Place the Liquid Detergent Dispenser in the right hand section of the dispenser drawer. Remove any water remaining from the previous wash before adding liquid detergent and ensure that the syphon tube is firmly in position.

When using liquids in their own dispensers, follow the manufacturer's instructions.













