This symbol, located on back or bottom of the unit, is intended to alert the user to the presence of uninsulated "dangerous voltage" within the product's enclosure that may be of sufficient magnitude to constitute a risk of electric shock to persons.

This product utilizes a Class 1 laser to read Compact Discs. This laser Compact Disc Player is equipped with safety switches to avoid exposure when the CD door is open and the safety interlocks are defeated. Invisible laser radiation is present when the CD Player's lid is open and the system's interlock has failed or been defeated. It is very important that you avoid direct exposure to the laser beam at all times. Please do not attempt to defeat or bypass the safety switches.

CAUTION: TO PREVENT ELECTRIC SHOCK, MATCH WIDE BLADE OF PLUG TO WIDE SLOT, FULLY INSERT.

To reduce the risk of electric shock, do not remove cover (or back). There are no user-serviceable parts inside. Please refer any servicing to qualified service personnel.




1. Plug the BC219 into an AC outlet or insert 8 C batteries into the battery compartment.






2. Adjust the **Source Switch** on the side of the unit to *CD/Aux, AM,* or *FM mode*.









CD/AUX MODE

1. Open the **CD Door** and load a CD into the unit.




2. Press the **Play/Pause Button** to begin playing the loaded CD.




AM OR FM MODE

PLAYING A CD

Disc compatibility: CD, CD-R/RW


1. Adjust the **Source Switch** to *CD/Aux Mode*.



2. Open the **CD Door** and load a CD into the unit.



Press the Play/Pause Button to begin playing the loaded CD.



- 4. Press the **Stop Button** to stop the CD during play.
- 5. Press the **Skip/Search Buttons** to skip between tracks on the loaded CD.

Press and hold the **Skip/Search Buttons** to search through individual tracks on a loaded CD.

6. Press the **Repeat Button** once to repeat the current CD track.


Press the **Repeat Button** twice to repeat an entire album

Please note: When an audio source is connected to the Auxiliary Input and a CD is loaded, the Auxiliary Input connection will take priority. To play a CD, disconnect the Auxiliary Input.

PROGRAMMING A CD

Before Programming a CD, read through the "Playing a CD" instructions.

1. After the CD is loaded and ready to play, press the **Program Button** to begin programming the CD's tracks.



- 2. Press the **Skip/Search Buttons** to select the track to play first.
- 3. Press the **Program Button** to program the selected track.
- 4. Repeat steps 2-3 to continue programming tracks numerically.

Up to 20 CD tracks can be programmed at one time.

5. Press the **Repeat Button** once to repeat all of the programmed tracks.

Press the **Repeat Button** twice to repeat an individual track from the programmed list.









OPERATIONS

TUNING THE AM/FM RADIO

Adjust the Source Switch to AM or FM radio modes.




2. Turn the **Tuning Dial** to adjust the AM or FM radio station.





The FM Stereo Indicator (FM ST) illuminates when the FM radio is in stereo mode.

Extend the FM antenna to improve FM reception. An AM antenna is built into the unit. Adjust the position of the unit to improve AM reception.



USING THE AUXILIARY INPUT

1. Adjust the **Source Switch** to *CD/Aux Mode*.



2. Connect an MP3 Player or other audio source to the **Auxiliary Input**.

Connecting an audio source to the Auxiliary Input requires a cord with a 3.5 mm mini-phono plug.



3. Use the connected device's controls to play, pause, stop, and skip between tracks on the connected device.

Please note: When an audio source is connected to the Auxiliary Input and a CD is loaded, the Auxiliary Input connection will take priority. To play a CD, disconnect the Auxiliary Input.












UNIT CONTROL GLOSSARY

01. Play/Pause Buttons

Press the Play/Pause Buttons to play or pause a loaded CD.

02. Skip/Search Buttons

Press the Skip/Search Buttons to skip between tracks on a loaded CD.

Press and hold the Skip/Search Buttons to search through an individual track on a loaded CD.

03. Program Button

Press the Program Button to program the tracks of a loaded CD to play in a particular order.

04. Stop Button

Press the Stop Button to stop a CD during play.

05. Repeat Button

Press the Repeat Button once to repeat the current CD track.

Press the Repeat Button twice to repeat the entire CD

06. LCD Display

07. CD Door

Open the CD Door using the finger grip at the bottom of the door.

Please note, the CD Door must be closed for a loaded CD to play.

08. FM Antenna

Extend and adjust the FM Antenna to improve FM radio reception.

An AM Antenna is built into the unit. Adjust the position of the unit to improve AM radio reception.

09. Source Switch (CD, Aux, Power Off, AM, FM)

Adjust the Source Switch to activate *CD, Aux, Power Off, AM,* or *FM modes*.

10. Tuning Dial

Turn the Tuning Dial to adjust the current AM or FM radio station.

11. Volume Dial

Turn the Volume Dial to adjust the volume of audio output from the unit.

12. Headphone Jack

Use the Headphone Jack to connect a set of earbuds or headphones to the unit.

13. Auxiliary Input

Use the Auxiliary Input to connect an MP3 player or other audio source to the unit.

14. AC Power Input

Use the AC Power Input to connect the included detachable AC cord to the unit.

15. Battery Compartment (Requires 8 C batteries, not included)



16. Repeat Button

Press the Repeat Button once to repeat the current CD track.

Press the Repeat Button twice to repeat the entire CD.

17. Program Button

Press the Program Button to program the tracks of a loaded CD to play in a particular order.

18. Play/Pause Button

Press the Play/Pause Buttons to play or pause a loaded CD.

19. Skip/Search Buttons

Press the Skip/Search Buttons to skip between tracks on a loaded CD.

Press and hold the Skip/Search Buttons to search through an individual track on a loaded CD.

20. Stop Button

Press the Stop Button to stop a CD during play.

21. FM Indicator

Displays when in FM radio mode.

22. AM Indicator

Displays when in AM radio mode.

23. Radio Station

Displays the current AM or FM radio station.

24. CD Track

Displays the current track of a loaded CD.

25. FM ST. Indicator

The FM Stereo Indicator illuminates when the FM radio is in *stereo mode*.
