T he AutoLock<sup>TM</sup> feature is an integrated circuit that receives and processes data sent by broadcasters, or other program providers, that contain program content advisories. When programmed by the viewer, a TV with AutoLock<sup>TM</sup> can respond to the content advisories and block program content that may be found objectionable (such as offensive language, violence, sexual situations, etc.). This is a great feature to censor the type of viewing children may watch.

Over the next few pages you'll learn how to block channels and certain rated programming. Below is a brief explanation of some terms and ratings you will find in the AutoLock feature.

# AutoLock<sup>™</sup> offers various BLOCKING controls from which to choose:

Access Code: An Access Code must be set to prevent children from unblocking questionable programming.

**Channel Block:** Individual channels including the A/V inputs can be blocked.

**Clear All:** Allows you clear all channels being blocked from your viewing set with the Channel Block Control.

**Block All:** Allows you to block ALL channels and A/V inputs at one time.

Movie Ratings: Block programming based on ratings patterned by the Motion Pictures Association of America.

#### HOW TO BLOCK ALL CHANNELS AT THE SAME TIME

There may come a time when you want to Block All the television's channels. Maybe you don't want your children to watch TV for a given time. With the Block All control, ALL available channels (including the A/V Inputs) can be set to block at the same time.

**Press the MENU button** on the remote to show the on-screen menu.

Press the CURSOR UP or DOWN button until the word FEATURES is highlighted.

Press the CURSOR RIGHT button to display the FEATURES menu options.

Press the CURSOR UP or DOWN button until the words AutoLock are highlighted.

Press the CURSOR RIGHT button.

Enter the correct access code number. "XXXX" shows on the Access Code display as you press the NUM-BERED buttons. AutoLock menu options will be displayed.

Press the CURSOR UP or DOWN button until the words BLOCK ALL are highlighted.

Press the CURSOR RIGHT button to turn Block All ON or OFF. When ON is selected, ALL available channels will be blocked.

When finished, press the SYSTEM MENU (OSD) button to remove the menu from the screen.

#### Helpful Hint

If you tune to a blocked channel and enter your Access Code to view the channel, ALL blocked channels will be viewable until the TV has been turned off. When the TV is powered back ON, the previously blocked channels will be blocked again.



#### BLOCKING PROGRAMS BASED ON MOVIE RATINGS

T here are two types of program ratings within the AutoLock<sup>TM</sup> feature. One is based on the Movie Industry ratings while the other is based on the TV Industry ratings. Both can be used to block or censor programming that has been rated in either manner.

Let's first look at the Movie Rating options of  $AutoLock^{TM}$ :

**Press the MENU button** on the remote to display the on-screen menu.

Press the CURSOR UP or DOWN button until the word FEATURES is highlighted.

Press the CURSOR RIGHT button to display the FEATURES menu options.

Press the CURSOR UP or DOWN button until AutoLock is highlighted.

Press the CURSOR RIGHT button. The screen will prompt you for your Access Code.

Using the NUMBERED buttons on the remote, enter your 4 digit Access Code. The AutoLock menu options will be displayed.

Press the CURSOR UP or DOWN button to highlight the words MOVIE RATING.

**Press the CURSOR RIGHT button** to display the **MOVIE RATING** options (G, PG, PG-13, R, NC17, or X).

Press the CURSOR UP or DOWN button to highlight any of the Movie Rating options. When highlighted, all these options can be turned ON (which will allow blocking) or OFF (which will allow viewing).

Use the CURSOR RIGHT button on the remote to turn the rating option ON or OFF.

#### Helpful Hint

When a rating is set to block, all higher ratings will be automatically blocked as well. (Example: If the the PG-13 rating is set to block, the R, NC-17, and X ratings will also be blocked.



## BLOCKING PROGRAMS BASED ON TV RATINGS

T his portion of the AutoLock<sup>TM</sup> features cover program ratings based on the TV Industry rating system. This is known as TV Rating within AutoLock<sup>TM</sup>.

After selecting the Autolock<sup>TM</sup> feature and entering your personal access code, the AutoLock<sup>TM</sup> options screen appears;

> Scroll the menu using the CURSOR UP or DOWN buttons until the words TV RATING are highlighted.

Press the CURSOR RIGHT button to display the TV Ratings (TV-Y, TV-Y7, TV-G, TV-PG, TV-14, or TV-MA). When highlighted, the TV-Y and TV-G can be turned ON (which will allow blocking) or OFF (which will allow viewing), of these rated programs.

The ratings of TV-Y7, TV-PG, TV-14, TV-MA can be customized to block V (violence), FV (fantasy violence), S (sexual situations), L (coarse language), or D (suggestive dialogue).

Press the CURSOR UP or DOWN button to highlight the desired rating.

Press the CURSOR RIGHT button on the remote to turn the TV-Y or TV-G rating ON or OFF. Or, press the CURSOR RIGHT button to enter the sub-menus for the TV-Y7, TV-PG, TV-14 or TV-MA ratings.

If the TV-Y7, TV-PG, TV-14 or TV-MA sub-menu is accessed, **press the CURSOR UP or CURSOR DOWN button** to select one of the options (Block All, V, S, L, D, or FV).

Press the CURSOR RIGHT button on the remote to turn the option ON or OFF.



TV-Y - (All children -- This program is designed to be appropriate for all children.) Designed for a very young audience, including children ages 2-6. This type of programming is not expected to frighten younger children.

**TV-Y7** - (Directed to Older Children -- This program is designed for children age 7 and above.) It may be more appropriate for children who have acquired the development skills needed to distinguish between make-believe and reality. This programming may include mild fantasy and comic violence (FV). **TV-G** - (General Audience -- Most parents would find this program suitable for all ages.) This type of programming contains little or no violence, no strong language and little or no sexual dialogue or situations.

TV-PG - (Parental Guidance Suggested -- This program contains material that parents may find unsuitable for younger children.)This type of programming contains one or more of the following: some suggestive dialogue (D), infrequent coarse language (L), some sexual situations (S), or moderate violence (V). TV-14 - (Parents Strongly Cautioned -- This program contains some material that many parents would find unsuitable for children under 14 years of age.) This type of programming contains one or more of the following: intensely suggestive dialogue (D), strong coarse language (L), intense sexual situations (S), or intense violence (V).

**TV-MA** - (Mature Audience Only -- This program is specifically designed to be viewed by adults and therefore may be unsuitable for children under 17.) This type of programming contains one or more of the following: crude indecent language (L), explicit sexual situations (S), or graphic violence (V).

#### HOW TO USE THE CLOSED CAPTIONING CONTROL

CC Off

Closed Captioning (CC) allows you to read the voice content of television programs on the TV screen. Designed to help the hearing impaired, this feature uses on-screen "text boxes" to show dialogue and conversations while the TV program is in progress.

**Press the CC button** on the remote to display the current Closed Caption setting.

Press the CC button repeatedly to choose from the four Closed Caption options (CC Off, CC 1, CC 2, CC Mute). Dialogue (and descriptions) for the action on the captioned TV program will appear on-screen if the tuned program is broadcasting CC information.

When finished, press the SYSTEM MENU (OSD) button to remove the menu from the TV's screen or let the option time out and disappear from the TV screen.

#### Helpful Hint

Not all TV programs and product commercials are made with Closed Caption (CC) information included. Neither are all Closed Caption modes (CC1, or CC2) necessarily being used during the transmission of a closed caption program. Refer to your area's TV program listings for the stations and times of Closed Caption shows.

## SETTING THE SMARTPICTURE<sup>™</sup> CONTROL

W hether you're watching a movie or a sporting event, your TV has automatic video control settings matched for your current program source or content. The SmartPicture<sup>™</sup> feature quickly resets your TV's video controls for a number of different types of programs and viewing conditions you may have in your home. Each SmartPicture<sup>™</sup> setting is preset at the factory to automatically adjust the TV's Brightness, Color, Picture, Sharpness, Tint, Color Temperature, DNR and Contrast+ levels.

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Press the SMART PICTURE button on the remote control. The current Auto Picture setting will appear in the middle of the screen.

2 Press the SMART PICTURE button repeatedly to select either PERSONAL, MOVIES, SPORTS, WEAK SIGNAL, or MULTIMEDIA picture settings.

Note: The PERSONAL setting is the setting that you setup using the PICTURE options within the on-screen menu. This is the only Smart Picture setting that can be changed. All other settings are setup at the factory during the time of production.

**MOVIES** - Preset picture options for watching Video Tapes, or DVDs.

**SPORTS** - Preset picture options for watching sporting events.

WEAK SIGNAL - Preset picture options for watching programs where the reception is not at its best.

MULTIMEDIA - Preset picture options for use with video gaming.



## SETTING THE SMARTSOUND<sup>™</sup> CONTROL

The SmartSound<sup>™</sup> feature allows the listener to select between four different factory set sound options. Personal (which can be set by the user), Theatre (for movie viewing), Music (for musical type programming) and Voice (when the program is mainly dialogue). These setting affect the Sound menu's Bass, Treble, AVL, and Incredible Surround controls

To select any of the options follow the directions below.

**Press the SMART SOUND button** on the remote control. The current Smart Sound setting will appear in the middle of the screen.

**Press the SMART SOUND button** repeatedly to toggle between the four settings.

Note: Only the PERSONAL control can be changed by the viewer. This changes the settings in the main on-screen menu's sound controls.

**THEATRE** - Preset sound options for watching movies.

MUSIC - Preset sound options for musical programming where there is little dialogue.

**VOICE** - Preset sound options for programming where heavy dialogue is present.



#### Using the QuadraSurf<sup>™</sup> Buttons



#### USING THE QUADRASURF<sup>™</sup> BUTTONS



The QuadraSurf™ buttons on your remote control allow you to store up to 10 channels per button (40 total). This is a great feature if you want to store all your favorite Sports channels, Movie channels, or News channels in one surf list. Family members can have there own favorite list of channels. You can even program the external A/V Input jacks (Front channel) for one of the buttons making it a "source" button for your external accessory devices.

Assuming channels have now been added to the four QuadraSurf<sup>TM</sup> lists (the four colored buttons on the remote, see the previous page), let's review how the feature works.

> Press one of the pre-programmed COLORED buttons on the remote (Red, Green, Yellow or Blue). The screen will display a smiley face with the first programmed channel for that surf list.

While the colored "smiley" face still appears on the screen, press the same COLORED button on the remote to tune the second channel programmed for that specific surf list.

Repeatedly pressing the same COL-ORED button while the "smiley" face appears will tune all the programmed channels for that specific surf list. After the last channel is tuned, pressing the COLORED button again will return you to the first channel in the list.

If the "smiley" face disappears from the screen and the same COLORED button is pressed, the surf channels will be displayed starting with the FIRST programmed channel again.



Repeat steps 1-3 for the other three COLORED buttons (Surf lists) if desired.

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Any time the "smiley" face appears with the channel number, **pressing the** "frownie" face button will allow you to remove it from the list (see the previous page for more details).

This section of the *Directions for Use* manual begins to explain the operating procedures of the DVD Player portion of this television.



## **OPERATING THE DVD PLAYER - DVD REMOTE BUTTONS**

 $T^{he}$  remote control supplied with your TV/DVD product has specific buttons for the operation of the DVD Player. This page is a brief overview of those buttons.

**POWER button -** Press to power the -TV/DVD on or off.

**REPEAT button -** Press once to repeat the playback of the current chapter. Press a second time to repeat the current title. Press a third time to repeat the entire disc. Press a fourth time to turn the repeat option off.

**AUDIO button -** Press to display the - onscreen DVD Audio options.

**SMART SOUND button -** Press to select – from factory set sound values to match the type of programming your watching. Choose from: Personal, Voice, Music, or Theatre. See the Smart Sound section of the TV in this manual.

**CURSOR buttons** - Press to navigate the onscreen menus. Press the  $\blacktriangleright$  to fast forward the playback of a disc. Press the  $\blacktriangleleft$  to fast backwards the playback a disc. Press the  $\blacktriangle$  to slow forward the playback of a disc. Press the  $\checkmark$  slow reverse the playback of a disc.

**OK button -** Press to confirm selections — within the onscreen menu options.

**MUTE button -** Press to mute the sound — coming from the TV speakers. Press again to restore the sound at its previous volume level.

**EJECT button** - With the TV on, press to place the unit in the DVD operational mode and open the disc tray. Press again to close the disc tray.

-SYSTEM MENU (OSD) button - Press to display the onscreen DVD menu options. When the menu is displayed, press to remove the menu from the TV screen.

**SUB-TITLE button** - Press to display the Sub-title option control.

**REPEAT A-B button -** Press once at your chosen starting point of the playback. Press again at our chosen ending point. The length of playback chosen will now repeat itself. Press again to turn the Repeat A-B option off.

**SMART PICTURE button -** Press to select from factory set picture values to match the type of programming your watching. Choose from: Personal, Movies, Sports, Weak Signal, or Multimedia. See the Smart Picture section of the TV in this manual.

- **DVD MENU button -** Press to access the built-in menu options stored on the DVD disc you are viewing.

- **TV/DVD button -** Press to toggle between the TV and DVD operational modes.

-**PLAY button -** Press to begin the playback of a disc.

**STOP button -** Press to stop the playback of a disc. Use to gain access to a locked disc if you have forgotten you PIN (press four times, then enter new PIN).

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## **OPERATING THE DVD PLAYER - MENU BAR OPERATION**

#### GENERAL EXPLANATION

This manual gives the basic instructions for operating this DVD Player. Some DVD (discs) require specific operation or allow only limited operation during playback. In these cases, the player may not respond to all operating commands. When this occurs, please refer to the instructions contained with the DVD (disc). When the symbol X appears on the TV screen, the operation is not permitted by the player or the disc.

Unless otherwise stated, all operations can be performed by using the remote control.

#### MENU BAR OPERATION

Press the SYSTEM MENU (OSD) button to display the DVD Player's on-screen menu.

Press the CURSOR RIGHT button to highlight and select TOOL BAR options: Play Option, Slide Show, View, Search, or Program.

OR, press the the CURSOR DOWN to highlight and select either **Preference or Setup** options.

Once you have chosen a specific TOOL BAR option, press the CUR-SOR DOWN button to highlight or select it's sub-option control. (See the Onscreen Menu Options outline at the bottom of this page.)

Repeatedly pressing the SYSTEM MENU (OSD) button while the onscreen menu is displayed will remove the menu from the TV screen.



When the "X" icon appears on the TV screen, it means the function cannot be preformed or is not an available option for that disc.

If the HELP LINE feature is set to ON, information about the status window can be displayed to help understand the best action to take. With the HELP LINE feature set to OFF, the text box at the bottom of the screen will not be displayed. Please refer to the Preference Options section of the manual for more details.

#### LANGUAGE: DEFAULT AUDIO, DEFAULT SUB-TITLE

You can select different languages so the DVD Player will automatically display its Onscreen Menu and DVD Disc Menus in the language you of your choice. The Default Audio and Sub-title can also be changed to a desired language. To change the Default Audio Language or Default Sub-title Language, follow the steps below.

Stop playback if a disc is playing in the player. Press the SYSTEM MENU (OSD) button on the remote control to display the on-screen menu.

Press the CURSOR DOWN button until the word Setup is highlighted.

Press the CURSOR RIGHT button to move the puck to the right highlighting the work Language.

Press the CURSOR DOWN button to highlight either the Default Audio, or Default Sub-Title control.

**Press the CURSOR RIGHT button** to gain access to the highlighted control's options.

Press the CURSOR UP or DOWN buttons to scroll the list of available languages. Choose from: English, Español, Français, Português, Italiano, Russian, Deutsch, Greek, Japanese, Korean, Chinese, Quechua, Guaraní, Aymará, or Inuplaq.

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**Press the OK button** to select or activate the chosen option.

Press the SYSTEM MENU (OSD) button to clear the on-screen menu from the TV screen.





#### TV: TV System

The DVD Player included in this television is compatible with NTSC and PAL. For the DVD Player to playback a disc correctly, the color system of the CD, the TV and the DVD Player should match.

> Stop playback if a disc is playing in the player. Press the SYSTEM MENU (OSD) button on the remote control to display the on-screen menu.

Press the CURSOR DOWN button until the word Setup is highlighted.

**Press the CURSOR RIGHT button** to move the puck to the right highlighting the word **TV**.

Press the CURSOR DOWN button to highlight the TV System control.

**Press the CURSOR RIGHT button** to gain access to the highlighted control's options.

Press the CURSOR UP or DOWN buttons to scroll the list of available languages. Choose from: PAL, NTSC or AUTO.

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**<u>PAL</u>**: Select this option if the connected to a PAL system. It will change the video signal of a NTSC disc and output in PAL format.

**NTSC:** Select this option if connected to a NTSC system. It will change the video signal of a PAL disc (VCD only) and output in NTSC format. **Auto:** Select this if compatible with both NTSC and PAL (multi-system). The output will determined by the video signal of the disc.

**Press the OK button** to select or activate the chosen option.

**Press the SYSTEM MENU (OSD) button** to clear the on-screen menu from the TV screen.

Note: It is possible that slight picture distortion may occur due to the video conversions. This is normal and does not require a service call.





#### AUDIO MENU: DIGITAL OUTPUT

If an external audio system is being used with your DVD Player, the Digital Output control may need to be set to match the output of the system.

> Stop playback if a disc is playing in the player. Press the SYSTEM MENU (OSD) button on the remote control to display the on-screen menu.

Press the CURSOR DOWN button until the word Setup is highlighted.

**Press the CURSOR RIGHT button** to move the puck to the right highlighting the words **Audio Menu**.

Press the CURSOR DOWN button to highlight the Digital Output control.

**Press the CURSOR RIGHT button** to gain access to the highlighted control's options.

Press the CURSOR UP or DOWN buttons to scroll the list of available languages. Choose from: PCM Only, All, or Off.

<u>PCM Only</u>: Select this option if your receiver is not capable of decoding Multi-channel audio.

All: Select this option if connected to a multi-channel decoder or receiver. Off: Select this option to deactivate the Digital Output control.

**Press the OK button** to select or activate the chosen option.

Press the SYSTEM MENU (OSD) button to clear the on-screen menu from the TV screen.





#### FEATURES: PBC (PLAYBACK CONTROL)

Some Video CDs contain information that allow you to control the playback of the disc through a special playback menu. the PBC (Play Back Control) can be set to On or Off.

> Press the SYSTEM MENU (OSD) button on the remote control to display the on-screen menu.

Press the CURSOR DOWN button until the word Setup is highlighted.

**Press the CURSOR RIGHT button** to move the puck to the right highlighting the word **Features**.

**Press the CURSOR DOWN button** to highlight the **PBC** control.

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Press the CURSOR RIGHT button to select On or Off.

**Press the OK button** to select or activate the chosen option.

**Press the SYSTEM MENU (OSD) button** to clear the on-screen menu from the TV screen.




# **OPERATING THE DVD PLAYER - SETUP MENU**

### ACCESS: PARENTAL LEVEL, CHANGE PIN, DISC LOCK

When using and making changes within the Access Control options an access PIN will have to entered before any new settings can be made. Other controls include Parental Level, Change PIN, and Disc Lock.

> **Press the SYSTEM MENU (OSD) button** on the remote control to display the on-screen menu.

Press the CURSOR DOWN button until the word Setup is highlighted.

**Press the CURSOR RIGHT button** to move the puck to the right highlighting the word Access.

Press the CURSOR DOWN button to highlight the Enter Current PIN control.

**Press the CURSOR RIGHT button** to gain access to the PIN entry screen.

If first time use, enter a 4-digit PIN using the NUMBERED buttons. If you have forgotten your PIN, press the STOP button 4 times, then enter a four digit PIN using the NUM-BERED buttons. (You will be asked to confirm the new number.)

Press the CURSOR DOWN button to scroll the available access controls. Choose from: Parental Level, Change PIN, or Disc Lock.

Once an option is selected, press the CURSOR RIGHT button to gain access to the highlighted control's options.

**Parental Level:** Press the CURSOR RIGHT or LEFT to select a level of security from 0-8 (see information below).

**<u>Change PIN</u>**: Select this option to create a new 4 digit PIN access number. Follow onscreen instructions.

**Disc Lock:** Press the CURSOR RIGHT to toggle the control On or Off to block view of certain discs.

**Press the OK button** to select or activate the chosen option.

Press the SYSTEM MENU (OSD) button to clear the on-screen menu from the TV screen.



Parental Level: (Ratings 1 to 8): If you set a rating for the player, all scenes with the same rating or lower will be played. Higher rated scenes will not be played unless an alternative is available on the disc. The alternative must have the same rating or a lower one. If in doubt, please make sure the disc plays according to your Parental Level system settings before you allow children access.

# **OPERATING THE DVD PLAYER - PREFERENCE MENU**

### Sound: Night Mode

The Sound option within the Preference Menu contains a control called Night Mode. the Night Mode control when On will optimize the dynamics of the Players sound output. High Volume sound are softened, enabling you to watch your favorite action movies without disturbing others at night. When the Night Mode control is set to Off, the sound output will be heard in its full dynamic range.

> Press the SYSTEM MENU (OSD) button on the remote control to display the on-screen menu.

Press the CURSOR DOWN button until the word Preferences is highlighted.

Press the CURSOR RIGHT button to move the puck to the right highlighting the word Sound.

Press the CURSOR DOWN button to highlight the Night Mode control.

Press the CURSOR RIGHT button to toggle the Night Mode control On or Off.

**On:** This setting will soften the dynamics of the sound output. **Off:** when the Night Mode control is set to Off, the disc will be heard in its full dynamic sound output.

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### FEATURES: HELP LINE, STATUS WINDOW

The DVD Player has two special controls that can be turned on to help navigate the menu with helpful suggestions (Help Line) and the show the current play state and time information (Status Window) on the screen during a disc playback.

> **Press the SYSTEM MENU (OSD) button** on the remote control to display the on-screen menu.

Press the CURSOR DOWN button until the word Preferences is highlighted.

**Press the CURSOR RIGHT button** to move the puck to the right highlighting the word **Features**.

Press the CURSOR DOWN button to highlight either the Help Line or Status Window control.

Press the CURSOR RIGHT button to toggle the selected control On or Off. <u>Help Line</u>:

**ON:** Will display a small window at the bottom of the screen with suggestions to help navigate the onscreen menu.

**OFF:** The Help Line will not appear when the onscreen menu is displayed on screen.

#### Status Window:

ON: Will display current disc status and time.

**OFF:** The Status Window will not appear on screen.

**Press the OK button** to select or activate the chosen option.

**Press the SYSTEM MENU (OSD) button** to clear the on-screen menu from the TV screen.



Help Line will give suggestions regarding the navigation of the onscreen menu.

## PLAY OPTION: DISC NAVIGATION, AUDIO, SUB-TITLE

T he Play Option area of the DVD Player onscreen menu contains three control that allow you to navigate the disc by titles and chapters, set the audio language, and set the sub-title language.

Press the SYSTEM MENU (OSD) button on the remote control to display the on-screen menu. the Toolbar option will be highlighted.

Press the CURSOR RIGHT button until the words Play Option are highlighted.

Press the CURSOR DOWN button to highlight the Disc Navigation, Audio, or Sub-title control.

Press the CURSOR RIGHT button to gain access to the highlighted control's options. Disc Navigation: Search the disc by

title and chapter. <u>Audio</u>: Use to set the audio language from a list of available choices. <u>Sub-title</u>: Use to set the sub-title language from a list of available choices.

Press the CURSOR UP or DOWN buttons to scroll and highlight the available menu options.

**Press the OK button** to select or activate the chosen option.

**Press the SYSTEM MENU (OSD) button** to clear the on-screen menu from the TV screen.







### SLIDE SHOW: PIC TIME, TRANS TIME, TRANS EFFECT

T he DVD Player has the capability to view photo CDs that contain digital photos (JPEG only) on the TV screen. The Slide Show controls of the Tool Bar menu allows you to control the viewing process.

With the TV/DVD in the DVD mode press the EJECT button to open the disc tray.

Place a Photo CD (JEPG only) into the disc tray and **press the EJECT button** to close the disc tray.

If available on the disc you will see Thumbnail Images tiled across the screen.

Press the CURSOR RIGHT, LEFT, UP or DOWN buttons to scroll through the available pictures.

**Press the OK button** after highlighting a Thumbnail to view the picture full screen.

Other Slide Show options (Pic Time, Trans Time, and Trans Effect:

> **Press the SYSTEM MENU OSD button** to display the onscreen menu. Toolbar will be highlighted.

Press the CURSOR RIGHT button until the words Slide Show are highlighted.

**Press the CURSOR DOWN button** to highlight one of the available control options.

**Pic Time:** Will control the length of time the picture is displayed. With **Pic Time** highlighted, **press the Cursor Right button** to enter the sub-menu categories. Choose from Slow, Medium or Fast.

Trans Time: Will control the length of time between picture display. Press the Cursor Right button to enter the submenu categories. Choose from Slow, Medium or Fast.

Trans Effect: Will allow you to change the transition effect between pictures. Press the Cursor Right button to enter the sub-menu categories. Choose from Cut-Fade 1, Cut-Fade 2, Cut In/Out or Fade In/Out.

**Press the PLAY** button to start the Slide Show.

**Press the STOP** ■ **button** to end the Slide Show



Note: With the thumbnails from a photo CD displayed on the screen, highlighting one and pressing the OK button will allow you to view the picture full screen. If viewing a Slide Show, pressing the Stop button will stop the show. Press the Play button again to continue the Slide show.













### VIEW: ANGLE, ZOOM, CHAPTER REVIEW, ROTATE

Some Discs contain additional information that will allow the viewer to change the camera angles, zoom the picture, rotate the picture, and scan chapters with chapter preview.

> **Press the SYSTEM MENU (OSD) button** on the remote control to display the on-screen menu. the Toolbar option will be highlighted.

Press the CURSOR RIGHT button until the word View is highlighted.

Press the CURSOR DOWN button to highlight either the Angle, Zoom, Chapter Preview, or Rotate control.

**Press the CURSOR RIGHT button** to gain access to the highlighted control's options.

Angle: If additional camera angle exist on the disc, press the Cursor Right to access the sub-meun, then the Cursor Up or Down to select desired angle. new camera angle will appear on the screen.

**Zoom:** Press the Cursor Right to activate, then use the Cursor buttons to select an area to zoom. Press the OK button repeatedly to zoom 2x, 4x, 8x, or to return to 1x picture size. Chapter Preview: Use turn Chapter Preview On or Off. When On disc will preview all available chapters. Rotate: If available on the disc, select rotate to turn the picture 90 degrees clockwise from the original. Great feature when viewing a photo CD.

Press the CURSOR UP or DOWN buttons to scroll and highlight the available menu options.

**Press the OK button** to select or activate the chosen option.

Press the SYSTEM MENU (OSD) button to clear the on-screen menu from the TV screen.





# SEARCH: TIME, FAST, SLOW, FRAME BY FRAME

 $T_{\rm playback}$  be a control allows you to start the playback at any chosen time on the disc or to search for certain areas. The search options can be set fast, slow, or can be searched frame by frame.

**Press the SYSTEM MENU (OSD) button** on the remote control to display the on-screen menu. the Toolbar option will be highlighted.

Press the CURSOR RIGHT button until the word Search is highlighted.

Press the CURSOR DOWN button to highlight the Time, Fast, Slow, or Frame by Frame control.

**Press the CURSOR RIGHT button** to gain access to the highlighted control's options.

**<u>Time</u>:** Search the disc by entering a desired time (based on playback time). Use the Numbered buttons to enter the time.

**Fast:** Use the  $\triangleleft \triangleleft$  or  $\triangleright \triangleright$  buttons to scan the disc at +4, +8, or +32 times speed forward or -4, -8, or -32 times speed backward.

Slow: Use the  $\triangleleft \triangleleft$  or  $\triangleright \flat$  buttons to scan the disc at +1/8, +1/4, +1/2 or +1 times speed forward or -1/8, -1/4, -1/2 or -1 times speed backward. Frame by Frame: Use the  $\triangleleft \triangleleft$  or  $\triangleright \flat$  buttons to search the disc one frame at a time forward or backward.

**Press the OK button** once you are done with the search process to return to the menu options.

**Press the SYSTEM MENU (OSD) button** to clear the on-screen menu from the TV screen.



### PROGRAM: PROGRAM, TRACKS, PLAY LIST, CLEAR ALL

**Y**ou can program your favorite tracks to be played in the order you want using the Program options within the Toolbar. Up to 20 tracks can be programmed at one time.

> **Press the SYSTEM MENU (OSD) button** on the remote control to display the on-screen menu. the Toolbar option will be highlighted.

Press the CURSOR RIGHT button until the word Program is highlighted.

Press the CURSOR DOWN button to highlight either the Program, Tracks, Play list, or Clear all control.

Press the CURSOR RIGHT button to gain access to the highlighted control's options.

Program: Once a Track or Chapter has been selected and added to the Play list, press the button to toggle the Program function On or Off. **Tracks**: Use the button to display a list of available Tracks, press the button again to display a list of available Chapters. With a track or chapter highlighted, press the OK button to add the selection to the Play list. **Play list:** Press the button to display the current Play list. Use the  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\blacktriangledown$ buttons to scroll the play list and press OK to start the playback at that point. Clear all: With Clear all selected, press the button to select Cleared, erasing all programming.

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**Press the OK button** once you are done with the programming process to return to the menu options.

Press the ▲ or ▼ button to scroll the available sub-title language options or the option "none".

**Press the OK button** to confirm the selection and remove the menu bar from the TV screen.

When "none" is the selection, no subtitle will appear on the screen during the playback of a disc.







Sub-title will appear at the bottom of the screen in the selected language.

### **REPEAT BUTTON**

The Repeat button on the remote control will allow you to program the playback of Chapters, Tracks, Titles, or the entire Disc to be repeated.

**Press the green REPEAT button** on the remote control repeatedly to choose one of the available repeat modes:

**Repeat :** Press the REPEAT button once, REPEAT will appear on the screen. This function will repeat the current CHAP-TER being viewed. Press OK to confirm the selection.

<u>Title</u>: Press the REPEAT button twice, TITLE will appear on the screen. This function will allow you to repeat current TITLE being viewed. Press OK to confirm the selection.

Disc: Press the REPEAT button three times, DISC will appear on the screen. This function will repeat playback of the entire DISC content. Press OK to confirm the selection.

<u>Off</u>: Press the REPEAT button a fourth time, OFF will appear on the screen. Press OK to confirm the selection and turn the Repeat sequence off.

### **REPEAT A-B BUTTON**

 $T^{\rm he}$  Repeat A-B button on the remote control will allow you to program the playback of certain lengths of Titles or Tracks on the disc.

During the playback of a disc, **press the yellow REPEAT A-B button** on the remote control to select a starting point for the repeat playback to begin. Repeat A will briefly appear on the screen.

When the disc reaches the ending point of the desired playback you want to repeat, **press the REPEAT A-B button again**. Repeat B will briefly appear on the screen. The sequence of playback between the "A" part and the "B" part will repeat itself.

**Press the REPEAT A-B button** on the remote control a third time to turn the Repeat A-B sequence off. Repeat A-B OFF will appear briefly on the screen.

### BOOKMARK DVD

The following steps describe how to Bookmark your DVDs when using the Timer Controls within the TVs onscreen menu.

Note: With an "on timer" sequence set (and active), the Timer Controls can tune the TV to the DVD mode when the TV powers itself on. If a DVD is playing and an "on timer" sequence is set (and active), the DVD can be Bookmarked so the Timer Controls will resume playback of the DVD when the TV powers itself on. For more information about specific Timer Control functions, please refer to page 13 of this manual.

**Press the MENU button** on the remote to display the TVs on-screen menu.

Press the CURSOR DOWN button until the word FEATURES is highlighted.

**Press the CURSOR RIGHT button** to display the **FEATURES** menu options. TIMER will be highlighted.

**Press the CURSOR RIGHT button** to shift the menu to the left and enter the TIMER control options.

Press the CURSOR DOWN button to select and highlight the word CHANNEL.

a.) <u>If not playing a DVD</u> press the CURSOR LEFT or RIGHT button to scroll the available channels until the word DVD appears.

b.) <u>If playing a DVD</u> press the CUR-SOR LEFT or RIGHT button to scroll the available channels until the words BOOKMARK DVD? appears.

Press the OK button to store the selection.

If DVD is selected and a Timer sequence active (refer to page 13), when the TV powers itself on, it will automatically tune to the DVD mode.

If BOOKMARK DVD? is selected, when the OK button is pressed the words will change to BOOKMARKED. With BOOKMARK DVD? selected and a Timer sequence active (refer to page 13), the playback of the DVD (in the position it was bookmarked) will resume when the TV powers itself on.

# Turning the BOOKMARK DVD feature OFF.

# AUDIO CD PLAYBACK

 $T^{he}$  following steps describe how to change the Audio Language control.

**Press the EJECT button** on the remote control to open the disc tray and place the TV/DVD in the DVD mode.

Insert an Audio CD into the disc tray and **press the EJECT button** on the remote to close the disc tray.

If automatic playback of the disc does not start, press the PLAY button on the remote control when the Audio CD menu appears to begin playback on Track 1.

**4** Press the  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\checkmark$  buttons to scroll through the other available tracks on the disc to begin playback of that selected track.

5 When finished, **press the STOP button** on the remote control to stop the playback of the disc.

Press the EJECT button on the remote control to remove the disc from the disc tray.

Note: some Audio CDs contain CD Text that will appear when tracks are playing. This text could include the track titles or special added text information.



### TROUBLESHOOTING

### No Power

- Check the TV power cord. Unplug the TV, wait 10 seconds, then reinsert the plug into the outlet and push the POWER button again.
- Check that the outlet is not on a wall switch.
- Be sure the fuse is not blown on the AC power strip, if one is being used.

#### **No Picture**

- Check antenna connections. Are they properly secured to the TV's ANT 75 $\Omega$  plug?
- Check the TUNER MODE control for the correct tuner setting.
- Try running the Auto Program feature to find all available channels.

#### No Sound

- Check the VOLUME buttons.
- · Check the MUTE button on the remote control.
- Check the SPEAKER on-screen control. If it is in the OFF position, sound at the set will be eliminated.
- If you're attempting to hook up auxiliary equipment, check the audio jack connections.
- (If applicable) Check the audio receiver for the correct operating mode.

#### **Remote Does Not Work**

- Check the batteries. If necessary, replace them with AA Heavy Duty (Zinc Chloride) or Alkaline batteries.
- Clean the remote control and the remote control sensor window on the TV.

- Check the TV power cord. Unplug the TV, wait 10 seconds, then reinsert the plug into the outlet and push the POWER button again.
- Be sure the fuse is not blown on the AC power strip, if one is being used.
- Check to be sure the TV outlet is not on a wall switch.

#### TV Displays Wrong Channel or No Channels Above 13

- Repeat channel selection.
- Add the desired channel numbers (using the CHANNEL EDIT control) into the TV's memory.
- Check to be sure the TUNER MODES are set to the CABLE option and run the Auto Program feature to find all available channels.

#### **Cleaning and Care**

- To avoid possible shock hazard, be sure the TV is unplugged from the electrical outlet before cleaning.
- When you are cleaning the TV, take care not to scratch or damage the screen surface (avoid wearing jewelry or using anything abrasive). Wipe the front screen with a clean cloth dampened with water. Use even, easy, vertical strokes when cleaning.
- Gently wipe the cabinet surfaces with a clean cloth or sponge dampened in a solution of cool, clear water. Use a clean, dry cloth to dry the wiped surfaces.
- Never use thinners, insecticide sprays, or other chemicals on or near the cabinet, as they might cause permanent marring of the cabinet finish.

#### WARNING Concerning Stationary Images on the TV Screen:

#### Do not leave stationary or letterbox images on screen for extended periods of time. This can cause uneven picture-tube aging.

Normal use of the TV should involve the showing of pictures that contain constantly moving and changing images that fill the screen. Be careful not to leave nonmoving images on screen for extended periods of time, or to display the same images on screen too frequently, because subtle ghost images can be left on the picture tubes. Sources of stationary images may be DVD disks, laser disks, video games, CD-i disks, videotapes, digital television boxes, broadcast channels, cable channels, satellite channels, and others. Here are some examples of stationary images (this is not an all-inclusive list; you may encounter others in your viewing):

- DVD menus—listings of DVD disk content
- Letterbox black bars—shown at the top and bottom of the TV screen when a wide screen (16:9) movie is viewed on a TV with standard (4:3) aspect ratio.
- Video-game images and scoreboards
- **Television station logos**—present a problem if they are bright and stationary; moving or low-contrast graphics are less likely to cause uneven aging of the picture tube
- Stock-market tickers—presented at the bottom of the TV screen
- Shopping channel logos and pricing displays—bright and shown constantly or repeatedly in the same location on the TV screen.

#### PLACEMENT OF THE TV

- To avoid cabinet warping, cabinet color changes, and increased chance of set failure, do not place the TV where temperatures can become excessively hot; for example, in direct sunlight or near a heating appliance.
- Be sure to allow a free flow of air to and from the perforated back cover of the set.

#### CLEANING

- To avoid possible shock hazard, be sure the TV is unplugged from the electrical outlet before cleaning.
- Regularly dust the TV with a dry, nonscratching duster to keep the TV clean.
- When cleaning the TV, take care not to scratch or damage the screen surface. Avoid wearing jewelry or using anything abrasive. Do not use household cleaners. Wipe the front screen with a clean cloth dampened with water. Use even, easy, vertical strokes when cleaning.
- Gently wipe the cabinet surfaces with a clean cloth or sponge dampened in a solution of cool, clear water and a mild soap or detergent. Use a clean, dry cloth to dry the wiped surfaces.
- Occasionally vacuum the ventilation holes or slots in the back cover of the set.
- Never use thinners, insecticide sprays, or other chemicals on or near the cabinet, as they might cause permanent marring of the cabinet finish.

### **GLOSSARY OF TERMS**

Auto Programming • The procedure of adding or deleting channel numbers into the Television's memory circuits. In this way the Television "remembers" only the locally available or desired channel numbers and skips over any unwanted channel numbers.

**Closed Caption** • Broadcast standard which allows you to read the voice content of television programs on the TV screen. Designed to help the hearing impaired this feature uses onscreen "text boxes" to show dialogue and conversations while the TV program is in progress.

**Coaxial Cable** • A single solid antenna wire normally matched with a metal plug (F-type) end connector that screws (or pushes) directly onto a 75 Ohm input found on the Television or VCR.

**Menu** • An on-screen listing of feature controls shown on the Television screen that are made available for user adjustments.

**On Screen Displays (OSD)** • Refers to the wording or messages generated by the television (or VCR) to help the user with specific feature controls (color adjustment, programming, etc.).

**Quadra Surf** • The feature that allows the programming of four separate Surf lists holding up to 10 channels each.

**Remote Sensor Window** • A window or opening found on the Television control panel through which infrared remote control command signals are received. **Side Audio/Video Inputs** • Located on the side of the TV these connectors (phono type plug) are used for the input of audio and video signals. Designed for easy use with VCRs or cameras.

**Surf** • The action of scanning specific channel in a limited channel list.

**System Menu (OSD)** • Allows the user to quickly confirm what channel number is currently being viewed. Status can also be used to clear the Television of on screen displays or information (rather than waiting for the displays to "time out" or automatically disappear from the screen).

**Tuner Mode** • Feature control settings made by the TV. Designed for first time set up and use. Settings for signal connections (antenna or cable TV), plus channel program memory are held in the TV's memory (even if the set is unplugged and moved to a new location.)

**Twin Lead Wire** • The more commonly used name for the two strand 300 Ohm antenna wire used with many indoor and outdoor antenna systems. In many cases this type of antenna wire requires an additional adapter (or balun) in order to connect to the 75 Ohm Input terminals designed into the more recent Televisions and VCRs.

### WHO IS COVERED?

You must have proof of purchase to receive warranty service. A sales receipt or other document showing that you purchased the product is considered proof of purchase.

### WHAT IS COVERED?

Warranty coverage begins the day you buy your product. For 90 days thereafter, all parts will be repaired or replaced free, and labor is free. From 90 days to one year from the day of purchase, all parts will be repaired or replaced free, but you pay for all labor charges. From one to two years from the day of purchase, you pay for the replacement or repair of all parts except the picture tube, and for all labor charges. After two years from the day of purchase, you pay for the replacement or repair of all parts, and for all labor charges.
