Also, you can easily raise and lower the display manually. The display can operate in landscape or portrait mode and tilts or swivels in a desk mount or wall mount.

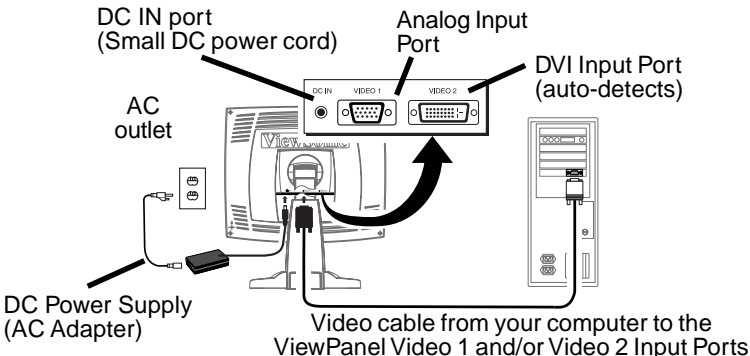

Installation-Wall Mount (optional)

To get a wall mounting kit, contact ViewSonic® or your local dealer. The VG181 is compatible with the VESA wall mounting standards. To convert the desk-mounted VG181 to a wall-mount installation, do the following:

1 Disconnect DC power.

Make sure the power is turned off and then disconnect the DC power cord from the back of the ViewPanel.

2 Lie the ViewPanel face down on a flat surface.

Be sure nothing sharp can scratch or puncture the LCD surface (the face of the ViewPanel).

3 Pull the square-like cover from the back of the ViewPanel.

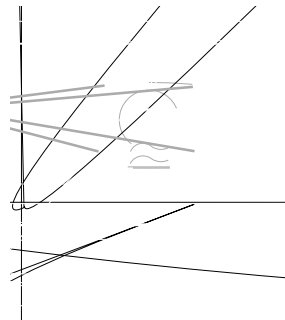

Setting the Timing Mode

The timing mode consists of the resolution and refresh rate (vertical frequency). After setting the timing mode, use the ViewSonic OnView® controls in this section to make adjustments. The recommended timing mode for this ViewPanel is: **1280 x 1024 @ 60Hz**.

To set the Timing Mode:

- 1 Set the resolution: Right-click on the Windows® desktop > **Properties** > **Settings** > **Desktop Area** > set the resolution (example 1280 x 1024 @ 60Hz).
- 2 Set the refresh rate: See your graphic card's user guide for instructions.

To switch from Portrait to Landscape mode, follow steps 1 - 3 above, but manually rotate the **VP181** panel *counter-clockwise* 90°.

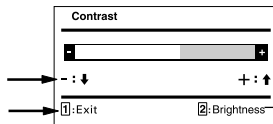

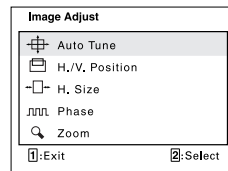

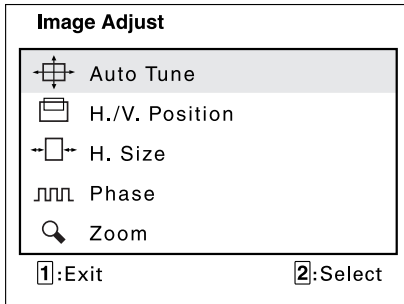

ViewMatch® Color Menu

The ViewMatch Color menu is shown below:



Color Temp Select provides several color options: several preset color temperatures and **User Color** which allows you to adjust red (R), green (G), and blue (B). The factory setting for this product is 9300K (9300 Kelvin).

Press [▼] or [▲] to scroll to your selection.

9300K — Adds blue to the screen image for cooler white (used in most office settings with fluorescent lighting).

6500K — Adds red to the screen image for warmer white and richer red.

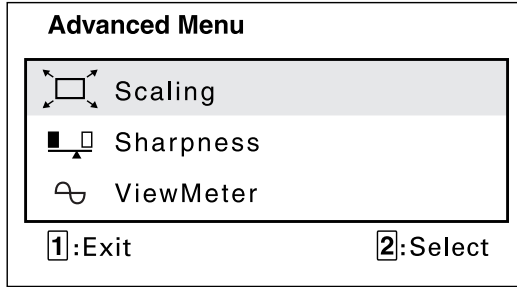

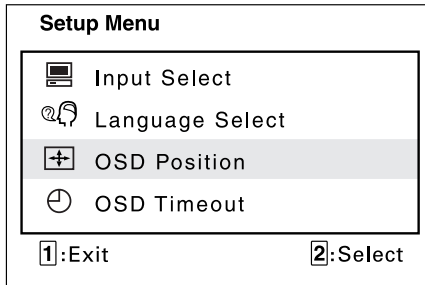

Troubleshooting

No power

- Press Power button ON.

- Make sure all short cables are installed see Installation section.

Power on but no screen image

- Make sure the video cable supplied with the ViewPanel® is tightly secured to the video output port on the back of the computer. If the other end of the video cable is not attached permanently to the ViewPanel, tightly secure it to the ViewPanel.
- Adjust brightness.

Wrong or abnormal colors

- If any colors (red, green, or blue) are missing, check the video cable to make sure it is securely connected. Loose or broken pins in the cable connector could cause an improper connection.
- Connect the ViewPanel to another computer.
- Check ViewMatch® color menu for proper settings

Entire screen image scrolls (rolls) vertically

- Make sure video input signals are within the ViewPanel's specified frequency range.
- Try the ViewPanel with another power source, graphics card, or computer system.
- Connect the video cable securely.

Control buttons do not work

- Press only one button at a time.

For units which sit on the floor, only SJT type cord sets may be used. The cord set must be selected according to the current rating for your unit. Please consult **Table A** below for the selection criteria for power cords used in the United States and Canada.
