

On Operation

Since the CD system offers a wide dynamic range, the peaks of the high level inputs are recorded with high fidelity, and the noise level is very low. Do not turn up the volume while listening to a part of the disc with no audio signals or very low level inputs. If you do so, the speakers may be damaged when the peak level of the sound is played. The lens of the laser should be kept clean. Do not touch the lens. If you do so, the lens may be damaged and the unit will not operate correctly

On Use

Never use the unit where it would be subject to:
- Heat sources such as radiators or air ducts.

- Direct sunlight
- Moisture or rain
- Mechanical vibration or shock
- Uneven surface.
- Do not place any heavy objects on top of the unit.
- When the unit is used with an AC power adapter, do not wrap the unit in a cloth, blanket, etc. If you do so, the temperature inside and outside the unit may rise considerably, resulting in malfunctioning of the unit.

CLOCK SETTING

Setting the clock can only be done in STANDBY mode.

- If the unit is plugged in with the supplied AC adapter and the unit is in standby mode, the standby indicator illuminates.



Speaker Connections

Connect the right speaker to the R terminal and the left speaker to the I terminal

Using the AC Adapter

Using an AC adapter other than the one supplied with the unit may damage the unit. This AC adapter operates on AC 100-120V~50/60Hz.

CAUTIONS:

- Before use, ensure the rated voltage of the adapter matches your local voltage
- The included AC adapter is for use with this unit only. Do not use it with other equipment.
- If you are not going to use the unit for a long time, disconnect the AC adapter from the wall outlet.
- Whenever the AC adapter is plugged in to a wall outlet, electricity is running through the unit, even when the power switch is turned off.

Presetting Stations

The unit can store a total of 20 stations in memory (10FM, 10AM). Presetting allows you to tune in to a station directly.

- Tune in to a desired station. Press the **PROG/MEM/** button. The preset number will blink and the "MEM" indicator will be shown on the display.
- Press the **MEM.UP/** button to select the preset number.
- Press the **PROG/MEM/** button again to store it in memory.
- Repeat steps 1-4 to store other stations.

Tuning in to a Preset Station

Press the **BAND/ STOP** button to select AM or FM then press the **MEM**. **UP/** button to select a preset number.

For Better Reception

FM: Fully unwind the antenna wire. Extend the antenna wire and place it in the position that sounds best. Note: Do not connect the FM antenna to an outside antenna.

AM: Reposition the unit to get better AM reception.

Notes:

- When the reception is good, the "STEREO" indicator will appear on the display.
- To prevent interference to the AM signal, please keep the AC adapter 3.17 feet (1 meter) away from the main unit


