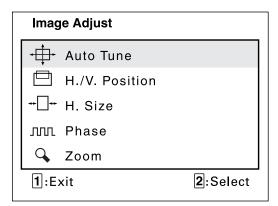
 $[\mathbf{V}]$ decreases contrast, $[\mathbf{\Delta}]$ increases contrast.

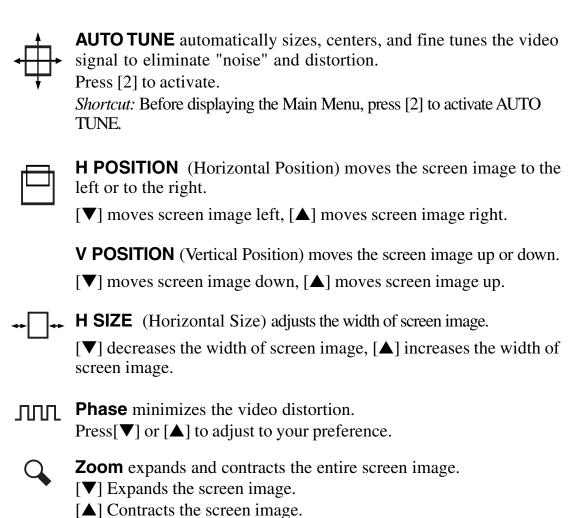
BRIGHTNESS adjusts background black level of the screen image.

[▼] decreases brightness, [▲] increases brightness.

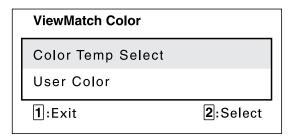

ViewMatch® Color Menu

The ViewMatch Color menu is shown below:



Color Temp Select provides several color options: several preset color temperatures and **User Color** which allows you to adjust red (R), green (G), and blue (B). The factory setting for this product is 6500K (6500 Kelvin).

Press $[\mathbf{V}]$ or $[\mathbf{A}]$ to scroll to your selection.

9300K — Adds blue to the screen image for cooler white (used in most office settings with fluorescent lighting).

6500K — Adds red to the screen image for warmer white and richer red.

5400K — Adds green to the screen image for a darker color.

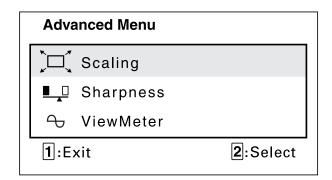
5000K — Adds blue and green to the screen image for a darker color.

User Color — Individual adjustments for red, green, and blue.

- 1 From the USER COLOR screen, press [▼] or [▲] to highlight red, green, or blue, then press button [2] to it.
- **2** To adjust a highlighted color, press $[\nabla]$ or $[\triangle]$. The number next to the status bar changes accordingly.
- **3** To save your adjustment and exit a color, press button [1].

Advanced Menu

Selecting the Advanced Menu from the Main Menu takes you to the menu shown below.





Scaling adjusts the video input signal to the screen size using the following options.

Press $[\mathbf{V}]$ or $[\mathbf{A}]$ to select from the following options:

1:1 adjusts the video signal so that the height and width of the picture are the same.



Sharpness adjusts the clarity and focus of the screen image.

Press $[\mathbf{V}]$ or $[\mathbf{A}]$ to adjust the image sharpness.

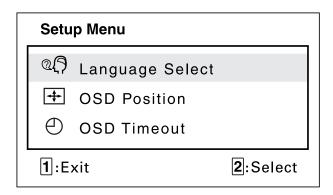


ViewMeter® displays the timing mode (video signal input) coming from the graphics card in your computer. See page 6 for instructions on changing the resolution. Also, see your graphic card's user guide for instructions on changing the <u>refresh rate</u> (vertical frequency).

NOTE: See the Preset Timing Modes chart on page 6. *Example:* **VESA® 1280 x 1024 @ 60Hz** (recommended) means that the resolution is **1280 x 1024** and the refresh rate is 60 Hertz.

Setup Menu

The Setup Menu takes you to the menu shown below.





Language Select allows you to choose the language used in the menus and control screens.

Press $[\nabla]$ or $[\triangle]$ to select a language (English, French, German, Spanish, or Italian).



OSD Position allows you to move the on-screen display menus and control screens.

Press $[\mathbf{V}]$ or $[\mathbf{A}]$ to move the OSD.



OSD Timeout sets the length of time the on-screen display screen is displayed. For example, with a "30 second" setting, if a control is not pushed within 30 seconds, the display screen disappears.

Memory Recall returns adjustments of <u>some controls</u> (see below) to the original factory settings if the display is operating in a factory Preset Timing Mode listed in this user guide.

The controls affected by MEMORY RECALL are:

CONTRAST, BRIGHTNESS, H (Horizontal) POSITION, V (Vertical) POSITION, H (Horizontal) SIZE, PHASE, ZOOM, OSD TIME OUT, and OSD POSITION.

NOTE: MEMORY RECALL does not affect changes made with the USER COLOR control.

Troubleshooting

No power

- Press Power button ON.
- Make sure AC power cord is securely connected to the DC power supply and the power supply is firmly connected to the ViewPanel[®].
- Plug another electrical device (like a radio) into the power outlet to verify that the outlet is supplying proper voltage.
- Make sure all short cables are installed see Installation section.

Power on but no screen image

- Make sure the video cable supplied with the ViewPanel is tightly secured to the video output port on the back of the computer. If the other end of the video cable is not attached permanently to the ViewPanel, tightly secure it to the ViewPanel.
- · Adjust brightness.

Wrong or abnormal colors

- If any colors (red, green, or blue) are missing, check the video cable to make sure it is securely connected. Loose or broken pins in the cable connector could cause an improper connection.
- Connect the ViewPanel to another computer.
- Check ViewMatch® color menu for proper settings

Entire screen image scrolls (rolls) vertically

- Make sure video input signals are within the ViewPanel's specified frequency range.
- Try the ViewPanel with another power source, graphics card, or computer system.
- Connect the video cable securely.

Control buttons do not work

Press only one button at a time.

The female receptacle of the cord set must meet IEC-6320 requirements and will look like (Figure 1 below):

For the United States and Canada

In the United States and Canada the male plug is a NEMA5-15 style (Figure 2), UL Listed, and CSA Labelled. For units which are mounted on a desk or table, type SVT or SJT cord sets may be used. For units which sit on the floor, only SJT type cord sets may be used. The cord set must be selected according to the current rating for your unit. Please consult Table A below for the selection criteria for power cords used in the United States and Canada.
