TOP

A. Cassette holder B. Tape transport control buttons

FRONT

C. POWER button -- Turns on and off this unit.

The equipment draws nominal non-operating power from the AC outlet with its STANDBY/ON switch in the OFF position.

- D. TUNING/BAND **button** -- Use this button to select the tuner mode then to change AM and FM bands.
- E. CD/PLAY/PAUSE button -- Use this button to select the CD mode, and start playing, press again to pause the CD.
- F. TAPE button -- Use this button to select TAPE mode.
- G. FM ST./MONO **button** -- In tuner mode, puts the tuner into mono mode typically to reduce noise in weak FM stereo signals.
- H. STOP button -- Stops the CD play.
- I. SKIP UP/ SKIP DOWN/ TUNING buttons When playing a CD, use this buttons to skip tracks. Holding down either button cue review functions.
 - While in Tuner mode, these buttons are used to search for broadcasts.
- J. VOLUME button (+/-) -- Use this button to adjust the volume level.
- K. **REPEAT button** -- While in CD mode, this button is used to change the repeat mode, this button switches preset stations up.
- L. **PROGRAM button** -- This button is used for program playback of CD or to preset broadcasts. Also used to change between the hours and the minutes when setting a built-in clock.
- M. **OPEN/CLOSE button** -- This opens and closes the CD compartment lid while in CD mode.
- N. Remote Sensor -- To control the unit from there mote, point it at this spot.
- O. **RANDOM button** -- Use this button play all tracks on the CD at random.

- P. SLEEP button -- Set the unit to stop and turn off after a certain time.
- Q. DISPLAY **button** -- To Display time.
- R. PHONES jack -- connect optional headphones to this jack.

Remote Control

- S. Numeric buttons -- They are use to directly access preset stations while In TUNER mode, or tracks while in CD mode.
- T. INTRO button -- This button offers a 10-second intro-scan through CD tracks.
- U. **MUTE button** -- Cuts the output to the speakers or headphones.

V. EQ button (Electronic Equalizer Preset System) -- this button offers Flat, Rock, Jazz, Pop and Classic modes.

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W. DBBS button (Bass Boost System)-- Set mode to Bass Boost.

X. RESET switch

If function buttons may not work properly, do it as follow:

- A. Press the RESET switch once or twice with a pencil or a ball-point pen lightly. Unit resume work.
- Press the POWER button turn off the unit for 60 seconds. Unit resume work.

In the Display of the Main Unit Y. Indicators

STEREO indicator lights when tuned in to a stereo FM station.

'RANDOM' indicator lights when a CD is in random play.

'INTRO' indicator lights when CD is in intro play.

'MW' or 'FM' indicator light when the unit is in Tuner mode.

REPEAT lights when a CD is playing in Repeat mode.

'CH' refers to a preset radio channel number.



'TRACK' refers to a CD track number. 'FLAT', 'ROCK', 'JAZZ',' POP'or 'CLASSIC' indicators are its as selected by the EQ switch.

Basic Operation

[Adjusting the volume

The volume is adjustable between the range between 00 and 40 using the

VOLUME buttons. You can hold down the - or + buttons to reduce or bring up the volume continuously.

EQ (Electronic EQ Preset System)

To enjoy different sound, press the ÉQ button.

Every time the EQ button of the remote control unit is pressed, the mode is as follows:

 \rightarrow ROCK \rightarrow JAZZ \rightarrow POP \rightarrow CLASSIC \rightarrow FLAT(off) \rightarrow

🖻 Muting

To cut the sound temporarily, press the MUTING button. Press the MUTING again to restore the sound. If you change the volume during the muting, the the muting will be cancel.

🛙 Listening through headphones

Insert the headphone plug into the PHONES jack, and adjust the volume. The sound from speakers will be cut off.

Listening to CDS

I Press the POWER Button to turn the unit ON.

Press the CD button to get 'DISC' displayed.

 \blacksquare Press the OPEN/CLOSE button (\blacktriangle) to open the disc compartment lid.

² Put a disc in place with the printed label facing you. Notes

- Push the disc until it clicks in so that it securely seats on the spindle.
- Never set more than one disc.

S Press the OPEN/CLOSE button again to close the lid.

• A moment later, the display shows the total playback time and the total number of tracks on the disc.

[☉] Press the PLAY/PAUSE button (►/II) to start playback.

Playback starts from the first track.

When the playback of all the tracks has been finished, the unit stops automatically.



Repeat Play back - CD

As you press the REPEAT button, 'REPEAT' blinks, turns on solid and then goes out, the mode changing as follows:

Repeat one track

Press the repeat button once during playback, The repeat indicator blinks. The track being played will be played repeatedly. If you press the SKIP button (IMA/ M) and select another track, the track you selected will be played repeatedly.

Repeat ALL the Tracks

All the tracks of the disc will be played repeatedly.

- Press the REPEAT button twice. The repeat indicator lights steadily.
- During program playback, only the programmed tracks will be played in order repeatedly.

Random Playback - CD

Tracks can be played randomly.

If `REPEAT' is blinking to indicate that the single track repeat function is activated, press the REPEAT button to get the indicator lit steadily or gone out.

Pressing the RANDOM button and [°]RANDOM[°] is indicated in the display. To start random playback, press the play/pause button (►/||).

- If you press the forward skip button (>>>>) during random play, another track is randomly selected and is played.
- If you press the backward skip button (I during random play, the current track is again played from the beginning.
- If you press the REPEAT button during random play to let `REPEAT blink, the current track is played repeatedly.
- To stop random play, press the stop button (
- To turn the RANDOM mode off, press the RANDOM button.

Programmed Playback-CD

Up to 16 tracks can be programmed in the desired order.

• Shuffle playback does not work during program playback.

I Press the PROGRAM button in the stop mode.

"Pr:01" is displayed, along with "**PROGRAM**".

≥ Press the skip(I or >>>) button to select a track.

E Press the PROGRAM button

The track is programmed and $\ensuremath{\tilde{\ensuremath{\mathsf{Pr}}}\xspace:02'}$ is displayed.

- Repeat steps 2 and 5 to program more tracks.
- You can program up to 16 tracks.
- To cancel the programming, press the STOP button (■), all the tracks you have programmed so far are cleared from memory.

☐ When the selection of track numbers is completed, press the PLAY/PAUS button (►/II)to start program playback.

The programmed contents are kept in memory even after you have switched the unit into the TUNER or TAPE modes or the power is turned off.

\boxtimes To check the programmed order

In the stop mode, press the PROGRAM button repeatedly. The track number will be shown on the display.

$\ensuremath{\mathbb{B}}$ To add a track to the end of the program

In the stop mode, press the PROGRAM button repeatedly until * -- * is displayed to the right of a program number. Select a track number by pressing the SKIP button (I or Def) and then press the PROGRAM button. The track is added to the end of the program.

🖾 To overwrite the program

In the stop mode, press the PROGRAM button repeatedly until the track number to be changed appears on the display.

Select a new track number by pressing the SKIP button (Here or Here) and then press the PROGRAM button.

🖸 To clear the program

To clear the program contents, press the STOP button (\blacksquare) in the stop mode. Pressing the OPEN/CLOSE button also clears the programmed contents.

• If the unit is disconnected from the power supply, the programmed contents will be cleared.

Listening to Radio Programs

I Press the TUNING/BAND button

2To select the band (AM or FM), press the TUNING/BAND button again.

Select a station.

Hold down the TUNING button(\checkmark or \land) for a while and release the button. When a station is tuned in, the tuning stops automatically. Repeat this step until the desired station is found. Press the TUNING button to stop the tuning.

- To select stations which cannot be tuned automatically, press the TUNING button repeatedly.
- STEREO' is displayed when a stereo broadcast is tuned in.

A If the reception is poor

press the FM ST./MONO button.

The unit is turned to mono mode, but the reception will improve. For a good reception, turn around the antenna so that you can get the station clearly.

Storing Preset Stations

Up to 20 FM and 12 AM stations can be stored in preset memories.

DPressing the TUNING/BAND to select FM or AM.

- **Press the TUNING button and tune in a station to be stored as a preset** station and then press the PROGRAM button.
- **E** Select a preset channel to store the station by pressing the REPEAT button or a numeric button, and then press the PROGRAM button. Remember not to overwrite a preset channel. It is wise of you to write down which stations are stored in which channels.

To store more stations, repeat step \blacksquare to \blacksquare .

A How to select preset stations press the REPEAT button or numeric buttons to select a preset channel.

Listening to Tapes

The tape transport cannot be controlled from the remote control unit..

Insert a cassette tape.

Press the STOP/EJECT button to open the cassette holder, load a cassette with its exposed side facing you, and close the cassette holder by pushing it.

Press the TAPE button to select TAPE'.

E Press the PLAY buttons (►).

 \square To stop playback --- press the STOP/EJECT button (\blacksquare/\triangle) to stop play back.

- **E** To pause in the playback --- press the PAUSE button(II). To resume play back , press the button again.
- □ Fast forward and rewind---press the F Forward(>>) or the REW(<<) button. press the STOP/EJECT(■/▲) button to stop the fast forward or rewind operation.
- □ To take out the cassette tape---press the Stop/EJECT(■/▲) button to stop playback then press the button again to open the cassette holder.

Tape Recording

I Load a recordable cassette tape into the cassette holder.

2 Select the source to be recorded by pressing the TUNER or the CD button

Press the RECORD button (•).
The record button is locked to the PLAY button: When the RECORD button is pressed down, the PLAY button also is

The recording stars •It is possible to record during random playback or program play back.

🛯 To stop recording

Press the STOP/EJECT button (\blacksquare/\triangle).

Clock Adjustment

The clock can be adjusted whether the unit is turned on or off.

1 If the unit is turned on, press the DISPLAY button. You need to press the switch twice if a CD is currently playing.

Press the PROGRAM button.

The hours start blinking.

E Press the skip/TUNING buttons as many times as necessary to enter the number of hours, and then press the PROGRAM button. The minutes start blinking.

Similarly with the hours, press the skip/TUNING buttons as many times as necessary to enter the number of minutes, and then press the PROGRAM button.

Using the sleep

Set the unit to stop and turn off after a certain time.

- **U** While enjoying the desired source-- Press SLEEP button to select the desired time.
- **2** TO cancel the SLEEP--Press SLEEP button to select OFF.
- **E** To confirm the remaining time.(only while unit is ON)--Press SLEEP button, the remaining time is shown for about 10 seconds.

To change the setting -- Press SLEEP button to select the new setting.

Note

- The play and seep can be used together.
- The sleep always has priority.

Trouble Shooting

In case of trouble with the unit, please take the trouble to look through this chart and see if you can solve the problem yourself before you call your dealer.

General

- No power
 - \rightarrow Check the connection to the Ac power supply.

No sound from speakers.

- \rightarrow Check the connection to the speakers.
- \rightarrow Adjust the volume.
- → Select proper source.
- → Pull out the headphones plug from PHONES jack.
- → If muting is on, press the MUTING button.

The sound is noisy.

→The unit is too close to a TV set or similar appliances. Install the unit apart from them, or turn them off.

Remote Control Unit

Remote control does not work.

- \rightarrow If the batteries are exhausted, change the batteries.
- → Use remote control unit within the range and point at the front panel.
- -> Clear obstacles between the remote control unit and the main unit.
- \rightarrow If a fluorescent light is near the unit, put it off.

Cassette Tape Deck

The cassette holder cannot be closed.

→Insert a cassette tape securely with its exposed side facing you.

No sound. Sound is distorted or noisy.

- → If a blank tape is loaded, replace it with a prerecorded tape.
- \rightarrow Clean and demagnetize the heads.

Can not record

- →If the safety tabs of the cassette tape have been broken off, cover the holes with adhesive tape.
- \rightarrow Clean and demagnetize the heads.
- →Use normal tapes.

Tuner

Can not listen to any station, or signal is too weak.

- → Tune in the station properly.
- → If a TV is near the unit, put it off.
- Re-orient the antenna until reception improves.

Though the broadcast is stereo, It sounds monaural.

→ Press the FM MODE button.

CD Player

Can not play.

- → Load a disc with label side facing you.
- → If the disc is dirty, clean the Surface of the disc.

One track is played repeatedly.

→ Press the REPEAT button to cancel the repeat mode.

Sound skips.

- → Place the unit on a stable place to avoid vibration and shock.
- → If the disc is dirty, clean the Surface of the disc.
- → Do not use scratched, damaged or warped discs.
