## **Child Safety**

# It makes a difference how and where you use your flat panel display

# As you enjoy your new product, keep these safety tips in mind

## The issue

The home theater entertainment experience is a growing trend, and larger TVs are popular purchases. However, TVs are not always supported on the proper stands or installed according to the manufacturer's recommendations. We and the consumer electronics industry are committed to making home entertainment enjoyable and safe.

TVs that are inappropriately placed on dressers, bookcases, shelves, desks, speakers, chests, or carts may fall over and cause injury.

## Tune into safety

- One size of TV stand does **not** fit all. Use only a TV stand rated for the weight of your TV.
- Carefully read and understand all enclosed instructions for proper use of this product.
- Don't let children climb on or play with entertainment system furniture and TVs.
- Don't place TVs on furniture that can easily be used as steps, such as a chest of drawers.
- Remember that children can become excited while watching a program, especially on a "larger-than-life" TV. Make sure that you place or install the TV where it cannot be pushed, pulled over, or knocked down.
- Make sure that you route all cords and cables so that they cannot be pulled or grabbed by curious children.



## Wall mounting

If you decide to wall mount your TV, always:

- One size of wall mount does **not** fit all. Use only a wall mount rated for the weight of your TV and that has been recommended by this TV manufacturer, listed in this manual, or otherwise listed by an independent laboratory (such as UL, CSA, or ETL) as suitable for your TV.
- Follow all instructions supplied by the TV and wall mount manufacturers.
- If you have any doubts about your ability to safely wall mount your TV, get help from a
  professional installer.
- Make sure that the wall where you are mounting the TV is appropriate. Some wall mounts are not designed to be mounted to walls backed with steel studs or cinder blocks. If you are unsure, ask a professional installer.



TVs can be heavy. At least two people are required for safe wall mount installation.

#### **Condensation**

Moisture will form in the operating section of the player if the player is brought from cool surroundings into a warm room or if the temperature of the room rises suddenly. When this happens, the DVD player's performance will be impaired. To prevent this, let the player stand in its new surroundings for about an hour before switching it on, or make sure that the room temperature rises gradually.

Condensation may also form during the summer if the player is exposed to the breeze from an air conditioner. In such cases, change the location of the player.

## **Handling the LCD panel**

- Do not press hard or jolt the LCD panel. It may cause the LCD panel glass to break and injury may occur.
- If the LCD panel is broken, make absolutely sure that you do not touch the liquid in the panel. This may cause skin inflammation.
- If the liquid gets in your mouth, immediately gargle and consult with your doctor. Also, if the liquid gets in your eyes or touches your skin, consult with your doctor after rinsing for at least 15 minutes or longer in clean water.

## Damage requiring service

Unplug this TV from the power outlet and refer servicing to qualified service personnel under the following conditions:

- When the power supply cord or plug is damaged or frayed.
- If liquid has been spilled or objects have fallen into your TV/DVD combo.
- If your TV/DVD combo has been exposed to rain or water.
- If your TV/DVD combo does not operate normally by following
  the operating instructions. Adjust only those controls that are
  covered by the operating instructions because incorrect
  adjustment of other controls may result in damage and will often
  require extensive work by a qualified technician to restore your
  TV/DVD combo to its normal operation.
- If your TV/DVD combo has been dropped or damaged in any way.
- When your TV/DVD combo exhibits a distinct change in performance.


#### Replacement parts


## Front panel and top buttons

**Note:** The buttons are on the top of your TV/DVD combo.




#	Component	Description
1	INPUT button	Press to select the video input source.
2	MENU button	Press to open the main menu.
3	VOL- / VOL+ buttons	Press to decrease or increase the volume.
4	CH-/CH+ buttons	In TV mode, press to go to the next lower or higher channel. In menu mode, press to move down or up in a menu.
5	POWER button	Press to turn on your TV/DVD combo or to put it in standby mode. When your TV/DVD combo is in standby mode, power is still flowing into your TV/DVD combo. To disconnect all power, unplug the power cord.
6	Power indicator	Lights red when your TV/DVD combo is in standby mode. Lights green when your TV/DVD combo is turned on.
7	Remote control sensor	Receives signals from the remote control. Do not block.

## **Right side**




#	Component	Description
1	■ STOP button	Press to stop playback. If you press this button once then press ►II, your TV/DVD combo begins playback where it stopped. If you press this button twice then press ►II, your TV/DVD combo begins playback at the beginning of the disc.
2	▶II PLAY/PAUSE button	Press to pause playback. Press again to resume playback.
3	▲ OPEN/CLOSE button	Press to eject the disc from the disc slot.
4	▶► NEXT button	Press to go to the next chapter or track.



# Setting up your TV/DVD combo Installing remote control batteries

#### To install remote control batteries:

1 Open the battery compartment cover.




- Insert two AA batteries into the battery compartment. Make sure that the + and - symbols on the batteries match the + and symbols in the battery compartment.
- 3 Close the cover.

## Using the remote control

#### To use the remote control:

 Point the remote control at the remote control sensor on the front of your TV. The remote control's range is 30° to each side of the remote sensor, 15° above and below the sensor, and within 26.25 ft. (8 m) of the sensor.



**Caution:** Do not expose the remote control to liquids, direct sunlight, or shock. Do not mix batteries of different types.

#### Notes:

Objects between the remote control the remote control sensor may block the remote control signal.

Direct sunlight or other bright light shining on the remote control sensor may decrease the range of the remote control. In this case, change the angle of the lighting, move your TV/DVD combo, or operate the remote control closer to the remote control sensor.

## Connecting an antenna or cable TV (no box)

#### To connect an antenna or cable TV (no box):

1 Connect one end of a coaxial cable (not included) to the ANT IN jack on the back of your TV/DVD combo, then connect the other end of the cable into the antenna or cable TV wall outlet.



2 To improve picture quality from an antenna in a poor signal area, install a signal amplifier.




3 If you need to split the antenna signal to connect two TVs, install a two-way splitter.

## Connecting a cable TV box with a coaxial cable

#### To connect a cable TV box with a coaxial cable:

- Make sure that your TV/DVD combo and the cable box are turned off.
- 2 Connect a coaxial cable (not included) to the **ANT IN** jack on the back of your TV/DVD combo, then connect the other end of the cable to the coaxial out jack on the cable box.




- **3** Set the channel switch on the cable TV box to 3 or 4.
- **4** Turn on your TV/DVD combo and the cable TV box, then set the TV channel to the same channel you selected in Step 3 (3 or 4).
- 5 Use the cable TV box controls or the cable TV box remote control to change channels.

## Connecting a cable TV box with a standard AV cable

#### To connect a cable TV box with a standard AV cable:

- 1 Make sure that your TV/DVD combo and the cable TV box are turned off.
- 2 Connect a standard AV cable (not included) to the VIDEO IN (yellow) and adjacent R (red) and L (white) AUDIO jacks on the back of your TV/DVD combo, then connect the other end of the cable to the VIDEO and AUDIO OUT jacks on the cable TV box.




- 3 Turn on your TV/DVD combo and the cable TV box.
- 4 Press INPUT, press CH+ or CH- to select VIDEO, then press FNTER
- 5 Use the cable TV box controls or the cable TV box remote control to change channels.

## Connecting a VCR with a standard AV cable

A standard AV connection provides good video and audio.

#### To connect a VCR with a standard AV cable:

- 1 Make sure that your TV/DVD combo and the VCR are turned off.
- 2 Connect a standard AV cable (not included) to the **VIDEO IN** (yellow) and adjacent **R** (red) and **L** (white) **AUDIO** jacks on the back of your TV/DVD combo, then connect the other end of the cable to the **VIDEO** and **AUDIO OUT** jacks on the VCR.




- 3 Turn on your TV/DVD combo and the VCR.
- 4 Press INPUT, press CH+ or CH- to select VIDEO, then press ENTER.

### Connecting a VCR with an S-Video cable

An S-Video connection provides better video than a standard AV connection.

#### To connect a VCR with an S-Video cable:

- 1 Make sure that your TV/DVD combo and the VCR are turned off.
- 2 Connect an S-Video cable (not included) to the S-VIDEO jack on the back of your TV/DVD combo, then connect the other end of the cable to the S-VIDEO OUT jack on the VCR.




- 3 Connect a standard audio cable (not included) to the R and L AUDIO jacks to the left of the VIDEO jack on the back of your TV/DVD combo, then connect the other end of the cable to the AUDIO OUT jacks on the VCR.
- 4 Turn on your TV/DVD combo and the VCR.
- 5 Press INPUT, press CH+ or CH- to select S-VIDEO, then press ENTER.

## Connecting a component video device

A component video device provides better video than an S-Video connection.

#### To connect a component video device:

- Make sure that your TV/DVD combo and the component video device are turned off.
- 2 Connect a component video cable (not included) to the Pr, Pb, and Y jacks on the back of your TV/DVD combo, then connect the other end of the cable to the corresponding COMPONENT OUT jacks on the component video device.




- 3 Connect a standard audio cable (not included) to the R and L AUDIO jacks below the Pr, Pb, and Y jacks on the back of your TV/DVD combo, then connect the other end of the cable to the COMPONENT AUDIO OUT jacks on the VCR.
- **4** Turn on your TV/DVD combo and the component video device.
- 5 Press INPUT, press CH+ or CH- to select COMPONENT, then press ENTER.

## Connecting an HDMI device

An HDMI connection provides the best video and audio. An HDMI cable carries both video and audio, so you do not need to make an audio connection.

#### To connect an HDMI device:

- Make sure that your TV/DVD combo and the HDMI device are turned off.
- 2 Connect an HDMI cable (not included) to the HDMI jack on the back of your TV/DVD combo, then connect the other end of the cable to the HDMI OUT jack on the HDMI device.



3 Press INPUT, press CH+ or CH- to select HDMI, then press ENTER.

## Connecting a camcorder or video game


#### To connect a camcorder or video game:

 Follow the instructions in "Connecting a VCR with a standard AV cable" on page 10.

#### Connecting a computer

#### To connect a computer:

- 1 Make sure that the computer has a VGA jack. See the documentation that came with the computer.
- Make sure that the computer and your TV/DVD combo are turned off.
- **3** Connect a VGA cable (not supplied) to the **VGA IN** jack on the back of your TV/DVD combo, then connect the other end of the cable to the **VGA** jack on the computer.



- 4 Connect an audio cable (not included) to the PC AUDIO IN jack on the back of your TV/DVD combo, then connect the other end of the cable to the AUDIO OUT jacks on the computer.
- 5 Turn on your TV/DVD combo first, then turn on the computer.
- 6 Press INPUT, press CH+ or CH- to select PC, then press ENTER.
- 7 If you see video "noise" on the screen, you may need to adjust the brightness or contrast on your TV/DVD combo or the computer's video resolution or refresh rate on the computer. For information about adjusting the video on your TV/DVD combo, see "Adjusting the computer image" on page 14. For information about adjusting the video on the computer, see the documentation that came with the computer.

## Using the TV

All instructions use the remote control unless otherwise noted.

### **Turning on your TV/DVD combo**

#### To turn on your TV/DVD combo:


- 1 Plug the power cord into a power outlet. Your TV/DVD combo enters standby mode and the power indicator lights red.
- 2 Press **O POWER**. Your TV/DVD combo turns on and the power indicator lights green.
- 3 To put your TV/DVD combo into standby mode, press 🖰 POWER again.

Caution: When your TV/DVD combo is in standby mode, power is still flowing into your TV/DVD combo. To disconnect all power, unplug the power cord.

### Selecting the TV signal source

#### To select the TV signal source:

 Press MENU, then press CH+ or CH- repeatedly until the Channel menu appears.




- **2** Press **VOL+** or **ENTER** to open the *Channel* menu.
- 3 Press CH+ or CH- repeatedly to select Tuner, then press VOL+ or VOL- to select Antenna or Cable.

## Setting up the channel list

The first time you use your TV/DVD combo or if you move your TV/DVD combo to a different broadcast area, you need to scan for channels. Your TV/DVD combo scans for channels available in your area and stores the channel information in the channel list. When you press **CH**+ or **CH**-, your TV/DVD combo goes to the next or previous channel in the channel list and skips any channel numbers that do not have a broadcast signal.


#### To set up the channel list:

1 Press **MENU**, then press **CH**+ or **CH**- repeatedly until the *Channel* menu appears.



**2** Press **VOL+** or **ENTER** to open the *Channel* menu.

3 Press CH+ or CH- repeatedly to select Channel Scan, then press VOL+ or ENTER to start scanning for channels.



When the scan is complete, your TV/DVD combo displays the first channel in the channel list.

## Selecting the video input source

To select the video input source:

- Press INPUT to open the Select Source menu, then press CH+ or CH- repeatedly to select the video input source. You can select TV, VIDEO, S-VIDEO, Component, DVD, PC, or HDMI.
- 2 Press ENTER to confirm.

## Adjusting the volume

To adjust the volume:

- Press **VOL**+ or **VOL** to increase or decrease the volume.
- Press MUTE to turn off the sound. Press MUTE again or VOL+ to restore the sound.

### **Changing TV channels**

To change TV channels:

- To tune directly to a channel, press the number buttons for the channel number.
- To go to the last viewed channel, press **RECALL**.

## **Cleaning the cabinet**

Wipe the front panel and other exterior surfaces of your TV/DVD combo with a soft cloth lightly dampened with lukewarm water.

## **Handling discs**

A dirty, scratched, or warped disc may cause skipping or noise. To care for discs:






- Hold discs by their edges.
- Store discs in their cases when you are not using them.
  Do not expose discs to direct sunlight, high humidity, high temperature, or dust. Prolonged exposure to extreme temperatures can warp discs.
- Do not stick labels or tape on discs.

## **Cleaning discs**

To clean a disc:



• With a soft cloth, wipe the disc from the center to the outer edge. Caution: Do not use detergent or abrasive cleaning agents. They will damage the disc surface.
