PRECAUTIONS

NOTES ON HANDLING:

- When shipping the DVD player, always use the original shipping carton and packing materials. For maximum protection, repack the unit as it was originally packed at the factory.
- Do not use volatile liquids, such as insect spray, near the DVD player. Do not leave rubber or plastic products in contact with the DVD player for a long time. They will leave marks on the finish.
- The top and rear panels of the DVD player may become warm after a long period of use. This is normal and not a malfunction.
- When the DVD player is not in use, be sure to remove the disc and turn off the power.
- If you do not use the DVD player for a long period, the unit may not function properly in the future. Turn on and use the DVD player occasionally.

NOTES ON LOCATING THE DVD PLAYER:

 When you place this DVD player near a TV, radio, or VCR, the playback picture may become poor and the sound may be distorted. In this case, move the DVD player away from the TV, radio, or VCR.

NOTES ON CLEANING:

Use a soft, dry cloth for cleaning.

- For stubborn dirt, soak the cloth in a weak detergent solution, wring well and wipe. Use a dry cloth to wipe it dry. Do not use any type of solvent, such as thinner and benzine, as they may damage the surface of the DVD player.
- If you use a chemical saturated cloth to clean the unit, follow that product's instructions.

TO OBTAIN A CLEAR PICTURE:

The DVD player is a high technology, precision device. If the optical pick-up lens and disc drive parts are dirty or worn down, the picture quality becomes poor. To obtain a clear picture, we recommend regular inspection and maintenance (cleaning or parts replacement) every 1,000 hours of use depending on the operating environment. For details, contact your nearest dealer.

NOTES ON MOISTURE CONDENSATION

Moisture condensation damages the DVD player. Please read the following carefully.

Moisture condensation occurs, for example, when you pour a cold drink into a glass on a warm day. Drops of water form on the outside of the glass. In the same way, moisture may condense on the optical pick-up lens inside this unit, one of the most crucial internal parts of the DVD player.

Moisture Condensation occurs during the following cases:

•When you bring the DVD player directly from a cold place to a warm place.

•When you use the DVD player in a room where you just turned on the heater, or a place where the cold wind from the air conditioner directly hits the unit.

•In summer, when you use the DVD player in a hot and humid place just after you move the unit from an air conditioned room.

•When you use the DVD player in a humid place.

Do not use the DVD player when moisture condensation may occur.

If you use the DVD player in such a situation, it may damage discs and internal parts. Remove the disc, connect the power cord of the DVD player to the wall outlet, turn on the DVD player and leave it "ON" for two or three hours. After two or three hours, the DVD player will have warmed up and evaporated any moisture. Keep the DVD player connected to the wall outlet and moisture condensation will seldom occur.

POWER SOURCE

Insert the AC plug (with the 2 blades) into a conveniently located AC outlet having 120V, 60 Hz.

NOTE: The AC plug supplied with the unit is polarized to help minimize the possibility of electric shock. If the AC plug does not fit into a nonpolarized AC outlet, do not file or cut the wide blade. It is the user's responsibility to have an electrician replace the obsolete outlet.

REMOTE CONTROL

BATTERY INSTALLATION



- 1. Open the battery compartment cover by sliding it out.
- 2. Install two "AA" batteries, paying attention to the polarity diagram in the battery compartment.
- 3. Replace the battery compartment cover.

BATTERY PRECAUTIONS

Follow these precautions when using batteries in this device:

- 1. Use only the size and type of batteries specified.
- 2. Be sure to follow the correct polarity when installing the batteries as indicated next to the battery compartment. Reversed batteries may cause damage to the device.
- 3. Do not mix different types of batteries together (e.g. Alkaline and Carbon-zinc) or old batteries with fresh ones.
- 4. If the device is not to be used for a long period of time, remove the batteries to prevent damage or injury from possible battery leakage.
- 5. Do not try to recharge batteries not intended to be recharged; they can overheat and rupture. (Follow battery manufacturer's directions.)

- If your TV only has one audio input, the use of a "Y" connector may be necessary. Visit your local electronics supply store.
- Connect the DVD player to your TV directly. If you connect the DVD player through a VCR, the playback picture will be distorted because DVD video discs are copy protected.
- Set the VIDEO SELECT Option (on the GENERAL MENU Page) to CVBS if using S-Video.
- After connecting, press the AUDIO MODE button to the desired audio setting.

CONNECTING THE DVD TO A TV USING THE Y/PB/PR JACKS



NOTES FOR CONNECTING TO A TV:

- TV must have Y, PB and PR input jacks.
- Set the VIDEO SELECT Option (on the GENERAL Menu Page) to YUV if using the component Video Out jacks.

CONNECTING THE DVD TO A HOME THEATRE SYSTEM



Place the subwoofer, front, rear and center speakers in locations as shown/described here. After correctly positioning the speakers, perform the Tone Test on the AV Amplifier and adjust the volume controls until the desired sound is achieved. For best results, sit in the viewing position and have someone adjust the volumes for you; this will enable you to set the optimal levels.

NOTE: To avoid scratching the furniture, place felt pads (not included) to the bottom of each speaker.

NOTE:

The rear speakers can also be located on the side wall facing the viewing position and each other. Make sure the viewing position is located between the 2 speakers in this case. Experiment to find optimal position.

NOTES FOR CONNECTING TO A TV:

- If your TV has an S-Video input, connect the DVD player with the S-Video cable for best results, otherwise use the video out jack on the DVD player.
- When connecting the DVD, refer to the owner's manual for the TV and the audio system, as well as this manual.
- When connecting, make sure the power is off and all units are unplugged before making any connections.
- Connect the DVD player to your TV directly. If you connect the DVD player through a VCR, the playback picture will be distorted because DVD video discs are copy protected.
- If using a TV with a blue screen option, turn the option off on the TV for best results.
- If you place the DVD player near a tuner, the radio broadcast sound might be distorted. In this case, move the DVD player away from the tuner.
- After connecting, press the AUDIO MODE button to the desired audio setting.

AUDIO CDs

When playing an MP3, "MP3" will appear in the display, and the TV screen will list the tracks. **MP3:**

MP3 is the abbreviation of "MPEG1 Audio Layer 3". MPEG Audio is a format that compresses the audio portion only. **IMPORTANT NOTES:**

• Due to many variables, including recording condition, type of disc, writing software, etc., this unit does not guarantee playback of all MP3 discs.

DISC TYPES:

DVD

Data on most DVDs is divided into sections called "titles" and then into subsections called "chapters", each of which is given a title or chapter number. Some features of this DVD player will not operate with some DVD discs as they are preset. If a function you selected does not run as desired, refer to the manual accompanying the DVD disc.

AUDIO CD

Data on an audio CD is divided into sections called "tracks", each of which is given a track number.



IMPORTANT:

It is important that you read the manual that accompanies the DVD disc, as there are features that are on the DVD player that cannot be used with certain DVDs. There are also extra features on the DVD disc that are different for each DVD disc, so they are not explained in this owner's manual.

This player conforms to the NTSC and PAL color systems. However, if you are in the USA, leave this setting on NTSC. If incorrectly set to PAL, the TV picture will roll vertically. In this case, simply turn the DVD off, and then back on.

SET-UP MENU

The setup menu lets you to customize the DVD player by allowing you to select various language preferences, set up a parental level, turn captions and screen saver on and off, adjust what type of television screen you have and more. Below, find the menu, and then find the corresponding page that describes the features of the selected menu option.

DISC MENU

LOCALE





Select the language the DISC MENU will be in (ENGLISH, CHINESE, FRENCH, SPANISH, JAPANESE). The DVD's DISC MENU must be made in the selected language, otherwise the default language of the DVD will be shown. Select the location in which the unit will used (CHINA, FRANCE, HONG KONG, JAPAN, TAIWAN, GBR or USA). This is used for determining the Parental Control settings.

PARENTAL

The Parental option enables parents to prevent their children from watching inappropriate material on a DVD. It reads the ratings for programming, then denies access to programming if the program's rating meets the limitations you select. In this case, the user will have to enter a password.



PASSWORD

Select this option to change the password. You must know the old password in order to change it. If you have forgotten the password, call customer service at the number listed in the warranty.



DEFAULTS

Select this option to reset all the preferences (except PASSWORD) to their original factory settings. This is useful to reset the NTSC System.



BASIC OPERATION (GENERAL)

IMPORTANT:

When the "," symbol appears while pressing a button, this means that the corresponding function cannot be performed either on the disc inserted, or in the selected mode.

3D SOUND

3D audio post-processing will give a multichannel effect when using only 2 speakers. This only works with discs encoded with Dolby Pro Logic, Dolby Digital and DTS multichannel audio tracks.



While playing an audio CD (not DVD), you can cycle between the audio modes as follows:



MUTE:

Press the MUTE button once to mute the sound, MUTE" will briefly appear on the TV screen. Press the MUTE button again to restore the sound.

DISPLAY

Each press of the DISPLAY button will display the elapsed time and remaining time of a playing disc. Each press of the DISPLAY button will cycle through, depending on the playback mode as follows:

DVD BASIC OPERATION

IMPORTANT NOTES:

- When turning the unit on for the first time, press the POWER button on the main unit (not the remote control) to the ON (in) position. You can then use the remote control to turn the unit off and on, as long as you do not press the POWER button on the main unit to the OFF (out) position. When the unit is in the Standby mode, the STANDBY indicator will light.
- "()" will appear on the TV screen during operation if you try to access a function that is not available on the disc.
- Some discs may take may few seconds to load.
- If a disc is inserted incorrectly, dirty, damaged or not present at all, "NO DISC" will appear in the display.
- Always hold the disc without touching either of its surfaces. When inserted a disc, position it with the printed title side facing up, align it with the guides and place it in its proper position.
- It is important that you read the manual that accompanies the DVD disc as there are features that are on this DVD player that cannot be used with certain DVDs. There are also extra features on the DVD disc that are different for each DVD disc, so they are not explained in this owner's manual.

PLAYBACK OF A DVD



Press the POWER button to turn on the unit. If turned on with the remote control, the STANDBY indicator will go out. See important note regarding STANDBY above.



Press the OPEN/CLOSE button ① to close the disc tray. "CLOSE" will appear on the screen and the display. The menu screen of the DVD should appear. Use the Navigation (\blacktriangleleft , \blacktriangleright , \blacktriangle , \blacktriangledown) buttons ② to select the desired option and ENTER button ③ to select it.

If the password is set and the inserted disc is within the Parental Ratings set, then the Password screen will appear, prompting you to enter the password.



Press the OPEN/CLOSE button to open the disc tray, "OPEN" will appear on the screen and in the display. Insert a disc will the label side facing up on the disc tray.



To stop playback, press the Stop (\blacksquare) button ①; "PRESS PLAY TO CONTINUE" will appear on the TV screen. Because the unit will remember where you stopped, simply press the Play (\triangleright) button ② to resume playback where you left off (resuming playback).

If the Stop (\blacksquare) button ① is pressed twice, the TV screen shows "STOP" and the unit will stop completely.

NOTES:

- If a MENU appears on the TV screen, press the Navigation (◄,►,▲,▼) buttons to select the desired option/item, then
 press the ENTER button. Please make sure to refer to the disc's jacket or case of the disc.
- · Resuming playback may not work on all discs.

DVD BASIC OPERATION (CONTINUED)

MAIN UNIT KEY LOCK

This feature is used to disable all the buttons on the main unit, except for the POWER button.



Press the KEY LOCK button; "KEY LOCK ON" will appear briefly on the TV display, and no buttons can be pressed on the main unit, except for the POWER button.

To turn the Key Lock feature off, press the KEY LOCK button again; "KEY LOCK OFF" will appear briefly on the TV screen.

SKIP

SLOW/R AND SLOW/F

Use this feature to move the DVD in slow motion.



During playback, press either the SLOW/R or SLOW/F button ① to move the DVD forward or backward in slow motion speeds of 1/2, 1/4, 1/8. The sound will be muted. The player will move forward or backward in slow motion until the PLAY (\triangleright) button ② is pressed again; normal playback will resume at that point.



 Press the Skip (►►) button ① to advance the DVD to the beginning of the next chapter. Press the Skip (►◄) button ② to move the DVD to the beginning of the previous chapters. 	During playback, press either the Search ►► button or Search ◄ button • to move the DVD forward or backward at double (x2) speed to locate a specific section. Repeatedly press these buttons and the speed with increase to x4, x6 and x8. The DVD will move forward or backward at high speed until the PLAY (►) button • is pressed again; normal playback will resume at that point.

DVD BASIC OPERATION (CONTINUED)

TITLE/CHAPTER SEARCH

Use this feature to directly go to a specific title and/or chapter.



Press the SEARCH button ① once. Press the Navigation $(\blacktriangleleft, \blacktriangleright)$ buttons ② to select the TITLE, then use the Number buttons ③ to select the desired title number.

Press the Navigation $(\blacktriangleleft, \blacktriangleright)$ buttons @ to select the CHAPTER, then use the Number buttons B to select the desired chapter number.

Press the PLAY (\blacktriangleright) button O to begin playback at the selected title and chapter.

TITLE/TIME SEARCH

Use this feature to directly go to a specific title and/or time.



While in the Stop mode, press the SEARCH button ① twice. Press the Navigation (\triangleleft , \triangleright) buttons ② to select the TITLE, then use the Number buttons ③ to select the desired title number.

Press the Navigation $(\blacktriangleleft, \blacktriangleright)$ buttons @ to select the TIME, then use the Number buttons @ to select the desired time. Press the PLAY (\triangleright) button @ to begin playback at the selected title and time.

NOTES:

- If the Search feature is attempted in the Play mode, then you can only go to a specific chapter or time, you cannot change the title number.
- If you enter a time that exceeds the time limit of the DVD, then the "." symbol will appear, and you must try again.
- Repeat may not work properly with some discs.

REPEAT PLAYBACK:

While playing back a DVD, this unit can repeatedly play back a chapter or title repeatedly as follows



A-B REPEAT PLAYBACK:

While playing back a DVD, this unit can repeatedly play back a specific section.



While in the Playback mode, press the A-B button to define While in the Playback mode, press the REPEAT button once; "TITLE REPEAT ON" will appear briefly on the TV where you want the section to start. Press the A-B button screen and the currently playing Title will repeat again to define where you would like the section to end, the continuously. unit will then play the selected area continuously. While in the Playback mode, press the REPEAT button a Press the A-B button again to cancel A-B Repeat mode; second time; "CHAPTER REPEAT ON" will appear briefly "CANCELLED" will appear on the TV screen. on the TV screen and the currently playing Chapter will repeat continuously. AUDIO MENU

Press the AUDIO MENU button to change the audio language. This feature is not available on all discs.

DVD MENU



Press the DVD MENU button ①, and the Main Menu of the disc will appear. Use the Navigation $(\blacktriangleleft, \triangleright, \blacktriangle, \checkmark, \lor)$ buttons ② to select the desired option, and then press the ENTER button ③.

This is not available on all discs.

ZOOM

The image on the screen can be magnified as follows:

SUBTITLE



Press the SUBTITLE MENU button to select a subtitle language, and to turn the subtitle menu on/off. This feature is not available on all discs.

TITLE MENU



Press the TITLE MENU button ①, and the Title Menu of the disc will appear. Use the Navigation $(\blacktriangleleft, \blacktriangleright, \blacktriangle, \blacktriangledown, \lor)$ buttons ② to select the desired option, and then press the ENTER button ③.

This is not available on all discs.

ANGLE

Some discs may contain scenes which have been shot simultaneously from a number of different camera angles. This feature only works on discs with more than one camera angle. The jacket will be marked with "°°(1"



MP3 BASIC OPERATION

PLAYBACK OF AN MP3 CD



Press the POWER button to turn on the unit. If turned on with the remote control, the STANDBY indicator will go out.



Press the OPEN/CLOSE button to close the disc tray. "CLOSE" will appear on the screen and the display. After loading, the TRACK/FILE menu will appear on the TV screen and playback will start automatically on most discs.

SELECTING TRACKS/FILES USING THE NUMBER BUTTONS



After the MP3 CD has been loaded, press the Stop (\blacksquare) button **①** to enter the Stop mode. Then, simply press the number buttons **②** corresponding to the track number you would like to play, followed by the ENTER button **③**.



Press the OPEN/CLOSE button to open the disc tray, "OPEN" will appear on the screen and in the display. Insert an MP3 disc will the label side facing up on the disc tray.



To stop playback, press the Stop (\blacksquare) button ①; Press the Play (\triangleright) button ② to start playback again.

SELECTING TRACKS/FILES USING THE SKIP (>>+) OR (+<+) BUTTON



After the MP3 CD has been loaded, simply press the Skip (\blacktriangleright) or (\blacksquare) button to select a track to be played. If the MP3 CD has multiple folders/pages, you can access the remaining folders by repeatedly pressing the (\blacktriangleright) or (\blacksquare) button.

To Repeat play a track/file, simply select the track/file as described on the previous page, then press the REPEAT button • once; "REP-ONE" will appear on the TV screen and the unit will repeat the selected track/file continuously until the STOP button • is pressed. MP3 FAQs (Frequently Asked Questions)

Please read before playing an MP3 CD.

What is an MP3 file?

An MP3 file is a computer format that makes a usually large music file into a smaller one which is more convenient to download and share.

Can I record my own MP3 CDs?

Yes, but you need a CD recorder, which is available from you local computer store.

Where can I find MP3 files?

MP3 files are available all over the internet.

Can this unit read regular music CDs?

Yes it can. However, you cannot mix MP3s and WAV files on the same CD. If you do this, the CD Player will play only the MP3 files.

Can I use the MP3 extension for non-audio data files?

No, this may result in serious malfunction and harmful noise interference.

Can I mix MP3 files with other file types on the CDR?

Yes, but your CD player will ignore those files and read only the MP3 files on the CDR.

Does this unit support subdirectories (subfolders)?

Yes, it can read MP3 files from subfolders.

Press the POWER button to turn on the unit. If turned on with the remote control, the STANDBY indicator will go out.



Press the OPEN/CLOSE button to close the disc tray. "CLOSE" will appear on the screen and the display. After loading, playback will start automatically.



Press the OPEN/CLOSE button to open the disc tray, "OPEN" will appear on the screen and in the display. Insert a disc will the label side facing up on the disc tray.



To stop playback, press the Stop (\blacksquare) button ①; Press the Play (\triangleright) button ② to start playback again.

Press the number buttons **①** corresponding to the track number you would like to play, followed by the ENTER button **②**.

Press the Skip (\blacktriangleright) or (\blacksquare) button to select a track to be played.

PROGRAMMED PLAYBACK

The CD player in this unit has a 99 track programmable memory that allows you to program up to 99 tracks on any disc for playback in any desired order. You may program 99 different tracks or you may also program certain tracks to play more than once. Programmed Playback only works for CDs, it does not work on DVDs or MP3 CDs. To perform programmed playback, proceed as follows:



TO CANCEL THE PROGRAM:

To cancel the program function, press the PROGRAM button twice, or press the OPEN/CLOSE button.

CD/VCD BASIC OPERATION (CONTINUED)

PBC (VCD ONLY)

DIGEST (VCD ONLY)

When playing a VCD with PBC function, you can enjoy simply interactive software on your TV.



Press the PBC button **1** to activate the "PBC ON" mode. THE VCD MUST HAVE THIS FUNCTION.

Press the Skip (►►) button ❷ to go to the Track Selection Menu. THE VCD MUST HAVE THIS MENU.

Press the Number buttons **③** to select the desired track to play. Press the RETURN button **④** to return to the Track Selection Menu.

Follow the instructions supplied with the disc as the operating procedure may differ according to the VCD.



While in the Stop mode, press the DIGEST button ①; the starting picture of all the tracks will appear on the TV screen simultaneously. If there are more than 9 tracks, press the Skip ($\blacktriangleright \blacksquare$) button ② to go to the next page. Press the Number buttons ③ to select the desired track.

Press the ENTER button **1** to start playback.

CARE AND MAINTENANCE

Caring for Compact Discs

• Treat the disc carefully. Handle the disc only by its edges. Never allow your fingers to come in contact with the shiny, unprinted side of the disc.



- Do not attach adhesive tape, stickers, etc. to the disc label.
- Clean the disc periodically with a soft, lint-free, dry cloth. Never use detergents or abrasive cleaners to clean the disc. If necessary, use a CD cleaning kit.
- If a disc skips or gets stuck on a section of the disc, it is probably dirty or damaged (scratched).
- When cleaning the disc, wipe in straight lines from the center of the disc to the outer edge of the disc. Never wipe in circular motions.



- Compact Discs should be stored in their cases after each use to avoid damage.
- Do not expose compact discs to direct sunlight, high humidity, high temperatures, or dust, etc. Prolonged exposure or extreme temperatures can warp the disc.
- Do not stick or write anything on either side of the disc. Sharp writing instruments, or the ink may damage the surface.

Cleaning the unit

- To prevent fire or shock hazard, disconnect your unit from the AC power source when cleaning.
- The finish on your unit may be cleaned with a dust cloth and cared for as other furniture. Use caution when cleaning and wiping the plastic parts.
- Mild soap and a damp cloth may be used on the front panel.
