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**∧** SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

Remove mains plug from socket when receiver is not in use for a long time or during a lightening storm.



Do not handle the power cord with wet hands. Do not pull the power cord to remove the plug from the socket.

It may cause an electric shock or damage.

Do not place any liquid container on top of RECEIVER.

If water spills into RECEIVER, an electric short may occur which can cause a fire.



Do not overload wall outlets and extension cords. It may result in power failure.



When a strange noise or smell comes from the RECEIVER, stop all operations and pull out plug. And then contact your Service agent.



Do not make any modifications. Never attempt to disassemble the unit.





Place the RECEIVER on a plain stable surface. If not, the RECEIVER may fall off or tip over causing injury or damage.



### Be sure to disconnect all cables before moving RECEIVER.



Do not put the RECEIVER in a place where it is humid or dusty, or near oil, smoke or steam.



Keep the RECEIVER safe from any foreign objects.



Put the RECEIVER in a place of moderate temperature 5 - 40 degrees.

If not, it may cause damage or shorten the lifetime of the RECEIVER.



#### Do not lay heavy objects on the RECEIVER.

It may cause ventilation trouble, internal temperature increasing, and fire.







Do not press two buttons of the remote controller in at the same time. Never attempt to disassemble remote controller.



Ensure the RECEIVER is placed in a position with good ventilation.

Leave a space more then 10Cm rear and 5Cm side from the wall.



Do not put RECEIVER under the sunlight or near heating units.

It may cause damage or shorten lifetime of the RECEIVER.



Keep the RECEIVER away from magnets or vibration.

It may cause blurred colour of screen and a damage.



Do not plug in when the shape of socket does not match with the plug.



# FRONT & REAR VIEW OF RECEIVER

### FRONT PANEL



#### **1. POWER BUTTON**

Use to power unit on & off.

#### 2. LED

POWER : Displays RED when the unit is powered off or standby, GREEN when the unit is powered on.

SOUND : Displays when the sound is STEREO or DUAL.

#### 3. TV/AV BUTTON

Use to select TV/External Input MODE. TV, AV1/2/3/4 is selected in order whenever the button is pushed.

#### 4. MENU BUTTON

Use to access MENU option. When The button is pressed once, MENU appears on the screen.

#### 5. RECALL BUTTON

Use to mark a channel banner.

#### 6. LEFT/RIGHT (◀ / ►) BUTTON

Use to move cursor left/right in the MENU option or use to control sound volume.

#### 7. UP/DOWN (▲ / ▼) BUTTON

Use to move cursor up/down in the MENU option or use for change channel.



REAR PANEL



- AV1, AV2 INPUT TERMINAL (SCART TERMINAL). Use to connect external input such as VTR, Satellite Receiver, DVD, etc. to the RECEIVER.
- 2. POWER CORD CONNECTOR

Use to connect POWER CORD to the RECEIVER.

#### 3. MONITOR / AUDIO OUTPUT TERMINAL

Use to connect MONITOR or external speaker to the RECEIVER.

4. PC INPUT / AUDIO INPUT TERMINAL

Use to connect PC input to the RECEIVER. PC input is transferred to output terminal when the power of RECEIVER is off.

#### 5. AV3 INPUT TERMINAL (S-VIDEO, V/L/R)

Use to connect S-VIDEO, A/V Input to the RECEIVER. S-VIDEO input is transferred to output terminal when S-VIDEO and RCA Video input is connected to the RECEIVER at the same time.

#### 6. A/V4 INPUT TERMINAL(V/L/R)

Use to connect A/V input to the RECEIVER.

#### 7. ANTENNA INPUT TERMINAL

Use to connect antenna to the RECEIVER.

\* This RECEIVER can receive PAL/ SECAM except PAL M/N via antenna and can receive PAL SECAM, NTSC input via external input terminal.

# CONNECTION GUIDE

### **Connecting with Monitor**

Connect D-SUB input of MONITOR to the output terminal of D-SUB output of the RECEIVER.

Connect input of speaker to audio output terminal of the RECEIVER.





### **Connecting with an Aerial**

Plug the aerial into the coaxial socket.

Notice

This RECEIVER can receive SECAM/PAL except PAL M/N via antenna.



### **Connecting with another Set Top Box or Video Equipment**

Connect output of another STB or Video equipment (SCART, A/V, S-video) to input of the RECEIVER using SCART cable, A/V cable, S-video cable.

Notice

This RECEIVER can receive SECAM/PAL/NTSC via external input.

### **Connecting with PC**

Connect PC output (D-SUB & audio output) to input of RECEIVER (D-SUB & audio input).

PC input can be outputted only when the power of RECEIVER is OFF.

### Caution

· Do not drop, avoid moisture, heat, and dust.



- Push to open the cover of the Remote Control.
- Set the Batteries in the battery (cell), compartment after checking the polarities(+/-), and then, shut the cover(battery type "AA").





# PROGRAMME BANNER





programme Banner allows you to view the current programme information. If you press the RECALL button in normal TV viewing, the channel banner appears on the screen. Press the RECALL button once again, the programme banner disappears.



### Volume Bar



Volume Bar allows you to control the volume  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\blacktriangledown$ .

## Features of the Main Menu



Pressing the MENU button on the remote controller takes you to the "Main Menu"screen. The "Main Menu" contains four options:PAP, Timer, Install, Language. Also each option has the submenu. The option you want to select is highlighted and its submenu is displayed on the right-hand.

- **PAP** : Screen displays and controls PIP, 2PIC, POP. Control sub picture.
- **Timer** : Set time.

# TO START SET

### Notice

Buttons on the front of the set have the same functions as those of the REMOTE CONTROL.





### TO MUTE THE SOUND INSTANTLY



This function is used when there is a phone call or a visitor. Press the MUTE button, to stop the sound of the program

• When this button is pressed, the sound goes off with word Mute Icon displayed on the Monitor.

<sup>•</sup> Press it again, and the sound returns.

- Check the memorised status by pressing PR ▲ / ▼ buttons.

# EDIT OF MEMORISED PROGRAM

- The EDIT menu shows you information as follows :
- Program position assignment : PR number and Station name.
- · Skip information : YES, NO
- Sound information : Auto, B/G, I, D/K1, D/K2, D/K3, L.

2 After Moving the cursor by ARROW ∢ / ► buttons, select the information by ARROW ▲ / ▼ button.

### Ex) ENTER A STATION NAME · Move the cursor to Name.

 You can enter a station name with the ▲ / ▼ buttons. A letter from the Alphabet and Numbers will appear one-by-one.

Check the Edit status by pressing PR ▲ / ▼ buttons." • The edit status appears in the PR banner.

### **SKIPPING THE PROGRAMS**





The programme marked with SKIP "YES" is skipped when changing channel using the PR  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\checkmark$  buttons.

A skipped program number can be selected using the NUMBER button 0..9, These will be displayed in Red.

• Select SKIP "YES" or "NO" with the "SKIP (Red)"button.



 You can also use the ARROW ▲ / ▼ buttons after moving the cursor to Skip.





### **DELETING THE PROGRAM POSITIONS**

- Position the selection bar to program number to delete with the ▲ / ▼ buttons.
- · Press the "DELETE (Yellow)"button.



### **MOVING THE PROGRAM POSITIONS**

- · Position the selection bar to program number you want to move.
- Press the "MOVE(Green)" button. The colour of selection bar will be changed to Green.
- · Position the new selection bar to new program number.
- · Press the MOVE(Green) button.



# MANUAL TUNING

If you are unable to get any programs because of a poor broadcasting signal, it is possible to store the Manual tuning.

- 2 Press the Arrow **∢** / **▶** Buttons.
  - A Tuning bar will move from left to right / from right to left.
  - After searching a station, the tuning Bar will stop. If you want to stop tuning, press the MENU button.



Select programme number using the  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\checkmark$  buttons and Press the "Green" button to store.

### **FINE TUNING**

- If you are unable to get a good picture or sound because of a poor broadcasting signal, it is possible to adjust the fine tuning.
- The change is memorised automatically.

Select "Fine Tuning".



Press ARROW **∢** / **▶** buttons to activate fine tuning up or down.



# WATCHING VIDEO PROGRAMS

Notice

S-VIDEO takes precedence if S-VIDEO is connected to AV3.



- 1 Connect the video cable to the VIDEO socket at the back of set, and press AV Button on the remote control and on the Front.
  - The screen changes to video mode as follows:
  - Whenever this button is pressed, the screen shifts in sequence :

PR ---> AV1 ---> AV2 ---> AV3 ---> AV4 ---> PR.





# **OPERATING PICTURE AND PICTURE**

### Notice

- The sound of the set is available only in the main program window(the left one).
- The same PRs or the two video programs can not be operated in both windows of the screen.
- Every time SWAP button is pressed, the Pictures alternate.



### PIP (PICTURE IN PICTURE)

You can enjoy two window programs at the same time. Along with the main window program, you can have another TV channel program or a Video program simultaneously.

Press PIP Button

· Single PIP appears on the picture left top.



Select a programme you want to watch in the auxiliary window.

 Select a programme you want to watch in the auxiliary window by using ARROW ▲ / ▼ buttons on the Remote Control.

Select Video Program in the auxiliary window.

 To operate VIDEO program in the auxiliary window, connect the video cable to the VIDEO IN socket at the back of SET, and press TV/VIDEO button on the auxiliary window control panel area on the Remote Control.







### **2PIC (Twin Pictures)**

 You can enjoy two window programs at the same time. Along with the main window program, you can have another TV channel program or a Video program simultaneously.



### Press 2PIC Button

• The operating program window becomes the main window and moves to the left side of the screen, an auxiliary window appears on the right side at the same time.





- Select a programme you want to watch, Select Video Program in the auxiliary window.
  - $\cdot$  The function is identical with the PIP function.



Press 2PIC Button again, and the auxiliary window disappears.



### POP (Picture Out Picture)

Five windows appear on the screen. Memorised programmes are connected one-by-one to each auxiliary window in sequence. Thus, it is easy to check the contents of the programs on air.



# **OPERATING PAP BY MENU**

Notice

Functions on the Menu have the same functions as those of the REMOTE CONTROL.





 There may be cases of stereo broadcasts where excessive noise will be heard due to weak incoming signal. You may be able to eliminate this noise by selecting the MONO mode.

### During a stereo Program transmission

- Press the Sound(<sup>o</sup>) button.
  It will change to MONO from STEREO.
  Then the Banner OSD will be changed to MONO.
- 2 Press the Sound (<sup>°</sup>) button again It will change it back to stereo.

During a bilingual programme transmission

- Press the Sound (<sup>o</sup>) button.
   It will change the language to the second channel (DUAL SUB).
- **2** Press again will change it back to the main channel (DUAL MAIN).

# **SETTING THE CLOCK**

Notice

If you turn the set off with MAIN POWER, the clock setting is lost and must be reset if necessary.







#### SWITCHING TELETEXT ON/OFF

Press the TEXT button().

The index page or the page viewed last will appear. Press the TEXT button((a)) again to return to the TV mode.

### COLOUR BUTTONS IN TOP/FLOF TELETEXT

A red( $\Box$ ), green( $\Box$ ), yellow( $\Box$ ) and blue( $\blacksquare$ ) field is shown at the bottom of the screen.

If TOP or FLOF Teletext is transmitted by the station, pressing the corresponding

colour button on the remote controller, you can select the desired page easily.

### SELECTING PAGES

The NUMBER button 0..9 are used to enter a page number.

The selected page number appears at the top of the screen and the page appears after a short time.

The  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\checkmark$  buttons increase or decrease the current page number by 1.

### INDEX PAGE

You can switch directly to the programme preview(with TOP text) or the overview

page of the station you are currently viewing by pressing the INDEX(III) button.

### PAGE HOLD

Several sub pages can be combined under a page number and are scrolled at an interval determined by the television station.

The presence of sub pages is indicated by, for example, 3/6 beneath the time, which means that you are looking at the 3rd page of a total of 6 pages.

If you want to look at a subpage for a longer period of time, press the HOLD (
) button.

The "stop!" appears beside page number and the contents of the subpage shown are kept on the screen and no longer updated or switched to other subpages.

Pressing the HOLD button(()) again, the current subpage appear.

### CALLING UP SUBPAGE DIRECTLY

Pressing the SUBPAGE( ) button , " sub-code - - - - " appears beside page number.

Enter the subpage number that you want to call up with the NUMBER button 0..9 ,for example, the 2nd page, sequence 0002.

The desired subpage will eventually be displayed on the screen and holds it there. Meanwhile whilst you are waiting, it is possible to go back to the TV picture by pressing the CANCEL button((a)) on the remote and after a while, press the CANCEL button((a)) again to revert back to the saved text sub page.

### WATCHING TELEVISION DURING TELETEXT MODE

Some pages are continually updated, for example, stock market reports, sports announcements, and the latest news.

If you want to watch television and stay informed at the same time, press CANCEL (
) button.

The regular programme is still visible and the teletext page number appears at the top of the screen.

Pressing the CANCEL button(()), the teletext page appears with the updated information.

#### **REVEAL ANSWER**

This function can be used on certain pages to reveal the solution of riddles. Press the REVEAL button (()) to reveal a hidden answer and press again to hide it.

#### **DOUBLING CHARACTER SIZE**

Repeatedly pressing the SIZE button (
) doubles the character size in the following order:

Upper half of the page -> Lower half of the page -> Return to normal size.

# TROUBLE SHOOTING

 Most problems are possible to solve by checking basic settings. Please check the following settings prior to calling the Daewoo Electronics Service Centre for assistance.

SYMPTOM	SOLUTION
It is not powering on	<ul> <li>Check to see if the power cord is plugged in securely.</li> </ul>
Can not change to a specific programme with PR ▲ / ▼button.	<ul> <li>Check the programme mode by pressing the RECALL button.</li> <li>It's possible that the channel may not have been memorised and stored correctly.</li> </ul>
Picture Quality is poor.	· Check the FINE TUNING.
Remote control doesn't work	<ul> <li>Check for batteries. Change batteries if the charge has been depleted.</li> <li>Use remote control within 23feet of the remote sensor.</li> <li>Remove all hindrances between remote sensor and remote control.</li> </ul>
