# □ Features

Your RadioShack 8-In-One Touch Screen Remote Control is an advanced universal remote control with touch screen control of up to eight home entertainment devices.

Its features include:

**Key Mover** — allows keys to be copied from one device to another, or to a different position in the same device mode.

**Home Theater Feature** — lets you combine different device applications under one convenient mode.

**Learning** — lets you add missing or unique functions from other remote controls.

**Programmable Macro Keys** — can be programmed with up to 15 keystrokes each to perform repetitive tasks with the press of one key.

**Extensive Searchable Code Library** — contains remote control codes for most available brands, as well as discontinued devices.

**Favorite Channel Scan** — lets you preview favorite channels.

**Automatic Backlighting** — changes the illumination in response to tilt movement and ambient lighting.

**Easy Device Setup** — can be programmed by device code or by library search.

**Real-Time Clock and Timed Macro Sequences** — for away-from-home device control.

**Powerful Infrared Beam** — lets you operate your home entertainment devices from a greater distance than with many of the original remote controls.

**Non-Volatile Memory** — retains programming even when the batteries are removed.

# ☐ A Quick Look at the Keys

This section contains a listing of all the remote's keys for all available devices that can be setup using this remote control.

For your device, not every function may be available or have the same name. For operation details on remote control keys, refer to the devices' owner's manuals.

### THE HARD KEYS

The most-often used remote control functions are assigned to hard keys and are located below the touch screen. A beep sounds each time you press a hard key.

If desired, the beep can be disabled (see "Adjusting Sound" on Page 23).

If a pressed key issues an IR signal, the red light blinks and <sup>♠</sup> flashes.

**Note:** If the Macro (1M, 2M, and 3M) keys have not been programmed, the red light and <sup>♠</sup> do not flash.

After you select a device, aim the remote control at the device and use the hard keys as follows:

Key	Function
POWER	Use to turn the selected device on or off.
VOL+/ –	Use to adjust the volume level of the selected device.
MUTE	Use to mute or restore the volume of the selected device.
CH+/-	Use to change to the next higher (or lower) channel of the selected device.

Key	Function
SCAN	Use to preview all available channels for a selected device at three-second intervals.  Press again to stop the scan at a desired channel.  To view favorite channels, SCAN must be programmed first. See "Programming Favorite Channel Scan" on Page 26.
1M, 2M, or 3M	After programming, use to run a macro. See "Programming Macros" on Page 28.
P	Use to program advanced features. Hold down for three seconds to enter the program mode.

#### THE TOUCH SCREEN KEYS

The remote control features a touch screen organized as a grid of soft keys (keys that change function via software) and respond to touch commands.

Each time you touch a soft key, a beep sounds, confirming your command. When you touch a device key (TV, VCR/DVD, CAB/SAT, RECVR, AUX 1, AUX 2, AUX 3, or AUX 4) a double beep sounds. If you touch a key in error, a higher-pitched beep sounds and INVALID appears. If a pressed key issues an IR signal, the red light blinks and \$\tilde{\text{flashes}}\$.

**Note:** You can disable the beep (see "Adjusting Sound" on Page 23).


### **Touch Screen Organization**

The touch screen has two groups of keys: Remote Control Function Keys and Mode Keys.

Remote Control Function Keys — Use to remotely control a selected device. The keys function according to the type of device you select and the information dictated by the manufacturer's code for that device (see "Manufacturers' Codes" on Page 47).

Mode Keys — Use to select a device you wish to control. The default mode includes TV, VCR/DVD, CAB/SAT, and RECVR keys. The secondary mode includes AUX 1, AUX 2, AUX 3, and AUX 4. The home theater mode includes THEATER, SET 1, SET 2, and SET 3. Press MODE SHIFT one or more times to view the secondary and home theater modes. Press it again to return to the default mode.

**Note:** The following illustration shows all possible keys and icons. Depending on the selected device and its brand, the keys vary.



**Note:** The following are displays you might see on the touch screen depending on how your remote is programmed. For example, if you programmed **RECVR** to control an audio tuner, **TUN** and a set of soft keys to control a tuner appear. However, if you programmed **RECVR** to control an audio amplifier, **RMP** and soft keys to control an amplifier appear.

### **INSTALLING BATTERIES**

Your remote requires four AAA batteries (not supplied) for power. For the best performance and longest life, we recommend RadioShack alkaline batteries.

#### Cautions:

- Use only fresh batteries of the required size and recommended type.
- Do not mix old and new batteries or different types of batteries (standard or alkaline).

Follow these steps to install batteries.

- Push in the battery compartment cover's tab and lift off the cover.
- 2. Place the batteries in the compartment as indicated by the polarity symbols (+ and –) marked inside.
- Replace the cover. The tab should click when the cover is locked.

If the batteries are inserted correctly, the entire touch screen display becomes active. After few seconds of inactivity, the touch screen turns off to conserve battery life. When **LOW BATT** appears or the remote stops operating properly, replace the batteries.

**Warning:** Dispose of old batteries promptly and properly. Do not burn or bury them.

**Caution:** If you do not plan to use the remote for a month or longer, remove the batteries. Batteries can leak chemicals that can destroy electronic parts.

#### **SETTING THE CLOCK**

**Note:** You must reset the clock each time you replace the batteries.

 Hold down P for at least 3 seconds. CODE SET appears.

**Note:** To exit setup at any time, hold down **P** again for at least 3 seconds. **EXITING** appears, followed by the last-used mode screen.

Touch the down arrow six times until CLOCK SET appears.

Note: If you scroll past **CLOCK SET**, touch the up arrow to scroll to it.

- 3. Touch **SELECT**. The day and time appear and the day flashes.
- Repeatedly touch the up or down arrows until the current day appears. Touch SELECT. The hour flashes.
- Repeatedly touch the up or down arrows until the current hour (and RM or PM) appears. Touch SELECT. The minute digit flashes.
- Repeatedly touch the up or down arrows until the current minute appears. Touch SELECT. The day flashes.
- 7. If you made an error, repeat Steps 4–6 to correctly set the values.

 To save the settings, hold down SELECT until SUC-CESS appears. EXITING appears, then the last-used screen.

### ADJUSTING SOUND

Your remote has three alert beep tones.

Tone	Type of Alert
One low tone	Valid key press or touch
One high tone	Invalid key press or touch
Double low tone	Valid mode key touch

Sound is preset to On. Follow these steps to turn sound off or on.

 Hold down P for at least 3 seconds. CODE SET appears.

**Note:** To exit setup, hold down **P** for at least 3 seconds. **EXITINS** appears, then the last-used mode screen.

2. Touch the up arrow. **SOUND** appears.

**Note:** If you scroll past **SOUND**, touch the down arrow to return to it.

3. Touch **SELECT**. **On** or **OFF** appears.

**Note:** If you change your mind, touch the up or down arrows until you see **Of**, then continue with Step 4.

4. Touch **SELECT. SUCCESS** appears, then **EXITINS**, then the last-used mode screen.

### **SETTING UP THE REMOTE**

**Note:** If no key is pressed for 60 seconds, the remote control automatically exits setup. **EXITINS** appears, and the remote returns to the previous mode screen.

1. Find the codes for your device(s) in "Manufacturers' Codes" on Page 47. On the supplied label, write

down the codes for the brand of each device you want to program.

**Note:** Some manufacturers may have several codes listed. Try each until you find the right one. If you cannot find the correct code, see "Manufacturer Code Search" on Page 25.

- 2. Turn on all home entertainment devices.
- Hold down P for at least 3 seconds. CODE SET appears.
- 4. Touch **SELECT**. The last selected mode appears.

**Note:** To exit this mode at any time, hold down **P** again for at least 3 seconds. **EXITINS** appears, then the last-used mode screen.

- Touch the desired mode key (TV, VCR/DVD, CAB/ SAT, RECVR, AUX 1, AUX 2, AUX 3, or AUX 4). The default or previously set device and code appear.
- 6. If the displayed device is not the desired type, use the up or down arrows to scroll to a device you want. Then touch **SELECT**. The selected device and its (default or previously set) code appear.

**Note:** There are 13 different devices available for setup. Refer to "A Quick Look at the Keys" on Page 6 for additional information on a desired device.

 Using the keypad, enter the first 4-digit manufacturer's code for the desired device and then touch SELECT. If you've entered a correct code, SUCCESS appears.

If the code is not correct, **NOT FOUND** appears instead. Enter the next code until **SUCCESS** appears.

**Note:** For TV/VCR combinations, touch **VCR/DVD** in Step 4 and use the VCR code listed for your model under "TV/VCR Combo Codes" on Page 60. If your TV/VCR combination also lists a TV code, you must program the TV separately by repeating Steps 4

and 5 to add volume control. In Step 3, press **TV**; then in Step 4, enter the TV code.

Point the remote control at the device you want to control and press POWER. The device should turn off. Try other remote control keys to see if they also function properly.

If the remote control does not operate all your device's functions, try the other codes listed in "Manufacturers' Codes" on Page 47 for your brand of device. Otherwise, use the search method to find a working code (see "Manufacturer Code Search").

If only a few functions do not seem to work, try learning those keys (see "Learning a Function" on Page 40).

9. Repeat Steps 3 through 7 to set up other devices.

To exit the programming mode, hold down **P** for at least 3 seconds. **EXITING** appears. The remote control returns to the last-used mode screen.

#### MANUFACTURER CODE SEARCH

If your home entertainment device does not respond to remote control commands after trying all of the codes listed for your brand, or if your brand is not listed at all, try searching for your code using the following procedure.

**Note:** If no key is pressed for 60 seconds, the remote control automatically exits setup. **EXITIN5** appears, and the remote returns to the previous mode screen.

Follow these steps to search for your code.

- 1. Turn on all home entertainment devices.
- Touch a mode key (TV, VCR/DVD, CAB/SAT, RECVR, AUX 1, AUX 2, AUX 3, or AUX 4) you want to set up. The default or previously set device and code appear.
- Hold down P for at least 3 seconds. CODE SET appears.

**Note:** To exit setup, hold down **P** for at least 3 seconds. **EXITINS** appears, then the last-used mode screen.

4. Touch the down arrow. **CODE SET** changes to **SERRCH**.

Note: If you scroll past **SERRCH**, touch the up arrow to return to it.

- 5. Touch **SELECT**. The last selected mode and its (default or previously set) code appear.
- 6. If needed, touch the up arrow (or down) to scroll up (or down) to the desired device.
- 7. Point the remote control at the desired device, then touch SELECT. The red light and ♠ flash.

If the device does not respond, continue pointing the remote control at the desired device and touch the up (or down) arrow to scroll up (or down) to the next code in the library. A new code appears, and the red light and  $\widehat{\circ}$  flash.

Repeat this step until you find a working code.

**Note:** The search is complete when all possible codes have been tried. **END CYCLE** appears, then **EXITINS.** The remote control exits the program and returns to the last-used mode.

 Once you have found a working code, touch SELECT. SUCCESS appears, then EXITING, then the last-used mode screen.

To find a code for another device, repeat Steps 2–8.

# PROGRAMMING FAVORITE CHANNEL SCAN

You can program the remote control to scan up to ten favorite channels.

Only devices with television tuners can be programmed for Favorite Channel Scan, including televisions, VCRs, and cable/satellite receivers. If you select another type of device (receiver, DVD or CD player, and so on), Invalid appears. An auxiliary device can be selected as

long as it has been set up as a television, VCR, cable box, or satellite receiver).

**Important:** If you program Favorite Channel Scan, you can no longer use **SCAN** for Channel Scan (see "Using Channel Scan" on Page 37). If you want to use the remote for Channel Scan after you have programmed it for Favorite Channel Scan, you must reset the entire operation of the remote (see "Using Operation Reset" on Page 44). You lose all stored information.

**Note:** If no key is pressed for 60 seconds, the remote control automatically exits setup. **EXITINS** appears, and the remote returns to the previous mode screen.

Follow these steps to program Favorite Channel Scan.

 Hold down P for at least 3 seconds. CODE SET appears.

**Note:** To exit setup, hold down **P** again for at least 3 seconds. **EXITING** appears, then the last-used mode screen.

2. Touch the up arrow twice. FRV CHRN appears.

Note: If you scroll past FRV CHRN, touch the down arrow to return to it.

- 3. Touch **SELECT**. The last selected mode appears.
- Touch a device key (TV, VCR/DVD, CAB/SAT, AUX 1, AUX 2, AUX 3, or AUX 4). The selected mode appears.
- 5. Touch **SELECT**. **ENT CHAN** appears.
- 6. Enter a favorite channel by touching the corresponding numbers on the keypad. To accept the entry, touch **SELECT. ENT CHAN** appears.

**Note:** A channel number can be up to four digits (for example, 2, 13, 132, or 1024).

7. Repeat Step 6 up to nine more times to enter other favorite channels for the same device.

**Important:** You can store up to 10 channels. If you store ten channels, the remote control will automatically exit the program. **SUCCESS** appears, then **EXIT-ING.** If you want to store less than 10 channels, hold down **SELECT** for at least 3 seconds after entering the last desired channel. **SUCCESS** appears, then **EXITING.** 

#### PROGRAMMING MACROS

Your remote control has three macro keys (1M, 2M, and 3M) you can use to program commonly-used operations.

You can store up 15 keystrokes (including learned keys) on each macro key. For example, you can create a macro that will instantly power on the TV and cable box and then tune-in a favorite channel.

- 1. Turn off all home entertainment devices.
- Hold down P for at least 3 seconds. CODE SET appears.
- Touch the down arrow four times. MRCRO KEY appears.

**Note:** If you scroll past **MACRO KEY**, touch the up arrow to return to it.

- 4. Touch **SELECT**. **SEL MRCRO** appears.
- Press a macro key (1M, 2M, or 3M). ENT MRCRO appears. For the example, press 1M.

**Note:** Pressing a previously-programmed macro key will overwrite its contents.

6. Press the appropriate keys in the desired order.

For the example, entering the following keys in the below order to program **1M** to turn on the TV and cable box, then tune the cable to channel 061.

Touch TV. SEL TO END appears.

**Note: SEL TO END** prompts you to press **SELECT** when you reach the end of the macro sequence you are entering.

Press POWER to turn on the TV.

Touch CAB/SAT to select the cable box.

Press **POWER** to turn on the cable box.

Touch 0 6 1 to enter the channel.

Hold down **SELECT** until **SUCCESS** appears. **EXITING** appears, then the last-used mode screen.

### **Deleting a Macro**

**Note:** If no key is pressed for 60 seconds, the remote control automatically exits setup. **EXITING** appears, and the remote returns to the previous mode screen.

Follow these steps to delete a macro.

 Hold down P for at least 3 seconds. CODE SET appears.

**Note:** To exit setup, hold down **P** for at least 3 seconds. **EXITING** appears, then the last-used mode screen.

Touch the down arrow four times. MRCRO KEY appears.

**Note:** If you scroll past the desired macro key (1M, 2M, or 3M), touch the up arrow to return to it.

- 3. Touch **SELECT**. **SEL MRCRO** appears.
- Select the macro key (1M, 2M, or 3M) you want to delete and press it once. Ent macro appears.
- 5. Hold down **SELECT** until **SUCCESS** appears. This action overwrites the existing data with no data. **EXITING** appears, then the last-used mode screen.

# PROGRAMMING HOME THEATER MODE

Your remote control includes a custom Home Theater mode that allows you to access four groups of remote control keys without changing device modes. Moreover, three macro keys are included for exclusive use in the Home Theater mode.

### **Control Groups**

The remote control keys you can combine for Home Theater mode are divided into the following four control groups:

Menu Controls — MENU, SELECT, up/down/left/right arrows, EXIT, GUIDE, PG +, PG -

Audio Controls - VOL+, VOL-, MUTE, and SURR

Channel Controls — CH+, CH-, Number Keypad 0-9, LAST, INPUT, TV/VCR, INFO, +100, ENTER, DISC, EXT, and BAND

Playback Controls — PLAY, STOP, FF, REW, PAUSE, REC, REPLAY, and LIVE

Note: POWER is inactive in the Home Theater mode.

### **Device Groups**

The four control groups can be assigned to the following home theater devices:

**Menu Controls** — TV, VCR, CAB (Cable Box), SAT (Satellite Receiver), DVD, CD, RECVR (Tuner or Audio Receiver), Amp (Audio Amplifier), and VID (Video Accessory)

**Audio Controls** —TV, VCR, CAB (Cable Box), CD, RECVR (Tuner or Audio Receiver), and AMP (Tuner or Audio Amplifier)

**Channel Controls** — TV, VCR, CAB (Cable Box), SAT (Satellite Receiver), RECVR (Audio Receiver), AMP (Audio Amplifier), and VID (Video Accessory)

**Playback Controls** — VCR, CAB (Cable Box), DVD, CD, and RECVR (Audio Receiver)

### **Setting Up Home Theater**

1. Turn on all home entertainment devices.

Hold down P for at least 3 seconds. CODE SET appears.

**Note:** To exit setup, hold down **P** again for at least 3 seconds. **EXITINS** appears, then the last-used mode screen.

3. Touch the up arrow three times. **THERTER** appears.

**Note:** If you scroll past **THERTER**, touch the down arrow to return to it.

- 4. Touch SELECT. PLRYBRCK appears.
- Press SELECT again. A device appears (for example, TV). Using the mode keys, touch a device (for example, DVD) whose playback controls you want to control in Home Theater mode. Then touch SELECT. RUDIO appears.
- Press SELECT again. A device appears (for example, TV). Using the mode keys, touch a device (for example, RECVR) whose audio controls you want to control in Home Theater mode. Then touch SELECT. EHROREL appears.
- Press SELECT again. A device appears (for example, TV). Using the mode keys, touch a device (for example, TV) whose channel controls you want to control in Home Theater mode. Then touch SELECT. MENU appears.
- Press SELECT again. A device appears (for example, TV). Using the mode keys, touch a device (for example, TV) whose menu controls you want to control in Home Theater mode. Then touch SELECT. PLAYBACK appears.
- 9. Hold down **SELECT** until **SUCCESS** appears. **EXITING** appears, then the last-used mode screen.

If you want to change any of the operations, repeat Steps 1–9.

### **Programming Home Theater Macros**

The Home Theater mode also includes three exclusive macro keys (SET 1, SET 2, and SET 3). You can store up to 15 keystrokes (including learned keys) on each macro key. For example, you can create a macro that powers on each device in your home theater system with the convenience of a single key touch.

**Note:** Macros can include learned keys, but not moved keys.

- 1. Turn off all home entertainment devices.
- Hold down P for at least 3 seconds. CODE SET appears.
- Touch the down arrow four times. MRCRO KEY appears.

Note: If you scroll past **MACRO KEY**, touch the up arrow to return to it.

- 4. Touch **SELECT**. **SEL MACRO** appears.
- 5. Press a macro key (SET 1, SET 2, or SET 3). ENT MRCRO appears. For the example, press SET 1.

**Note:** Pressing a previously-programmed macro key will overwrite its contents.

6. Press the appropriate keys in the desired order.

For the example, entering the following keys in the below order to program **SET 1** to turn on the TV and cable box, then tune the cable to channel 061.

Touch TV. SEL TO END appears.

**Note: SEL TO END** prompts you to press **SELECT** when you reach the end of the macro sequence you are entering.

Press POWER to turn on the TV.

Touch CAB/SAT to select the cable box.

Press POWER to turn on the cable box.

Enter the channel 0 6 1 by touching each key.

Hold down **SELECT** until **SUCCESS** appears. **EXITING** appears, then the last-used mode screen.

# PROGRAMMING A TIMED MACRO SEQUENCE

You can use timed macro sequences to store up to 15 keystrokes (including learned keys) to be run on a specific day and time.

You can also use timed macro sequences to turn on a device for a preset time period on a daily or weekly basis. For example, you can use it as an alternative method of recording an hour-long soap opera (that starts at 2:00 PM on Channel 4, each weekday) on your VCR.

**Note:** If no key is pressed for 60 seconds, the remote control automatically exits setup. **EXITINS** appears, and the remote returns to the previous mode screen.

Follow these steps to program a timed macro sequence.

- 1. Turn on all home entertainment devices.
- Hold down P for at least 3 seconds. CODE SET appears.

**Note:** To exit setup, hold down **P** for at least 3 seconds. **EXITING** appears, then the last-used mode screen.

3. Touch the up arrow four times. **MRCRO SEQ** appears.

**Note:** If you scroll past **MRCRO SEQ**, touch the down arrow to return to it.

- 4. Touch **SELECT. BES TIME** appears. The day and time appear, with the day flashing.
- 5. Enter the beginning day and time of your TV program. For this example, enter the following data:

Touch the up or down arrow until the desired day appears (for the example, scroll to **M-F**). Touch **SELECT**. The hour flashes.

Touch the up or down arrow until the desired hour appears (and **RM** or **PM**). For the example, scroll to **2 PM**. Touch **SELECT**. The minutes flash.

Touch the up or down arrow until the desired minutes appear (for the example, scroll to **00**). Touch **SELECT**. The day flashes.

Verify the desired day and time. If needed, repeat Step 5 to correctly set the values.

To save the beginning day and time settings, hold down **SELECT** until **BEG MACRO** appears. Then **ENT MACRO** appears.

6. Enter the next step of the macro sequence. For the example, you have entered the beginning time for the macro and you must now program the VCR to turn on and record your television show. Enter the following data:

Touch the mode key of the desired device (for the example, touch VCR/DVD). **SEL TO END** appears and remains on the screen until you finish programming this step of the macro.

Press **POWER** to turn on the VCR.

Touch 0 4 to enter channel 04.

Touch REC.

Hold down **SELECT** until **END TIME** appears.

Enter the ending day and time when your TV program stops.

**Note:** If you have chosen **m-F** as the beginning day, the day field cannot be changed.

Touch the up or down arrow until the desired day appears (for the example, scroll to **M-F**). Touch **SELECT**. The hour flashes.

Touch the up or down arrow until the desired hour appears (AM or PM). For the example, scroll to **3 PM**. Touch **SELECT**. The minutes flash.

Touch the up or down arrow until the desired minutes appear (for the example, scroll to **00**). Touch **SELECT**. The day flashes.

Verify the desired day and time. If needed, repeat Step 6 to correctly set the values.

To save the beginning day and time settings, hold down **SELECT** until **END MRCRO** appears. Then **ENT MRCRO** appears.

7. Enter the ending macro sequence. For the example, follow these steps:

Touch VCR/DVD to select the VCR. **SEL TO END** appears.

Press POWER to turn off the VCR.

 To save the macro, hold down SELECT until SUCCESS appears. EXITING and P appear, followed by the lastused mode screen.

# Operation

If you have any problems operating your remote, call customer service at 888-269-8705.

### **SELECTING A DEVICE**

Once you have programmed your remote control, use the following steps to become familiar with the selection and control of your devices.

 Pick up the remote control or touch the touch screen once, anywhere on the screen, to activate the display. The default mode is set to TV.

**Note:** When the remote control is not in use, the touch screen turns off after a preset time to conserve battery life. When activated, the remote control remembers and displays the last-used mode.

- Point the remote control at the device you want to control.
- 3. Using the Mode Keys, touch a desired device key (for example, VCR/DVD). If necessary, touch the MODE SHIFT key repeatedly to display other device choices. The selected device appears, along with the appropriate remote control keys. Refer to "A Quick Look at the Keys" on Page 6 to view lists of the available keys for each device.

### CONTROLLING A SELECTED DEVICE

Press or touch the appropriate hard and soft keys to control a desired function. For example, from the VCR mode, press **POWER** (hard key) to turn on the VCR. Then insert a tape and touch **PLAY** (soft key) to start playback.

Refer to "A Quick Look at the Keys" on Page 6 for tables of the available keys for each device and their functions.

**Note:** The selected device will not respond if it has not been set up. Check the following table to see if the default factory settings cover any of your system devices. If

not, set up your entertainment devices (see "Setting Up The Remote" on Page 23).

### **USING CHANNEL SCAN**

If you have not programmed your remote for Favorite Channel Scan, you can use **SCAN** to scan all channels of the desired device.

Press **SCAN** to begin scanning. To stop scanning on the desired channel, press **SCAN** again.

**Important:** If you program Favorite Channel Scan, you can no longer use **SCAN** for Channel Scan. If you want to use the remote for Channel Scan after you have programmed it for Favorite Channel Scan, you must reset the entire operation of the remote (see "Using Operation Reset" on Page 44). You lose all stored information.

### **USING FAVORITE CHANNEL SCAN**

Select the desired device using the mode keys. Then aim the remote control at the device and press **SCAN**. Previews of your favorite channels at 3-second intervals. Press **SCAN** again to stop the scan on a desired channel.

#### **USING A MACRO**

Aim the remote control at the devices and press the programmed macro key (see "Programming Macros" on Page 28).

### **USING HOME THEATER**

- Touch MODE SHIFT one or more times until the THE-ATER key appears.
- 2. Touch **THEATER**. Your custom set of Home Theater remote control keys appear.
- 3. Use the keys as usual. The keys operate only the devices you assigned them to. For example, if you assigned the playback keys to your VCR, any time you press PLAY (or any other key from the menu controls) the VCR plays. PLAY no longer operates your DVD or other devices.
- To exit Home Theater mode, press the device key (for example, VCR/DVD) of the desired mode. If necessary, touch the MODE SHIFT key repeatedly to display other device choices.

### **USING A TIMED MACRO SEQUENCE**

To use a Timed Macro Sequence, place the remote control so it faces the device used in the macro. In the example, aim the remote control at the VCR.

At the appropriate time, the macro sequence will automatically run to turn on the VCR, record the show, and then turn off the VCR.

### **USING VOLUME LOCK**

Your remote control's Volume Lock is preset to unlock. Pressing the volume and mute keys directly controls the volume of the currently-selected device. If you change to another mode, the volume controls automatically transfer to the newly-selected device.

However, you may want to lock the volume controls to one or more modes. For example, you can lock the volume controls to the TV mode. This way, TV volume is always controllable no matter what mode is selected.

### **Locking the Volume**

**Note:** If no key is pressed for 60 seconds, the remote control automatically exits setup. **EXITING** appears, and the remote returns to the previous mode screen.

- 1. Turn on all home entertainment devices.
- Hold down P for at least 3 seconds. CODE SET appears.

**Note:** To exit setup, hold down **P** for at least 3 seconds. **EXITING** appears, then the last-used mode screen.

Touch the down arrow seven times. VOL LOCK appears.

Note: If you scroll past VOL LOCK, touch the up arrow to return to it.

- 4. Touch **SELECT**. **TO MODE** appears.
- Touch a mode once (for example, TV) where you want the volume controls to be locked. SUCCESS appears, then EXITING, then the last-used mode screen.

### **Unlocking the Volume**

When no key is pressed for 60 seconds, the remote control automatically exits setup. **EXITINS** appears, and the remote returns to the previous mode screen.

 Hold down P for at least 3 seconds. CODE SET appears.

**Note:** To exit setup, hold down **P** for at least 3 seconds. **EXITINS** appears, then the last-used mode screen.

Touch the down arrow eight times. VOL UNLOCK appears.

Note: If you scroll past VOL UNLOCK, touch the up arrow to return to it.

- 3. Touch SELECT. ALL MODE appears.
- To unlock all modes, touch SELECT. UNLOCKED appears, then EXITING, then the last-used mode screen.

To unlock individual modes, touch the up or down arrow. **ONE MODE** appears. Press **SELECT. SEL MODE** appears. Touch a mode (for example, **TV**) where you want the volume controls to be unlocked. **UNLOCKED** appears, then **SEL MODE**.

**Note:** If the mode is already unlocked, an error beep sounds and **INVALID** appears.

To unlock another mode, repeat Step 4 as often as needed.

5. To exit the program, hold down **P** until **EXITING** appears. The last-used mode screen appears.

### **USING LEARNING**

Your remote control is equipped with a learning program so you can add a function unique to a home entertainment device (for example, tracking up or down for a VCR). You can skip this section if you are satisfied with the remote control operation on all devices.

### **Learning a Function**

This method assumes all devices have been set up. If not, perform the instructions in "Setting Up The Remote" on Page 23. Also, have your original remote controls handy before programming learning.

Follow these steps to learn a function.

- 1. Select the mode key for the desired learning mode.
- 2. Hold down **P** for at least 3 seconds. **CODE SET** appears.

**Note:** To exit setup, hold down **P** for at least 3 seconds. **EXITINS** appears, then the last-used mode screen.

3. Touch the down arrow two times. **LERR** appears.

Note: If you scroll past **LERRO**, touch the up key to return to it.

- 4. Touch **SELECT**. The last selected mode appears.
- If needed, touch a mode key to select a different device to be learned.
- Place your original device's remote control head-tohead (about 2 inches apart) with the 8-In-One.

**Note:** For best results, use low-level ambient lighting and stay away from high levels of natural daylight or energy-efficient fluorescent lights.

7. On the original remote control, hold down the key you want to be learned. On the 8-In-One, touch a key where you want the learned data to reside. The red light flashes rapidly and LERRIINS appears.

**Note:** Be sure to press (or touch) each key within 5 seconds. Otherwise, an error message appears as a reminder to perform the actions listed in this step.

If **INVALID** appears, the selected key cannot be learned.

If **SUCCESS** appears, the selected key was learned.

If there is a problem, **ERROR** appears. Repeat Step 6 until **SUCCESS** appears.

To learn other functions from the same device's remote control, repeat Steps 6 and 7.

8. To exit programming, hold down **P** for at least 3 seconds. **EXITING** appears, then the remote control returns to the last-used mode screen.

If desired, repeat Steps 2–8 to learn functions from a different device's remote control.

### **Deleting a Learned Function**

**Note:** If no key is pressed for 60 seconds, the remote control automatically exits setup. **EXITING** appears, and the remote returns to the previous mode screen.

 Hold down P for at least 3 seconds. CODE SET appears.

**Note:** To exit setup, hold down **P** for at least 3 seconds. **EXITING** appears, then the last-used mode screen.

Touch the down arrow key three times until DEL LEARN appears.

Note: If you scroll past **DEL LEARN**, touch the up arrow to return to it.

- 3. Touch **SELECT**. The last selected device appears.
- If necessary, touch a device key (TV, VCR/DVD, CAB/ SAT, RECVR, AUX 1, AUX 2, AUX 3, or AUX 4) that contains the learned function. The selected mode appears.

**Note:** Do not use the arrow keys to locate the desired device.

5. Touch the key that contains the learned data you want to delete. **DELETED** appears. If the key cannot be deleted, **INVALID** appears.

To delete other learned functions for the same device, repeat Step 5. To delete learned functions on other devices, repeat Steps 4 and 5.

To exit programming, hold down P for at least 3 seconds. EXITING appears, then the last-used mode screen.

#### **USING KEY MOVER**

Your remote control also includes a key mover feature that allows a key to be copied from one device to another, or to a different position in the same device mode.

### Moving a Key

For example, follow these steps to copy **TV/VCR** from VCR/DVD mode and move it to an unused key in TV mode:

**Note:** If there is no activity for 60 seconds, the remote control automatically exits setup. **EXITINS** appears, and the remote returns to the previous mode screen.

 Hold down P for at least 3 seconds. CODE SET appears.

**Note:** To exit setup, hold down **P** again for at least 3 seconds. **EXITINS** appears, then the last-used mode screen.

2. Touch the up arrow five times. **KEYMOVER** appears.

**Note:** If you scroll past **KEYMOVER**, touch the down arrow to return to it.

- 3. Touch **SELECT**. **FROM MODE** appears.
- Touch the mode key where the function key resides (for the example, touch DVD/VCR). FROM KEY appears.
- 5. Touch the function key you want to copy (for the example, touch **TV/VCR**). **TO MODE** appears.
- Touch the mode key where you want to place the copy (for the example, touch TV). TO KEY appears.
- Touch an unused function key (for the example, touch EXT). SUCCESS appears. EXITING appears, then the last-used mode screen.

### **Deleting a Moved Key**

 Hold down P for at least 3 seconds. CODE SET appears.

**Note:** To exit setup, hold down **P** again for at least 3 seconds. **EXITING** appears, then the last-used mode screen.

2. Touch the up arrow five times. **KEYMOVER** appears.

**Note:** If you scroll past **KEYMOVER**, touch the down arrow to return to it.

- 3. Touch **SELECT**. **FROM MODE** appears.
- Touch the mode key where the moved key to be deleted resides. FROM KEY appears.
- Touch the function key you want to delete. TO MODE appears.
- 6. Repeat Steps 4 and 5 exactly. **DELETE** appears, then **EXITING**, then the last-used mode screen.

**Note:** Be sure to select the same mode and function keys you touched in Steps 4 and 5. By repeating this action, the stored data is overwritten using the "from" data to clear the original "to" settings.

### **USING OPERATION RESET**

Operation Reset lets you clear all memory settings and return the unit to its original default values.

**Important:** Activating this feature completely erases all your stored settings, including device setups, macros, learned keys, and home theater macro sets.

**Note:** If no key is pressed for 60 seconds, the remote control automatically exits setup. **EXITINS** appears, and the remote returns to the previous mode screen.

Follow these steps to activate Operation Reset.

 Hold down P for at least 3 seconds. CODE SET appears.

**Note:** To exit setup, hold down **P** again for at least 3 seconds. **EXITING** appears, then the last-used mode screen.

2. Touch the down arrow five times until **OPS RESET** appears.

Note: If you scroll past **OPS RESET**, touch the up arrow to return to it.

# ☐ Troubleshooting

If the remote control stops working after you have successfully tested the control for each device, or if you are unable to get the remote control to work at all, do the following:

- Be sure you press the device key for the device you want to control before you press any other key.
- Confirm that your IR devices are working properly by using the original remote control or the manual controls.
- · Replace the batteries.

If you have any other problems with your remote, call customer service at 888-269-8705.

Your RadioShack 8-In-One Touch Screen Remote Control does not have any user-serviceable parts. Opening the case, except for the battery cover, may cause permanent damage to your remote control.

#### CARE

Keep the remote dry; if it gets wet, wipe it dry immediately. Use and store the remote only in normal temperature environments. Handle the remote carefully; do not drop it. Keep the remote away from dust and dirt, and wipe it with a damp cloth occasionally to keep it looking new.

Modifying or tampering with the remote's internal components can cause a malfunction and might invalidate its warranty. If your remote is not performing as it should, take it to your local RadioShack store for assistance.
