

Note:

An LOD panel and/or video monitor may be installed in a motor vehicle and visible to the driver if the LOD panel or video monitor is used for vehicle information, system control, rear or side observation or navigation. If the LOD panel or video monitor is used for television reception, video or DVD play, the LOD panel or video monitor must be installed so that these features will only function when the vehicle is in "park" or when the vehicle's parking brake is applied.

An IOD panel or video monitor used for television reception, video or DVD play that operates when the vehicle is in gear or when the parking brake is not applied must be installed to the rear of the driver's seat where it will not be visible, directly or indirectly, to the operator of the motor vehicle.

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A. Cautions and Warnings

All operation and maintenance instructions must be followed and warnings adhered to

- · Do not expose the unit to excessive moisture.
- Do not place objects filled with liquids, such as vases, on the unit.
- Do not use the unit where there are temperature extremes (below 41°F, 5°C or exceeding 95°F, 35°C).
- · Adjust the volume to prevent damage to speakers.
- Sudden changes in the ambient temperature may cause condensation to form on the optical lens inside the unit. If this happens, remove the disc, and allow about 2 hours to pass and then proceed with normal operation.
- To ensure proper ventilation and proper operation, never cover or block the slots and openings with a cloth or other material.
- Keep the unit away from strong magnets, heating sources, sunlight, and excessive dust.
- Never allow objects of any kind or liquids to be pushed/spilled into the unit
 openings as they may come into contact with dangerous voltages.
- Unplug the unit from the wall outlet before cleaning. Do not use liquid or aerosol cleaners.
- Do not use accessories not recommended in this manual as they may be hazardous.

B. About This Manual

The operations described mainly refers to the use of the remote control.

Buttons with same or similar marking on the main unit have the same function as those on the remote control.

If the symbol $^{(1)}$ occurs on the screen during operation, the function requested is not supported by the media type inserted in the DVD player. The unit will play the following:

Note: Usually the unit plays CD-R, CD-RW and MP3 discs. But due to the variety of disc types, recording computers, operating systems and software for burning we cannot guarantee that every CD-R, CD-RW or DVD is playable within this unit.

Please be aware of the following:

- This instruction manual explains the basic instruction of this unit.
- Some DND discs have different functions that may not be explained in this instruction manual. You may need extra instructions. In this case, please follow the instructions displayed on the screen or jacket or case of the disc.
- The disc information takes priority in various settings.

- In this manual, the language in the on-screen display is English. If you change the language, please follow the selected language in the on-screen display.
- The screen shown as an example in this manual may be different from the actual screen.
- On-screen displays subject to change without notice.

Note: The types of functions and operations that can be used for a particular disc vary depending on the features of that disc. In some cases, these functions and operations may differ from the descriptions given in this Owner's Manual. In this event, follow the instructions given on the screen and on the sleeve of the disc.

Region Management Information

This DMD player is designed and manufactured to respond to the region management information that is recorded on a DMD disc. If the region number described on the DMD disc does not correspond to the Region number of this DMD player, this DMD player cannot play this disc. The region number for this DMD player is '1'.



Please note that the program of a DVD may be divided into several 'titles' (e.g. main movie, bonus material, interviews etc.). Each of these titles can be divided into 'chapters'. The program of audio CD's is divided into "tracks".



C. Desktop Base Installation




Unit Base

- 1. Place the tablet DVD player base on flat surface.
- 2. Align the thumb screwwith the hole on the back of the DVD player.
- 3. Thread the thumb screw into the hole on the back of the DVD player and turn the thumb screw clockwise to tighten the base to the DVD player.
- 4. Whileholding the DVD player and the base, adjust the unit's swivel angle for a confortable viewing position.

D. Mount the unit on the wall

The unit can be easily be mounted on the wall. You will need an optional VESA75 Wall Mount Bracket. The VESA75 Wall Mount Bracket can be purchased at most local electronic retailers. The rear of the unit contains four screwholes (Refer to figure below). The VESA75 Wall Mount Bracket is attached to the back of the unit with four screws (MAX6 or MAX8). Follow the instructions supplied with the VESA75 Wall Mount Bracket to complete the installation.



E. Prior to Operation

Place in Position

- For setting up the unit please choose a location with sufficient air circulation to prevent overheating.
- The product must be positioned horizontally only.
- Do not place heavy objects on its housing.
- To protect the laser unit avoid dusty surroundings. If necessary, please use a cleaning disc carefully following its operating instructions.

Moisture Condensation

In some cases water may condense on the laser lens causing a malfunction:

- The unit was suddenly brought from a cold to a warm surrounding.
 - => Please take out the disc and wait for about an hour, until the unit has warmed up.
- The unit was operated in a very humid surrounding.
 - => Please choose a location with lower humidity.

Handling Disc's

- In order to keep the disc clean, never touch the shiny surface.
- Never place a sticker or adhesive label on the disc.





- Dan't expose discs to direct sunlight or other heat sources.
- Please store the discs only in their sleeves.

Cleaning a Disc

To clean a disc use a soft cloth without any cleaning agents.

Only wipe from the center hole towards


the outer edge, never in toward the center.



Using the Remote Control Handset

1. The remote control uses a pre-installed Li-ion type battery. To prevent the battery from discharging, we've inserted an insulating strip. Please pull it out prior to first use.


If the remote control should begin to operate unreliably replace the battery with a new battery of the same type. To replace the battery open the battery compartment. Push the retention clip in the direction of arrow and pull out the battery mounting.





- 3. Please point the remote control towards the main unit when operating the buttons. Obstacles between the remote control and infrared sensor will adversely affect operation of the remote control.
- Batteries should disposed in an environmentally correct manner. Never throw batteries into fire.
- ➤ If the remote control is not to be used for an extended period of time, please remove the battery from the compartment to prevent damage by battery legace
- ➤ When replacing the battery, please observe the polarity. The '+' must face upwards.

F. The Remote Control




H. Power Supplies

a. Using AC adaptor

Connect the supplied AC adaptor.

INPUT: AC 100 ~ 240V, 50/60Hz, 0.4A

OUTPUT: DC 12V, 1.7A



- Use this unit only th**e supplied** AC adaptor.
 Use with other AC adaptors may damage the unit.
- Do not touch the AC adaptor with wet hands. Doing so is dangerous, as this could result in an electric stock.
- Do not use with a voltage other than the voltage displayed. Improper voltage could cause fire, electrical shock, or damage.

b. Using cigarette lighter adaptor

Connect the supplied DC power adaptor to vehicle power outlet.

Vehicle DC Power Adapter

INPUT: DC 12-14V OUTPUT: DC 12-14V

Caution on the cigarette lighter adaptor:

- \bullet Use only the supplied DC power adaptor. Using other DC power adaptors could damage the unit.
- After use, disconnect the cigarette lighter adaptor plugs from both this unit and the vehicle power socket.
- The DC power adaptor may cause interference with reception from the car radio or another radio inside the vehicle. If this is the case, discorrect the DC power adaptor from the vehicle power socket, or use the radio located at a further distance from the vehicle power socket.

Traffic safety:

 \bullet Do not use while operating a motorized vehicle. It may create a traffic hazard and is illegal in many areas.

After connecting the unit to power, press "POWER" button, and the logo picture will appear on the screen and the LED power indicator located on lower left front of the unit will be light.


I. Connections

Although this unit has its own screen, you can connect it to an external television set as well.

1. Playing a Video Game

- 1) Slide the AV in/out switch to the "In" position.
- 2) Plug the AV output from your game system into the Audio L+R and video input jack on the left side of the unit with corresponding color:

 (Audio Left= White, Audio Right= Red, Video=vellow).
- 3)Press "DVD/TV/AV" until the word "AV" appears on the top right; Adjust the volume control and the brightness control on the top of the unit to your individual preference.



2. Connecting to a TV or another monitor




- Slide the AV in/out switch to the "Out" position
- Insert each cable firmly into its designated jack.
- If your antenna uses 300-chm twin lead cables, do not coil the cables. Also, keep the twin lead cables away from audio/video cables.

- 1) Connect the supplied AV (RCA) cables into the Audio L+R and video jack on the left side of the unit following the corresponding colors: (Audio Left= White, Audio Right= Red, Video=yellow).
- 2) Connect the supplied AV cables on the other end to your TV. Match the cable by color code.

J. Receiving TV Programs

- 1. Connect the External antenna to the Cable Antenna Connector on the left side of the unit.
- 2.Press "TV/AV/DVD" until the word "TV" appears on the topright.





- 4. Press "AUTO" in remote control or "Program" on the unit, the unit will search TV channels automatically.
- 5. After the channels are searched, you can use CH $^{\blacktriangle}$ or $^{\blacktriangledown}$ to choose the channel you like.

Note:

- a. The picture and audio are not visible when searching channels.


K. Reading SD (Secure Digital) and MMC (Multimedia) Card/MS

You can enjoy high-quality pictures, music and cinema stored in an SD card.

Note:

The maximum card size is 2GB.


- 1. Press "TV/AV/DVD" until the word "DVD" appears on the top right.
- 2. Insert the SD card (with the label side faced to you) into the SD slot on the left side of the unit and the unit will read it automatically.
- 3. Press "DVD/SD-USB" button to switch between SD screen and DVD screen.
- 4. Press the▲and V button to switch between Music and Photo.
- 5. Then pull out the SD card for exit.




L. Playing DVDs

DVD Playback

- 1. Press "TV/AV/DVD" until the word "DVD" appears on the top right of the screen.;
- Insert the disk in the right side of the unit with label facing to you. Then the disk will be pulled into the unit and play will begin automatically.





DVD discs will usually show a menu to choose from. Use the navigation buttons $\blacktriangle \blacktriangleright \blacktriangle \blacktriangledown$ on the remote control.

Highlight the desired menu item and press the **ENTER** button to activate it. This starts the playback of the selected item.


To stop playback press the STOP button once. The screen shows "Press Play key to continue". The player will recall the location where playback was stopped.

Press the FLAY button to resume playback there. But if you press the STOP button again the unit will stop and not recall the last position of playback.

The "resume play" is not supported by all discs.



If this symbol appears on the screen during operation, the function requested is not supported by the media type inserted.



PICTURE ADJUSTMENT

Picture: Cycle through picture adjustments

Brightness, Contrast, Tint, Color, Sharpness

and Recall.

Vol -: Decrease picture adjustment

M. Menu

A DMD is divided into sections called titles and chapters. When you play a DWD, a root menu of the disc will appear on the screen of your TV or Monitor. The contents of the menu vary from disc to disc. Press MENU during playback to display the menu. Some DWDs only allow you to select disc playback options using the DWD root menu.


N. Display





2. SUBTITLE

During disc playback press 'SUBITHE' to select the subtitle language you desire*, with the current Subtitle Language Number (1) and the total Number of Subtitle Languages (2) displayed. If there are multiple languages press 'SUBTHE' again to select another subtitle language. To turn subtitles OFF, press the 'SUBITHE' button until 'Subtitle Off' is displayed. The Subtitle display will disappear automatically if the 'SUBITHE' button is not pressed again within 3 seconds.




Subtitle Screen Display

3. AUDIO

During playback press 'AIDIO' to select the audio language you desire*, with the current Audio Channel Number (1) and the total number of Audio Channels (2) displayed. Press AIDIO again to select another audio language. The audio display will disappear automatically if the 'AIDIO' button is not pressed within for 3 seconds.

4. REPEAT

During playback each time 'REPEAT' is pressed, the following modes will become available.

Chapter: Repeat the current chapter


Title: Repeat the current title



O. Playing Audio CDs

When playing an audio OD press the DISPLAY button repeatedly on the remote to view time information. The options below appear on screen display circularly to show you what information is available using this function.



CD Display Mode

Single Elapsed: The current track playing and playing time of that track will display on the screen.

Single Remain: The current track playing and the amount of time left.

Total Elapsed: The current track playing and the total time that the

Ohas been playing.

Total Remain: The current track playing and the amount of time

remaining on the CD.

Display Off: The CD time Information will not be displayed.

Take 'Single Elapsed' display as a example:

USING THE REPEAT FEATURE


The default mode for the Repeat feature is OFF. Pressing 1/ALL REPEAT consecutively changes the repeat options:

- Track-repeats the track that is playing.
- All-repeats the disc that is playing.
- *a*ff

As you toggle through the options, the repeat option changes. The selected repeat option loops repeatedly until you turn it off.

P. Playing MP3 Discs

MP3 is a format for storing digital audio. An audio CD-quality song is compressed into the MP3 format with very little loss of audio quality (192Kbps min) while taking up much less disc space. CD-R /RW discs that have been encoded in MP3 format are compatible with this system.



MP3 MENU Screen Display

When an MP3 disc is inserted into the unit, the menu screen appears automatically. You can use the menu screen to select your desired folders and songs or the system plays the songs in the order they were burned onto the disc.

- Press the ▲ or ▼ button to choose a folder from the folder list on the left side of the screen.
- 2. Press ENTER to select the highlighted folder. The songs available under the folderwill be listed.
- 3. Use \triangle or ∇ button to choose a song from the list. Press **ENTER** to select and begin playback of the highlighted song.

USING THE REPEAT FEATURE

The default mode for the Repeat feature is OFF. Pressing REPEAT consecutively changes the repeat options:

- Repeat One (repeat playback of a song)
- Repeat Folder (repeat playback of a specific folder)
- Repeat Off (normal playback)

As you toggle through the options, the repeat mode changes. The selected repeat mode loops repeatedly until you turn it off.

NOTICE

- " icon in front of a file name indicates that this is a folder, not an MP3 file.
- "MP3" icon in front of a file name indicates that this is an MP3 file.

Q. Setup DVD

1. General Setup Page

1) With no disc inside the player, press 'SETUP' to display the Main screen of the Setup Menu. The "General Setup Page" will also appear. At the same time, "General Setup" is highlighted. Press 'SETUP' again to exit the Setup Menu.

- 2) Press the ENIER button, "TV Display" is highlighted.
- 3) Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the other menus in general setup page.
- 4) Press > to enter the submenu.
- 5) Press the \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown button to select the submenu and press the ENIER to confirm your selection.
- 6) Repeat steps 3-5 for other menus.

Note: Press 4 to return the previous menu.

a) TV Display

- * Normal/PS: When the player outputs signal to a normal TV, a normal picture is shown on the full screen.
- * Normal/IB: When the player outputs signal to a normal TV, a normal picture is shown on the screen with a black strip at both the top and bottom of the screen.
- * Wide: When the player outputs signal to a wide screen TV, a wide picture is shown on the full screen.

b) Angle Mark

- * On: The screen will show the angle mark icon. (*If an angle option is available).
- * Off: The screen will not display the Angle Mark

NOTE: Not all discs contain above features. The above features are disc dependent.

c) Screen Saver

*On: Enables screen saver

*NOTE: The DVD player will enter the Screen Saver mode after approximately five minutes if the same image remains on the screen.*Off: Disables screen saver (off)

d) Last Memory

*On: The unit will return to the last position on the disc.

*Off: The unit will not return to the last position on the disc.

2. Password

In Setup menu, Press the \P or ightharpoonup button to select "Password Setup Page" and \ref{a} is highlighted. Press ENIER to enter the password page.

Press ENIER twice to enter the Password Change Page. Input the Old Password or the Default Password, the New Password, and Confirmed the New Password. Press ENIER to confirm the change.

Note: The default password is 3308.

4. Preference Page

- 1) In Setup menu, Press the ◀ or ▶ button to select "Preference Page" and is highlighted. Press ENIER to enter the preference page.
- 2) Press the ENIER button, "Audio" is highlighted.
- 3) Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the other menus in preference page.
- 4) Press > to enter the submenu.
- 5) Press the \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown button to select the submenu and press the ENIER to confirmyour selection.
- 6) Repeat steps 3-5 for other menus.

Note: Press 4 to return the previous menu.

- a) Audio
- b) Subtitle
- c) Disc Menu

Note: Language and subtitle selection is only available for discs that are recorded in the above listed languages. If the selected language is not available, the player will play and display on the screen the original recorded language contained in the disc.

d) Parental

Select 'Parental' using the \blacktriangle and \blacktriangledown button, then press \Longrightarrow to enter the submenu. Select the parental level you desire using \blacktriangle and \blacktriangledown the button for discs with lock-out function or multiple rating levels. These are listed from the lowest level (1 Kid Safe) to the highest level (8 Adult). Press ENIER and input 4 digit password, then press ENIER again to confirm the parental level setting.

NOTE: The level of 8 Adult is the factory default.

e) Default.

Select 'Default' using the \blacktriangle and \blacktriangledown button, then press \Longrightarrow to enter the submenu. Press ENIER to make the setting return to the factoryset mode.

NOTE: The parental setting is not affected by the default reset function.

NOTE: The Default Password is 3308. This password is always effective even after you have selected your own password and changed it. To avoid the possibility of others using the default password to set the parental level and change the password, you can record this default password in another area and delete it from this manual. Some discs can be limited depending on the age of users while some discs cannot.

R.Setup TV

Power on the TV and press the menu button to display the setup menu. The menu will automatically disappear after being inactive for ten seconds. Press menu button to exit setup menu.

Using Up/Down button to select the Screen Format item and press Enter button to select Automode and 16:9 mode




V-Chip Lock


