# Android™ – what and why?

An Android™ phone can perform many of the same functions as a computer and you can customize it to your own needs. For example, you can add and delete applications, or enhance existing applications to improve functionality. At Android Market™ you can download a range of applications and games from a constantly growing collection. You can also integrate applications on your Android™ phone with other applications and with online services that you use. For example, you can back up your phone contacts, access your different email accounts and calendars from one place, keep track of your appointments, and engage in social networking.

Your Android™ phone is pre-loaded with Google™ services. To get the most out of the provided Google™ services, you should have a Google™ account and sign in to it when you first start your phone. You also need to have Internet access to use many of the features in Android™.

# **Applications**

An application is a phone program that helps you perform a task. For example, there are applications to make calls, take photos and download more applications.


# **Assembly**

To remove the top cover




Using your thumbs, slide off the cover on the top of the phone.

# To insert the memory card and the SIM card




- 1 Turn off your phone and remove the top cover from the back of the phone, then insert the memory card into its slot on the left side, with the gold-colored contacts facing down.
- On the top right side, pull out the SIM card holder.Insert the SIM card with the gold-colored contacts facing down.
- Push back the SIM card holder.
- The memory card may not be included at purchase in all markets.

# To remove the memory card



- 1 Turn off the phone, or unmount the memory card from Settings > Storage > Unmount SD card.
- 2 Remove the top cover, then press against the edge of the memory card and release it.
- 3 Draw the card outward to remove it.

#### To remove the SIM card



- 1 Turn off your phone.
- 2 Remove the top cover and pull out the SIM card holder.
- 3 Draw out the SIM card.
- 4 Push back the SIM card holder.

#### To attach the top cover




- 1 Place the top cover over the top back of the phone, then fit it into the slots.
- 2 Slide the top cover downward. You hear a sound when the cover locks into place.

# Turning the phone on and off

### To turn on the phone

Make sure the battery is charged for at least 30 minutes before you turn on the phone for the first time.



- 1 Press and hold down the power key **()** on the right side of the phone until the phone vibrates.
- 2 If your screen goes dark, briefly press the power key **()** to activate the screen.
- 3 To unlock the screen, drag 1 to the right across the screen.
- 4 Enter your SIM card PIN when requested, and select **OK**.
- 5 Wait a while for the phone to start.
- Your SIM card PIN is initially supplied by AT&T, but you can change it later from the **Settings** menu. To correct a mistake made entering your SIM card PIN, tap ...

# To turn off the phone

- 1 Press and hold down the power key (1) until the options menu opens.
- 2 In the options menu, tap Power off.
- 3 Tap **OK**.
- It may take a while for the phone to shut down.

#### Screen lock

When your phone is on and left idle for a set period of time, the screen darkens to save battery power, and locks automatically. This lock prevents unwanted actions on the touchscreen when you are not using it. On the lockscreen, you can still view notifications, for example, notifications of missed calls and messages that arrived since the phone was last locked. You can also control the playback of audio tracks without unlocking the screen.

#### To activate the screen

Briefly press the power key ①.

#### To view missed calls from the lockscreen

- 1 To activate the screen, briefly press the power key **()**.
- 2 Drag to the right across the screen.



#### To view new text messages from the lockscreen

- 1 To activate the screen, briefly press the power key ①.
- 2 Drag to the right across the screen.



#### To play an audio track from the lockscreen

- 1 To activate the screen, briefly press the power key (i).
- 2 To display music player controls, place a finger on the time and date area and flick to the left.
- 3 Tap ►.

#### To pause an audio track from the lockscreen

- 1 To activate the screen, briefly press the power key (1).
- 2 When the music player controls appear, tap ...

# To change audio tracks from the lockscreen

- 1 To activate the screen, briefly press the power key (1).

#### To unlock the screen



Drag to the right across the screen.

#### To lock the screen manually

• When the screen is active, briefly press the power key ①.

#### Accounts and services

Sign in to your online service accounts from your phone and benefit from a range of services. Combine services and get even more out of them. For example, collect contacts from your Google<sup>TM</sup> and Facebook<sup>TM</sup> accounts and integrate them into your phonebook, so you have everything in one place.

You can sign up to online services from your phone as well as from a computer. When you sign up for the first time, an account is created with your user name, password, settings and personal information. The next time you sign in, you get a personalized view.

# Google™ account

Having a Google account is key to using a range of applications and services with your Android phone. You need a Google<sup>™</sup> account, for example, to use the Gmail<sup>™</sup> application in your phone, to chat to friends using Google Talk<sup>™</sup>, to synchronize your phone calendar with your Google Calendar<sup>™</sup>, and to download applications and games from Android Market<sup>™</sup>.

# Microsoft® Exchange ActiveSync® account

Synchronize your phone with your corporate Microsoft® Exchange ActiveSync® account. This way, you keep your work email, contacts, and calendar events with you at all times.

### Facebook™ account


Facebook™ is a social networking service that connects you with friends, family and colleagues around the world. Set up Facebook to work on your phone so that you can stay in touch from anywhere.


# SyncML™ account


# **Battery**

Your phone has an embedded battery.

# Charging the battery

Your phone battery is partly charged when you buy the phone. It may take a few minutes before the battery icon appears on the screen when you connect the phone charger cable to a power source, such as a USB port or a phone charger. You can still use your phone while it is charging. Charging the phone over a long period of time, for example, overnight, does not damage the battery or the phone.

The battery will start to discharge a little after it is fully charged and then it charges again after a certain time when the phone charger is connected. This is to extend battery life and may result in the charge status showing a level below 100 percent.



Make sure the USB symbol is facing up for the correct orientation.

#### To charge the phone

- 1 Plug the phone charger into a power outlet.
- 2 Plug one end of the USB cable into the charger (or into the USB port of a computer).
- Plug the other end of the cable into the micro USB port on your phone, with the USB symbol facing up. The battery status LED lights up when charging starts.



4 When the phone is fully charged, disconnect the USB cable from your phone by pulling it straight outward.



Be sure not to bend the connector when removing the cable from the phone.

# **Battery LED status**

Green	The battery is fully charged
Flashing red	The battery level is low
Orange	The battery is charging. The battery level is between low and full

#### To check the battery level

- 1 From the Home screen, tap ##.
- 2 Find and tap **Settings** > **About phone** > **Status**.

#### Improving battery performance

The following tips can help you improve battery performance:

- Charge your phone frequently. This will not affect the lifetime of the battery.
- Downloading data from the Internet is power consuming. When you're not using the
  Internet, you can save power by disabling all data connections over mobile networks.
  You can do this from Settings > Wireless & networks > Mobile networks > Data
  enabled. This setting does not prevent your phone from transmitting data over other
  wireless networks.
- Turn off GPS, Bluetooth™ and Wi-Fi® when you don't need these features. You can turn them on and off more easily by adding the Quick settings widget to your Home screen.
- Set your synchronization applications (used to synchronize your email, calendar and contacts) to synchronize manually. You can also synchronize automatically, but increase the synchronization intervals.
- Check the battery usage menu in the phone to see which applications use the most power. Your battery consumes more power when you use video and music streaming applications, such as YouTube™. Some Android Market™ applications also consume more power.
- Close and exit applications that you are not using.
- Lower the screen display brightness level.
- Turn off your phone or use Airplane mode if you are in an area with no network coverage. Otherwise, your phone repeatedly scans for available networks, and this consumes power.
- Use a Sony original handsfree device to listen to music. Handsfree devices demand less battery power than the phone's loudspeakers.
- Keep your phone in standby whenever possible. Standby time refers to the time during which the phone is connected to the network and is not being used.

#### To access the battery usage menu

- 1 From the Home screen, tap ##.
- 2 Find and tap Settings > About phone > Battery use to see which installed applications consume the most battery power.

#### To add the Data traffic widget to your Home screen

- 1 From your Home screen, press =.
- 2 Tap Add > Widgets > Tools.
- 3 Flick left to find and select the **Data traffic** widget. You can now turn your data connection on and off more easily.

#### To add the Quick settings widget to your Home screen

- 1 From your Home screen, press =.
- 2 Tap Add > Widgets > Tools.
- 3 Select the Quick settings widget.

# Using the touchscreen

A protective plastic sheet is attached to the screen of your phone when you buy it. You should peel off this sheet before using the touchscreen. Otherwise, the touchscreen might not function properly.

When your phone is on and left idle for a set period of time, the screen darkens to save battery power, and locks automatically. This lock prevents unwanted actions on the touchscreen when you are not using it. You can also set personal locks to protect your subscription and make sure only you can access your phone content.

Your phone screen is made from glass. Do not touch the screen if the glass is cracked or shattered. Avoid trying to repair a damaged screen yourself. Glass screens are sensitive to drops and mechanical shocks. Cases of negligent care are not covered by the Sony warranty service.

#### To open or highlight an item

Tap the item.

#### To mark or unmark options

Tap the relevant checkbox or list option.




#### Zooming

The zoom options available depend on the application you are using.

#### To zoom

- When available, tap or to zoom in or out.
- You may have to drag the screen (in any direction) to make the zoom icons appear.

#### To zoom with two fingers



- Place two fingers on the screen at once and pinch them together (to zoom out) or spread them apart (to zoom in).
- ·


  ✓ Use the zoom function when viewing photos and maps, or when browsing the Web.

# Scrolling

Scroll by moving your finger up or down on the screen. On some web pages you can also scroll to the sides.

Pragging or flicking will not activate anything on the screen.

#### To scroll



- Drag or flick your finger in the direction you want to scroll on the screen.
- To scroll more quickly, flick your finger in the direction you want to go on the screen.

#### To flick



 To scroll more quickly, flick your finger in the direction you want to go on the screen. You can wait for the scrolling movement to stop by itself, or you can stop it immediately by tapping the screen.


### Sensors

Your phone includes a light sensor and a proximity sensor. The light sensor detects the ambient light level and adjusts the brightness of the screen accordingly. The proximity sensor turns the touch screen off when your face touches the screen. This prevents you from unintentionally activating phone functions when you are engaged in a call.

#### Home screen

Your phone's Home screen is the equivalent of the desktop on a computer. It's the gateway to your phone's main features. You can customize your Home screen with widgets, shortcuts, folders, themes, wallpaper, and other items.

The Home screen extends beyond the regular screen display width, so you need to flick left or right to view content in one of the screen's four extensions. Shows which part of the Home screen you are in.



The items in the bar at the bottom of the screen are always available for quick access.

#### To go to the Home screen

Press

#### To browse the Home screen

• Flick right or left.

#### To share an item from your Home screen

- 1 Press nto open your Home screen.
- 2 Touch and hold an item until it magnifies and the phone vibrates, then drag the item to N...
- 3 Select an option and confirm, if necessary. You can now share the applications and widgets you like with your friends so they can download and use them.

# Widgets

Widgets are small applications that you can use directly on your Home screen. For example, the Music player widget allows you to start playing music directly.

#### To add a widget to the Home screen

- 1 From your Home screen, press =.
- 2 Tap Add > Widgets.
- 3 Tap a widget.

### To get an overview of all widgets on your Home screen

- Pinch on any area of your Home screen. All widgets from different parts of your Home screen are now displayed in one view.
- When all Home screen widgets are combined in one view, tap on any widget to go to the part of the Home screen containing that widget.

# Rearranging your Home screen

Customize the appearance of your Home screen and change the features you can access from it. Change the screen background, move items around, create folders, and add shortcuts to contacts.

#### To open the options menu of your Home screen

You can open the Home screen options menu in two ways:

- From your Home screen, press ==.
- Touch and hold on any part of your Home screen.

#### To add a shortcut to the Home screen

- 1 From your Home screen, press =.
- 2 Tap Add > Shortcuts.
- 3 Find and select a shortcut.
- Add an application shortcut directly from the Application screen by touching and holding the application.

#### To add a folder to the Home screen

- 1 From your Home screen, press
- 2 Tap Add > Folder.
- 3 Enter a name for the folder and tap **Done**.
- Drag and drop an item on top of another item on your Home screen to create a folder automatically.

#### To add items to a folder

 Touch and hold an item until it magnifies and the phone vibrates, then drag the item to the folder.

#### To rename a folder

- 1 Tap the folder to open it.
- 2 Touch the folder's title bar to show the Folder name field.
- 3 Enter the new folder name and tap **Done**.

#### To move an item on the Home screen

- 1 Press nto open your Home screen.
- 2 Touch and hold an item until it magnifies and the phone vibrates, then drag the item to the new location.

#### To delete an item from the Home screen

 Touch and hold an item until it magnifies and the phone vibrates, then drag the item to m.

# Changing the background of your Home screen

Adapt the Home screen to your own style using wallpapers and different themes.

#### To change your Home screen wallpaper

- 1 From your Home screen, press
- 2 Tap Wallpaper, then select a wallpaper.
- You can use a photo you have taken, or an animation. Go to Google Play™ and other sources to download, for example, live wallpapers that change with the changing hours of the day.

#### To set a theme

- 1 From your Home screen, press =.
- 2 Tap **Theme**, then select a theme.
- When you change a theme, the background also changes in some applications.

# Accessing and using applications

Open applications from shortcuts on your Home screen or from the Application screen.

# **Application screen**

The Application screen, which you open from your Home screen, contains the applications that come installed with your phone as well as the applications you download.

The Application screen extends beyond the regular screen width, so you need to flick left and right to view all content.

# To open the Application screen



From your Home screen, tap \( \begin{aligned} \text{...} \end{aligned} \)

#### To browse the Application screen

• Open the Application screen, then flick right or left.

#### To create a shortcut to an application on the Home screen

- 1 From your Home screen, tap \( \begin{array}{c} \begin{array}{c} \end{array} \end{array} \).
- 2 Touch and hold an application until it appears on your Home screen, then drag it to the desired location.

# To share an application from your Application screen

- 1 From your Home screen, tap ##.
- 3 Select an option and confirm, if necessary. You can now share the applications you like with your friends so they can download and use them.

# Opening and closing applications

#### To open an application

From your Home screen or the Application screen, tap the application.

# To close an application

- Press
- Some applications are paused when you press to exit, while other applications may continue to run in the background. In the first case, the next time you open the application, you can continue where you left off. Remember that some applications may cause data connection charges when they are running in the background, for example, social networking services.

# Recently used applications window

You can view and access recently used applications from this window.

#### To open the recently used applications window

Press and hold down

#### Application menu

You can open a menu at any time when you are using an application by pressing the key on your phone. The menu will look different depending on which application you are using.



#### To open a menu in an application

- While using the application, press =
- A menu is not available in all applications.

#### Rearranging your Application screen

Move the applications around on the Application screen according to your preferences.

#### To arrange applications on the Application screen

- 1 From your Home screen, tap | to go to the Application screen.
- 2 Tap the sorting icon on the bottom left corner of the screen and select an option.

#### To move an application on the Application screen

- 1 Open the Application screen, then tap .....
- Touch and hold an item until it magnifies and the phone vibrates, then drag the item to the new location.
- 3 Tap we to exit edit mode.
- You can only move your applications when 📭 is selected.

#### To uninstall an application from the Application screen

- 1 From your Home screen, tap ##.
- 3 Tap the application you want to uninstall, then tap **OK**.

#### Status and notifications

The status bar at the top of your screen shows what's going on in your phone. To the left you get notifications when there is something new or ongoing. For example, new message and calendar notifications appear here. The right side shows the signal strength, battery status, and other information.



A notification light also gives you battery status information and some notifications. For example, a flashing blue light means there is a new message or a missed call. The notification light may not work when the battery level is low.



# Checking notifications and ongoing activities

You can drag down the status bar to open the Notification panel and get more information. For example, open a new message or view a calendar event from the Notification panel. You can also open running applications, such as the music player.

### To open the Notification panel



Drag the status bar downwards.

### To close the Notification panel



• Drag the tab at the bottom of the Notification panel upward.

# To open a running application from the Notification panel

• From the Notification panel, tap the icon for the running application to open it.

### To clear the Notification panel

• From the Notification panel, tap Clear.

# Phone settings menu

View and change your phone settings from the Settings menu.

### To access the phone settings

- 1 From the Home screen, tap ......
- 2 Tap Settings.

# **Typing text**

You can select from a number of keyboards and input methods to type text containing letters, numbers and other characters.

#### To switch keyboards

- 1 When you enter text, touch and hold the text field until the Edit text menu appears.
- 2 Tap Input method.
- 3 Select a keyboard.

# Android keyboard

You can use the Android keyboard provided by Google™ to enter text.

# Using the Android keyboard



- 1 Change the character case and turn on the caps lock. For some languages, this key is used to access extra characters in the language.
- 2 Display numbers and symbols.
- 3 Open the input settings menu to make a change.
- 4 Use voice input. You need an Internet connection to use this function.
- 5 Enter a space.
- 6 Tap and hold to display frequently used symbols.
- 7 Multi-function key. For example, this key functions as a smiley key when you enter message text.
- 8 Delete a character before the cursor.
- All illustrations are for illustration purposes only and may not accurately depict the actual phone.

### To display the Android keyboard to enter text

Tap a text entry field.

# To hide the Android keyboard

When the Android keyboard is open, press

#### To use the Android keyboard in landscape orientation

- When you enter text, turn the phone sideways.
- For the keyboard to support this feature, landscape mode must be supported by the application you are using, and your screen orientation settings must be set to automatic.

#### To enter text using the Android keyboard

- To enter a character visible on the keyboard, tap the character.
- To enter a character variant, touch and hold a regular keyboard character to get a
  list of available options, then select from the list. For example, to enter "é", touch
  and hold "e" until other options appear, then, while keeping your finger pressed on
  the keyboard, drag to and select "é".

#### To shift between upper-case and lower-case letters

Before you enter a letter, tap to switch to upper-case , or vice versa.

#### To turn on the caps lock

Before you type a word, tap or until appears.

#### To enter numbers or symbols

• When you enter text, tap ?123. A keyboard with numbers and symbols appears. Tap ALT to view more options.

#### To delete characters

Tap to place the cursor after the character you want to delete, then tap <a>x</a>.

#### To edit text

- 1 When you enter text, touch and hold the text field until the **Edit text** menu appears.
- 2 Select an option.

# Android keyboard settings

You can select settings for the Android keyboard, such as writing language and automatic correction.

#### To access the Android keyboard settings

- 1 When you enter text using the Android keyboard, tap **o**.
- 2 Tap Android keyboard settings.

#### To change the Android keyboard writing language

- 1 Tap a text entry field, then tap **o**.
- 2 Tap Android keyboard settings > Input languages, then mark the checkbox for the languages that you want to use for writing. When you have finished, press to confirm.
- 3 To change the writing language, slide left or right on the space bar of the keyboard.


# Xperia<sup>™</sup> keyboard

You can also select the Xperia<sup>™</sup> keyboard as your text input method. The Xperia<sup>™</sup> keyboard gives you two different options, the on-screen keyboard and the Phonepad. The Phonepad is similar to a 12-key telephone keypad. The on-screen keyboard is similar to the Android keyboard, but also has other features such as Gesture input.

#### On-screen keyboard

Tap the keys of the on-screen QWERTY keyboard to enter text conveniently. Some applications open the on-screen keyboard automatically. You can also open this keyboard by touching a text field.

# Using the on-screen keyboard



- 1 Change the character case and turn on the caps lock. For some languages, this key is used to access extra characters in the language.
- 2 Close the on-screen keyboard view. Please note that this icon does not show in portrait mode.
- 3 Display numbers and symbols.
- 4 Display smileys.
- 5 Enter a space.
- 6 Open the input settings menu to make a change, for example, under **Writing languages**. This key also changes the writing language when more than one input language is selected.
- 7 Enter a carriage return or confirm text input.
- 8 Delete a character before the cursor.

#### To enter text using the on-screen keyboard

- To enter a character visible on the keyboard, tap the character.
- To enter a character variant, touch and hold a regular keyboard character to get a
  list of available options, then select from the list. For example, to enter "é", touch
  and hold "e" until other options appear, then, while keeping your finger pressed on
  the keyboard, drag to and select "é".

#### To enter common punctuation marks

- 1 When you finish entering a word, tap the space bar.
- 2 Select a punctuation mark from the candidate bar. The selected mark is inserted before the space.
- To quickly enter a full stop, tap the space bar twice when you finish entering a word.

#### To insert a smiley

- 1 When you enter text, tap ...
- 2 Select a smiley.

#### To enter a carriage return

• When you enter text, tap **u** to enter a carriage return.

#### To edit text

- 1 When you enter text, touch and hold the text field until the Edit text menu appears.
- 2 Select an option.

# Using the Gesture input function to write words

You can input text by sliding your finger from letter to letter on the on-screen keyboard. You can lift your finger between words so that the phone recognizes them.

**Gesture input** is only available when you use the on-screen keyboard.

# To change the Gesture input settings

- When you enter text using the on-screen keyboard, tap . If you have selected more than one writing language, touch and hold the input language key instead. For example, touch and hold .....
- 2 Tap Keyboard settings > Text input settings.
- 3 Mark or unmark the **Gesture input** checkbox.
- 4 If you want to automatically add a space between gestures without having to tap the space bar each time, mark the **Space between gestures** checkbox.


#### To enter text using the Gesture input function

- 1 When you enter text using the on-screen keyboard, slide your finger from letter to letter to spell the word you want to write. Lift up your finger when you've finished entering a word.
- The phone suggests a word based on the letters you have traced. If necessary, select the correct word in the candidate bar. To view more options, scroll right or left in the word candidate bar. If you cannot find the desired word, tap once to delete the entire word. Then you can try again or tap each letter to enter the word.
- 3 If the Space between gestures setting is activated, slide on the keyboard to enter the next word. Otherwise, enter a space and then slide to enter the next word.
- To enter joined compound words when the **Space between gestures** setting is activated, you may need to slide to enter the first part of the word, then tap each letter to enter the rest of the word.

#### **Phonepad**

The Phonepad is similar to a standard 12-key telephone keypad. It gives you predictive text and multi-tap input options. You can activate the Phonepad text input method via the keyboard settings. The Phonepad is only available in portrait orientation.

#### To enter text using the Phonepad

- When appears in the Phonepad, tap each character key only once, even if the letter you want is not the first letter on the key. Tap the word that appears or tap to view more word suggestions and select a word from the list.
- When appears in the Phonepad, tap the on-screen key for the character you want to enter. Keep pressing this key until the desired character is selected. Then do the same for the next character you want to enter, and so on.

#### To enter numbers using the Phonepad

• When the Phonepad is open, tap 123. A Phonepad with numbers appears.

### To insert symbols and smileys using the Phonepad

- 1 When the Phonepad is open, tap . A grid with symbols and smileys appears.
- 2 Scroll up or down to view more options. Tap a symbol or smiley to select it.

### Keyboard and Phonepad settings

You can select settings for the on-screen keyboard and the Phonepad, such as writing language and automatic correction.

#### To access the on-screen keyboard and Phonepad settings

- 2 Tap Keyboard settings.

### To add a writing language to the on-screen keyboard or the Phonepad

- 1 When you enter text using the on-screen keyboard or Phonepad, tap . If you have selected more than one writing language, touch and hold the input language key instead, for example, ......
- 2 Tap Writing languages and mark the checkbox for the languages you want to use for writing. When you have finished, press to confirm.
- 3 To switch between languages, tap the input language key, for example, [N].

# Text input settings

When entering text using the on-screen keyboard or the Phonepad, you can access a text input settings menu that helps you set options for text prediction. For example, you can decide how you want the phone to present word alternatives and correct words as you type, or enable the text input application to remember new words you write.

#### To change the text input settings

# Adjusting the volume

You can adjust the ringtone volume for phone calls and notifications as well as for music and video playback.

#### To set the phone to silent and vibrate mode

- 4 Select Vibrate and choose an option.

#### To enhance the speaker loudness

- 1 From the Home screen, tap ......

- 3 Mark the xLOUD™ checkbox.

# **Customizing your phone**

Adapt the phone to your needs by adjusting, for example, your personal ringtone, phone language and your Privacy settings.

#### Time and date

You can change the time and date in your phone.

#### To set the date manually

- 7 Tap **am** to change to **pm**, or vice versa.
- 8 Tap Set.

#### To set the time zone

- 3 Unmark the **Automatic** checkbox, if it is marked.
- 4 Tap **Select time zone**.
- 5 Select an option.

#### To set the date format

# To set a phone ringtone

#### To set a vibrating alert

# To adjust the screen brightness

- 2 Find and tap Settings > Display > Brightness.
- To decrease the screen brightness, drag the slider to the left. To increase it, drag the slider to the right.

- The brightness level affects your battery performance. For tips on how to improve battery performance, see *Improving battery performance* on page 15.

#### To set the screen to vibrate

#### To adjust the idle time before the screen turns off

- 3 Select an option.
- To turn off the screen quickly, briefly press the power key ①.

# To keep the screen on while charging the phone

- 1 From the Home screen, tap **....**
- 2 Find and tap Settings > Applications > Development.
- 3 Mark the Stay awake check box.

# Phone language

You can select a language to use in your phone.

#### To change the phone language

- 1 From your Home screen, tap ......
- 2 Find and tap Settings > Language & keyboard > Select language.
- 3 Select an option.
- 4 Tap **Done**.
- If you choose the wrong language and cannot read the menu texts, find and tap the **Settings** icon . Then select the entry beside A, and select the first entry in the following menu. You can then select the language you want.

### Flight mode

In Airplane mode, your phone's network and radio transceivers are turned off to prevent disturbance to sensitive equipment. However, you can still play games, listen to music, watch videos and other content, as long as all this content is saved on your memory card or internal storage. You can also be notified by alarms, if alarms are activated.

- Turning on Airplane mode reduces battery consumption.

#### To turn on Flight mode

- 1 From your Home screen, tap \( \begin{aligned} \pm \ext{...} \ext{...} \ext{...} \ext{...} \ext{...} \ext{...} \ext{...} \ext{...} \ext{...}
- 2 Find and tap **Settings** > **Wireless & networks**.
- 3 Mark the Airplane mode checkbox.
- You can also select Airplane mode from the Phone options menu. To access the Phone options menu, press and hold the power key (1).

# **Memory**

You can save content on a memory card and in the phone memory. Music, video clips, and photos are saved on the memory card while applications, contacts, and messages are saved in the phone memory.

You can move some applications from the phone memory to the memory card.

#### To move an application to the memory card

- 1 From your Home screen, tap \( \begin{array}{c} \begin{array}{c} \end{array} \end{array} \).
- 2 Find and tap **Settings** > **Applications** > **Manage applications**.
- 3 Tap the desired application.
- 4 Tap Move to SD card.
- It is not possible to move some applications from the phone memory to the memory card.

# Memory card

Your phone is preloaded with a microSD™ memory card, which is used for media content. This type of card can also be used as a portable memory card with other compatible devices.

+ Higher capacity memory cards are available for purchase as optional accessories.

# Safely removing the memory card

You can safely remove the memory card from your phone any time when the phone is turned off. If you want to remove the memory card when your phone is on, you must first unmount the memory card before you physically remove it from the phone. This can prevent damaging the memory card or losing data stored on the memory card.

#### To unmount the memory card

- 1 From your Home screen, tap \( \begin{aligned} \text{True} \\ \text{True} \end{aligned} \)
- 2 Find and tap Settings > Storage > Unmount SD card.

# Formatting the memory card

You can format the memory card in your phone, for example, to free up memory. This means that you erase all data on the card.

All content on the memory card gets erased when you format it. Make sure you make backups of everything you want to save before formatting the memory card. To back up your content, you can copy it to your computer. For more information, refer to the chapter *Connecting your phone to a computer* on page 106.

# To format the memory card

- 1 From your Home screen, tap .....
- 2 Find and tap Settings > Storage > Unmount SD card.
- 3 After you have unmounted the memory card, tap **Erase SD card**.

# Stereo portable handsfree



! Use the accessories provided with your phone, or other compatible accessories, for optimal performance.

#### To use a handsfree

- 1 Connect a portable handsfree.
- 2 To answer a call, press the call handling key. If you are listening to music, it stops when you receive a call and resumes when the call has ended.
- 3 To end a call, press the call handling key.
- If a portable handsfree is not included with the phone, you may purchase it separately.

# Turning off data traffic

You can disable all data connections with your phone to avoid any unwanted data downloads and synchronisations. Contact AT&T if you need detailed information about your subscription plan and data traffic costs.

- ∳- You can still use Wi-Fi® and Bluetooth™ connections when the data traffic is turned off.

#### To turn off all data traffic

- 3 Unmark the Data enabled checkbox.

# **Data roaming**

Depending on your network operator, it might be possible to allow for mobile data connections outside of your home network (roaming). Please note that data transmission charges may apply. Contact AT&T for more information.

Applications may sometimes use the Internet connection in your home network without any notification, for example, when sending search and synchronization requests. Additional charges may apply for data roaming. Consult AT&T.

- 3 Mark the **Data roaming** checkbox.
- You can't activate data roaming when data connections have been deactivated

# **Emergency calls**

Your phone supports international emergency numbers, for example, 112 or 911. You can normally use these numbers to make emergency calls in any country, with or without the SIM card inserted, if you are within range of a network.

#### To make an emergency call

- 1 From your Home screen, tap .....
- 2 Find and tap Phone.
- 3 Enter the emergency number and tap **Call**. To delete a number, tap **X**.
- You can make emergency calls when no SIM card is inserted or when outgoing calls are barred.

#### To make an emergency call while the SIM card is locked

- 1 Tap Emergency call.
- 2 Enter the emergency number and tap Call. To delete a number, tap < x.</p>

# **Call handling**

You can make a call by manually dialing a phone number, by tapping a number saved in your phone's contact list, or by tapping the phone number in your call log view.

#### To make a call by dialing

- 1 From your Home screen, tap ......
- 2 Find and tap Phone.
- 3 Enter the number of the recipient and tap Call. To delete a number, tap X.

#### To end a call

Tap End call.

# To make an international call

- 2 Find and tap Phone.
- 3 Touch and hold 0 until a "+" sign appears.
- 4 Enter the country code, area code (without the first 0), and phone number, then tap **Call**.

#### To answer a call



- Drag to the right across the screen.
- If you are using regular headphones without a microphone, you have to remove the headphones from the headset connector to be able to answer the call.

#### To decline a call

Drag to the left across the screen.

# To change the ear speaker volume during a call

Press the volume key up or down.

#### To turn on the loudspeaker during a call

Tap (1).

#### To mute the microphone during a call

Tap

#### To activate the screen during a call

• Press 🏠.

#### To enter numbers during a call

- 1 During a call, tap **III**. A keypad appears.
- 2 Enter numbers.

#### To mute the ringtone for an incoming call

• When you receive the call, press the volume key.

#### Recent calls

In the call log, you can view recently missed **1**, received **1** and dialed **2** calls.

#### To view your missed calls

- 1 When you have missed a call, 
   appears in the status bar. Drag the status bar downwards.
- 2 Tap Missed call.

#### To call a number from your call log

- 1 From your Home screen, tap .....
- 2 Find and tap **Phone** > **Call log** to enter the call log view.
- To call a number directly, tap a next to the number. To edit a number before calling, touch and hold the number, then tap **Edit number before call**.

# To add a number from the call log to your contacts

- 2 Find and tap Phone > Call log.
- 3 Touch and hold the number, then tap Add to Contacts.
- 4 Tap the desired contact, or tap **Create new contact**.
- 5 Edit the contact details and tap **Done**.

#### Voicemail

If your subscription includes an answering service, callers can leave a voicemail message when you cannot answer a call. Usually, the voicemail number is saved on the SIM card. If not, contact AT&T to get your voicemail number. You can then enter the number manually.

- 3 To activate or deactivate call waiting, tap **Call waiting**.

#### To reject a second call

• When you hear repeated beeps during a call, tap **Busy**.

## To answer a second call and end the ongoing call

• When you hear repeated beeps during a call, tap **End current call and answer**.

#### To answer a second call and put the ongoing call on hold

• When you hear repeated beeps during a call, tap Answer.

#### To make a second call

- 1 During an ongoing call, tap ##.
- 2 Enter the number of the recipient and tap ...
- 3 If the recipient answers, the first call is put on hold.
- The same procedure applies to subsequent calls.

#### To switch between multiple calls

 To switch to another call and put the current call on hold, tap the desired number or contact.

#### To end the ongoing call and return to the next call on hold

Tap End call.

#### Conference calls

With a conference or multiparty call, you can have a joint conversation with two or more people.

#### To make a conference call

- 1 During an ongoing call, tap **III**.
- 2 Dial the number of your second participant and tap <a>[~]</a>.
- 3 If the second participant answers, the first call is put on hold.
- 4 Tap ♠.
- To add more participants, repeat steps 1 to 4.

#### To have a private conversation with a conference call participant

- 1 During an ongoing conference call, tap the button showing the number of participants. For example, tap **3 participants**if there are three participants on the call.
- 2 Tap the name of the participant you want to talk to privately.
- 3 To end the private conversation and return to the conference call, tap ...

#### To release a participant from a conference call

- 1 During an ongoing conference call, tap the button showing the number of participants. For example, tap **3 participants** if there are three participants.
- 2 Tap next to the participant you want to release.

#### To end a conference call

• During the conference call, tap **End conference call**.

## Call settings

## Barring calls

You can bar all or certain categories of incoming and outgoing calls. When you use call barring for the first time, you need to enter your PUK (Personal Unblocking Key) and then a new password to activate the call barring function.

#### To bar incoming or outgoing calls

- 3 Select an option.
- 4 Enter the password and tap **Enable**.

## Forwarding calls

## **Fixed Dialing Numbers**

If you have received a PIN2 code from AT&T, you can use a list of Fixed Dialing Numbers (FDN) to restrict outgoing calls.

#### To enable or disable fixed dialing

- 2 Find and tap **Settings** > **Call settings** > **Fixed dialing numbers**.
- 3 Tap Activate fixed dialing or Deactivate fixed dialing.
- 4 Enter your PIN2 and tap **OK**.

- 2 Find and tap Settings > Call settings > Fixed dialing numbers > Fixed dialing numbers.

## **Contacts**

Use the Contacts application to store and manage all your numbers, email addresses, and other contact data in one place. Just tap on a contact to see all communications with that contact in one easy overview.

You can add new contacts in your phone and synchronize them with contacts saved in your Google™ account, AT&T Address book, Microsoft® Exchange ActiveSync® account, or other accounts that support synchronization. The Contacts application automatically creates new entries and also helps you match data such as email addresses with existing entries. You can also manage this process manually.

## Transferring contacts to your new phone



There are several ways to transfer contacts to your new phone. Select a transfer method that best suits your situation.

## Transferring contacts using a PC

You can use a PC to transfer contacts from several phone brands, including iPhone, Samsung, HTC and Nokia.

## Managing your contacts

You can create, edit and synchronize your contacts in a few simple steps. You can select contacts saved in different accounts and manage how you display them in the phone.

If you synchronize your contacts with more than one account, you can join contacts in your phone to avoid duplicates.

Some synchronization services, for example, some social networking services, do not allow you to edit contact details.

#### To view your contacts

From your Home screen, tap , then tap . Your contacts are listed here.

#### To select which contacts to display in the Contacts application

- 1 From your Home screen, tap \( \big| \), then tap \( \big| \).

- In the list that appears, mark and unmark the desired options. If you have synchronized your contacts with a synchronization account, that account appears in the list. To further expand the list of options, tap the account.

- If you have synchronized your contacts with one or more accounts, select the account to which you want to add this contact, or tap **Phone contact** if you only want to use this contact in your phone.

- If you add a plus sign and the country code before a contact phone number, you can use the number when you make calls from other countries.

- 2 Touch and hold the contact you want to edit, then tap **Edit contact**.
- 3 Tap \int and select the desired method for adding the contact picture.
- 4 When you have added the picture, tap **Done**.
- You can also add a picture to a contact directly from the Gallery application.

#### To view your communication with a contact

- 1 From the Home screen, tap \( \big| \), then tap \( \big| \).
- 2 Tap the contact you want to view.
- To view your communication with the contact for different media, tap or flick through the filter items at the bottom of the screen.

#### To delete contacts

- 1 From your Home screen, tap ##, then tap ...
- 2 Press =, then tap Delete contacts.
- 3 Mark the contacts you want to delete, or tap Mark all if you want to delete all contacts.
- 4 Tap **Delete** > **OK**.

#### To edit contact information about yourself

- 1 From your Home screen, tap , then tap ...
- 2 Touch and hold **My info** at the top of the contact list, then tap **Edit contact**.
- 3 Enter the new information or make the changes you want.
- 4 When you are done, tap **Done**.

## Avoiding duplicate entries in the Contacts application

If you synchronize your contacts with a new account or import contact information in other ways, you could end up with duplicate entries in the Contacts application. If this happens, you can join such duplicates to create a single entry. And if you join entries by mistake, you can separate them again later.

### To join contacts

- From your Home screen, tap \(\big|\), then tap \(\big|\).
- 2 Touch and hold the contact you want to join with another contact, then tap Join contacts.
- From the list that appears, tap the contact whose information you want to join with the first contact, then tap **OK** to confirm. The information from the first contact is merged with the second contact, and the first contact is no longer displayed in the Contacts list.

#### To separate joined contacts

- 1 From your Home screen, tap ##, then tap ...
- 2 Touch and hold the joined contact you want to edit, then tap **Edit contact**.
- 3 Press =, then tap Separate.
- 4 Tap **OK**.

#### **Favorites**

You can mark a contact as a favorite. The **Favorites** tab gives you quick access to your marked contacts. In **Favorites**, you can also find a list of the contacts you communicate with most frequently.

## To mark or unmark a contact as a favorite

- 1 From the Home screen, tap ##, then tap ....
- 2 Tap the contact you want to add to or remove from your favorites.
- 3 Tap ★.

## Communicating with your contacts

#### To search for a contact

- 1 From your Home screen, tap | then tap |...
- 2 Enter the first few letters of the contact name in the **Search** field. All contacts beginning with those letters appear.

## The quick contact menu

Tap a contact's thumbnail to view quick communication options for a particular contact. Options include calling the contact, sending a text or multimedia message, and starting a chat using the Google Talk™ application.

For an application to appear as an option in the quick contact menu, you may need to set up the application in your phone and be logged in to the application. For example, you need to start the Gmail™ application and enter your login details before you can use Gmail™ from the quick contact menu.

- 3 Press =, then tap Send contact > OK.
- 4 Select an available transfer method and follow the on-screen instructions.

#### To send a contact

- 4 Select an available transfer method and follow the on-screen instructions.

#### To send several contacts at once

- 1 From your Home screen, tap \( \big| \), then tap \( \big| \).
- 2 Press \_\_\_, then tap Send contacts.
- 3 Mark the contacts you want to send, or select all if you want to send all contacts.
- 4 Tap **Send**, then tap **OK** to confirm.
- 5 Select an available transfer method and follow the on-screen instructions.

## **Backing up contacts**

You can use a memory card, a SIM card, or an online synchronization tool such as Microsoft® Exchange ActiveSync® to back up contacts.

### To export all contacts to a memory card

- 1 From your Home screen, tap ##, then tap ....
- 2 Press , then tap Back up contacts > SD card.
- 3 Tap **OK**.

#### To export contacts to a SIM card

- 1 From your Home screen, tap ., then tap ...
- 2 Press =, then tap Back up contacts > SIM card.
- 3 Mark the contacts you want to export, or tap **Mark all** if you want to export all your contacts.
- 4 Tap Back up.
- 5 Select Add contacts if you want to add the contacts to existing contacts on your SIM card, or select Replace all contacts if you want to replace the existing contacts on your SIM card.
- When you export contacts to a SIM card, not all information may get exported. This is due to memory limitations on SIM cards.

# Messaging

## Using text and multimedia messaging

You can send and receive text messages from your phone using SMS (Short Message Service). If your subscription includes MMS (Multimedia Messaging Service), you can also send and receive messages that contain media files, for example, pictures and videos. The number of characters you can send in a single text message varies depending on the operator and the language you use. If you exceed the character limit, then all your single messages are linked together and sent as one message. You are charged for each single text message you send. When you view your messages, they appear as conversations, which means that all messages to and from a particular person are grouped together.

## To create and send a message

- 1 From your Home screen, tap \(\begin{array}{c} \pm \ext{then find and tap } \equiv \ext{1}.\)
- 2 Tap New message.
- To add a recipient, tap \_\_\_\_, then find and mark the checkbox next to the recipient name. To add more than one recipient, mark the checkboxes for the desired recipients. You can also enter the full phone number in the search field manually, then tap Add.
- 4 When you are finished adding recipients, tap **Done**.
- 5 Tap Write message and enter your message text.
- 6 If you want to add a media file, tap 📑 and select an option.
- 7 To send the message, tap **Send**.

#### To read a received message

- 1 From your Home screen, tap ##, then find and tap 3.
- 2 Tap the desired conversation.
- 3 If the message is not yet downloaded, tap and hold the message, then tap **Download message**.
- You can also open messages from the status bar when appears there. Just drag down the bar and tap the message.

#### To reply to a message

- 1 From your Home screen, tap \(\begin{aligned}
  \text{...} then find and tap \(\begin{aligned}
  \text{...}
  \end{aligned}
  \end{aligned}
- 2 Tap the conversation containing the message.
- 3 Enter your reply and tap **Send**.

#### To forward a message

- 1 From your Home screen, tap \(\begin{array}{c} \text{then find and tap } \equiv \equiv. \end{array}\)
- 2 Tap the conversation containing the message you want to forward.
- 3 Touch and hold the message you want to forward, then tap **Forward message**.
- 4 Select a recipient from the list, or tap Add recipient to add a recipient who is not in the list.
- 5 Edit the message and tap **Send**.

#### To delete a message

- 1 From your Home screen, tap | , then find and tap | ...
- 2 Tap the conversation containing the message you want to delete.
- 3 Touch and hold the message you want to delete, then tap Delete message > Yes.

#### To delete conversations

- 1 From your Home screen, tap \(\begin{array}{c} \text{then find and tap } \equiv \equiv. \end{array}\)
- 2 Mark the checkboxes for the conversations you want to delete, then tap **Delete**.

#### To save a sender's number

- 1 From your Home screen, tap \( \begin{aligned} \text{...} \\ \text{then find and tap } \equiv \end{aligned} \).
- 2 Tap a conversation.
- 3 Press =, then tap Add to Contacts.
- 4 If you want to add the number to an existing contact, select the relevant contact. Or tap if you want to create a new contact.
- 5 Edit the contact information and tap **Done**.

## To call a message sender

- 2 Tap a conversation.
- 3 Tap the recipient's name or number at the top of the screen.
- 4 If the recipient is saved in your contacts, tap the phone number that you want to call. If you have not saved the recipient in your contacts, tap ...

## To save a file contained in a message you receive

- 1 From your Home screen, tap ##, then find and tap 1.
- 2 Tap the conversation you want to open.
- 3 If the message has not been downloaded yet, tap and hold the message, then tap **Download message**.
- 4 Touch and hold the file you want to save, then select the desired option.

#### To search for messages

- 1 From your Home screen, tap \( \big| \), then find and tap \( \big| \).
- 2 Press Q.
- 3 Tap Search Messaging.
- 4 Enter your search keywords, then tap .

## Text and multimedia message options

#### To change your message notification settings

- 1 From your Home screen, tap \(\begin{array}{c} \pm \ext{then find and tap } \equiv \ext{1}.\)
- 2 Press = , then tap Settings.
- 3 To set a notification sound, tap **Notification tone** and select an option.
- 4 For other notification settings, check or uncheck the relevant checkboxes.

#### To view messages saved on the SIM card

- 2 Press \_\_\_, then tap Settings > SIM messages.

## E-mail

Use the Email application in your phone to send and receive emails through your regular email account or through your corporate account. Or you can do both. Your phone can handle several email accounts at the same time. You can set up these accounts to run through one combined inbox, or through separate inboxes. Note that emails you receive to your Gmail™ account can be accessed in the phone from both the Email and the Gmail™ applications.

÷ Your corporate Microsoft® Outlook® email messages have to be stored on a Microsoft® Exchange server for the functionality described above to work. See Synchronizing your corporate email, calendar and contacts on page 64 for more information.

#### To set up an email account in your phone

- 1 From your Home screen, tap \( \begin{aligned} \begin{aligned
- 2 Find and tap E-mail.
- 3 Enter your email address and password, then tap **Next**.
- 4 If the settings for the email account cannot be downloaded automatically, complete the setup manually. If necessary, contact your email service provider for detailed settings. For corporate email setup on your phone, select Exchange Active Sync as the account type.
- 5 When you are prompted, enter a name for your email account, so that it is easily identifiable. The same name shows in the emails you send from this account. When you are finished, tap **Done**.
- You can set up more than one email account. See To add an extra e-mail account in your phone on page 48.

## **Using e-mail**

#### To create and send an e-mail message

- 4 To select an email address saved in your contacts, tap 💇, then find and mark the checkbox next to a recipient field. To add more than one recipient, mark the checkboxes for the desired recipients. When you are finished, tap **Done**.
- 5 Tap **Subject** and enter the email subject.
- 6 To attach a file, tap . Select the type of file, then tap the file that you want to attach from the list that appears.
- 7 In the message area, enter your message text.
- To set a priority level, press, then tap **Set priority** and select an option. To add Cc/Bcc fields, press, then tap **Add Cc/Bcc**.
- 10 To send the email, tap **Send**.

## To receive email messages

- 1 From your Home screen, tap .....
- 2 Tap E-mail.
- 3 If you are using several email accounts, tap the account that you want to check. If you want to check all your email accounts at once, tap Combined inbox.
- To download new messages, press =, then tap **Refresh**.
- If you have set up a corporate email account, you can set the checking frequency to Automatic (Push).

#### To read your email messages

- 1 From your Home screen, tap ......
- 2 Find and tap E-mail.
- If you are using several email accounts, tap the account you want to check. If you want to check all your email accounts at once, tap **Combined inbox**.
- 4 In the email inbox, scroll up or down and tap the email you want to read.

### To use the email preview pane

- 1 From your Home screen, tap \(\frac{\pmail}{2}\), then find and tap \(\frac{\pmail}{2}\).
- 2 If you are using several email accounts, tap the account you want to check. If you want to check all your email accounts at once, tap **Combined inbox**. The email preview pane appears.
- 3 Scroll up or down in the email inbox and tap the email that you want to read. The email opens in the preview pane. To view more information about the email, tap the downward arrow next to the sender's name. In the body text field, pinch two fingers together, or spread them apart, to zoom in or out.
- 4 To view the email in fullscreen format, drag the split bar (located between the email list and the email body) accordingly. In fullscreen format, use the forward and backward arrows at the top of the screen to read your next or previous message.
- 5 To return to the inbox view, drag the split bar accordingly.
- To hide the preview pane, change the preview pane settings.

#### To change email preview pane settings

- 1 From your Home screen, tap ##, then find and tap E-mail.
- 2 If you are using several email accounts, tap the account you want to check. If you want to check all your email accounts at once, tap **Combined inbox**.
- 3 Press =, then tap **Preview pane** and select an option.

#### To view an email message attachment

- 3 Find and tap the desired message in your email inbox. Emails with attachments are identified by .
- 4 Find the attachment in the email body, then tap **View** or **Save** next to it.

## To save a sender's email address to your contacts

- 2 Find and tap **E-mail**.
- 3 Find and tap the desired message in your email inbox.
- 4 Tap the name of the sender at the top of the screen.
- Tap **OK** when you are prompted to add the name to your contacts.
- 6 Select an existing contact, or tap Create new contact if you want to create a new contact.
- 7 Edit the contact information and tap **Done**.

#### To reply to an e-mail message

### To sort your emails

- 5 Select a sorting option.

#### To search for emails

- 4 The search result appears in a list sorted by date. Tap the email you want to open.
- 5 To change search options, tap and select a different option.

#### To manage your email in batches

- 5 Enter your Out of Office message in the body text field.
- 6 Tap **OK** to confirm.

## To set an email account as your default account

- 2 Find and tap E-mail.
- 3 Tap and hold the account you want to use as the default account for composing and sending email, then tap **Account settings**.
- 4 Mark the **Default account** checkbox.
- · If you only have one email account, this account is automatically the default account.

#### To remove an e-mail account from your phone

- 3 If you have several email accounts in your phone, go to step 4. If you only have one email account, press =, then tap **Accounts**.
- 4 Touch and hold the account you want to remove, then tap **Delete account** > **OK**.

## Gmail™ and other Google™ services

After you set up your Google™ account to work in the phone, you can also chat to friends using the Google Talk™ application, synchronize your phone calendar application with your Google Calendar™, and download applications and games from Android Market™.





#### **Permissions**

Some applications might misuse their permissions by stealing or deleting data, or reporting your location. Make sure you only install and give permissions to applications you trust.





# Synchronizing data on your phone

You can sync contacts, email, calendar events, and other information with your phone from multiple email accounts, synchronization services and other kinds of accounts, depending on the applications installed on your phone. Synchronizing your phone with other information sources is an easy and practical way to stay up to date.

#### You can:

- access your Gmail™, Google Calendar™, Google™ contacts, and other Google services you use.
- access your corporate email, contacts and calendar applications.
- access your Facebook™ contacts, calendar, albums, and other services you use.
- synchronize your phone with an Internet server using SyncML™.

## Synchronizing with Google™

Synchronize your phone with your Gmail™, Google Calendar™, Google™ contacts, and data from other Google services you use. View and manage them from your phone just as easily as you would from a computer.

After synchronizing, you can find Gmail™ in the Gmail™ application; Google Calendar™ in the Calendar application; Google™ contacts in the Contacts application; and other data in corresponding Google applications that you have installed.

## To set up a Google™ account in your phone for synchronization

- 1 From your Home screen, tap ##.
- 2 Tap Settings > Accounts & sync.
- 3 Make sure the **Activate auto-sync** checkbox is marked so that applications can synchronize data automatically.

## Synchronizing your corporate email, calendar and contacts

Access your corporate email messages, calendar appointments and contacts directly from your phone. View and manage them just as easily as you would from a computer.

After setup, you can find your information in the **E-mail**, **Calendar** and **Contacts** applications.

For you to access the functionality described above, your corporate information must be stored on a Microsoft® Exchange server.

#### To set up corporate email, calendar and contacts in your phone

- 2 Tap Settings > Accounts & sync.
- 3 Make sure the **Activate auto-sync** checkbox is marked so that your data will synchronize automatically according to the sync interval you set.
- 4 Tap Add account > Exchange Active Sync.
- 5 Enter your corporate email address and password.
- 6 Tap Next.
- 7 Follow the steps to configure your account and select the kinds of data you want to sync to the phone, such as contacts and calendar. If the settings for your corporate account are not found automatically, complete the setup manually. Contact your corporate network administrator if you need more information.
- 8 When the setup is done, enter a name for this corporate account, so that it is easily identifiable, then tap **Done**.
- 9 If prompted, activate the device administrator to allow your corporate server to control certain security features in your phone. Device administrators for your phone are typically email, calendar, or other applications to which you grant authority to implement security policies on the phone when you connect to enterprise services that require this authority.

# Connecting to wireless networks

You can access the Internet wirelessly from your phone using Wi-Fi® technology. This way you can browse the web and access cheaper call and data rates.

If your company or organization has a virtual private network (VPN), you can connect to this network with your phone. You can use a VPN to access intranets and other internal services at your company.

## Wi-Fi®

Using Wi-Fi® technology you can access the Internet wirelessly with your phone. To access the Internet using a Wi-Fi® connection, you first need to search for and connect to an available Wi-Fi® network. The signal strength of the Wi-Fi® network may differ depending on your phone's location. Moving closer to the Wi-Fi® access point may increase the signal strength.

## Before using Wi-Fi®

Your device has Wi-Fi® turned on by default. To browse the Internet using a Wi-Fi® connection, you need to search for and connect to an available Wi-Fi® network and then open the Internet browser. The signal strength of the Wi-Fi® network may differ depending on your phone's location. Move closer to the Wi-Fi® access point to increase the signal strength.

#### To turn on Wi-Fi®

- 1 From the Home screen, tap \( \frac{1}{2} \).
- 2 Find and tap **Settings** > **Wireless & networks**.
- 3 Mark the Wi-Fi checkbox. The phone scans for available Wi-Fi® networks.
- It may take a few seconds before Wi-Fi® is enabled.

## To turn on AT&T Wi-Fi® auto connect

- 2 Find and tap Settings > Wireless & networks > Wi-Fi settings > AT&T Wi-Fi auto connect.
- Your device is pre-configured to connect to any AT&T Wi-Fi® Hotspot when you are within range.

## To connect to a Wi-Fi® network

- 2 Find and tap Settings > Wireless & networks > Wi-Fi settings.
- 3 Available Wi-Fi® networks are displayed under **Wi-Fi networks**. The available networks may be open or secured. Open networks are indicated by 膏 and secured networks are indicated by 膏 next to the Wi-Fi® network name.
- 4 Tap a Wi-Fi® network to connect to it. If you are trying to connect to a secure Wi-Fi® network, you are asked to enter a password. ☐ is displayed in the status bar once you are connected.
- Your phone remembers Wi-Fi® networks you connect to. The next time you come within reach of a previously connected Wi-Fi® network, your phone automatically connects to it.
- In some locations, open Wi-Fi® networks require you to log in to a web page before you can get access to the network. Contact the relevant Wi-Fi® network administrator for more information.

#### To connect to another Wi-Fi® network

- 1 From the Home screen, tap .....
- 2 Find and tap **Settings** > **Wireless & networks** > **Wi-Fi settings**. Detected Wi-Fi® networks are displayed in the **Wi-Fi networks** section.
- 3 Tap another Wi-Fi® network to connect to it.

#### Wi-Fi® network status

When you are connected to a Wi-Fi® network or when there are Wi-Fi® networks available in your vicinity, it is possible to see the status of these Wi-Fi® networks. You can also enable the phone to notify you whenever an open Wi-Fi® network is detected.

#### To view detailed information about a connected Wi-Fi® network

- 3 Tap the Wi-Fi® network that you are currently connected to. Detailed network information is displayed.

#### Wi-Fi® sleep policy

By adding a Wi-Fi® sleep policy, you can specify when to switch from Wi-Fi to mobile data.

If you are not connected to a Wi-Fi® network, the phone uses mobile data connection to access the Internet (if you have set up and enabled a mobile data connection in your phone).

#### To add a Wi-Fi® sleep policy

- 1 From the Home screen, tap ......
- 2 Find and tap **Settings** > **Wireless & networks** > **Wi-Fi settings**.
- 3 Press =
- 4 Tap Advanced ★.
- 5 Tap Wi-Fi sleep policy.

### Using a static IP address

You can set up the phone to connect to a Wi-Fi® network using a static IP address.

#### **WPS**

WPS (Wi-Fi Protected Setup) is a computing standard that helps you establish secure wireless network connections. If you have little background knowledge of wireless security, WPS makes it easy for you to set up Wi-Fi Protected Access (WPA) encryption to secure your network. You can also add new devices to an existing network without entering long passwords.

Use one of these methods to enable WPS:

- Push button method simply push a button on a WPS access point, for example, a router.
- PIN method your phone creates a random PIN (Personal Identification Number), which you enter on the network access point device.

#### To connect to a Wi-Fi® network using a WPS button

- 1 From your Home screen, tap ......
- 2 Find and tap Settings > Wireless & networks.
- 3 Mark the Wi-Fi checkbox.
- 4 Tap Wi-Fi settings > Auto setup (WPS).
- 5 Press the WPS button on the access point within two minutes.

#### To connect to a Wi-Fi® network using a WPS PIN

- 1 From your Home screen, tap \( \begin{array}{c} \text{ from your Home screen, tap } \end{array} \)
- 2 Find and tap **Settings** > **Wireless & networks**.
- 3 Mark the Wi-Fi checkbox.
- 4 Tap Wi-Fi settings.
- 5 Tap a network indicated by and select **Use PIN**.
- 6 Follow the instructions that appear.

#### Using the Connected devices feature to share files

Share media files in your phone with other devices over a shared Wi-Fi® connection using the Connected devices feature. For example, you can use a connected client device to view photos or play music tracks that are saved on your phone. Or you can open files from the other device on your phone. A connected client device can be, for example, computer, a camera, TV, or a PlayStation®3. All devices must be DLNA Certified™ by the Digital Living Network Alliance.

#### To set up file sharing using the Connected devices feature

- 1 Connect your phone to a Wi-Fi® network.
- 2 From your Home screen, tap | then find and tap Connected devices.
- 3 Press =, then tap Media server.
- 4 Tap 
   and edit your phone name, if desired. This name will later appear on other client devices connected to the Wi-Fi network, to identify your phone.
- Mark the **Share contents** checkbox. appears in the status bar. Your phone can now work as a media server.
- 6 Connect your computer or other device(s) to the same Wi-Fi® network as your phone.
- 7 A notification appears in the status bar of the phone. Tap it and set access permissions.
- 8 To close the **Connected devices** view, press **5**. The Media server function stays running in the background.
- 9 To turn off the media server, go to the **Connected devices** view in the phone and unmark the **Share contents** checkbox.
- The instructions described above may differ depending on the client devices. Also refer to your client device User guide. If the device cannot connect, check that your local network is working.

#### To set access permissions for a pending device

- 1 From your Home screen, tap | then find and tap Connected devices.
- 2 Press =, then tap Media server.
- 3 Select a device from the **Pending devices** list.
- 4 Select an access permission level.

#### To change the name of a registered device

- 1 From your Home screen, tap | then find and tap Connected devices.
- 2 Press =, then tap Media server.
- 3 Select a device from the **Registered devices** list, then select **Change name**.
- 4 Enter a new name for the device.

#### To change the access level of a registered device

- 1 From your Home screen, tap **!!!**, then find and tap **Connected devices**.
- 2 Press =, then tap Media server.
- 3 Select a device from the **Registered devices** list.
- 4 Tap Change access level and select an option.

#### To get help about sharing content with other devices

• When the **Connected devices** view is open, tap **Help** > **Learn more**.

## Playing files from other devices on your phone

Once you have set up the Connected devices feature, you can start playing media files from other devices on your phone.

#### To play shared media files on your phone

- 1 Make sure the devices that you are sharing files with are set up to use the Connected devices feature.
- 2 From your Home screen, tap ##, then find and tap Connected devices.
- 3 Select a connected device from the list.
- 4 Browse the folders of the device and select the media files you want to play. The files start playing automatically.

#### Playing shared media files on other devices

You can use the Connected devices feature to access photos and videos saved to the internal storage or memory card of your phone from other devices.

#### To open media files from your phone on another device

- 1 Make sure the device that you are sharing files with is set up to use the Connected devices feature.
- 2 From your Home screen, tap \( \frac{1}{2} \).
- 3 Find and tap Gallery.
- 4 Open the album containing the content you want to work with.
- 5 To activate item selection mode, touch and hold a photo or video.
- 6 Check the items you want to open on another device.
- 7 Press  $\equiv$ , then tap **Share** > **Play on device**.
- 8 Select a device. The files open automatically on the device that you have selected.
- You can also open the checked items on another device by tapping the items and then tapping .

#### To play a track from your phone on another device

- 1 Make sure you have set up file sharing using the Connected devices feature on all devices.
- 2 From your Home screen, tap \(\big|\), then find and tap \(\big|\).
- 3 Tap MY MUSIC.
- 4 Tap to browse audio by artist. Tap to browse by album. Tap to use playlists. Tap to browse audio by track.
- 5 Scroll up or down and browse to a track.
- 6 Tap ♠.
- 7 Select a device. The track plays automatically on the device that you have selected.

## Sharing your phone's mobile data connection

You can share your phone's mobile data connection with a single computer using a USB cable. This process is called USB tethering. You can also share your phone's data connection by turning your phone into a portable Wi-Fi® hotspot. At a given time, a maximum of eight hot spot clients can connect to the portable Wi-Fi hotspot.

You must have a tethering data plan to be able to use this feature. Contact AT&T for more information.

When your phone is sharing its data connection, the following icons may appear in the status bar or in the Notification panel:

- USB tethering is active
- Portable Wi-Fi® hotspot is active
- Both USB tethering and portable hotspot are active

#### To share your phone's data connection using a USB cable

- 1 Deactivate all USB cable connections to your phone.
- 2 Using the USB cable that came with your phone, connect your phone to a computer.
- 3 From your Home screen, tap ......
- 4 Find and tap **Settings** > **Wireless & networks** > **Tethering & portable hotspot**.
- Mark the **USB tethering** checkbox. The phone starts sharing its mobile network data connection with the computer over the USB connection. An ongoing notification appears in the status bar and the Notification panel.
- 6 Unmark the **USB tethering** checkbox, or disconnect the USB cable to stop sharing your data connection.
- You cannot share your phone's data connection and SD card over a USB cable at the same time. For more information, see *Connecting your phone to a computer* on page 106.
- You may need to prepare your computer to establish a network connection via USB cable. Go to android.com/tether to get the most current information.

#### To share your phone's data connection as a portable Wi-Fi® hotspot

- 1 From the Home screen, tap .....
- 2 Find and tap Settings > Wireless & networks > Tethering & portable hotspot.
- 3 Tap Portable Wi-Fi hotspot settings > Configure Wi-Fi hotspot.
- 4 Enter the **Network SSID** for the network. Tap the **Security** field to select a security type.
- 5 If required, enter a password.
- 6 Tap Save.
- 7 Mark the **Portable Wi-Fi hotspot** checkbox. The phone starts broadcasting its Wi-Fi® network name (SSID).
- 8 Unmark the **Portable Wi-Fi hotspot** checkbox when you want to stop sharing your data connection via Wi-Fi®.

## To rename or secure your portable hotspot

- 1 From the Home screen, tap .....
- 2 Find and tap Settings > Wireless & networks > Tethering & portable hotspot.
- 3 Make sure the **Portable Wi-Fi hotspot** checkbox is marked.
- 4 Tap Portable Wi-Fi hotspot settings > Configure Wi-Fi hotspot.
- 5 Enter the **Network SSID** for the network.
- 6 Tap the **Security** field to select a security type.
- 7 If required, enter a password.
- 8 Tap Save.

# Virtual private networks (VPNs)

Use your phone to connect to virtual private networks (VPNs), which allow you to access resources inside a secured local network from outside the actual network. For example, VPN connections are commonly used by corporations and educational institutions for users who need to access intranets and other internal services when they are outside of the internal network, for example, when they are travelling.

VPN connections can be set up in many ways, depending on the network. Some networks may require you to transfer and install a security certificate in your phone. See *Connecting your phone to a computer* on page 106 for more information on how to transfer content to your phone. For detailed information on how to set up a connection to your virtual private network, please contact the network administrator of your company or organization.

#### To add a virtual private network

- 1 From the Home screen, tap ##.
- 2 Find and tap Settings > Wireless & networks > VPN settings.
- 3 Tap Add VPN.
- 4 Select the type of VPN to add.
- 5 Enter your VPN settings.
- 6 Press and tap Save.

### To connect to a virtual private network

- 2 Find and tap Settings > Wireless & networks > VPN settings.
- 3 In the list of available networks, tap the VPN you want to connect to.
- 4 Enter the required information.
- 5 Tap Connect.

#### To disconnect from a virtual private network

- 1 Drag the status bar downwards.
- 2 Tap the notification for the VPN connection to turn it off.

# Web browser

Use your web browser to view and navigate web pages, add pages as bookmarks, and create shortcuts to your Home screen. You can open several browser windows at the same time and use the zoom function when navigating a web page.

#### To open the web browser





# Search and address bar

Use the search and address bar to browse the web.



- 1 View the download progress of the current web page
- 2 Enter a search word to search for a web page, or enter a web page address to load a web page
- 3 Cancel the download of the current web page



# To open a web page

- 1 In your browser, tap the text field in the search and address bar to activate the keypad.
- 2 Enter a web address.
- 3 If you are using portrait view, tap . If you are using landscape mode, tap Go.

#### To search for a web page

- 1 Tap the search and address text field to activate the keypad.
- 2 Enter a search word or phrase.
- If you are using portrait view, tap . If you are using landscape mode, tap Go.

# To exit the web browser

- While browsing, press .
- When you open the browser again, the browser appears exactly as it did before you exited, that is, with the same number of windows, position and zoom levels.

# Navigating web pages

#### To select a link

- To select a link in a web page, tap the link. The selected link is highlighted in orange, and the web page is loaded when you release your finger.
- If you select a link by mistake before releasing your finger, you can deselect it by dragging your finger away until the link is no longer highlighted.

## To go to the previous page while browsing

• Press •

#### To zoom in or out on a Webpage

Use one of the following methods to zoom in or out on a web page:

- Touch an area of the page with two fingers at once and spread them apart to zoom in, or pinch them together to zoom out.
- Slide your finger on the screen to make the zoom controls appear. Tap the icon to zoom in, or tap to zoom out.
- Double-tap to zoom in on the web page, or double-tap again to zoom out.

#### To reload the current web page

• Press =, then tap Refresh.

# To add a webpage shortcut to your Home screen

- 1 When viewing a webpage, press =
- 2 Tap Bookmarks > Add.
- 3 If desired, you can edit the name and the web address. When you're done, tap OK.
- 4 Tap and hold the bookmark to open a menu.
- 5 Tap Add shortcut to Home.

#### To share a link to the current web page

- 1 While browsing, press
- 2 Tap More > Share page.
- 3 Select an available transfer method, and follow the on-screen instructions.

# **Managing bookmarks**

Bookmarks let you access your favorite and frequently visited web pages quickly. Some bookmarks may be pre-installed on your phone.

#### To bookmark a web page

- 1 While you are viewing a web page, press =
- 2 Tap Bookmarks > Add.
- 3 If desired, you can edit the name and the web address.
- 4 When you're done, tap **OK**.
- To bookmark a web page, you can also tap the icon to the right of the search and address field.

#### To open a bookmark

- 1 When the Browser is open, press =
- 2 Tap Bookmarks.
- 3 Tap the bookmark you want to open.

#### To edit a bookmark

- 1 When the Browser is open, press =.
- 2 Tap Bookmarks.
- 3 Touch and hold a bookmark to open a menu.
- 4 Tap **Edit bookmark**.
- 5 Edit the name and the web address, as desired.
- 6 When you're done, tap **OK**.

#### To delete a bookmark

- 1 When the Browser is open, press =
- 2 Tap Bookmarks.
- 3 Touch and hold a bookmark to open a menu.
- 4 Tap **Delete bookmark** to delete the selected bookmark.
- · ¥ You cannot delete a pre-installed bookmark.

#### To bookmark a previously visited web page

- 1 When the Browser is open, press =
- 2 Tap Bookmarks.
- 3 Tap the **History** tab, or the **Most visited** tab, to view a list of previously visited web pages.
- 4 Tap the \*\right\* icon to the right of the web page you want to add as a bookmark.

# Managing text and images

#### To find text within a web page

- When you are viewing a web page, press =
- 2 Tap More > Find on page.
- 3 Enter your search text. Matching characters appear highlighted in green.
- 4 Tap the left or right arrow to go to the previous or next matching item.
- 5 Tap X to close the search bar.

#### To copy text from a webpage

- 1 Locate the text you want to copy.
- 2 Press =
- 3 Tap More > Select text.
- 4 Place your finger at the start of the text you want to select and then drag it to the desired end point. The text you select becomes highlighted.
- 5 Tap the selected text to copy it.
- To paste text into an email, text message or multimedia message, touch and hold the text field in the relevant application and tap **Paste** in the menu that appears.

# To save an image from a web page

- 1 On the active web page, touch and hold the desired image until a menu appears.
- 2 Tap Save image.
- If an SD card is inserted, you can select where you want to save the image. Select a location. If you prefer to making the current download setting the default setting, mark the **Set as default download memory** checkbox.
- If both the internal storage and the SD card are unavailable, the image cannot be saved.

# **Multiple windows**

Your browser can run in up to eight different windows at the same time. You can, for example, log in to your webmail in one window and read today's news in another. You can easily switch from one window to another.

### To open a new browser window

- 1 When the Browser is open, press =
- 2 Tap New window.

#### To open a link in a new browser window

- 1 Touch and hold a link until a menu appears.
- 2 Tap Open in new window.

#### To switch between browser windows

- 1 When the Browser is open, press =
- 2 Tap Windows to see a list of all open windows.
- 3 Tap the window you want to switch to.

# Downloading from the web

You can download applications and content when you browse the web using the web browser in your phone. Usually you have to touch a download link for the desired file and the download then starts automatically.

# To view your downloaded files

- 1 When the Browser is open, press
- 2 Tap More > Downloads.

# To cancel an ongoing download

- 1 When the Browser is open, press =
- 2 Tap More > Downloads.
- 3 Mark the checkbox beside the downloading file you want to delete.
- 4 Tap Cancel.

# **Browser settings**

## To change your browser settings

- 1 When the Browser is open, press =
- 2 Tap More > Settings.

# Auto-fitting web pages

The auto-fit option makes it easier for you to read large websites with text and images, such as news sites. For example, if you zoom in on a web page when auto-fit is enabled, the text automatically adjusts to the new screen size. If auto-fit is disabled, you might need to scroll sideways to read a full sentence.

# To auto-fit web pages

- 1 When the Browser is open, press =
- 2 Tap More > Settings > Auto-fit pages.

# Music

Get the most out of your music player. Listen to and organize music, audio books and podcasts that you have transferred to your memory card from a computer, or purchased and downloaded from online stores.

To make content easily available to the music player, you can use the Media Go<sup>™</sup> application. Media Go<sup>™</sup> helps transfer music content between a computer and a phone. For more information, see *Connecting your phone to a computer* on page 106.

# **Protecting your hearing**

Listening to the music player or other media players for a prolonged period of time can damage your hearing, even when the volume is at a moderate level. To alert you to such risks, a volume level warning appears when the volume is too high, and after the music player is used for over 20 hours.

#### To turn off the volume level warning

- When appears, tap OK to dismiss the warning.
- Every time you restart your phone, the media volume is automatically set to a safe level.

# Copying media files to your memory card

Copy all your favorite media content from computer to phone and start using your phone's entertainment features to the full. It's easy to transfer music, photos, videos and other files. Just connect your phone to a computer with a USB cable and use either the computer's file manager application or the Media  $Go^{TM}$  application to transfer your files.



- 4 Tap a track to play it.

- 2 Tap **Equalizer**. If you want to adjust the sound manually, drag the frequency band buttons up or down.
- 3 If you prefer to adjust the sound automatically, tap and select a style.

#### To turn on the Surround sound

- 1 When the music player is open, press =
- 2 Tap Equalizer > More > Headphone surround.
- 3 Select a setting.
- 4 Tap **OK**.

#### To view the current play queue

While a track is playing in the music player, tap the album art and then tap

# To minimize the music player

When the music player is playing, press to go to the previous screen, or press to go to the Home screen. The music player stays playing in the background.

#### To return to the music player when it is playing in the background

- 1 Drag the status bar downwards to open the Notification panel.
- 2 Tap the track title to open the music player.
- Alternatively, you can press and hold 🏫 and then tap 🗾 to return to the music player.

#### To delete a track

- 1 Open the music player library and browse to the track you want to delete.
- 2 Touch and hold the track title, then tap **Delete**.
- You can also delete albums this way.

#### To share a track

- 1 When browsing your tracks in the music player library, touch and hold a track title.
- 2 Tap Send.
- 3 Select an available transfer method, and follow the on-screen instructions.
- You can also share albums and playlists this way.
- You might not be able to copy, send or transfer copyright-protected items.

#### To recommend a track on Facebook™

- While the track is playing in the music player, tap **(a)** to show that you "Like" it on **Facebook™**. If desired, add a comment in the comments field.
- 2 Tap **Share** to send the track to **Facebook™**. If the track is received successfully, you will get a confirmation message from **Facebook™**.

# Searching for related content with the infinite button

When a track is playing in the music player, you can use the infinite button to instantly search for audio content that is related to the artist or track.

The infinite button launches a search for the following:

- music and karaoke videos on YouTube™
- artist info on Wikipedia™
- lyrics on Google.com

- 1 In the music player, tap **MY MUSIC**.
- 2 Tap 0, or 1, and browse to the track that you want to save as a shortcut.
- 3 Touch and hold the track title.
- 4 Tap **Add as shortcut**. The shortcut now appears in the My music main view.

# To rearrange shortcuts

- 1 In the music player, tap MY MUSIC.
- 2 Touch and hold a shortcut until it magnifies and the phone vibrates, then drag the item to a new location.

#### To delete a shortcut

- 1 In the music player, tap MY MUSIC.
- You can't delete the following tabs: Tracks, AlbumsArtists, Playlists and SensMe™ channels.

#### To update your music with the latest information

- 1 In My music, press
- 2 Tap 1. Your phone searches online and downloads the music application searches online and downloads the latest available album art and track information for your music.
- Downloading music information also enables SensMe™ channels.

# Categorizing your music using SensMe<sup>™</sup> channels

The SensMe<sup>™</sup> channels application helps you arrange your music by mood and tempo. SensMe<sup>™</sup> groups all your tracks into twelve categories, or channels, so you can select music that matches your mood or suits the time of day.

# To enable the SensMe<sup>™</sup> channels application

- 1 In the music player, tap **MY MUSIC**.
- 2 Tap => 1/3.
- This application requires a mobile or Wi-Fi® network connection.

# Playing music in random order

You can play tracks in playlists in random order. A playlist can be, for example, a playlist you have created yourself, or an album.

#### To play tracks in random order

- 1 In the music player, tap **MY MUSIC**.
- 2 Tap or and browse to an album or playlist.
- 3 Tap the album or playlist, to open it.
- 4 Tap 🔀.
- When an album or playlist is open, you can also tap and choose shuffle mode or repeat

# **Playlists**

The music player automatically creates Smart playlists on the playlist tab in the music player library. You can also create your own playlists from the music that is saved on your memory card.

In addition, you can install the Media Go<sup>™</sup> application on a computer and use it to copy playlists from the computer to your phone's memory card. For more information, see *Connecting your phone to a computer* on page 106.

# To create your own playlists

- 1 In the music player, tap MY MUSIC.
- 2 To add an artist, album or a track to a playlist, touch and hold the name of the artist or the title of the album or track.
- 3 In the menu that opens, tap Add to playlist > Create new playlist.
- 4 Enter a name for the playlist and tap **OK**.

#### To add tracks to a playlist

- 1 When browsing the music player library, touch and hold the name of the artist or the title of the album or track you want to add.
- 2 Tap Add to playlist.
- 3 Tap the name of the playlist to which you want to add the artist, album or track. The artist, album or track is added to the playlist.

#### To play your own playlists

- 1 In the music player, tap MY MUSIC.
- 2 Tap = ...
- 3 Under Playlists, tap a playlist.
- 4 Tap a track to play it.

# To remove a track from a playlist

- 1 In a playlist, touch and hold the title of the track you want to delete.
- 2 Tap Delete from playlist.

# To delete a playlist

- 1 In the music player, tap MY MUSIC, then select Playlists.
- 2 Touch and hold the playlist you want to delete.
- 3 Tap **Delete**.
- 4 Tap **Delete** again to confirm.

# Music player widget

The music player widget is a miniature application that gives you direct access to the music player from your Home screen. You need to add this widget to your Home screen before you can use it.

# To add the music player widget to your Home screen

- 1 From your Home screen, press =.
- 2 Tap Add > Widgets.
- 3 Tap **1**.

# **FM** radio

You can browse and listen to FM radio stations, and save them as favorites. You can listen to the radio either through a portable handsfree or headphones, or through the speaker in the phone. You have to connect a portable handsfree or headphones, as they work as the antenna for the FM radio. When you open the FM radio, available channels appear automatically. If a channel has RDS information, it appears a few seconds after you start listening.

#### To start the FM radio

- 1 Connect a portable handsfree or a set of headphones to your phone.
- 2 From your Home screen, tap .....
- Find and tap **FM radio**. The available channels appear as you scroll through the frequency band.
- You have to connect a portable handsfree or headphones, which function as an antenna.

# FM radio overview



- 1 Tuned frequency
- 2 A saved favorite channel
- 3 Tuning dial
- 4 Move down the frequency band to search for a channel
- 5 Move down the frequency band to the next favorite channel
- 6 Move up the frequency band to the next favorite channel
- 7 Save or remove a channel as a favorite
- 8 Move up the frequency band to search for a channel
- 9 Radio on/off button

#### To move between radio channels

- Flick your finger left or right along the frequency band.
- Drag the tuning dial right or left.

# Using your favorite radio channels

You can save the radio channels you most frequently listen to as favorites. By using favorites you can quickly return to a radio channel.

#### To save a channel as a favorite

- 1 When the radio is open, navigate to the channel that you want to save as a favorite.
- 2 Tap ★, then select ★.
- 3 Enter a name for the channel, then press **Save**.

#### To remove a channel as a favorite

- 1 When the radio is open, tap ...
- 2 Select the channel that you want to remove as a favorite.
- 3 Tap Delete.

#### To move between favorite channels

- When the radio is open, tap or ...
- To move between favorites, you must first save at least two channels as favorites.

# Making a new search for radio channels

If you have moved to a new location or the reception has improved in your current location, you can start a new scan for radio channels.

Any favorites you have saved are not affected by a new scan.

#### To start a new search for radio channels

- 1 When the radio is open, press =.
- 2 Tap **Search for channels**. The radio scans the whole frequency band, and all available channels are displayed.

# Switching between the speaker and the handsfree

You can choose to listen to the radio either through the portable handsfree or headphones, or through the speaker in the phone.

#### To switch between the speaker and the handsfree

- 1 When the radio is open, press =.
- 2 Tap Play in speaker.







# Working with batches of content in Gallery

You can select several photos or videos in an album and work on them in batches, for example, to send a few photos from an album to a friend.

#### To work with batches of photos or videos in Gallery

- 1 From your Home screen, tap ......
- 2 Find and tap Gallery.
- 3 Open the album containing the content that you want to work with.
- 4 To activate selection mode, touch and hold one of the items that you want to work with.
- 5 Check or uncheck the items that you want to work with.
- 6 Press =, then use the tools in the toolbar to work with your selected items.

#### To share an album in Gallery

- If you share an album, do not delete the original copy of the album before the items in the album are completely sent.
- 1 From the main Gallery screen, touch and hold an album that you want to work with. Selection mode is now activated.
- 2 Check the albums you want to share, then press =
- 3 Tap Share.
- 4 In the menu that opens, tap the application that you want to use to share the selected albums.

#### To delete an album in Gallery

- 1 From the main Gallery screen, touch and hold an album that you want to work with. Selection mode is now activated.
- 2 Check the albums that you want to delete, then press = ...
- 3 Tap **Delete**. In the dialog that opens, tap **Delete** again.

# Working with photos in Gallery

You can edit and reorganize your photos in Gallery. For example, you can crop photos, use them as contact pictures and as wallpaper.

#### To zoom a photo

- When you are viewing a photo, double-tap the screen to zoom in. Double-tap again to zoom out.
- When you are viewing a photo, spread two fingers apart to zoom in, or pinch two fingers together to zoom out.

#### To watch a slideshow of your photos

- 1 From your Home screen, tap \( \begin{aligned} \pm \ext{.} \\ \ext{.} \ext{.} \ext{.} \ext{.} \ext{.} \ext{.} \ext{.}
- 2 Find and tap Gallery.
- 3 Tap an album to open it, then tap a photo and press =.
- 4 In the toolbar at the bottom of the screen, tap **Slide show**.
- 5 Tap a photo to end the slideshow.

# To rotate a photo

- 1 When you are viewing a photo, press =.
- 2 Tap **More**, then tap either **Rotate Left** or **Rotate Right**. The photo is saved in the new orientation.

## To use a photo as a contact picture

- 1 When you are viewing a photo in the photo viewer, press =
- 2 In the toolbar at the bottom of the screen, tap **Set as** > **Contact picture**.
- 3 Select the contact you want to associate with the photo.
- 4 Crop the photo, if required.
- 5 Tap Save.

#### To use a photo as wallpaper

- 1 When you are viewing a photo in the photo viewer, press
- 2 In the toolbar at the bottom of the screen, tap Set as > Wallpaper.
- 3 Crop the photo, if required.
- 4 Tap Save.

#### To crop a photo

- When you are viewing a photo in the photo viewer, press =
- 2 In the toolbar, tap More > Crop.
- To adjust the crop frame, touch and hold the edge of the crop frame. When crop arrows appear, drag inward or outward to resize the frame.
- 4 To resize all sides of the crop frame at the same time, touch and hold one of the four corners to make the arrows appear, then drag the corner accordingly.
- 5 To move the crop frame to another area of the photo, touch and hold inside the frame, then drag it to the desired position.
- To save a copy of the photo as you cropped it, tap **Save**. The original uncropped version remains on your phone's memory card.

## To share a photo

- 1 When you are viewing a photo in the photo viewer, press =
- 2 In the toolbar, tap **Share**.
- 3 Select one of the available transfer methods.

#### To delete a photo

- 1 When you are viewing a photo in the photo viewer, press =.
- 2 In the toolbar at the bottom of the screen, tap **Delete**.
- 3 In the dialog that opens, tap **Delete**.

# Viewing your photos on a map

If you enabled location detection when taking photos, you can use the information gathered at a later stage. For example, you can view your photos on a map and show friends and family where you were when you took the photo. Adding location information is also referred to as geotagging. To geotag your photos, you first need to enable location detection in your phone. You can select to use either GPS satellites or wireless networks, or both, to find your position.

#### To enable location detection

- 1 From your Home screen, press =
- 2 Tap Settings > Location & security. See Using location services to find your position on page 110 for more information.
- 3 Mark the Use GPS satellites and/or Use wireless networks checkboxes.

# To view geotagged photos on a map

- 1 When you are viewing a photo that you have geotagged, press =
- 2 Tap More > Show on map.

# Working with videos

Use Gallery to watch videos that you've taken with the camera, downloaded, or copied to your memory card. You can also share your videos with friends, or upload them to  $YouTube^{TM}$ .

#### To play a video

- 1 In Gallery, browse to the album containing the video that you want to play.
- 2 Tap the video to play it.
- 3 If the playback controls are not displayed, tap the screen to display them. To hide the controls, tap the screen again.

#### To pause a video

- 1 When a video is playing, tap the screen to display the controls.
- 2 Tap .....

#### To fast forward and rewind a video

- 1 When a video is playing, tap the screen to display the controls.
- 2 Drag the progress bar marker left to rewind, or right to fast forward.
- dlternatively, you can tap b or ≪.

#### To adjust the volume of a video

Press the volume key.

#### To share a video

- 1 Open a Gallery album containing a video.
- 2 To activate selection mode, touch and hold an item that you want to work with.
- 3 Check the video or videos that you want to share.
- 4 Press =.
- 5 Tap Share.
- 6 In the menu that opens, tap the application that you want to use to share the selected video, then follow the relevant steps to send it.
- You might not be able to copy, send or transfer copyright-protected items. Also, some items may not send if the file size is too large.

# To delete a video

- 1 Open a Gallery album containing a video.
- 2 To activate selection mode, touch and hold an item that you want to work with.
- 3 Check the video or videos that you want to delete.
- 4 Press =, then tap **Delete**.
- 5 In the dialog that opens, tap **Delete**.

# Bluetooth™ wireless technology

Use the Bluetooth<sup>™</sup> function to send files to other Bluetooth<sup>™</sup> compatible devices, or to connect to handsfree accessories. Turn on the Bluetooth<sup>™</sup> function in your phone and create wireless connections to other Bluetooth<sup>™</sup> compatible devices such as computers, handsfree accessories, and phones. Bluetooth<sup>™</sup> connections work better within a 10 meter (33 foot) range, with no solid objects in between. In some cases you have to manually pair your phone with other Bluetooth<sup>™</sup> devices. Remember to set your phone to "discoverable" if you want other Bluetooth<sup>™</sup> devices to detect it.

Interoperability and compatibility among Bluetooth™ devices can vary.

#### To turn on the Bluetooth™ function and make your phone visible

- 1 From your Home screen, tap ......
- 2 Find and tap **Settings** > **Wireless & networks**.
- 3 Mark the **Bluetooth** checkbox. \*\* appears in the status bar.
- 4 Tap Bluetooth settings.
- 5 Mark the **Discoverable** checkbox. The phone will now be visible to other devices for 120 seconds.

# Naming your phone

You can give your phone a name. This name is shown to other devices after you have turned on the Bluetooth™ function and your phone is set to visible.

#### To give your phone a name

- 1 Make sure the Bluetooth™ function is turned on.
- 2 From your Home screen, tap ##
- 3 Find and tap Settings > Wireless & networks > Bluetooth settings > Device name.
- 4 Enter a name for your phone.
- 5 Tap **OK**.

# Pairing with another Bluetooth™ device

When you pair your phone with another device, you can, for example, connect your phone to a Bluetooth<sup>TM</sup> handsfree or a Bluetooth<sup>TM</sup> car kit and use these devices to make and receive calls.

Once you have paired your phone with a Bluetooth<sup>TM</sup> device the phone will remember this pairing. When pairing the phone with a Bluetooth<sup>TM</sup> device, you may need to enter a passcode. Your phone will automatically try the generic passcode 0000. If this does not work, refer to your Bluetooth<sup>TM</sup> device documentation for the device passcode. You do not need to re-enter the passcode the next time you connect to a paired Bluetooth<sup>TM</sup> device.

Some Bluetooth  $^{\text{TM}}$  devices, for example, most Bluetooth  $^{\text{TM}}$  headsets, require you to both pair and connect with the other device.

You can pair your phone with several Bluetooth™ devices, but you can only connect to one Bluetooth™ profile at the same time.

#### To pair your phone with another Bluetooth™ device

- 1 From the Home screen, tap ##.
- 2 Find and tap Settings > Wireless & networks > Bluetooth settings.
- 3 Tap Scan for devices. The Bluetooth™ devices found will be listed under Bluetooth devices.
- 4 Tap the Bluetooth™ device that you want to pair with your phone.
- 5 Enter a passcode, if required.
- 6 The phone and the Bluetooth™ device are now paired. With some devices you also need to connect before you can start using them. The status of the pairing and connection is shown below the name of the Bluetooth™ device in the Bluetooth devices list.
- Make sure that the device you want to pair your phone with has the Bluetooth™ function activated and Bluetooth™ visibility turned on.

#### To connect your phone to another Bluetooth™ device

- Some Bluetooth<sup>™</sup> devices, for example, most Bluetooth<sup>™</sup> headsets, require you to first pair and then connect with other Bluetooth<sup>™</sup> devices before a successful connection can be established.
- 1 From the Home screen, tap ......
- 2 Find and tap Settings > Wireless & networks > Bluetooth settings.
- 3 In the **Bluetooth devices** list, tap the Bluetooth<sup>™</sup> device to which you want to connect your phone.

# To unpair a Bluetooth™ device

- 1 From the Home screen, tap ##.
- 2 Find and tap Settings > Wireless & networks > Bluetooth settings.
- 3 In the Bluetooth devices list, touch and hold the name of the paired but not connected Bluetooth™ device.
- 4 Tap Unpair.

# Sending and receiving items using Bluetooth™ technology

Share items with other Bluetooth™ compatible devices such as phones or computers. You can send and receive several kinds of items using the Bluetooth™ function, such as:

- Photos and videos
- Music and other audio files
- Contacts
- Web pages

# To send items using Bluetooth™

- 1 Receiving device: Make sure the Bluetooth<sup>™</sup> device you want to send the item to has Bluetooth<sup>™</sup> turned on and is in discoverable mode.
- In your phone, open the application which contains the item you want to send and scroll to the item.
- 3 Depending on the application and the item you want to send, you may need to, for example, touch and hold the item, open the item or press . Other ways to send an item may exist.
- 4 Select a share or send menu item.
- 5 In the menu that appears, select **Bluetooth**.
- 6 Turn on Bluetooth™, if you are asked to do so.
- 7 Under **Bluetooth devices**, tap the name of the receiving device.
- 8 Receiving device: If asked, accept the connection.
- 9 If asked, enter the same passcode on both devices, or confirm the suggested passcode.
- 10 Receiving device: Accept the incoming item.

# To receive items using Bluetooth™

- 2 Find and tap **Settings** > **Wireless & networks**.
- 3 Mark the **Bluetooth** checkbox. 

  appears in the status bar.
- 4 Tap Bluetooth settings.
- 5 Mark the **Discoverable** checkbox. The phone is now visible to other devices for 120 seconds.
- 6 The sending device should now start sending data to your phone.
- 7 If prompted, enter the same passcode on both devices, or confirm the suggested passcode.
- 8 When you are notified of an incoming file to your phone, drag the status bar downward and tap the notification to accept the file transfer.
- 9 Tap **Accept** to start the file transfer.
- 10 To view the progress of the transfer, drag the status bar downward.
- 11 To open a received item, drag the status bar downward and tap the relevant notification.
- Your phone must have a memory card inserted to be able to receive items using Bluetooth™ wireless technology.

# Connecting your phone to a computer

Connect your phone to a computer and start transferring pictures, music and other file types. The easiest ways to connect are using a USB cable or Bluetooth wireless technology.

You might not be able to transfer some copyright-protected material between your phone and computer.

# Transferring and handling content using a USB cable

Use a USB cable connection between a computer and your phone for easy transfer and management of your files. Once the two devices are connected, you can drag and drop content between them using the computer's file explorer. If you're transferring music, video, pictures, or other media files to your phone, it's best to use the Media Go<sup>TM</sup> application on your computer. Media Go<sup>TM</sup> converts media files so you can use them on your phone.

#### **USB** connection modes

The two most common methods to share data between your phone and other devices using a USB cable are Media transfer protocol (MTP) mode and Mass storage (MSC) mode.

- Media transfer mode (MTP) the most common protocol for communication with Windows computers. MTP mode is for data transfer between a computer and the phone's internal storage only. It doesn't work for transferring data to or from a memory card in the phone. MTP mode is enabled by default.
- Mass storage mode (MSC) the most common way to connect phones with media devices such as TVs, car kits, and Mac OS/Linux computers lacking MTP support. MSC mode only works for data transfers between other devices and a memory card in the phone. It doesn't work for transferring data to or from the phone's internal storage.

#### To transfer data between a computer and your phone's memory card

- 1 Connect your phone to a computer using a USB cable. **Internal storage connected** appears in the status bar.
- **Computer**: Open Microsoft® Windows® Explorer from the desktop and wait until your phone's memory card appears as an external disk in Microsoft® Windows® Explorer.
- 3 Computer: Drag and drop the desired files between your phone and the computer.

# To disable automatic connections to your memory card in MSC mode

- 1 From your Home screen, tap |
- 2 Find and tap Settings > Xperia<sup>™</sup> > Connectivity.
- 3 Unmark the Auto connect in MSC checkbox.
- When you set Mass Storage mode as the default USB connection mode, the Auto connect in MSC checkbox gets checked automatically. You do not need to activate it manually.

# To transfer data between a computer and phone memory card using MSC mode

- 1 Connect your phone to a computer using a USB cable. **SD card connected** appears in the status bar.
- **Computer**: Open Microsoft® Windows® Explorer from the desktop and wait until your phone's memory card appears as an external disk in Microsoft® Windows® Explorer.
- 3 Computer: Drag and drop the desired files between your phone and the computer.

#### To safely disconnect the USB cable after an MSC transfer

- Do not disconnect the USB cable when transferring content as this may corrupt the content.
- 1 Computer: Use the Safely Remove Hardware feature to disable the USB cable connection.
- 2 **Phone**: Drag the status bar downwards.
- 3 Tap SD card connected.
- 4 Tap **Disconnect** in the screen that opens.
- 5 Disconnect the USB cable from both devices.
- Computer instructions may vary depending on your operating system. See the documentation of your computer's operating system for more information.

# Transferring files using Media transfer mode via Wi-Fi®

You can transfer files between your phone and other MTP compatible devices, such as a computer, using a Wi-Fi<sup>®</sup> connection. Before connecting, you first need to pair the two devices. If you're transferring music, video, pictures, or other media files between your phone and a computer, it's best to use the Media Go<sup>™</sup> application on the computer. Media Go<sup>™</sup> converts media files so you can use them on your phone.

In order to use this feature, you need a Wi-Fi® enabled device that supports Media transfer, for example, a computer running Microsoft® Windows Vista® or Windows® 7.

# To pair your phone wirelessly with a computer using Media transfer mode

- 1 Make sure Media transfer mode is enabled on your phone. It is normally enabled by default.
- 2 Connect your phone to the computer using a USB cable.
- 3 **Computer**: Once the phone name appears on the screen, click *Network* configuration and follow the instructions to pair the computer.
- 4 When you are finished pairing, disconnect the USB cable from both devices.
- The above instructions only work if Windows® 7 is installed on your computer and the computer is connected to a Wi-Fi® Access Point via a network cable.

#### To connect paired devices wirelessly in Media transfer mode

- 1 Make sure Media transfer mode is enabled on your phone. It is normally enabled by default.
- 2 From your Home screen, tap \( \frac{1}{2} \).
- 3 Find and tap Settings > Xperia<sup>™</sup> > Connectivity.
- 4 Tap the paired device that you want to connect to under **Trusted devices**.
- 5 Tap Connect.
- Make sure your phone's Wi-Fi<sup>®</sup> function is turned on.

#### To disconnect a wirelessly paired device in Media transfer mode

- 2 Find and tap Settings > Xperia<sup>™</sup> > Connectivity.
- 3 Tap the paired device that you want to disconnect from under Trusted devices.
- 4 Tap **Disconnect**.

#### To remove a pairing with another device

- 1 From your Home screen, tap ##.
- 2 Find and tap Settings > Xperia<sup>™</sup> > Connectivity.
- 3 Tap the paired device that you want to remove.
- 4 Tap Forget.

# **PC Companion**

PC Companion is a computer application that gives you access to additional features and services which help you transfer music, video and pictures to and from your phone. You can also use PC Companion to update your phone and get the latest software version available. The installation files for PC Companion are saved on your phone and the installation is launched from the phone when you connect it to a computer via USB cable.

You need a computer running one of the following operating systems to use the PC Companion application:

- Microsoft® Windows® 7
- Microsoft® Windows Vista®
- Microsoft® Windows® XP (Service Pack 3 or higher)

#### To install PC Companion

- 1 New phone: Turn on your new Android™ phone and connect it to a PC using a USB cable.
- 2 New phone: Tap Install to install PC Companion on the PC.
- **Computer**: If a popup window appears, select *Run Startme.exe*. In the new popup window that appears, click *Install* to start the installation and then follow the instructions to complete the installation.

#### To start PC Companion

- 1 Make sure that PC Companion is installed on your PC.
- 2 Open the PC Companion application on the PC, then click Start to open one of the features you want to use.

#### Media Go™

The Media Go™ computer application helps you transfer and manage media content in your phone and computer.

You need one of these operating systems to use the Media Go™ application:

- Microsoft® Windows® 7
- Microsoft® Windows Vista®
- Microsoft® Windows® XP, Service Pack 3, or higher

# To transfer content using the Media Go™ application

- 1 Connect your phone to a computer using a supported USB cable.
- 2 Phone: In the status bar, Internal storage connected appears.
- **Computer**: The PC Companion application launches automatically. In PC Companion, click *Media Go* to start the Media Go<sup>™</sup> application. In some cases, you may have to wait for Media Go<sup>™</sup> to install.
- 4 Using Media Go™, drag and drop files between your computer and phone.
- · ∳- Media Go™ can also be downloaded from www.sonymobile.com.

### Connecting your phone to a TV set

Connect your phone to a TV set using a HDMI™ (High Definition Multimedia Interface) cable, and start viewing content saved in your phone on a larger screen. When you connect your phone to the TV set, the TV Launcher application opens. This application helps you to play media files from your phone on TVs and other devices.

#### To view phone content on a TV using a HDMI cable connection

- 1 Connect your phone to the TV set using a HDMI<sup>TM</sup> cable. appears in your phone's status bar after a connection is established.
- The **TV launcher** application starts automatically. Follow the instructions on your phone screen to view your media files on the TV.
- ✓You may need to purchase a TypeD HDMI<sup>™</sup> cable separately. For best results, use a Sony IM-820 cable.

#### To view instructions on using a TV remote control with your phone

- 1 Drag the status bar downward to open the Notification panel while the HDMI™ cable is connected to both your phone and the TV set.
- 2 Tap **HDMI connected** to view instructions on how to use the control buttons on your TV's remote control.

#### To disconnect your phone from the TV set

Disconnect the HDMI™ cable from your phone or the TV set.

# Using location services to find your position

Use your phone to find out where you are. There are two methods: GPS and wireless networks. Enable the wireless networks option if you only need your approximate location, and want it fast. If you want a more exact position, and have a clear view of the sky, enable the GPS option. In situations where the wireless network connection is weak, you should enable both options to ensure that your location is found.

Sony does not warrant the accuracy of any location services including but not limited to navigational services.

#### To enable GPS

- 1 From the Home screen, tap
- 2 Tap Settings > Location & security.
- 3 Mark the Use GPS satellites checkbox.

#### To enable wireless networks

- 1 From your Home screen, tap ......
- 2 Tap Settings > Location & security.
- 3 Mark the Use wireless networks checkbox.

#### **Using GPS**

Your phone has a global positioning system (GPS) receiver that uses satellite signals to calculate your location.

When you use features that require the GPS receiver to find your location, make sure you have a clear view of the sky.

#### Getting the best performance

The first time you use the GPS it can take 5 to 10 minutes for your location to be found. To help the search, make sure you have a clear view of the sky. Stand still and don't cover the GPS antenna (the highlighted area in the image). The GPS signals can pass through clouds and plastic, but not through most solid objects such as buildings and mountains. If your location isn't found after a few minutes, move to another location.



#### Google Maps™

Track your current location, view real-time traffic situations and receive detailed directions to your destination. Before taking trips, you can download and save maps to your memory card to avoid high roaming costs.

The Google Maps<sup>™</sup> application requires an Internet connection. You may incur data connection charges when you connect to the Internet from your phone. Contact your service provider for more information. The Google Maps<sup>™</sup> application may not be available in every market, country or region.

#### To use Google Maps™

- 1 From the Home screen, tap \( \frac{1}{2} \).
- 2 Find and tap Maps.
- If you want to use your location, enable at least one of the location methods available under Settings > Location & security.

#### To learn more about Google Maps™

When you use Google Maps<sup>™</sup>, press =, then tap Help.

#### Viewing your friends' locations with Google Latitude™

Join Google Latitude  $^{\text{TM}}$  to view your friends' locations on maps and share your location and other information with them.

#### Using Google Maps™ to get directions

Use the Google Maps<sup>™</sup> application to get directions when you travel by foot, public transportation, or car. You can add a shortcut to a destination on your Home screen to get quick directions from wherever you are.

When you view a map, you make an Internet connection, and data is transferred to your phone. So it's a good idea to download and save maps to your phone before you take a trip. This way, you can avoid high roaming costs.

#### Using the Navigation application

Use the Navigation application in your phone to get turn-by-turn instructions on how to get places. The directions are both spoken and displayed on the screen.

The Navigation application may not be available in every market.

#### To start Navigation

# Backing up and restoring phone content

Use the Backup and restore application to make backups of phone content to your memory card or to an online storage account. Such backups can be used to restore your content and some phone settings in cases where your data gets lost or deleted.

#### Types of content you can back up

Use the Backup and restore application to back up the following types of data:


- Bookmarks
- Call log
- Contacts
- Applications downloaded from Android Market<sup>™</sup>
- Multimedia messages
- System settings (such as alarms, ringer volume)
- Text messages
- You do not need to back up music files and photos or videos taken with the phone camera. They are backed up automatically to the phone's memory card.
- You may incur additional data transmission charges when you restore Android Market™ applications.

## Locking and protecting your phone

#### **IMEI** number

Every phone has a unique IMEI (International Mobile Equipment Identity) number. You should keep a copy of this number. If your phone is stolen, your network provider can use your IMEI number to stop the phone from accessing the network in your country.

#### To view your IMEI number



• Remove the cover to view your IMEI number.

#### To view your IMEI number in the phone

- 1 From the Home screen, tap \( \begin{aligned} \text{T} \\ \text{.} \end{aligned} \)
- 2 Find and tap Settings > About phone > Status.
- 3 Scroll to IMEI to view the IMEI number.

#### SIM card protection

The SIM card lock only protects your subscription. Your phone will still work with a new SIM card. If the SIM card lock is on, you have to enter a PIN (Personal Identity Number). If you enter your PIN incorrectly more times than the maximum number of attempts allowed, your SIM card will become blocked. You need to enter your PUK (Personal Unblocking Key) and then a new PIN. Your PIN, PIN2, and PUK are supplied by AT&T.

#### To enable the SIM card PIN lock

- 1 From the Home screen, tap \( \begin{array}{c} \begin{array}{c} \end{array} \end{array} \).
- 2 Find and tap Settings > Location & security > Set up SIM card lock > Lock SIM card.
- 3 Enter the SIM card PIN and tap **OK**.

#### To change the SIM card PIN

- 1 From the Home screen, tap ##.
- 2 Find and tap Settings > Location & security > Set up SIM card lock > Change SIM PIN.
- 3 Enter the old SIM card PIN and tap **OK**.
- 4 Enter the new SIM card PIN and tap **OK**.
- 5 Retype the new SIM card PIN and tap **OK**.

#### To change the SIM card PIN2

- 1 From the Home screen, tap ......
- 2 Find and tap Settings > Call settings > Fixed dialing numbers > Change PIN2.
- 3 Enter the old SIM card PIN2 and tap OK.
- 4 Enter the new SIM card PIN2 and tap **OK**.
- 5 Confirm the new PIN2 and tap **OK**.

#### To unblock a locked SIM card

- 1 When **SIM card locked** appears, enter the PUK code and tap **OK**.
- 2 Enter a new PIN code and tap **OK**.
- 3 Reenter the new PIN code and tap **OK**.
- If you enter an incorrect PUK code too many times, the SIM card becomes blocked. If this happens, contact AT&T to get a new SIM card.

#### Setting a screen lock

#### To set a screen lock
