SYMPTOMS AND CORRECTION

Symptom	Correction
No power	Connect the power plug into the wall outlet securely.Verify the power button on the player is engaged.
No picture	 Press STOP button then press I/P button on the remote control repeatedly. Connect the video cable into the jacks securely. Refer to your television owners manual. Verify the connection from the DVD video output to the TV video input. Then switch TV to appropriate mode (Video 1, Video 2, etc.).
No sound	 Connect the audio cables into the jacks securely. Verify the connection from the DVD audio output to the TV or receiver audio input. Then switch to the appropriate input source on the receiver. Refer to your audio amplifier owners manual for specific instructions.
A red picture on screen	Press STOP button then press the I/P button on your remote control repeatedly.
Black & White picture	 Incorrect connection of component video cables Damaged S connector (bent pin), check for bent pins on your S-Video cable. Press STOP button, then press I/P button on remote repeatedly.
The playback picture has occasional distortion	 Picture distortion may appear because of a poor quality video/sound transfer. Wipe with a soft clean cloth top remove fingerprints or other residue. A scratched disc may disrupt or interfere with the video signal
Brightness is unstable or noises are produced on playback pictures	 Connect the DVD player directly through the TV and not through any other source like a VCR. What you're viewing is the effect of the copy protection circuitry required on all DVD players.

The DVD video player does not start playback	 Place the disc with the graphics side up. Place the disc on the disc tray correctly inside the guides. Turn the power off then disconnect the power plug. Reinsert it back into the wall and retry again. Make sure the disc is free from scratches & fingerprints. Press the SETUP button to turn off the menu screen. Cancel the parental lock function or change the parental lock level. (The Pre-set password is 3308.) Use region 1 discs only.
MP3 won't read disc or it skips	 Reburn disc as the software edition used may not be compatible with the player. Check web site for instruction. When burning discs,use the ISO 9660 type format. This option is typically in the preference settings section of your burning software. If using ADAPTEC 3.5 or higher set to mode 1.
The remote control does not work properly	 Replace the batteries with new ones. Point the remote closer to the unit. Remove any obstructions and reposition bright lights that may be reflecting off of the player.

Good - Composite

Connect the supplied video (yellow) and audio (red & white) cables as shown.

To view, cycle through your TV input sources from your TV remote (Video 1, 2, etc.) to select the source that your DVD player is connected to.



For better quality, connect the DVD video player with an optional S-Video cable if the TV has an S-Video input. Do not connect the yellow video cable if using an S-Video cable. Connect the supplied audio (red & white) cables as shown.

To Progressive Scan Video Input

How To Play A Disc

Turn on the player

Push the main **POWER** button to turn on the DVD unit. Once on, you may wish to use the Standby button from your remote to turn the unit on or to Standby Mode, which places the player in to a low powered sleep mode when not in use.

Turn on your TV (Home Theater System)

Select the corresponding inputs on your TV (Video 1, Video 2, etc.). If connected through an amplifier/receiver, cycle through your Home Theater System's audio input sources (audio 1, audio 2, etc.) and locate the input assigned to your DVD player.



Load a disc

Press OPEN/CLOSE button on the remote control (or front panel) to open the disc tray. Insert disc label side up. Press OPEN/CLOSE button or PLAY button. The disc will initiate. When the Movie Menu appears on screen, press ENTER/▶ or a DIRECTION KEY to select the desired feature in the menu. Press ENTER/▶ button on the remote (or on the unit) to start playback of the DVD.

NOTE: Place the disc's label side up, blank side down.

Press a **DIRECTION KEY** to select the desired feature in the movie menu, and then press the **ENTER/Þ** button to confirm a selection.

NOTE:

Normally, when a MP3 disc is loaded, the unit will take a longer time to download the initial data. A DVD disc that does not match the region code cannot be played by this player. This DVD player will play Region 1 DVDs only. To return to the disc's Main Menu, press the **MENU** button on the remote.

Do not load a disc upside down.

Numeric Key Pad / Direct Program access

I/P Progressive Scan

The player is equipped with three modes of video output (For the 3 connection options available to you, see p 9):

1) S-Video / Composite Video (Default Setting)

2) Interlace component (for non HDTV sets with component input) 3) Progressive Scan component *

*For use with ED/HDTV to produce a "film-like" quality DVD presentation.

Press STOP button then press I/P button on the remote control repeatedly to display a signal based on your connection from your DVD player to TV.



**NOTE:

Only 1 output (S-Video, Interlace component, or Progressive Scan component) may be used at one time. Interlace component and Progressive Scan component use the same video output jacks named Y, Pb, Pr. Typically, EDTV or HDTV sets support a Progressive Scan video input providing a more desirable "film-like" guality.



If a DVD disc contains the Multi-Subtitle feature, a subtitle may be selected:

While in playback mode, repeatedly press the SUB-T button to select the desired subtitled language. Status will be displayed on screen.

**NOTE: A DVD disc may contain up to 32 subtitle selections.

Certain DVD discs may contain specially featured scenes that are shot simultaneously from a number of different angles. For these discs, the same scenes can be viewed from each of these different angles using the ANGLE button (The recorded angles vary depending on the disc programmed).

If a DVD disc contains Multi-Angle material, viewing angles may be selected:

During playback, repeatedly press the ANGLE button to select the desired viewing angle. Status will be displayed on screen.

Multi-Audio Soundtrack



If a DVD disc contains a Multi-Audio Soundtrack feature. Audio Language can be selected:

During playback, repeatedly press AUDIO button to select the desired audio language. Playback status will be displayed on screen.

In most cases, an Audio Soundtrack selection will be displayed on a DVD disc start up menu. Press the **DIRECTION KEYS** to select **ENTER**/ ▶ button to confirm.

What is MP3?

About MP3

MP3 (MPEG 1, Audio Layer 3) is a digital audio format for quick downloading files that sound similar in performance to CDs. MP3 uses entropy encoding to reduce the number of redundant sounds in an audio signal to a minimum. It takes music from a CD and reduces it by a factor of 12, with no noticeable loss of quality. Whereas a typical CD holds only 74 minutes of music you can store over 130 songs with MP3.

Disc information

Sampling rate should be 44.1 kHz and bit rate is recommended within the range from 128 Kbps to 256 Kbps, in order to achieve the best performance. In general, higher quality settings result in larger file sizes.

ATTENTION:

TIPS FOR MAKING A GOOD MP3 CD ON YOUR COMPUTER:

- Using a good quality CD-RW/CD-R disc is recommended. Up to 650 MB (74-minute CD) or 700 MB (80-minute CD) of MP3 files can be recorded.

- Select a high quality and stable CD Recorder (writer).

- Select an advanced CD burning software.

- MP3 is data and not WAV information, therefore Mode 1 must be selected when compiling and burning your discs.

- Drag and drop must not be used to compile the disc. The player will not recognize this format.

- Select Data CD Project in your software user interface, the file system should comply with the standard ISO 9660 or Joliet. Or, select MP3 CD Project for more convenient operation.

- Finalize the CD after it is burned.

Program Settings
