Start Your Installation

- Connecting the Touchmonitor (Figure 7.1)
 - To setup this touchmonitor, please refer to the following figure and procedures.
 - 1. Be sure all equipment is off.
 - 2. Connect the VGA signal cable from display input connector to the 15-pin connector of your host computer and tighten the screws.
 - 3. Connect the female end of the touchscreen cable to the serial port on the back of your PC, and the male end of the cable to your touchmonitor.
 - 4. Connect the DC power cord to the power connector; plug one end of the AC power cord into the power adapter, and then the other end into an electrical outlet.
 - 5. Connect the Audio-In cable from audio input port of your touchmonitor to the Audio-out port of your computer. If you need to use earphone, connect your earphone cable to the earphone port of your display.
 - 6. Turn on both your computer and touchmonitor.

Tilt

Grasp both sides of the monitor screen with your hands and adjust the tilt as desired.

Notice: To ensure the LCD display works well with your computer, please configure the display mode of your graphic card to less than or equal to 800 x 600 resolution. Make sure the timing of the display mode is compatible with the LCD display. We have listed the Compatibility Modes of this LCD display in the appendices for your reference.

¹⁰ How to Use the OSD Menus

- 1. Press the "MENU" button to pop up the on-screen menu and to toggle between Main Menu Page 1 to Page 3.
- 2. Choose the adjustment items by pressing the "SELECT" button.
- Press the "MENU" button again to turn off the OSD menu. If you don't operate the OSD menu in a pre-set time, the OSD will automatically disappear.

On-Screen Display Menus

First OSD Menu:



Brightness

Adjusts the brightness of the image.

Contrast

Adjusts the contrast of the display image.

Horizontal Position

Adjusts the horizontal position of the image.

Vertical Position

Adjusts the vertical position of the image.

Tracking

Synchronizes the signal timing of the display to that of the graphic card. When you are experiencing an unstable or flickering image, use this function to make an adjustment.

Frequency

Changes the display data frequency to match the frequency of your graphic card. When you are experiencing a vertical flickering bar, use this function to make an adjustment.

Auto-Adjustment

Choose this function to obtain an optimum image.

Re-Scaling

If the input resolution is less than 800 x 600, you can select this function to obtain the full screen image.

Display Mode

Select this function to demonstrate the display resolution, vertical refresh, and horizontal scan of the current mode.

OSD Off-Time

Adjusts the time period in which the OSD menu will disappear.

Language

Choose the language you need; English, French, German, Spanish and Japanese.

Text-Graphic

Toggles between VGA text mode (mode M03H) and graphic mode (mode M13H).

Volume

Allows you to control the volume of sound,

Mute

Allows you to disable the sound immediately.

Reset

Returns the display parameters of the current mode to the factory defaults.

Troubleshooting

If you are experiencing trouble with the LCD display, refer to the following. If the problem persists, please contact your local dealer or our service center. Please refer to the back cover of this manual for the phone number of the Elo TouchSystems office nearest you.

Problem: No image appears on screen.

- Check that all the I/O and power connectors are correctly and well connected as described in the "Installation " section.
- Make sure the pins of the connectors are not crooked or broken.

Problem: Partial image or incorrectly displayed image.

- Check to see if the resolution of your computer is higher than that of the LCD display.
- Reconfigure the resolution of your computer to less than or equal to 800 x 600.

Problem: Image has vertical flickering line bars.

- Use "Frequency " to make an adjustment.
- Check and reconfigure the display mode of the vertical refresh rate of your graphic card to make it compatible with the LCD display.

Problem: Image is unstable and flickering

• Use "Tracking" to make an adjustment.

Problem: Image is scrolling

- Make sure the VGA signal cable (or adapter) is well connected.
- Check and reconfigure the display mode of the vertical refresh rate of your graphic card to make it compatible with the LCD display.

Problem: Touch doesn't work

• Make sure the touchscreen cable is securely attached at both ends.

Warning Signal

Sometimes you will see warning messages from the LCD screen. This means that the LCD display cannot receive the signal from the computer graphic card.

There are three situations where this may happen. Please check the connected cables or contact your local dealer for more information.

No Signal

This message means that the LCD display has been powered on but it cannot receive any signal from the computer graphic card. Check all the power switches, power cables, and VGA signal cable.

Going to Sleep

This message means that the LCD display is in power saving mode. In addition, the LCD display will go to the sleep mode when experiencing a sudden signal disconnecting problem.

Unsupport Mode

This message means that the signal of the computer graphic card is not compatible with the LCD display. When the signal is not included in the compatibility mode we have listed in the Appendices of this manual, the LCD display will show this message.

²⁰ Installing the Driver Software

Elo TouchSystems provides driver software that allows your touchmonitor to work with your computer. Drivers are located on the enclosed CD-ROM for the following operating systems:

Windows 2000 Windows Me Windows 98 Windows 95 Windows NT 4.0

Additional drivers and driver information for other operating systems (including MS DOS, Windows 3.x, OS/2, Macintosh and Linux) are available on the Elo TouchSystems web site at www.elotouch.com.

Your Elo touchmonitor is plug-and-play compliant. Information on the video capabilities of your touchmonitor is sent to your video display adapter when Windows starts. If Windows detects your touchmonitor, follow the instructions on the screen to install a generic plug-and-play monitor.

Installing the Touch Driver for Windows 2000, Me, 95/98 and NT 4.0

Refer to the appropriate following section for driver installation instructions.

Note: For Windows 2000 and NT 4.0 you must have administrator access rights to install the driver.

1. Insert the Elo CD-ROM in your computer's CD-ROM drive.

If the AutoStart feature for your CD-ROM drive is active, the system automatically detects the CD and starts the setup program. 2. Follow the directions on the screen to complete the driver setup 21 for your version of Windows.

If the AutoStart feature is not active:

- 1. Click Start > Run.
- 2. Click the **Browse** button to locate the touch.exe program on the CD-ROM.
- 3. Click **Open**, then **OK** to run touch.exe.
- 4. Follow the directions on the screen to complete the driver setup for your version of Windows.

Installing the Touch Driver for MS-DOS and Windows 3.1

You must have a DOS mouse driver (MOUSE.COM) installed for your mouse if you wish to continue using your mouse along with your touchmonitor in DOS.

To install Windows 3.*x* and MS-DOS from Windows 95/98, follow the directions below:

- 1. Insert the Elo CD-ROM in your computer's CD-ROM drive.
- 2. From DOS, type d:\EloDW to change to the correct directory on the CD-ROM (your CD-ROM drive may be mapped to a different drive letter).
- 3. Type install and press Enter to start the installation.
- 4. Align the touchscreen.

Refer to Chapter 2 of the Elo DOS and Windows Driver Guide as necessary for additional installation information. The driver guide can be found on Elo's web site at www.elotouch.com. To run the INSTALL program:

- 1. Type INSTALL at the DOS prompt in the directory containing the driver install files.
- 2. INSTALL asks you to select the software to install. Then choose d:\EloDW from the displayed list.
- 3. INSTALL also asks you for the paths to use during installation, or you may use its defaults. INSTALL creates directories as necessary, and warns you if they exist.

If you are updating your software, you may wish to specify the paths containing the earlier versions, and overwrite the obsolete files. All executable programs are upward compatible. For a list of differences from each previous version of the drivers, be sure to select "Differences from Previous Versions" during the installation process.

INSTALL updates your AUTOEXEC.BAT file with the drivers you select. INSTALL makes a copy of your original AUTOEXEC.BAT called AUTOEXEC.OLD. If you already have Elo driver commands in your AUTOEXEC.BAT file, they will be commented out.

When INSTALL is finished, it leaves a file called GO.BAT in the subdirectory you specified. GO loads the touchscreen driver, runs the calibration program ELOCALIB, and gives you some final instructions.

If you are using Windows 3.1, you will also calibrate the touchscreen within Windows 3.1 with the Touchscreen Control Panel.

Regulatory Information

I. Electrical Safety Information:

Buyer shall notify Seller in writing promptly (and in no case later than thirty (30) days after discovery) of the failure of any Product to conform to the warranty set forth above; shall describe in commercially reasonable detail in such notice the symptoms associated with such failure; and shall provide to Seller the opportunity to inspect such Products as installed, if possible. The notice must be received by Seller during the Warranty Period for such product, unless otherwise directed in writing by the Seller.
