## Adjusting the Airflow Direction

#### Semi-concealed type





This air conditioner is equipped with auto flaps. You can set the airflow direction to a specific angle or to the sweep mode using the remote control unit. (Refer to the description of the remote control unit.)



Ceiling mounted type (T)



#### A. Vertical directions (automatic)

This air conditioner is equipped with an auto flap. You can set the airflow direction to a specific angle or to the sweep mode using the remote control unit. (Refer to the description of the remote control unit.)



#### B. Horizontal directions (manual)

The horizontal airflow direction can be adjusted manually by moving the vertical vanes to the left or right.

#### Adjusting the Airflow Direction (continued)

#### Wall mounted type (K)

#### A. Vertical directions (automatic)

Confirm that the remote control unit has been turned on. Press the FLAP button to start the flap moving up and down. If you want to stop the flap movement and to direct the air in the desired direction, press the FLAP button again. In the cool mode, don't direct the flap down more than 30°, otherwise, condensation may drip on to the floor. Zone "A" is the recommended flap position for cooling.



#### B. Horizontal directions (manual)

The horizontal airflow can be adjusted manually by moving the vertical vanes to the left or right.



#### ■ Concealed duct type (U)

This air conditioner is not equipped with air outlet parts. These must be obtained locally. Please refer to the manual of the locally adopted air outlet parts.



## **Special Remarks**

"DRY" Operation	
How it works Heating Operation	<ul> <li>Once the room temperature reaches the level that was set, the unit repeats the cycle of turning on and off automatically.</li> <li>In order to prevent the humidity in the room from rising again, the indoor fan also turns off when the unit stops operating.</li> <li>The fan speed is set to "LO." automatically, and cannot be adjusted.</li> <li>"DRY" operation is not possible if the outdoor temperature is 59 °F or less.</li> </ul>
Heating performance	• Because this appliance heats a room by utilizing the heat of the outside air (heat pump system), the heating efficiency will fall off when the outdoor temperature is very low. If sufficient heat cannot be obtained with this heat pump, use another heating appliance in conjunction with this unit.
Defrosting	<ul> <li>When the outdoor temperature is low, frost or ice may form on the outdoor heat exchanger coil, reducing the heating performance. ## Setting the Timer





 Each press of the ▲ button decreases the timer operation period with half an hour (30 minutes) step, down to half an hour.

## Care and Cleaning



Air Intake and outlet side (Indoor Unit) 1. For safety, be sure to turn the air conditioner off and also to disconnect the power before cleaning.

2. Do not pour water on the indoor unit to clean it. This will damage the internal components and cause an electric shock hazard.

Clean the air intake and outlet side of the indoor unit with a vacuum cleaner brush, or wipe them with a clean soft cloth.

If these parts are stained, use a clean cloth moistened with a mild liquid detergent. When cleaning the air outlet side, be careful not to force the vanes out of place.

- 1. Never use solvents or harsh chemicals when cleaning the indoor unit. Do not wipe plastic parts using very hot water.
- 2. Some metal edges and the fins are sharp and may cause injury if handled improperly; be especially careful when you clean these parts.
- 3. The internal coil and other components of the outdoor unit must be cleaned every year. Consult your dealer or service center.

Air filter The air filter collects dust and other particles from the air and should be cleaned at regular intervals as indicated in the table below or when the filter indication (⊞) on the display of the remote control unit (wired type) shows that the filter needs cleaning. If the filter gets blocked, the efficiency of the air conditioner drops greatly.

#### \*Concealed duct type (U):

An air filter is not provided with this air conditioner at the time of shipment. To get clean air and to extend the service life of the air conditioner, an air filter must be installed in the air intake. For installation and cleaning the air filter, consult your dealer or service center.

#### NOTE

How to clean the filter

How to remove the filter 4-way semi-concealed type (X):



The frequency with which the filter should be cleaned depends on the environment in which the unit is used.

- 1. Remove the air filter from the air intake grille.
- 2. Use a vacuum cleaner to remove light dust. If there is sticky dust on the filter, wash the filter in lukewarm, soapy water, rinse it in clean water, and dry it.
- 1. Remove the bolt screw on each side out of the latch using a screwdriver. (After cleaning, be sure to reattach the two bolt screws.)
- 2. Slide the two latches of the air intake grille to the direction of the arrow to open the grille.
- 3. Open the air intake grille downward.

When cleaning the air filter, never remove the safety chain. If it is necessary to remove it for servicing and maintenance inside, be sure to reinstall the safety chain securely (hook on the grille side) after the work.

#### Wall-mounted type (K):

- 1. Move the flap on the air outlet grille to its lowest position with the remote control unit.
- **2.** The filter is disengaged by pushing the tab up gently. Hold the air filter by the tab at the bottom, and pull downward.



When replacing the filter, make sure that the FRONT mark is facing you. Push it up until you hear it click back into position.

## Tips for Energy Saving

  - Do not let direct sunlight into the room. Use sunshades, blinds or curtains. If the walls and ceiling of the room are warmed by the sun, it will take longer to cool the room.
- Always try to keep the air filter clean. (Refer to "Care and Cleaning.")
   A clogged filter will impair the performance of the unit.
  - To prevent conditioned air from escaping, keep windows, doors and any other openings closed.

## Using the Wireless Remote Controller

#### How to Install Batteries

- 1. Press and slide the lid on the back of the wireless remote controller in the direction of the arrow.
- 2. Install two AAA alkaline batteries (LR03). Make sure the batteries point in the direction marked in the battery compartment.
- **3.** Press the ACL button, then replace the lid. If you press it, the current time, ON time, and OFF time are all reset to 0:00.





- The batteries last about six months, depending on how much you use the wireless remote controller.
   Replace the batteries when the wireless remote controller's lamp fails to light, or when the wireless remote controller cannot be used to change the air conditioner's setting.
- Use two fresh leak-proof type-AAA alkaline batteries (LR03).
- In replacing batteries, follow the instructions as mentioned in the sub-section "How to Install Batteries".
- If you do not use the wireless remote controller more than 1 month, take out the batteries.

## Setting the Timer



When two remote control units are being used, either a main-remote control unit or a sub-remote control unit can be used for timer operations. (Refer to the description of the remote control unit.)


 Each press of the ▼ button decreases the timer operation period with half an hour (30 minutes) step, down to half an hour.

- **NOTE** While the operation reservation indicator is blinking, the display will not change by pressing any button other than the PROGRAM button.
  - While the operation reservation indicator is blinking, if you have not pressed the PROGRAM button for 30 seconds, the indicator resumes the ordinary indicator mode.

#### 9. How to change programmed operation times

- ① In the ordinary indicator mode, press the PROGRAM button.
- Press the DAY button to move the operation reservation indicator ( •) to the day the programmed operation times of which you want to change.
- ③ Press the SET button.
- ④ By pressing the SET button, times indicators blink in turn in the order described below. Make the time to change blink.
- 5 Press the HH or/and MM button to change the time.
- 6 Press the SET button.
- ⑦ Press the PROGRAM button to complete the change.

- By using the CANCEL button, you can temporarily cancel per-day programmed operation.
- Press the CANCEL button. The holiday indicator (| |) starts blinking.
- 2 Press the DAY button to move the holiday indicator (| |) to the day that you want to set as a holiday.

   The holiday indicator (| |) stops blinking and remains lit (|-|).

#### To clear a programmed holiday

- ① Press the CANCEL button.
- 2 Press the DAY button to move the holiday indicator (| |) to the day the set holiday of which you want to clear.

   The holiday indicator (|-) will change to the operation reservation indicator (-).

#### Explanation of the operation

On the day that is programmed as a holiday, programmed operation does not work temporarily. Next day, the holiday indicator (|) will change to the operation reservation indicator (•) and programmed operation resumes.

You cannot set a holiday to a day for which no operation is programmed.

#### 1. Power failure

When the power resumes after a power failure, the display shown on the above will appear (the colon of the present time indicator ":" will blink).

#### To restart operation

- ① Turn on the power (or the circuit breaker) for the air conditioner.
- 2 Turn on the air conditioner with the remote controller.
- ③ Press the PROGRAM button of the programmable weekly timer. The colon (:) stops blinking, the clock display will appear and the ordinary indictor mode will resume. Your program is saved with the backup, therefore you do not need to program again.

#### 2. The operation of the programmable weekly timer and air conditioners

The operation of air conditioners with the programmable weekly timer can be controlled with the timer or the remote controller.
