This manual describes how to properly use your new voice recorder. Read it carefully to avoid damaging the recorder and injuring yourself. Pay particular attention to the following serious warnings.





Situations that may result in death or serious injury to yourself or others

- Do not use the product during a thunderstorm. Thunderstorms can cause the product to malfunction and increase the risk of electric shock.
- Using earphones or headphones for an extended time may cause serious damage to your hearing.
- If you are exposed to sound louder than 85db for an extended time, you may adversely affect your hearing. The louder the sound is, the more seriously damaged your hearing may be. Note that an ordinary conversation is between 50 to 60 db and road noise is approximately 80 db.
- You are strongly advised to set the volume level to medium. The medium level is usually less than 2/3 of the maximum.
- If you hear a ringing in your ear(s), lower the volume or stop using the earphones or headphones.
- Exposure to loud sounds while walking or driving may distract your attention and cause an accident.
- Do not use the earphones while riding a bicycle, driving an automobile or motorcycle, or while walking or jogging on a road or in a crosswalk. 






If your recorder is frozen or unresponsive, insert a pointed object (such as a toothpick or paper clip) into the reset hole. The system will be initialised.

# Charge the battery

Charge the battery before you use your recorder for the first time or when you have not used it for a long time.



The rechargeable battery incorporated in this product is no user replaceable. For information on its replacement, please contact your service provider.



- Connect the USB end of the travel adapter to the USB connection port of your recorder.
- Connect the power plug of the travel adapter to the wall outlet.



#### About the battery

- Charge and store the battery at 5° C ~ 35° C (41° F ~ 95° F).
- Do not charge the battery for more than 12 hours or leave the battery fully discharged for a long time. Doing so may shorten the battery life.
- Depending on how you use your recorder, actual battery life may vary and may be shorter than specified.




Do not use a separate AC Adapter as it may not charge the battery or allow proper operation of the voice recorder.

# Connect to a PC

Connect your recorder to a PC to transfer recorded files from your recorder and edit them on the PC. You can also download music files or charge the battery.



2 Connect the larger end of the USB cable to the USB port of a PC.





- The charging time may differ depending on your PC's capabilities.
- If you want to charge the battery on your laptop, make sure that the laptop's battery is full or the laptop is plugged into a power source.



# Turn your recorder on and lock the buttons



Press and hold @/HOLD to turn your recorder on or off.





#### Note

If you do not use your recorder for 5 minutes, it will automatically turn off.

#### Lock or unlock the buttons

Lock the buttons to prevent any unwanted operations while recording voice or playing files. Press @/HOLD to lock or unlock the buttons.





# Download files

Download files of your choice from your PC.



To avoid damage to your recorder and corruption of your files, do not disconnect the USB cable while files are being transferred.

#### **Installing Kies**

- Insert the Installation CD into the CD-ROM drive of your PC.
- Click <KIES Install>.
  - Follow the instruction to start installation.
  - <Kies> installation starts and then creates an icon on your desktop when installation is complete.

#### Caution

- Ensure that you run the <Kies> installer in your PC's administrator account.
   Otherwise, <Kies> will not be installed. To find the administrator account, please refer to your PC's user manual.
- Use care when inserting the Installation CD into a vertically oriented CD-ROM drive.

#### **Download files with Kies**

You can easily download music files with Kies.



We regularly upgrade Kies for peak performance. Some features of Kies may change without prior notice.

- 1 Connect your recorder to a PC using the USB cable.
  - See page 12 to connect the recorder to your PC.
  - When the recorder is connected to your PC, Kies launches automatically on your PC.
- Click in the Kies Widget Dock.
- Click at the top of the Contents Manager.
- Click at the top left of the window.
- 5 Select a folder or file you want.
  - The list of the files stored in your PC appears.
- 6 Select a file, and then click 1 at the bottom right of the window.
  - The selected file is copied to your recorder.

#### Note

- You cannot use your recorder when connected to a PC.
- If you connect your recorder to a PC when the recorder's battery is low, the battery charges for a few minutes before your recorder links to the PC and Kies launches.
- Connect the recorder directly to the USB port of your PC.
   If you connect through a USB hub or a USB extension cable, your recorder may not work properly.
- When you format your recorder on a PC, use the FAT32 system. In Windows Vista/7, click <Restore device defaults> and then format your recorder.

### Download files using your recorder as a removable disk

- Connect your recorder to a PC using the USB cable.
- On your PC, open <My Computer> and then the <VP2> folder.
- Select a folder you want.
- Select a music file in your PC and copy it to recorder.



#### Note

- The order of files on your PC will differ from the order of files in your recorder.
- Your recorder restricts playback of files protected by a DRM (Digital Rights Management) system.

#### What is DRM?

Digital Rights Management (DRM) is a technology and service that prevents the illegal copying of digital contents and protects the profit and rights of copyright holders or content producers.

## Disconnect your recorder from a PC

Carefully follow the steps below when disconnecting your recorder from a PC to avoid data loss or damage to your recorder.

#### Example: Windows XP

Click on the Windows taskbar.



Click the pop-up message.




- 3 Click the window that says you can remove the recorder safely.
- Unplug the USB cable from your recorder and the PC.

#### Caution


- To avoid damage to your recorder and corruption of your files, do not disconnect the USB cable while files are being transferred.
- Do not disconnect your recorder when playing files stored in your recorder on a PC. Make sure that you stop playback and then disconnect your recorder from a PC.





# Insert a memory card (optional)

Insert a memory card (optional) into your recorder and play music files saved on the memory card.



• Insert the memory card with the label side facing up.







- Push the memory card in the memory card slot until it locks in place.
  - When the memory card is correctly inserted, will appear at the top of the main menu screen.



- Your recorder accepts microSD™ or microSDHC™ memory cards from 1 GB to 16 GB. (Use only memory cards compatible with your recorder. Depending on the manufacturer, some memory cards may not be compatible with your recorder.)
- Do not insert a memory card in the wrong direction.
- Do not remove a memory card from your recorder while in use.
- Remember to make backup copies of all important data stored on memory cards. The manufacturer's warranty does not cover loss of data that results from user actions.

#### Remove a memory card

To remove a memory card, push it gently until it disengages from the recorder, and then pull the memory card out of the memory card slot.

Search for files in folders and delete files from your recorder.

- 3 Scroll through the file list.
- Select a file you want.

#### Delete files

- Select a folder from the list.
- Select a file to delete.
- 3 Press and hold DIVIDE/DEL.
- 4 Select <Yes> from the pop-up window.

### Voice Recording and Playback

You can record voice, and playback recording and music files.

### Voice Recording

With Voice Recording, you can record conversations in meetings and lectures as well as your own voice.



- 📘 In the main menu, select 👤
- Press FOLDER BOOKMARK to select a folder to save the recording.
- 3 Press •.
  - The recording starts.
  - Press to pause recording.
- Press to stop recording.
  - The recorded file is saved automatically.
- 5 Select <Yes> to play the recorded file.

#### Caution

- When making voice recording, do not bring the earphones close to you as this may
  cause noise in your recorded file.
- Do not save copyrighted material that you have recorded to other devices, such as a PC, or distribute them to others without the permission of the content owners. Doing this may violate copyright laws. Samsung is not liable for any legal issues caused by the user's illegal use of copyrighted material.




#### Voice Recording and Playback > Voice Recording



- Even when the power is off, press and hold the button to turn the recorder back on and start recording.
- to turn the recorder back on and start recording.
  When the battery is low, you cannot record voice memos.
- Up to 400 voice files can be saved in one voice folder.
- Recorded files are saved in a folder you have selected in <MY FILES> → <Voice>.
- You can use the external microphone (optional, \$\Phi\$3.5) for voice recording, or line-in cable (optional, \$\Phi\$3.5) for recording music from a connected external device. When you connect the optional cable, the <Select Input> screen appears. Select the connected cable and start recording.


#### Listen to a desired file

- 🚺 In the main menu, select 🧖.
- 2 Select a folder you want.
- 3 Select a recorded or music file to play.
- 4 Control playback by using the buttons. See "Recording playback screen".

#### Dividing a file

While playing a recorded file, press DIVIDE/DEL. The fill is divided into two sections at the point where you press the button. You can save the two sections as separate files.



- · You can also divide and save sections while recording.
- To divide a file, the total length must be greater than 3 seconds.

#### Repeat a section of a file

You can select a section of a file to repeat.

- Press A + B at the beginning of the section you want to repeat.
  - H— is displayed at the top of the screen and the color of the progress bar changes.
- Press ·A ↔ B at the end of the section you want to repeat.
  - A-B displays at the top of the screen.
     Your recorder repeats the marked section.
- 3 To cancel repeating, press ·A↔B again.



You can set the end point 3 seconds after the start point.

#### Use simple repeat

You can skip backward 3 seconds while listening to music or a recording. While listening to a file, press REPEAT to repeat the previous 3-second section.



If you press REPEAT within 3 seconds of the beginning of the file, the playback will restart from the beginning.

#### Set up SoundAlive

Select appropriate sound effects for music.

- During playback, press □.
- 2 Select <SoundAlive>.
- 3 Select a sound effect you want.



- If you select <Auto>, your recorder searches the track information (ID3 tag) and automatically selects an appropriate effect.
- To select your own equaliser, select <User>.

#### Example: Set your own equalizer to <User>

- Select <SoundAlive $> \rightarrow <$ User> and press  $\Box$ .
- 2 Select a mode, and then adjust the settings.



You can set SoundAlive only when the earphone is connected.

#### Voice Recording and Playback > Listen to my recordings and music

#### Insert a bookmark

You can insert a bookmark at the point you want and go to the bookmark to play from that point.

- Select a file you want.
- During playback, press and hold BOOKMARK at the point you want to bookmark.
  - A bookmark is inserted to the progress bar.



You can insert 10 bookmarks per file and set up to 50 bookmarks.

#### Move to the bookmark point

- 1 In the main menu, select 🦰.
- Select a bookmarked file to play.
- 3 Listen to your recording or music.

#### Remove a bookmark

- 📘 In the main menu, select <mark>--</mark>-.
- Select a file to delete.
- 3 Press and hold DIVIDE/DEL.
- 4 Select <Yes> from the pop-up window.

# Microphone mode settings

Use the microphone mode switch to adjust the setting for the environment.

You can switch recording modes between interview mode, music mode, and meeting mode by moving the microphone mode switch up or down.

### Listen to the FM radio

#### FM Radio

You can listen to and record the FM radio, as well as save radio stations.



You must connect the earphones to your recorder to listen to the FM radio. The earphones serve as a radio antenna.



- 🚺 In the main menu, select 🧐
- Press to scan the radio stations.
  - Press (a) / (b) to scroll through radio frequencies.
  - Press and hold \( \bigcirc\) \( \bigcirc\) to scan the available stations automatically.
- 3 Listen to the FM radio.





The FM radio may not tune frequencies for stations correctly depending on the signal strength and transmitting conditions in your current region.

#### Record the FM radio

You can record audio from an FM radio station.

- From the FM radio screen, press □.
- Select <FM Recording>.
  - FM recording starts.
- Press to stop recording.
  - The recorded file is saved automatically.
- Select <Yes> to play the recorded file.
  - After playing the recorded file, the FM radio screen appears.
  - To return to the FM radio screen, select <No>.

#### Note

- · You cannot record the FM radio when the battery is low.
- The recorded files will be saved in <MY FILES> → <FM Record>.
- During the FM Radio recording, you cannot pause the recording.

#### Save radio stations




