





POWER SUPPLY

Charging Your Player


Your player has a rechargeable lithium-polymer battery that will provide up to 12 hours of play time.



The battery should be charged fully (minimum 4 hours) before its initial use to ensure optimum lifetime performance.

To charge your player:

- AC Adapter: Plug one end of the supplied AC Adapter into the DC 5V Power Jack and plug the other end into a 100-240V wall outlet.
- USB Port: Your player can be charged through its USB MSC Port. Charging through the USB MSC port will take longer than charging with the AC Adapter.
 - Set your player's USB Charge option to "On" (refer to the <u>Setup</u> section for details).
 - While your player is off, plug
 one end of the USB cable into the USB
 MSC Port and plug the other end into the USB
 port of a powered-on computer.





WARNING:


- The battery used in this device may present a fire or chemical burn if mistreated. Do not, disassemble, incinerate, or heat the battery.
- Do not connect the power plug to a power outlet other than that which is indicated here and on the label as this may result in the risk of fire or electric shock.
- Do not handle the power plug with wet hands. Doing so may cause electric shock.

Turning Your Player On/Off


- To turn the player on, slide the Power/Lock switch to the right.
- To turn the player off, slide and hold the Power/Lock switch to the right until you see the "Goodbye!" screen.

Locking/Unlocking Your Player's Controls (Hold)

When engaged, the Lock feature disables your player's controls to prevent accidental key presses when it is in your pocket or bag.



To unlock the player, slide the Power/Lock switch to the right to release it from the Lock position.





USB CONNECTIONS

USB-MSC versus USB-MTP

The MP-C951 comes equipped with two types of USB ports: USB-Mass Storage Class (USB-MSC) and USB-Media Transfer Protocol (USB-MTP). Both USB connections allow for simple, high-speed transfers of files between your player and a computer, and allow you to use your computer's operating system to view, manage, and transfer files to your player from your computer

There are, however, a few differences to take note of.

Note that you MUST use the USB MTP port in conjunction with Windows XP and Windows Media Player 10 to transfer and synchronize encrypted WMDRM10 files. Most online music stores and subscription services use WMDRM10 files*. Please refer to the documentation of either Microsoft or the store from which you purchased your music for details.

Content owners use Windows Media digital rights management technology (WMDRM) to protect their intellectual property, including copyrights. This device uses WMDRM software to access WMDRM-protected content. If the WMDRM software fails to protect the content, content owners may ask Microsoft to revoke the software's ability to use WMDRM to play or copy protected content. Revocation does not affect unprotected content. When you download licenses for protected content, you agree that Microsoft may include a revocation list with the licenses. Music purchased and downloaded from the iTunes music store are AAC files encrypted with Apple Fairplay DRM. The MP-C951 does not support AAC file playback. Please use only MP3, WMA, OGG, or WAV music files with your player.

USB CONNECTIONS

USB Driver Installation (Required for Windows 98 SE Only)

It is not necessary to install the USB driver if your computer is running Microsoft Windows ME/2000/XP or newer, or Macintosh OS X. Computers running these operating systems will recognize your player automatically when connected.

If your computer is running Windows 98 SE:

- Insert the Installation CD into your computer's CD or DVD drive. Make sure to place the mini-CD in the center, recessed well of the drive tray.
- 2. Navigate to MY COMPUTER and double-click on the CD/DVD drive icon (usually "D:").
- 3. Double-click on the folder "Win98 USB Drivers" and then on the folder "english".
- 4. Double-click on the SETUP icon (SETUP.EXE) to start the USB driver installation program.
- 5. Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the installation and then restart your computer.

Note:




Mini-CDs should only be used in normal tray-loading CD/DVD drives. Mini-CDs may be used in slot-loading drives with the proper adapter; please contact your computer or drive manufacturer for more information.

Connecting to a Computer

To connect the player to your computer:

- Connect the player to your computer with the supplied USB cable as shown in the diagram.
 - If the USB Charge option is set to OFF, continue to the next step.
 - If the USB Charge option is USB Port (mini) set to ON, you may see the Battery Charge icon. Touch E to continue connecting to your computer.



Disconnecting from a Computer

Disconnect your player as instructed below to prevent data loss or corruption. If you are using a USB-MTP connection, you can simply disconnect the cable from your player.

Microsoft Windows

- Double-click the green arrow in the taskbar located on the lower-right side of the computer screen (Safely Remove Hardware).
- Select "USB Mass Storage Device" from the list that appears and then click on "Stop". 2.
- 3. Select "USB Mass Storage Device" from the list that appears and then click on "OK".
- 4. Disconnect the USB cable from the player and your computer.





USB CONNECTIONS

Macintosh OS X

- On the left side of the Finder window, identify the appropriate Removable Disk icon.
- 2. Click on the "Eject" arrow on the right of the Removable Disk icon.
- 3. Disconnect the USB cable from the player and your computer.



Transferring Files

USB connections makes it easy to transfer music, video, photo, and text files (or any other data) quickly between the player and your computer.



Do not disconnect or otherwise interrupt the player during transmission - this could damage or corrupt the player's firmware or your files. If the player is accidentally disconnected and is not working properly, use a pin to press the reset button on the back of the player.

Do NOT delete the following files:

- sample.hds
- wmpinfo.xml

Microsoft Windows

- Open a Windows Explorer window. Locate the files or folders you would like to transfer from your computer. Select the files/folders with the mouse and press CTRL-C (copy) on the keyboard.
- Navigate to MY COMPUTER and double-click on the Removable Disk icon. The computer will display all files and folders currently stored in the player.
- Press CTRL-V (paste) on the keyboard to transfer the files you selected in Step 1 to the player.

Macintosh OS X

- Open a Finder window. Locate the files you would like to transfer from your computer. Select the files/folders with the mouse and press APPLE-C (copy) on the keyboard.
- Click on the Removable Disk icon located on the left side of the finder window. The computer will display all files and folders currently stored in the player.
- Press APPLE-V (paste) on the keyboard to transfer the files you selected in Step 1 to the player.

Note:

You may also use the mouse to drag-and-drop files between the player and your computer.

If you need further assistance with transferring files, please refer to your operating system's instruction manual or on-screen help. If you are using media management software such as iTunes, Winamp, or Windows Media Player, please refer to their documentation for support.

USB HOST CONNECTION

The USB HOST connection allows you to transfer data from other USB drives directly to your player -- without the use of a computer. This makes it easy to use the MP-C951 to save photos from a digital camera or documents from a thumb-drive while you're on the go.

The USB Host connection will work with most USB devices that are formatted as FAT16 drives and are USB Mass Storage Class devices.

To use the USB Host connection:

- Connect the USB Host cable to your player's USB-MTP/HOST port.
- Use the USB cable to connect the external device to the player through the USB Host cable.
- 3. Navigate to the Main menu. From the Main menu, touch and hold menu to initiate a USB Host connection.
- 4. Upon successfully connecting, you will see the USB HOST ROOT folder structure. This screen displays all the files and folders on the external device.
- - · Copy: Copy the selected file.
 - Whole Copy: Copy the contents of the entire external device.
 - Info: View information about the selected file.
- 6. The player will then prompt you to select a destination to save the files to. The screen will display all the files and folders on your player (Tree View). Highlight a folder and touch to confirm.
- 7. Once the file has been saved, the player will return to the USB HOST ROOT screen.
- 8. To end the USB HOST connection, simply disconnect the cable from your player.

BASIC OPERATIONS

Using the Touchpad Controls

Your player comes equipped with a touch-sensitive control pad. The active key areas glow red; touch these areas lightly to use the controls as you would a button. If you touch and hold a key, it will register as a continuous button press.

Basic Navigation

To navigate through the different menu options and files on your player:

Touch the Navigation keys to move the selection in the direction of the arrow.
 Touch and hold a Navigation key to scroll quickly in the direction of the arrow.



- Touch (ENTER) to confirm a selection.
- From most screens, you can touch
 to return to the previous screen, or touch
 to advance to the next screen.
- Touch and hold **menu** to return to the Main menu at any time.

Basic Music Playback

- Select and confirm MUSIC from the Main menu.
- 2. Select a track from the File Browser list and touch 🖺 to confirm and play the track.

 - During playback, touch E to return to the File Browser list (the current track will continue to play). To return to the Current Track screen, touch .

Basic Movie Playback

- Select and confirm MOVIE from the Main menu.
- 2. Select a track from the File Browser list and touch 🖺 to confirm and play the track.

 - During playback, touch menu to stop playback and return to the File Browser list.

Adjusting the Volume

During playback, touch

to raise the volume level; touch

to lower the volume level.



WARNING: Set the volume to the lowest level before headphone use to avoid damage to your hearing or to your headphones.

BASIC OPERATIONS

Play Mode Options

Play Mode options change the order in which music tracks are played. The current Play Mode is indicated at the top of the screen.

Note: Play Mode options can be used for music or voice playback only.

To change the Play Mode options:

- 1. Enter Music mode and play a track.
- 2. Touch nenu to cycle through and change the Play Mode.

The available options are:

- ALL Play all tracks sequentially
- Repeat current track
- Repeat all tracks in current folder
- Repeat all tracks in current folder and sub-folders
- Repeat all tracks
 - INTRO Play the first 10 seconds of each track
- Repeat current track
- Play tracks in current folder randomly
- Play tracks in current folder and sub-folders randomly
- Play all tracks randomly
 - Play current track once
 - Play tracks in current folder once
 - Play tracks in current folder and sub-folders once

Repeat A-B Function

The Repeat A-B function allows you to set a segment of a track to be played repeatedly.

- 1. Touch recate to set the start point (A) of the track segment to be repeated. The Repeat A-B Indicator will display ♣A.
- 2. Touch recal again to set the end point (B) of the track segment. The segment will now play in a loop and the Repeat A-B Indicator will display AB.
- 3. Touch resume normal playback.

Note: You will not be able to see the Repeat A-B Indicator during movie playback.

MUSIC MODE


Enter Music mode to play your MP3, WMA, OGG, or WAV audio files.


To enter Music mode, select and confirm MUSIC in the Main menu. Upon entering Music mode, you will have the following options: Music, Encode, Voice, Playlists, and Search.

Music

Select and confirm MUSIC in the Music Mode menu to access the File Browser to look for music files in the ROOT folder of your player.

- Use the Navigation keys to select folders and music files to play. Refer to the <u>Basic Operations</u> section for details.
- While a track is playing (Current Track), touch 🖺 to return to the File Browser. The currently playing track will continue to play.
- With a file selected in the File Browser, touch and hold to display a context menu with the
 following advanced functions: Favorite (+/-), Info, and Exit. Refer to the <u>Advanced Functions:</u>
 <u>Music</u> section for details.
- While a music track is playing, touch and hold
 Eto display a context menu with the following advanced functions: Favorite (+/-), EQ, Play Speed, Info, and Exit.





File Browser Screen

MUSIC MODE

Encode

Select and confirm ENCODE in the Music Mode menu to access the File Browser to look for Line-In and FM Radio recording files in the ENCODE folder of your player. This is where your player stores Line-in and FM Radio recordings; refer to the Recording section for more details).

- Use the Navigation keys to select folders and recording files to play. Refer to the <u>Basic Operations</u> section for details.
- With a file selected in the File Browser, touch and hold E to view file or folder information.
- While a music track is playing, touch and hold
 Eto display a context menu with the following advanced functions: Favorite (+/-), EQ, Play Speed, and Info. Refer to the <u>Advanced Functions</u>: Music section for details.

Voice

Select and confirm VOICE in the Music Mode menu to access the File Browser to look for Microphone (Voice) recording files in the VOICE folder of your player. This is where your player stores Voice recordings; refer to the <u>Recording</u> section for more details).

- Use the Navigation keys to select folders and recording files to play. Refer to the <u>Basic Operations</u> section for details.
- With a file selected in the File Browser, touch and hold 🖺 to view file or folder information.


Playlists

Select and confirm PLAYLISTS in the Music Mode menu to access your quick-add Favorites Playlist (refer to the <u>Advanced Functions: Music</u> section for details). You can also access M3U playlists that have been created on your computer and saved in the PLAY LIST folder of your player.

Search

Select and confirm SEARCH in the Music Mode menu to quickly find music by the first 3 letters of its file name.

- Touch or to select the first letter and then touch . The list below will reflect all files that start with the letter you have selected.
- Touch or to select the second letter and then touch . The list will now reflect all files that start with the first and second letters you have selected.



Search Screen

3. Touch or to select the third letter and then touch . The list will now reflect all files that start with the first, second, and third letters you have selected.

MUSIC MODE

Advanced Functions: Music

Favorite (+/-)

Use the Favorite function to quickly add a song to your Favorites Playlist. Favorite tracks can be found in by selecting **Music > Playlists > Favorite**.

- If a track has not been stored as a Favorite, the Favorite option will have a (+) symbol next to it. Select and confirm the option to add the track to your Favorites Playlist.
- If a track has been stored as a Favorite, the Favorite option will have a (-) symbol next to it.
 Select and confirm the option to remove the track from your Favorites Playlist.

EQ (Equalizer)

Use the EQ function to adjust the equalizer settings to optimize the way the player processes audio signals. The EQ options are: Normal, Rock, Classic, Jazz, U-Bass (Ultra-Bass), and User. The User equalizer setting can be customized in the **Setup > Sound > User EQ** menu; refer to the <u>Setup</u> section for details.

Play Speed

Use the Play Speed function to adjust playback tempo. The Play Speed options are: 70% (slower), 100% (normal speed), and 120% (faster).

Info

Use the Info function to view file type, size, and date-added information.

- You can view information on folders as well as files.
- Touch to cancel when you have finished viewing the information.

MOVIE MODE

Enter Movie mode to play your XviD-encoded AVI video files.



The MP-C951 supports playback of XviD-encoded AVI files. Please see the <u>Creating Movies</u> with <u>VirtualDub</u> section for details on how to create video files that are compatible with the MP-C951.

To enter Movie mode, select and confirm MOVIE in the Main menu. Upon entering Movie mode, you can use the File Browser to look for movie files in the MOVIE FILE folder of your player.

- Use the Navigation keys to select folders and movie files to play. Refer to the <u>Basic Operations</u> section for details.
- With a file selected in the File Browser, touch and hold 🖺 to view file information.
- While a movie file is playing, touch **E** to display the progress bar on screen. The on-screen display will disappear automatically after a few seconds.

PHOTO MODE

Enter Photo mode to play your JPEG and BMP photo files.

To enter Photo mode, select and confirm PHOTO in the Main menu. Upon entering Photo mode, you can use the File Browser to look for photo files in the IMAGE FILE folder of your player.

- Use the Navigation keys to select folders and photo files to play.
- While a photo is displayed:

 - Touch to view thumbnails of your photos. Use the Navigation keys to select a thumbnail and then touch to view it.
 - Touch to view the photos as a slideshow.
 - Touch and hold 🖺 to view information on the file or to set the Slide-Show Time option.
- With a file selected in the File Browser, touch and hold 🗈 to display file information.

FM RADIO MODE

Enter FM Radio mode to play tune into FM Radio broadcasts.



You must have a pair of headphones connected to the headphone jack to receive FM broadcasts; your player will utilize the headphone cord as an FM antenna.

To enter FM Radio mode, select and confirm FM RADIO in the Main menu.

Basic FM Radio Operation

Upon entering FM Radio mode, you can tune into stations manually (FREQ) or by using preset stations (PRESET).

- Touch E to toggle between FREQ and PRESET tuning modes. If no Preset stations have been saved, you will not be able to toggle between FREQ and PRESET tuning mode -please save a preset station first as described below.
 - FREQ: Listen to Manually-Tuned Channels.
 Touch to tune to higher frequencies; touch to tune to lower frequencies.
 - PRESET: Listen to Preset Channels.

 Touch to tune higher Preset stations or to tune to lower Preset stations.
- Touch low to automatically detect and save as a preset station any frequency with a signal.
 This will overwrite any previously saved preset stations.
- Touch menu to toggle between Stereo and Mono receptions modes.

Advanced Functions: FM Radio

Touch and hold E to access the Advanced Function options: Presetting, Scan-Level, and Area.

- Presetting: Manually save the current station as a Preset.
- Scan-Level: sets the sensitivity of the Auto-Scan feature (low, medium, high).
- Area: Sets the FM frequency range area (US, Japan, Europe).

E-BOOK MODE

Enter E-Book mode to read TXT E-book files.

To enter E-Book mode, select and confirm E-BOOK from the Main menu. Upon entering E-Book mode, you can use the File Browser to look for text files in the TEXT FILE folder of your player.

- Use the Navigation keys to select folders and text files to play.
- · While a text file is displayed:
 - Touch

 to skip forward one line; press

 to skip forward one page.
 - Touch

 to skip back one line; press

 to skip back one page.
 - Touch
 E to toggle the auto-scroll feature on or off.

Advanced Functions: E-Book

- Go To: Select a page to go to directly. The "Max" number indicates the total number of pages in the text file.
- Auto Scroll Time: Set the time interval for the auto-scroll feature (in seconds).
- Info: View file information.

RECORDING

Your player can record from 3 types of sources: Microphone, Line-In, or FM Radio. (See the <u>SETUP</u> section for details about changing your player's recording options.)

Voice Recording

Make voice recordings through the integrated microphone located on the top of your player.


- 1. Place the player in MUSIC mode.
- 2. Disconnect any cables from the Line-In jack located on the top of your player.
- 3. Touch and hold recator to start recording through the microphone.


 - If the VAD option is set to "On", the player will automatically pause recording when no signal is detected through the microphone (refer to the Setup section for more details).
- 4. Touch **menu** to stop and save the recording.
 - The resulting file will be saved to the VOICE folder.
 - The file will be named VOCXXX.MP3 where XXX corresponds to the numerical sequence in which the recording was made (numbering starts from 001.)

Line-In Recording

Make recordings from an external device through the Line-In jack located on the top of your player.

- Connect the external device to the Line-In jack of your player as shown in the diagram below.
- Place the player in MUSIC mode. Start playback on the external device.
- Touch and hold rec/a-b to start recording through the Line-In jack.
 - Touch to pause recording; press again to resume recording.
 - If the Sync On/Off option is set to "On", the player will start recording automatically when a signal is detected through the Line-In jack (refer to the <u>Setup</u> section for more details).
- 4. Touch menu to stop and save the recording.
 - The resulting file will be saved to the ENCODE folder
 - The file will be named ENCXXX.MP3 where XXX corresponds to the numerical sequence in which the recording was made (numbering starts from 001.)





RECORDING

FM Recording


Make recordings of FM Radio broadcasts.

- 1. Place the player in FM RADIO mode.
- 2. Tune to the FM broadcast station you would like to record.
- 3. Touch and hold rec/a=to to start recording the FM Radio broadcast.
 - Touch □ to pause recording; press □ again to resume recording.
- 4. Touch menu to stop and save the recording.
 - The resulting file will be saved to the ENCODE folder.
 - The file will be named FMXXX.MP3 where XXX corresponds to the numerical sequence in which the recording was made (numbering starts from 001.)

EXPLORER MODE

Enter Explorer mode to view and manage the folders and files on your player.

To enter Explorer mode, select and confirm EXPLORER from the Main menu. Upon entering Explorer mode, you will see a "Tree View" which will display all of the folders on your player (see figure below). Use the Navigation keys to select a folder and touch \blacksquare to view its contents.



Explorer File Browser

Note:

Tree View will display all your folders and subfolders, only. Select and confirm the folder ROOT to access all files and folders on your player.

You can use the Explorer File Browser to delete, copy, cut (move), and view information about your files and folders.

Delete

Enter Setup mode to set the system options of your player. To enter SETUP mode, select and confirm SETUP in the Main menu.

Upon entering Setup mode, you will have the following options: Sound, Display, General, Timer, Record, and Information.

Sound

Select and confirm SOUND in the Setup Mode menu to set options relating to the way audio is processed by your player. The Sound options are: User EQ and Balance.

User EQ

Set your custom, user-defined equalizer setting.


- Touch (a) and (b) to select a band to adjust. Select the bands to the left to adjust low (bass) frequencies; select the bands in the middle to adjust mid-frequencies; and select the bands to the right to adjust high frequencies (treble).
- Touch one to raise the selected band level; touch to lower the selected band level.
- 3. Touch when you are finished to save.

Once this has been set up, you can access this digital equalizer preset through the equalizer menu (please refer to the <u>Music Mode > Advanced Functions: Music</u> section for details).



Set the left-channel and right-channel levels.

- Touch (to increase the left-channel level (L); touch to increase the right-channel level (R). The center-position (C) will result in a balanced left/right stereo mix.



Backlight Time



Brightness

General

Select and confirm GENERAL in the Setup Mode menu to set options relating to your player's general features. The General options are: Auto Play, Format, USB Charge, and Load Default.

Auto Play

Set the Auto Play feature on or off. When Auto Play is set to ON, your player will automatically resume playback from where it left off when it wakes from standby.

Format

Prepare the hard disk for use with the player. It may become necessary to format your player if data or files become corrupt. Always use the Format function of the player when it is necessary to format a disk.



Formatting will destroy all data on a disk so make sure to back up your data before formatting the disk.

 Select and confirm NO to cancel; select and confirm YES to begin formatting. Again, you should always back up your data before formatting.

USB Charge

Set the USB Charge function on or off.

- When this is set to ON, your player will start charging when it is connected to a computer using a USB MSC connection. You may need to touch to continue connecting to the computer.
- When this is set to OFF, your player will connect to the computer automatically

Load Default

Restore all of the player's settings to their factory-default state.



Sleep

Set the Sleep Timer (in minutes). The player will automatically turn off after the set amount of time.

Record

Select and confirm RECORD in the Setup Mode menu to set options relating to your player's recording features. The Record options are: MIC Quality, Line-In Quality, Radio Quality, Sync On/Off, and Voice Detect.

MIC Quality

Set the quality of recordings made through the integrated microphone. The options are: L (Low), M (Medium), and H (High). High-quality recordings will sound best, but will take up more of the player's memory.

Line-In Quality

Set the quality of recordings made through the Line-In jack. The options are: L (Low), M (Medium), and H (High). High-quality recordings will sound best, but will take up more of the player's memory.

Radio Quality

Set the quality of recordings made from the FM Radio. The options are: L (Low), M (Medium), and H (High). High-quality recordings will sound best, but will take up more of the player's memory.

Sync On/Off

Set the recording Sync feature on or off. When this is set to ON, your player will detect audio signals from the Line-In jack and automatically synchronize the beginning and ending of recordings with the signal.

Voice Detect

Set the Voice Detect feature on or off. When this is set to ON, your player will detect audio signals from the integrated microphone and automatically pause recording when no signal is detected.

Information

Select and confirm INFORMATION in the Setup Mode menu to view information about your player. The Information options are: HDD Info. Total File. and Version.

HDD Info

View information about your player's hard disk drive: Size (total memory), Free (available memory), and Used (percentage of memory used).

Total File

View information about the files stored on your player's hard disk drive: Total Number of Folders and Total Number of Files.

Version

View information about your player's firmware (software): Version.

Use the VirtualDub video conversion software utility included on the Installation CD to create movies that are suitable for playback on the MP-C951.

Installing VirtualDub and Media Codecs on your Computer

Installing XviD


The XviD video codec must be installed on your computer in order to properly encode videos using VirtualDub.

- Insert the Installation CD into your computer's CD or DVD drive. Make sure to place the mini-CD in the center, recessed well of the drive tray.
- 2. Navigate to MY COMPUTER and double-click on the CD/DVD drive icon (usually "D:").
- 3. Double-click on the folder "XviD".
- Double-click on the file icon named "XviD-1.1.0-30122005.exe" to start the XviD codec installation program.
- Follow the on-screen instructions (the default options are recommended) to complete the installation.

Installing LAME

The LAME audio codec must be installed on your computer in order to properly encode videos using VirtualDub.

- Insert the Installation CD into your computer's CD or DVD drive. Make sure to place the mini-CD in the center, recessed well of the drive tray.
- 2. Navigate to MY COMPUTER and double-click on the CD/DVD drive icon (usually "D:").
- 3. Double-click on the folder "lame 3.96.1".
- Double-click on the folder "ACM".
- 5. Locate the file icon "LameACM.inf" and right-click on the file. In the context menu that appears, select "INSTALL".



A warning window will appear. Click "CONTINUE ANYWAY" to install the LAME encoder.



Installing VirtualDub

VirtualDub is a standalone application and does not need to be "installed" like a regular program. Simply copy the folder to a location on your computer and double-click the application icon to start VirtualDub.


- Insert the Installation CD into your computer's CD or DVD drive. Make sure to place the mini-CD in the center, recessed well of the drive tray.
- 2. Navigate to MY COMPUTER and double-click on the CD/DVD drive icon (usually "D:").
- 3. Double-click on the folder "Video Transcoder".
- 4. Copy the folder "VirtualDub" to a location on your computer (e.g., "C:\Program Files").
- 5. Double-click on the VirtualDub folder.
- 6. Locate the VirtualDub.exe icon. Double-click this to start the VirtualDub program.

Note:

You may wish to create a shortcut to VirtualDub for your convenience. To create a shortcut to VirtualDub on your desktop, right-click "VirtualDub.exe" and then select "Send To" > "Desktop (create shortcut)" from the menu that appears. You can now run VirtualDub by double-clicking the new shortcut icon on your desktop.

Using VirtualDub to Create Movies

- Start the VirtualDub application.
- Select the source video file to convert.
 - From the top menu bar, select File > Open Video File. Alternately, you may press Ctrl+O on the keyboard.



 Use the dialog box that appears to find and select the source video file and then click the OPEN button.



- 3. Load a Processing Setting preset.
 - From the top menu bar, select File > Load Processing Settings. Alternately, you may press Ctrl+L on the keyboard.



 Select "QCIF.vcf" for smaller (176x144) video files; select "QCIF-plus.vcf" for larger (220x176) video files. Click the OPEN button to load the selected preset.



Note:

The QCIF preset contains the following settings:

- Video > Filters > Add > Resize (New Width: 176; New Height: 144)
- Video > Framerate > Frame rate conversion (Convert to fps: 15)
- Video > Compression > XviD MPEG-4 Codec (configured to the "Handheld" profile)
- With Audio in "Full Processing Mode": Audio > Compression > Lame MP3 (set to 44100Hz, 128kbps CBR, Stereo)


The QCIF preset contains the following settings:

- Video > Filters > Add > Resize (New Width: 220; New Height: 144)
- Video > Framerate > Frame rate conversion (Convert to fps: 12)
- Video > Compression > XviD MPEG-4 Codec (configured to the "Handheld" profile)
- With Audio in "Full Processing Mode": Audio > Compression > Lame MP3 (set to 44100Hz, 128kbps CBR, Stereo)

If you find you are having problems playing the converted file, try reducing the Frame rate conversion setting.

Use the settings detailed above if you decide to use an alternate video conversion software program.

- 4. Convert the source file to an XviD-encoded AVI output file.
 - From the top menu bar, select File > Save as AVI. Alternately, you may press F7 on the keyboard.



 Use the dialog box that appears to select a destination folder to save the converted output file to. Type a file name for the file in the "File name" box, and then click the SAVE button



RESTORE & FIRMWARE UPDATES


Restoring Your Player



Formatting your player will erase all of your data from it (including music, movies, photos, text files). Make sure to copy and back up any data on your player that you do not want to lose prior to formatting.

To format your player:

- 1. Connect the MP-C951 to a computer using the USB-MSC connection.
- 2. On the computer, locate the Removable Disk icon that corresponds to the MP-C951.
- 3. Right-click on the Removable Disk icon and select "Format"



- A dialog box will appear on-screen. Set the options as shown below, then click the START button to begin formatting the MP-C951.
- When the formatting process is complete, disconnect the USB cable from the player. Turn
 the player off (slide the Power/Lock switch to the right and hold until the screen turns off)
 and then turn it back on.

Updating Your Player's Firmware

Firmware updates may be found on the COBY Electronics website at www.cobyusa.com. Check this site periodically for new updates. Firmware updates may improve performance or add new functionality to your player.

The player does not turn on.

- Ensure that the battery is charged or that the player is operating on AC power.

I cannot transfer files to the player.

- Ensure that your computer is running a supported operating system.
- If you are running Microsoft Windows 98 SE, ensure that the USB driver has been properly installed.
- Ensure that the supplied USB cable is securely attached to the player and the PC, or try using another USB cable.
- If you have connected the player through a USB hub, try connecting the player directly to your computer.
- If you are connected using the USB MTP/HOST port, try using the USB MSC port to connect
 to your computer.
- The files you are trying to transfer may contain Digital Rights Management (DRM) restrictions. Please refer to the documentation of the site from which you downloaded these files for more information.

The buttons do not work.
