
TO PLAY



TO INSTALL BATTERIES

Use a Phillips/cross head screwdriver to loosen screw in battery compartment door (screw remains attached to door). Slide door to the right and remove. Insert 4 fresh "D"/LR20 (I.5V) alkaline batteries. Fit door onto unit (tabs into notches), then slide door to the left. Tighten screw.
