Charge the battery


Your device has a built-in battery. Before using the device for the first time, you must charge the battery.



Use only Samsung-approved chargers. Unauthorised chargers can cause batteries to explode or damage your device.



- Charge the battery only with a charger. You cannot charge the battery with the PC data cable.
- When your battery is low, the device will emit a
 warning tone and display a low battery message.
 The battery icon will also be empty and turn red.
 If the battery level becomes too low, the device will
 automatically power off. Recharge your battery to
 continue using your device.
- Connect the PC data cable to the USB power adapter and then plug the end of the PC data cable into the multifunction jack.

Connecting the travel adapter improperly may cause serious damage to the device. Any damage caused by misuse is not covered by the warranty.

Plug the USB power adapter into a power outlet.



- You can use the device while it is charging, but it may take longer to fully charge the battery.
- While the device is charging, the touch screen and the touch keys may not function due to an unstable power supply. If this happens, unplug the USB power adapter from the power outlet or unplug the PC data cable from the device.
- While charging, the device may heat up. This is normal and should not affect your device's lifespan or performance.
- If your device is not charging properly, bring your device and the charger to a Samsung Service Centre.
- 3 When the battery is fully charged (the battery icon is no longer moving), unplug the USB power adapter and PC data cable from the device and then from the power outlet.



To save energy, unplug the travel adapter when not in use. The travel adapter does not have a power switch, so you must unplug the travel adapter from the outlet to interrupt the power supply. The travel adapter should remain close to the socket when in use.

Getting started

Turn your device on and off

To turn on your device,

- Press and hold [♠].
- If you turn on your device for the first time, follow the onscreen instructions to set up your device.

To turn off your device, press and hold $[\mathbb{O}]$ and then select **Power off** \rightarrow **OK**.

Switch to Flight mode


In Flight mode, you can disable all wireless connections and use non-network services in areas where wireless devices are prohibited, such as aeroplanes and hospitals.


To activate Flight mode, go to **Settings** \rightarrow **Wireless & networks** \rightarrow **Flight mode**. You can also press and hold $[\bullet]$ and then select **Flight mode**.

To deactivate Flight mode and use wireless connections, go to **Settings** \rightarrow **Wireless & networks** and clear the check box next to **Flight mode**.

Use the touch screen

Your device's touch screen lets you easily select items or perform functions. Learn basic actions to use the touch screen.



- To avoid scratching the touch screen, do not use sharp tools.
- Do not allow the touch screen to come into contact with other electrical devices. Electrostatic discharges can cause the touch screen to malfunction.
- Do not allow the touch screen to come into contact with water. The touch screen may malfunction in humid conditions or when exposed to water.



- For optimal use of the touch screen, remove the screen protection film before using your device.
- Your touch screen has a layer that detects small electrical charges emitted by the human body. For best performance, tap the touch screen with your fingertip. The touch screen will not react to touches of sharp tools, such as a stylus or pen.

You can control your touch screen with the following actions:

- Tap: Touch once with your finger to select or launch a menu, option, or application.
- Drag: Tap and drag your finger up, down, left, or right to move to items on lists.
- Tap and hold: Tap an item and hold it for more than 2 seconds to open a pop-up option list.
- Drag and drop: Tap and hold your finger on an item, and then drag your finger to move the item.
- Double-tap: Tap twice quickly with your finger to zoom in or out while viewing photos.

> Rotate the touch screen

Your device has a built-in motion sensor that detects its orientation. If you rotate the device, the interface will automatically rotate according to the orientation.

To set the interface to keep the orientation,

- Select the system bar at the bottom right of the screen and then select ■.
- 2 Next to **Lock screen orientation**, drag **ON** to the right.


Lock or unlock the touch screen

When you do not use the device for a specified period, your device turns off the touch screen and automatically locks the touch screen to prevent any unwanted device operations. To manually lock the touch screen, press $[\mathbb{O}]$.

To unlock, turn on the screen by pressing [①], and drag ② in any direction until it reaches the border of the circle. If you set a screen lock, you need to enter your PIN or password, or draw a pattern. ▶ p. 22

Get to know the Home screen

When the device is in Idle mode, you will see the Home screen. From the Home screen, you can view your device's status and access applications. Scroll left or right to a panel of the Home screen.





The above screen may differ depending on your region or service provider.

> Add items to the Home screen

You can customise the Home screen by adding shortcuts to applications or items in applications, widgets, or folders.

To add an item to the Home screen,

- I From the Home screen, select +.
- 2 Select an item category.
 - Widgets: Add widgets. Widgets are small applications that provide convenient functions and information on your Home screen.
 - App Shortcuts: Add shortcuts to applications on the Home screen.
 - Wallpaper: Set a background image.
 - More: Add shortcuts to items, such as bookmarks, contacts, and maps.
- 3 Select an item to add to the Home screen.

Move items on the Home screen

- Tap and hold an item to move until the Home screen grid appears.
- 2 Drag the item to the location you want.

> Remove items from the Home screen

- Tap and hold an item to remove.
 The trash bin appears at the top right of the Home screen.
- 2 Drag the item to the trash bin.
- 3 When the item and the trash bin turn red, release the item.

> Add a shortcut to an application

- 1 From the application list, tap and hold an application icon and drag it to a Home screen panel at the bottom of the screen.
 - The shortcut icon for the application is added to the Home screen.
- 2 Move the icon to the location you want or move it to another panel of the Home screen.

> Use the notifications summary panel

From the Home screen or while using an application, select the right side of the system bar, and then select ## on the notifications panel.

You can view the device's current status and use the following options:

- Flight mode: Activate or deactivate Flight mode.
- Wi-Fi: Activate or deactivate the WLAN feature.
- Lock screen orientation: Activate or deactivate the rotation lock.
- Brightness: Adjust the brightness of the display.
- **Notifications**: Set the device to alert you for various events.
- **Settings**: Access the Settings menu.



Available options may vary depending on your region or service provider.

Access applications

- I From the Home screen, select **Apps** to access the application list.
- 2 Select All → an application.
 To view downloaded applications, select Downloaded.

Access recent applications

- Select to open the list of applications you have accessed recently.
- 2 Select an application.

Customise your device

Get more from your device by customising it to match your preferences.

> Change the language of the display

- From the Home screen, open the application list and select Settings → Language & input → Select language.
- 2 Select a language you want.

> Set the current time and date

- 1 From the Home screen, open the application list and select Settings → Date & time.
- 2 Select your time zone, set the time and date, and change other options.

> Turn the touch tone on or off

From the Home screen, open the application list and select **Settings** \rightarrow **Sound** \rightarrow **Audible selection**.

Adjust the device's volume

- 1 Press the Volume key up or down.
- 2 Select s and drag the sliders to adjust the volume level for system sounds and notifications.

Switch to Silent mode

Press and hold [①] and select **Silent mode** to mute or unmute your device.

Select a wallpaper for the Home screen

- I From the Home screen, select $+ \rightarrow$ **Wallpaper**.
- 2 Select an image folder \rightarrow an image.
- 3 If you selected a live wallpaper, select Set wallpaper.
 If you selected an image from Gallery, move or resize the rectangle to select a portion of the image, and then select OK.



Samsung is not responsible for any use of default images or wallpapers provided on your device.

Activate animation for switching windows

You can set a transition effect between windows while using the device.

- I From the Home screen, open the application list and select **Settings** \rightarrow **Screen** \rightarrow **Animation**.
- 2 Select an animation option.

> Adjust the brightness of the display

- From the Home screen, open the application list and select Settings → Screen → Brightness.
- 2 Clear the check box next to Automatic brightness.
- 3 Drag the slider to adjust the level of brightness.
- 4 Select **OK**.



The brightness level of the display will affect how quickly the device consumes battery power.

Set a screen lock

You can lock the touch screen with an unlock pattern or password to prevent unauthorised people from using the device without your permission.



- Once you set a screen lock, your device will require an unlock code each time you turn it on or unlock the touch screen.
- If you forget your PIN or password, bring your device to a Samsung Service Centre to reset it.
- Samsung is not responsible for any loss of security codes or private information or other damages caused by illegal software.

Set an unlock pattern

- From the Home screen, open the application list and select Settings → Location & security → Configure lock screen → Pattern.
- 2 See the on-screen instructions and example patterns and select Next.
- 3 Draw a pattern by dragging your finger to connect at least 4 dots.
- 4 Select **Continue**.
- 5 Draw a pattern again to confirm.
- 6 Select **Confirm**.

Set an unlock PIN code

- From the Home screen, open the application list and select Settings → Location & security → Configure lock screen → PIN.
- 2 Enter a new PIN (numeric) and select **Continue**.
- 3 Enter the PIN again and select **OK**.

Set an unlock password

- From the Home screen, open the application list and select Settings → Location & security → Configure lock screen → Password.
- 2 Enter a new password (alphanumeric) and select Continue.
- $\it 3$ Enter the password again and select **OK**.

Enter text


You can enter text by selecting characters on the virtual keypad.



You cannot enter text in some languages. To enter text, you should change the writing language to one of the supported languages. ▶ p. 82

> Enter text using the Android keyboard

Enter text by selecting alphanumeric keys and you can use the following keys:



Number	Function
0	Move the cursor to the next text input field.
2	Enter text in capital lock.
3	Change case.

6	Access the keypad settings; Change the keypad type or activate the voice input feature (tap and hold).

Copy and paste text

While you are entering text, you can use the copy and paste feature to use text in other applications.

- Tap and hold a word.
- 2 Drag dor b to select the text you want.
- 3 Select Copy to copy, or Cut to cut the text onto the clipboard.
- 4 In another application, tap and hold the text input field.
- 5 Select Paste to insert the text from the clipboard into the text input field.

Web

Web services require a data connection. Contact your operator to choose the best data plan.

Browser

Learn to access and bookmark your favourite web pages.



- You may incur additional charges for accessing the web and downloading data. For details, contact your service provider.
- The web browser menu may be labelled differently depending on your service provider.
- Available icons may vary depending on your region or service provider.

> Browse web pages

From the Home screen, open the application list and select **Browser** to launch your homepage.
To access a specific web page, select the URL input field, enter the web address of the web page, and select .

Navigate web pages with the following keys:

0	Close the current tab.
2	Move backward or forward to web pages in history.
3	Reload the current web page; While the device is loading web pages, this icon changes to X.
4	Open a new tab.
5	Search for information.
6	Access a list of web browser options.

While browsing the web page, use the following options:

- To zoom in or out, tap the screen with two fingers and spread them apart (move your fingers closer together to zoom out).

- To send the web address of the web page to others, select
 → Share page.
- To view page details, select → Page info.

Search for information by voice



This feature may be unavailable depending on your region or service provider.

- From the Home screen, open the application list and select **Browser**.
- 2 Select 9.
- 3 Select **Q** and say a keyword into your device's microphone.

The device searches for information and web pages related with the keyword.

Open multiple pages

You can open multiple pages and switch back and forth between them.

- I From the Home screen, open the application list and select **Browser**.
- 2 Select to open a new tab.
- 3 Access another web page on the new tab.
- 4 To switch back and forth between currently open tabs, select the title of a tab.

> Bookmark your favourite web pages

If you know the web address of the web page, you can manually add a bookmark.

Add a bookmark

- I From the Home screen, open the application list and select **Browser**.
- 2 Select

 → Add bookmark...
 You can also select

 to bookmark the current web page.
- 3 Enter a page title and a web address.
 To bookmark the web page you were viewing, skip to step 5.
- 4 Select the **Bookmarks** drop-down menu and select a bookmark location to add (if necessary).
- 5 Select **OK**.

To use bookmark options, select , tap and hold a bookmark:

- To open the web page in the current tab, select **Open**.
- To open the web page in a new tab, select Open in new tab.
- To edit the bookmark, select **Edit bookmark**.
- To add the bookmark shortcut to the Home screen, select **Add shortcut to home**.
- To send the web address of the web page to others, select **Share link**.
- To copy the web address of the web page, select Copy link URL.
- To delete the bookmark, select **Delete bookmark**.
- To use the web page as your homepage of the browser, select **Set as homepage**.

Create a bookmark folder

- I From the Home screen, open the application list and select **Browser**.
- 2 Select \square , and then tap and hold a bookmarked web page.
- 3 Select **Edit bookmark**.
- 4 Select the **Bookmarks** drop-down menu.
- 5 Select Other folder... \rightarrow New folder.
- 6 Enter a name for the bookmark folder and select **OK**.

Access recent history

- From the Home screen, open the application list and select **Browser**.
- 2 Select \bigcirc \rightarrow **History**.
- 3 Select a web page to access.

Pulse

You can use the Pulse reader to add feeds for your favourite news topics and read news articles on your device.

> Read feeds

- I From the Home screen, open the application list and select **Pulse**.
- If you are launching this application for the first time, tap the screen to clear the hint.
- 3 Select © to update feeds.
- 4 Scroll up or down to select a feed source.
- 5 Scroll left or right and select a feed.
- 6 While reading a feed, use the following options:
 - To upload a feed to community websites, select
 f or E.
 - To send a feed to others, select .
 - To return to a feed list, select

Manage feed sources

- From the Home screen, open the application list and select Pulse.
- 2 Select ◊ to view the feed source list.
- 3 Select **■** or **X** to add or delete a feed.

> Customise the reader settings

- From the Home screen, open the application list and select Pulse.
- 2 Select \Longrightarrow \rightarrow **Settings** to customise the display or sync settings for the Pulse reader.

Market

Based on the Android platform, your device's functionality can be extended by installing additional applications. Android Market provides you an easy and quick way to shop for games and mobile applications.

 - Your device will save user files from downloaded applications to the internal memory.

Download and install an application

- I From the Home screen, open the application list and select **Market**.
 - You can also select at the top right of the screen.
- 2 If you are launching this application for the first time, read the terms and conditions and select **Accept**.

> Uninstall an application

- I From the Home screen, open the application list and select **Market**.
- 2 Select **My apps**.
- 3 Select the item you want to delete.
- 4 Select Uninstall.

YouTube

Learn to view and upload videos via YouTube.

Watch videos

- I From the Home screen, open the application list and select **YouTube**.
- 2 Select a video from the list.
- 3 Select a video screen → 3 to display a full screen.
- 4 Control playback with the virtual keys.

- 2 Select Your Channel.
- 3 Select **Upload** and then select a video.
- 4 Enter details for the upload and select **Upload**.

Maps

Learn to use Google Maps[™] to find your location, search the map for streets, cities, or countries, and get directions.

Search for a specific location

- I From the Home screen, open the application list and select Maps.
- If you are launching this application for the first time, select **OK**.
 The map will display your current location.
- 3 Select Search Maps.
- 4 Enter a keyword for the location and select ▶.
 - To search for a location by voice, select <u>____</u>.
 - To view your current location, select .
 - To search for a place around you, select \(\bigvelow\).
 - To get directions to a specific destination, select
 - To add layers to the map, select \sigma.
 - To access a list of other options, select **.**
 - To zoom in or out, place two fingers on the screen and spread them apart (move your fingers closer together to zoom out) or double-tap the screen.

> Get directions to a specific destination

- From the Home screen, open the application list and select Maps.
- 2 Select �.
- 3 Enter the addresses of the starting location and the ending location. To enter an address from your contact list or point the
 - location on the map, select □ → Contacts or Point on map.
- 4 Select a travel method (car, bus, or walk) and select **Go**.
- 5 Select a travel route to view details of your trip (if necessary).
- 6 When you are finished, select $\blacksquare \rightarrow \text{Clear Map}$.

Latitude

Learn to share your location with your friends and view friends' locations via Google Latitude™.



This feature may be unavailable depending on your region or service provider.

- From the Home screen, open the application list and select Latitude. The device automatically joins Latitude.
- 2 Select → Select from Contacts or Add via email address.
- 3 Select friends you want to add, or enter an email address and select Add friends.

- 4 Select Yes.
 When your friend accepts your invitation, you can share locations.
- 5 Select a friend from the list. Your friends' locations are marked with their photos on the map.

Places

Learn to search for a place around you.

- 2 Select a category.
 Your device searches for places around your current location that are related to the category.
- 3 Select a place name to view its details.

Navigation

Learn to use the GPS navigation system to find and show your destination with voice guidance.

- I From the Home screen, open the application list and select **Navigation**.
- If you are launching this application for the first time, select **Accept**.
- 3 Enter your destination by using one of the following methods:
 - **Speak Destination**: Speak your destination such as "Navigate to destination."
 - **Type Destination**: Enter your destination with the virtual keypad.
 - **Contacts**: Select your destination from addresses of your contacts.
 - **Starred Places**: Select your destination from the list of your starred places.
- 4 Select **Install** to use voice-guided navigation (if necessary).
- 5 Follow the route indicated on the map and the voice guide.
 To view directions in text form, select .
- 6 To end the navigation, press [**□**] → **Exit Navigation**.

Search

You can search for applications and files in your device and specific data on the web.

- From the Home screen, open the application list and select **Search**.
- 2 Enter a letter or a word of the data to search for.
- 3 Select the item's name you want to access.

You can retrieve new email messages from Google Mail™ to your Inbox. When you access this application, the Inbox screen appears. The total number of unread messages displays in the title bar and unread messages display in bold.

> Send an email message

- I From the Home screen, open the application list and select Google Mail.
- 2 Select ■...
- 3 Enter a name or address in the recipient field.
- 4 Enter a subject and message.
- 5 Select $\mathscr{O} \rightarrow$ a file to attach an image file.
- 6 Select **Send** to send the message.

> View an email message

- From the Home screen, open the application list and select Google Mail.
- 2 Select an email message.

From the message view, use the following options:

- To move to the previous or next message, select Older or Newer.
- To search for an email message, select Q.
- To create a new message, select 록.
- To archive the message, select \bigselect.
- To delete the message, select :
- To make the message as unread, select **■** → **Mark unread**.

- To customise the email settings, select **■** → **Settings**.
- To add a label to a message, select
- To reply to the message, select .
- To reply to the message including all recipients, select
- To add a star to the message, select ☆.
- To view an attachment, select View. To save it to your device, select Save.

Email

Learn to send or view email messages via your personal or company email account.

Set up an email account

- I From the Home screen, open the application list and select **Email**.
- 2 Enter your email address and password.
- 3 Select Next (for general email accounts) or Manual setup (for other company email accounts).
- 4 Follow the on-screen instructions.
- 5 To add more email accounts, select → Account settings → Add account and repeat steps 2-4.

When you are finished setting up the email account, the email messages are downloaded to your device. If you have created more than two accounts, you can switch between email accounts; Select an account name at the top left of the screen and select the one you want to retrieve messages from.

> Send an email message

- From the Home screen, open the application list and select **Email** → an email account.
- 2 Select 록.
- 3 Add recipients of your message. Enter email addresses manually, separating them with a semicolon or a comma.
- 4 Select + Cc/Bcc and add more recipients.
- 5 Select the subject field and enter a subject.
- 6 Select the text input field and enter your email text.
- 7 Select $\emptyset \rightarrow$ a file to attach an image file.
- δ Select **Send** to send the message.



If you are offline or outside your service area, the message will be held in the outbox until you are online and in your service area.

> View an email message

When you open an email account, you can view previously retrieved emails offline or connect to the email server to view new messages. After retrieving email messages, you can view them offline.

- 1 From the Home screen, open the application list and select **Email** → an email account.
- 2 Select \$\mathcal{C}\$ to update the message list.
- 3 Select an email message.

From the message view, use the following options:

- To move to the previous or next message, select Older or Newer.

- Use location for Google Search: Set the device to use your current location for Google search and other Google services.
- Configure lock screen: Set the unlock security code.

- **Auto-sync**: Set the device to synchronise contact, calendar, and email data automatically.

Privacy

- **Back up my data**: Set to back up your settings and application data to the Google server.
- **Backup account**: Add and view your Google account to back up your data.

- Automatic restore: Set to restore your settings and application data when the applications are reinstalled on your device.
- Factory data reset: Reset your settings to the factory default values and delete all your data.

Storage

Check memory information of your device.

Language & input

Change the settings for text input, the voice recogniser, and the text-to-speech feature.

- **Select language**: Select a display language for all menus and applications.
- User dictionary: Set up your own dictionary. The words in your dictionary will appear as word suggestions for your text inputs.
- Voice recognition settings:
 - **Language**: Select a language for the Google voice recognition.
 - SafeSearch: Set the device to filter explicit text and/or images from voice search results.
 - **Block offensive words**: Hide offensive words your device recognised from voice search results.
- Text-to-speech settings:
 - Listen to example: Listen to the spoken text for an example. Install voice data for using the text-to-speech feature.
 - Always use my settings: Set the device to use the settings you specify in applications rather than the default settings.

- **Default engine**: Set the speech synthesis engine to be used for spoken text.
- **Install voice data**: Download and install voice data for the text-to-speech feature.
- **Speech rate**: Select a speed for the text-to-speech feature.

Troubleshooting

Your device displays network or service error messages

- When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose reception. Move to another area and try again.
- You cannot access some options without a subscription.
 Contact your service provider for more details.

The touch screen responds slowly or improperly

If your device has a touch screen and the touch screen is not responding properly, try the following:

- Remove any protective covers from the touch screen.
 Protective covers may prevent the device from recognising your inputs and are not recommended for touch screen devices.
- Ensure that your hands are clean and dry when tapping the touch screen.
- Restart your device to clear any temporary software bugs.
- Ensure that your device software is upgraded to the latest version.
- If the touch screen is scratched or damaged, take it to your local Samsung Service Centre.

Your device freezes or has fatal errors

If your device freezes or hangs, you may need to close programs or reset the device to regain functionality. If your device is frozen and unresponsive, press and hold [①] for 8-10 seconds. The device will reboot automatically.

If this does not solve the problem, perform a factory data reset. From the Home screen, open the application list and select **Settings** \rightarrow **Privacy** \rightarrow **Factory data reset** \rightarrow **Reset tablet** \rightarrow **Delete all**.

The device beeps and the battery icon flashes

Your battery is low. Recharge the battery to continue using the device.

The battery does not charge properly or the device turns off

If the battery will no longer charge completely, you need to replace it with a new battery. Take your device to your local Samsung Service Centre.

Your device is hot to the touch

When you use applications that require more power or use applications on your device for an extended period of time, your device may feel hot to the touch. This is normal and should not affect your device's lifespan or performance.

Error messages appear when launching the camera

A connection is not established when you connect the device to a PC
