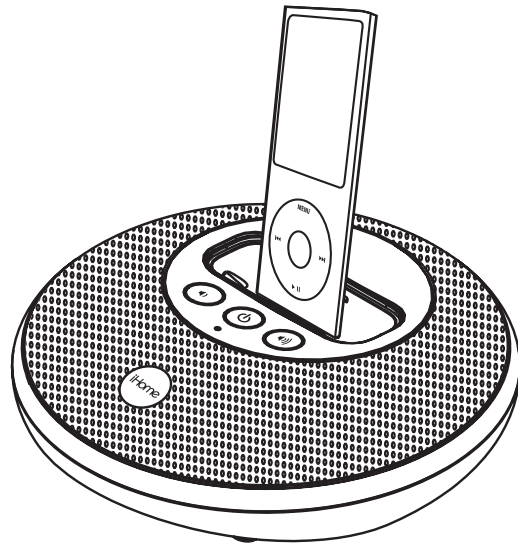




Model iH170 Portable Speaker System for your iPod®

Quick Start

1:batteries

Remove the battery compartment cover on the bottom of the unit. Install 4 AA batteries with polarities (+ and -) as shown. Replace cover.

2:inserts

Select the dock insert for your iPod model from the table below and place insert in dock. Never dock an iPod without an insert in place.

3:iPod

Insert iPod into dock with proper insert (iPod must not be in a skin or case). Press the power button on the iH170 to play the iPod.

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Maintenance

- Place the unit on a level surface away from sources of direct sunlight or excessive heat.
- Protect your furniture when placing your unit on a natural wood and lacquered finish. A cloth or other protective material should be placed between it and the furniture.
- Clean your unit with a soft cloth moistened only with mild soap and water. Stronger cleaning agents, such as Benzine, thinner or similar materials can damage the surface of the unit.

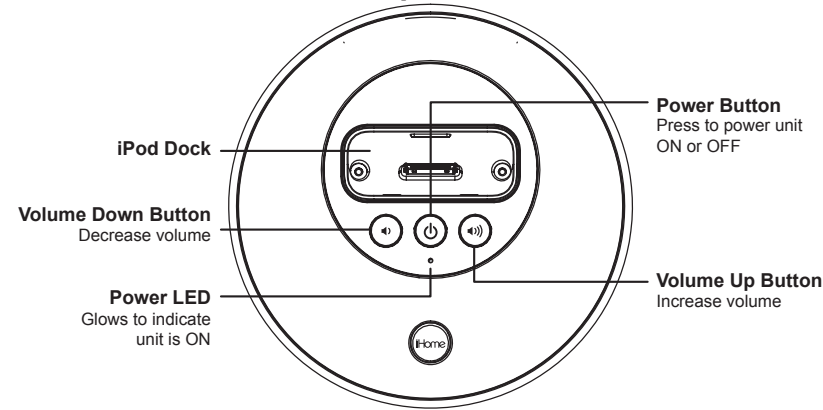
Battery Information

For Models That Require More Than One Battery

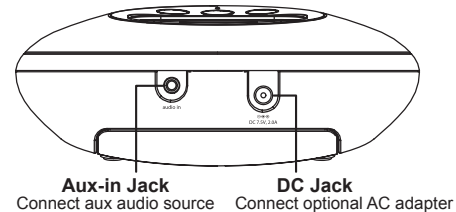
- Do not mix with used or other battery types/brands
- Replace all cells at the same time
- Do not open batteries
- Do not dispose of in fire
- Do not heat above 75°C (167°F)
- Do not expose contents to water
- Do not charge or recharge
- Do not install backwards

Getting Started

Thank you for purchasing the iHome iH170 Portable Speaker System for your iPod. Designed specifically to work with your iPod, this system provides high quality audio performance that brings out the best in your music.

Please read this instruction book carefully before operating the iH170 and keep it for future reference.

Check for iPod compatibility

To make sure your iPod works properly with iH170, please update your iPod firmware with the latest version via iTunes.

Using iH170

Install iPod Insert

Your iH170 comes with inserts to ensure your iPod fits properly in the dock. To place an insert:

1. Select the insert for your iPod (see table on page 1).
2. Gently press the iPod insert into the dock.
3. Carefully place your iPod into the dock. The iPod must not be in a case or "skin".

Installing/Replacing Batteries for Portable Operation

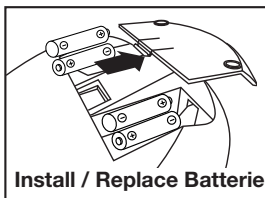
The iH170 uses 4 "AA" batteries for portable operation. The iH170 will not charge your iPod while operating on batteries.

If sound becomes weak or distorted, it is time to replace the batteries.

- Open the battery compartment cover located on the bottom of the unit.
- Insert 4 "AA" batteries as indicated.
- We recommend the use of alkaline batteries for longer life.






Batteries information:

- Do not mix old and new batteries.
- Do not mix alkaline, standard (carbon -zinc) or rechargeable (nickel-cadmium) batteries.







Install / Replace Batteries

Listening to Your iPod

1. Dock an already playing iPod and the iH170 will automatically turn on. You will hear the music playing from your iPod.
Note: If the volume on the playing audio is too low on the iPod, the iH170 may not detect that the iPod is in play mode. Press the  button once to play iPod.
2. When the iPod is docked and in standby mode, press the  button on the iH170 to play your iPod.
3. Press **play/pause** on your iPod to pause play; press again to resume it.
4. Press the  or  buttons on the iH170 to adjust the system volume.
5. To turn off the unit, press the  button on the iH170.

Listening to non-docking iPod or other audio devices

1. Plug one end of an audio cable (**available at www.ihomeaudio.com**) into the headphone or line-out jack on your device and the other end of the patch cord into the iH170 Aux-in Jack.
2. Press the  button to turn the iH170 on.
3. Press the  or  Buttons on the iH170 to adjust the system volume. You may need to adjust your device volume, too.
4. To turn off the iH170, press the  button. Please remember to turn off your device, too.

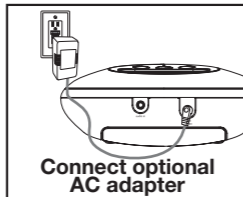
NOTE: Do not connect and try to play an aux audio device while a docked iPod is playing or you will hear both.

Connecting the Optional Adapter

An optional AC adapter is available at www.ihomeaudio.com. This adapter will charge your docked iPod while unit is connected to a working outlet. It will not charge batteries in the unit.

Connect the AC adapter cable plug into the DC jack on the back of the iH170, then plug the AC adaptor into a working wall outlet.

Warning: Using an incorrect adapter may damage your unit. You must use an adapter with regulated output of 7.5 Volts DC, 2 Amps, available at www.ihomeaudio.com.



A Consumer Guide to Product Safety

IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

When used in the directed manner, this unit has been designed and manufactured to ensure your personal safety. However, improper use can result in potential electrical shock or fire hazards. Please read all safety and operating instructions carefully before installation and use, and keep these instructions handy for future reference. Take special note of all warnings listed in these instructions and on the unit.

1. **Water and Moisture** – The unit should not be used near water. For example: near a bathtub, washbowl, kitchen sink, laundry tub, swimming pool or in a wet basement.
2. **Ventilation** – The unit should be situated so that its location or position does not interfere with its proper ventilation. For example, it should not be situated on a bed, sofa, rug or similar surface that may block ventilation openings. Also, it should not be placed in a built-in installation, such as a bookcase or cabinet, which may impede the flow of air through the ventilation openings.
3. **Heat** – The unit should be situated away from heat sources such as radiators, heat registers, stoves or other appliances (including amplifiers) that produce heat.
4. **Power Sources** – The unit should be connected to a power supply only of the type described in the operating instructions or as marked on the appliance.
5. **Power-Cable Protection** – Power supply cables should be routed so that they are not likely to be walked on or pinched by items placed upon or against them. It is always best to have a clear area from where the cable exits the unit to where it is plugged into an AC socket.
6. **Cleaning** – The unit should be cleaned only as recommended. See the Maintenance section of this manual for cleaning instructions.
7. **Objects and Liquid Entry** – Care should be taken so that objects do not fall and liquids are not spilled into any openings or vents located on the product.
8. **Attachments** – Do not use attachments not recommended by the product manufacturer.
9. **Lightning and Power Surge Protection** – Unplug the unit from the wall socket and disconnect the antenna or cable system during a lightning storm or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time. This will prevent damage to the product due to lightning and power-line surges.
10. **Overloading** – Do not overload wall sockets, extension cords, or integral convenience receptacles as this can result in a risk of fire or electric shock.
11. **Damage Requiring Service** – The unit should be serviced by qualified service personnel when:
 - A. the power supply cable or plug has been damaged.
 - B. objects have fallen into or liquid has been spilled into the enclosure.
 - C. the unit has been exposed to rain.
 - D. the unit has been dropped or the enclosure damaged.
 - E. the unit exhibits a marked change in performance or does not operate normally.
12. **Periods of Nonuse** – If the unit is to be left unused for an extended period of time, such as a month or longer, the power cable should be unplugged from the unit to prevent damage or corrosion.
13. **Servicing** – The user should not attempt to service the unit beyond those methods described in the user's operating instructions. Service methods not covered in the operating instructions should be referred to qualified service personnel.

Limited 90-Day Warranty Information

iHome Products, a division of SDI Technologies Inc. (hereafter referred to as SDI Technologies), warrants this product to be free from defects in workmanship and materials, under normal use and conditions, for a period of 90 days from the date of original purchase.

Should this product fail to function in a satisfactory manner, it is best to first return it to the store where it was originally purchased. Should this fail to resolve the matter and service still be required by reason of any defect or malfunction during the warranty period, SDI Technologies will repair or, at its discretion, replace this product without charge (except for a \$10.00 charge for handling, packing, return UPS/postage, and insurance). This decision is subject to verification of the defect or malfunction upon delivery of this product to the Factory Service Center listed below. The product must include proof of purchase, including date of purchase. The fee for service without proof of purchase is \$20.00.

Before returning this product for service, please first replace the batteries (if applicable) with fresh ones, as exhausted or defective batteries are the most common cause of problems encountered.

If service is still required:

1. Remove the batteries (if applicable) and pack the unit in a well padded, heavy corrugated box.
2. Enclose a photocopy of your sales receipt, credit card statement, or other proof of the date of purchase, if within the warranty period.
3. Enclose a check or money order payable to the order of SDI Technologies, for the sum of \$10.00 (\$20.00 without proof of purchase).
4. Send the unit prepaid and insured, to the Factory Service Center listed below.

Trouble Shooting

Symptom	Possible Problem	Solution
Unit doesn't respond (no power)	Batteries are weak/dead	Replace current batteries with fresh ones
iPod does not dock properly	Using no or wrong iPod insert	Make sure the dock insert is the proper fit to your iPod
	Dock or connector is obstructed	Remove your iPod from the dock and check for obstruction on the connectors in the dock and on your iPod. Then reseat it in the dock.
iPod does not respond to the unit	iPod is not docked properly	Remove your iPod from the dock and check for obstruction on the connectors in the dock and on your iPod. Then reseat it in the dock.
	Your iPod software is too old	Upgrade software on your iPod via iTunes
	iPod is locked up	Please refer to your iPod manual for details. Please make sure your iPod is working properly before docking in the unit.
	iPod touch and iPhone (touchscreen units) will not respond if turned off completely	Press and hold the wake/sleep button on top of your iPhone/iPod touch to turn it on.
iPod doesn't charge up	Unit is operating on batteries/not connected to AC adapter	Unit will not charge iPod when running on batteries. Connect unit to optional AC adapter to charge iPod
	iPod is not docked properly	Remove your iPod from the dock and check for obstruction on the connectors in the dock and on your iPod. Then reseat it in the dock.
	iPod is locked up/frozen	Please refer to your iPod manual for details. Please make sure your iPod is working properly before docking into the unit.
	iPod battery has problem	
Sound is distorted	Volume level is set too high	Decrease the volume.
	Sound source is distorted	If iPod original sound source is poor quality, distortion and noise are easily noticed with high-power speakers. Try a different audio source such as a music CD. If you are using an iPod Shuffle or external sound source like older generation iPod, try reducing the output volume on the device itself. Also, try reducing bass.
	Batteries are weak/dead	Replace current batteries with fresh ones

Solución De Problemas

Síntoma	Causa Posible	Solución
La unidad no responde (no enciende)	Las baterías están gastadas	Reemplace las baterías
El iPod no encastra correctamente	El encastre no es el correcto o no ha colocado encastre alguno.	Verifique tener el encastre correspondiente antes de intentar acoplarlo al aparato.
	La muesca o el encastre están obstruidos.	Retire el iPod de la muesca y elimine la obstrucción. Vuelva a acoplar su iPod.
El iPod no se comunica con la unidad	El iPod no está colocado correctamente.	Retire el iPod de la muesca y elimine la obstrucción. Vuelva a acoplar su iPod.
	El software (programa) de su iPod es obsoleto	Actualice su programa vía iTunes.
	El iPod está trabado	Verifique el correcto funcionamiento de su iPod antes de acoplarlo a la unidad. Por favor, refiérase al Manual del Usuario de su iPod para mayor información.

	La batería del iPod tiene algún problema.	
El sonido sale distorsionado	El nivel de volumen está alto	Baje el nivel de volumen. Apague la función EQ/3D.
	La fuente de sonido está distorsionada	Si la grabación original de sonido del iPod o MP3 era de mala calidad, escuchará ruido/distorsión al ser amplificadas mediante los parlantes de alta potencia. Intente utilizar otra fuente de sonido como la música de un CD. Si utiliza un iPod Shuffle o una fuente de sonido externa como un iPod de generaciones anteriores, intente bajar el volumen del aparato en sí. También puede intentar reducir los bajos.
	Las baterías están gastadas	Reemplace las baterías
