Preface

This guide describes the basic operating procedures for *Models 102*, *1I1*, *202*, *2I1*, *4I3*, *and 5I3* of the IBM 4230 Printer and should be read and used by those who install or operate the printer, or supervise printer operations.

You need only basic operating experience to use the IBM 4230 Printer. This experience includes an understanding of how a printer works, how to connect cables, and how to select items from an operator panel menu.

You can use the IBM 4230 Printer for many different types of applications. This guide includes the procedures necessary for you to put together step-by-step instructions tailored to your operation.

A training outline in the Appendix gives the experienced IBM 4230 Printer operator a guideline for teaching others how to use the printer.

Introduction

Your IBM 4230 Printer is a wire-matrix printer with many features to help you perform your work efficiently. Your printer combines excellent print quality along with the ability to print in several print styles and graphics.

Your printer receives some instructions from you and some instructions from the *computer system*. The computer does the *processing*; the printer prints the result. It is important that you communicate with the people who operate and program the computer so that you know when any changes are made that could affect your printer.

The 4230 Printer can use one of four different *forms devices* to move paper through the printer. Each device does a different type of print job, depending on the type of forms you use: continuous forms for large printouts, tear-off forms such as retail invoices, or cut sheet forms. See "Forms Handling Devices" on page 3-19 for more information.

The 4230 Printer has four different print quality settings:

Fast Draft Quality
DP (Data Processing) Quality
DP Text Quality
Near Letter Quality.

You can set the *character spacing* on the 4230 Printer to the following characters per inch (CPI):

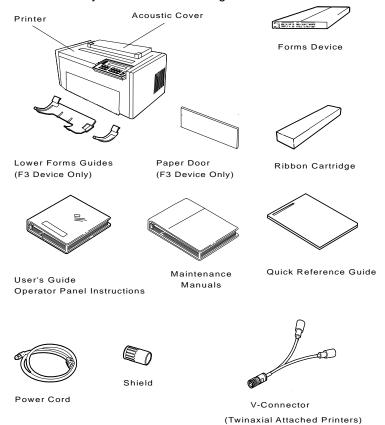
Do Each Step in Order

Complete each step before you start the next one. If you cannot successfully complete all of the following steps, call your place of purchase.

Beginning Printer Installation

To install the 4230 Printer, follow these steps:

1. Be sure that you have the following items:

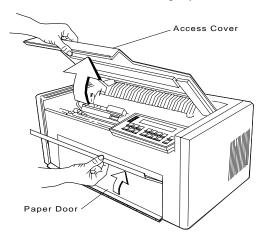

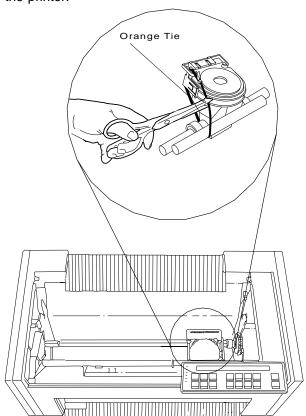
- a. Contact your place of purchase if any of the items shown above are missing.
- b. The Document Insertion Device (F3) is shipped with a long and short lower forms guide and a paper door. If you ordered the F3 forms device, be sure that you find the guides and paper door and set them aside.
- c. You also will have enclosed a V-connector.

Note: The printer weighs approximately 20.4 kg (45 lb). Do not lift it by yourself.

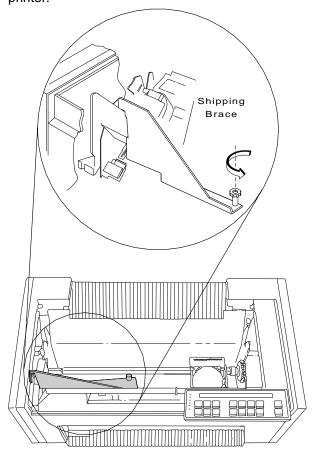
- Place the printer at the workstation (printer stand or table of your choice). Be sure that you have access to both the front and the rear of the printer.
- 3. Remove the protective film from the access cover window and discard it.
- 4. Remove the packaging material, if present, from under the acoustic door.
- 5. Open the *access cover*. Then open the front paper door as follows:
 - a. Pull the door up until it will not go any higher.
 - b. Push the door back slightly to lock it in the open position.



6. Find the orange tie on the right side of the printer to the left of the print head. Carefully cut the orange tie and remove it from the printer.



7. Consult the following figure and then find the large *orange knob* and *orange shipping brace* in the center of the printer. Unscrew the knob and remove the knob and shipping brace from the printer.



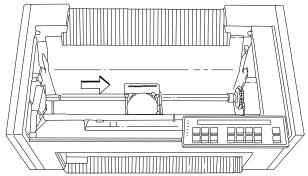
Note: Save the shipping brace in case you relocate the printer.

Installing the Ribbon Cartridge and Guide

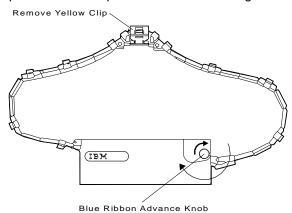
The following sections describe preparation, installation, and verification of the ribbon cartridge.

To install a new ribbon cartridge, follow these steps:

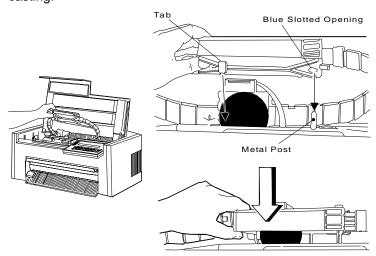
1. Slide the print head to the center of the printer.



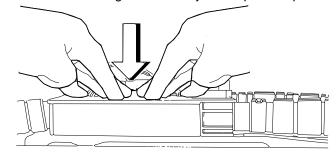
- 2. Remove the ribbon cartridge from the package.
- 3. Remove the yellow clip from the ribbon.
- 4. Turn the **blue ribbon advance knob** clockwise to take up slack in the ribbon. If the ribbon does not move, contact your place of purchase and replace the ribbon cartridge.



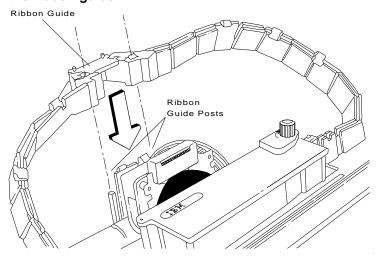
5. Align the **blue slotted opening** on the bottom of the ribbon cartridge with the *metal post*. You may need to turn the **blue ribbon advance knob** to align the slots. Lower the ribbon cartridge onto the *metal post*. Be sure that the *plastic tab* on the bottom of the ribbon cartridge aligns with the hole in the printer casting.



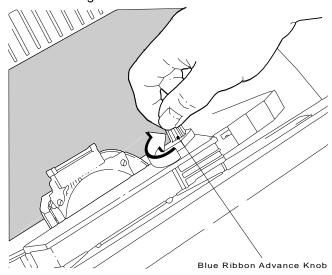
6. Press the cartridge down firmly to snap it into place.



7. Align the holes in the ribbon guide with the *ribbon guide posts* on the *print head carrier*. Press the guide all the way down on the posts until the tops of the posts are even with the top of the ribbon guide.



- 8. To be sure you have installed the ribbon cartridge correctly, check that:
 - a. The left side of the ribbon cartridge is securely snapped onto the printer. The right side fits over the ribbon drive post but does not latch down.
 - b. There are no twists or folds in the ribbon.
 - c. The ribbon is not catching on the print head.
 - d. The ribbon moves when you turn the **blue ribbon advance knob** clockwise. If the ribbon does not move, replace the ribbon cartridge.



Preparing for Forms Device Installation

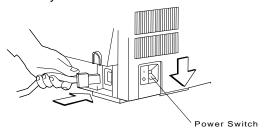
To prepare for installing the forms device, follow these steps:

CAUTION:

The construction of this machine provides extra protection against the risk of electric shock by grounding appropriate metal parts. The extra protection may not function unless the power cord is connected to a properly grounded outlet. This machine has a grounding-type (3-wire) power cord because grounding is necessary. It is the responsibility of the customer or the person installing the machine to connect it to a properly grounded outlet. Seek professional assistance before using an adapter or extension cord; such a device could interrupt the grounding circuit.

If this machine is connected to an outlet that has been incorrectly connected to the building wiring, serious electric shock could result.

1. Make sure the power switch is Off (O). Connect the power cord to the rear of the printer. Press firmly to be sure that the plug is securely seated.

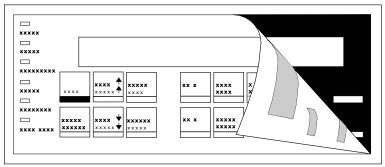


Plug the power cord into the electrical outlet.

2. If you received your printer without an operator panel template installed, you must install the template shipped with the printer.

To install the template, do the following:

- a. Remove the paper from the back of the template.
- b. Press the template into place on the operator panel, as shown in the following figure.

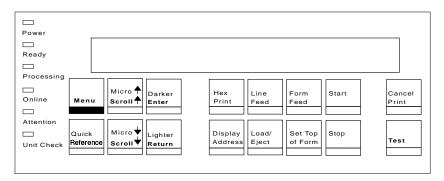


Figure 1-1. 4230 Printer Models 102 and 1I1 Operator Panel

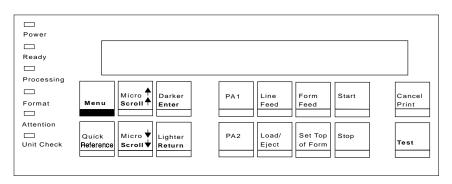


Figure 1-2. 4230 Printer Models 202 and 211 Operator Panel

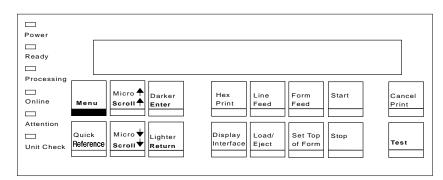


Figure 1-3. 4230 Printer Model 4I3 Operator Panel

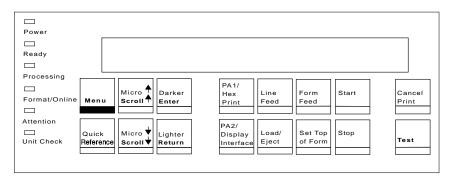


Figure 1-4. 4230 Printer Model 5l3 Operator Panel

Ignore these messages until you have attached the printer to your computer. (Press **Stop** to turn off the alarm, if necessary.)

5. If the printer operated correctly, go to Step 6 on page 1-17, otherwise, check the following:

Operator Note

If you turned the power Off (O) and back On (|) in less than 10 seconds, the display may be blank or a message may appear.

If the power-on messages do not appear in your language, see "Using Printer Setup Parameters" in IBM 4230 Printer Models 102, 111, 202, 211, 413, and 513 Operator Panel Instructions to change the Display Language.

a. Did the printer come on after you turned the power On (|) in Step 4 on page 1-14?

> If Yes, go to Step 5b. If No, perform Steps 5a1 through 5a6.

- 1) Turn the power Off (O).
- 2) Unplug the printer power cord from the electrical outlet.
- 3) Be sure that the power cord is firmly connected to the rear of the printer.
- 4) Try another electrical device (such as a lamp) in the outlet.
- 5) If the outlet is working, connect the printer to the outlet again. Return to Step 4 on page 1-14 and try again.
- 6) If the printer still fails to come on, call your service representative.
- b. Did the printer display a code or message and did the same code or message remain on the display after approximately 30 seconds?

If Yes, go to Appendix B, "Problem Solving," find the status code or message the printer displayed, and follow the instructions.

If No, go to Step 5c on page 1-17.

c. Did the indicators or display not respond, or did you have an alarm problem?

If Yes, then call for service.

6. The shipping box for the forms device has printing on the side to help you identify what type of forms device you have. Note which forms device is checked off, then remove the forms device from the shipping box.

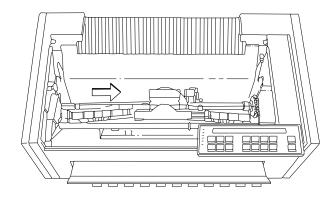

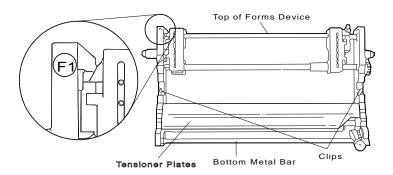
Installing the Continuous Forms Device (F1)

To install the F1 forms device, follow these steps:

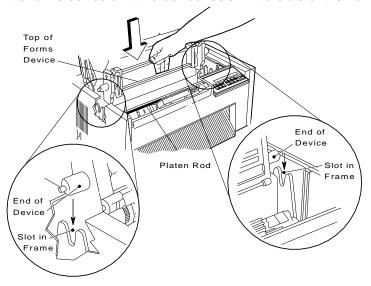
- Hold the forms device so that the device number F1 is in the upper left corner facing you. Note the bottom metal bar and the clips; they will be important later.
- 2. Remove the orange shipping clip, if installed.

Important -

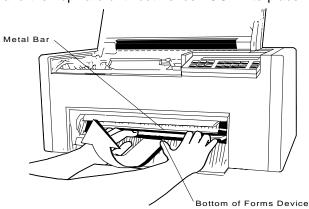
The F1 forms device for the 4230 Printer has a circle around the F1 emblem. Use only these forms devices in the 4230 Printer.



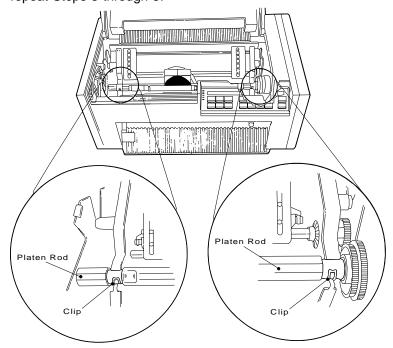
3. Lower the forms device into the printer behind the platen rod so that the bottom metal bar enters the printer first. Align the ends of the forms device with the slots in the frame. Continue to lower the forms device until the device rests in the slots of the frame.



- 4. Look through the front bottom opening in the printer and find the metal bar at the bottom of the forms device.
- 5. Grasp the metal bar with BOTH hands and pull firmly toward you and then upward until both ends LOCK into place.



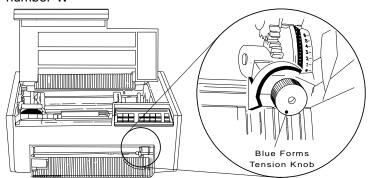
6. To be sure that you have installed the forms device correctly, look at the following figure and compare it to your printer. Check both the left and right sides. Are the *clips* around the *platen rod* as shown? If so, you installed the forms device correctly. If not, repeat Steps 3 through 5.



Preparing to Load Forms

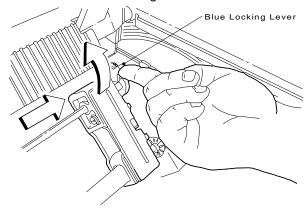
To prepare to load forms in the F1 forms device, follow these steps:

- 1. Slide the print head to the far left side of the printer.
- 2. Loosen the blue forms tension knob by turning it counterclockwise, and then move the blue forms tension knob towards the bottom of the printer until you see the * below the number 1.

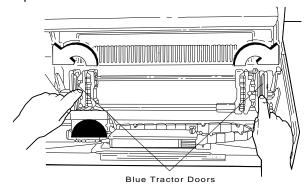


Note: Moving the blue forms tension knob to the * position lets you load forms.

3. Unlock the blue locking lever on the right tractor. Slide the tractor to the extreme right.



4. Open both of the **blue tractor doors**.

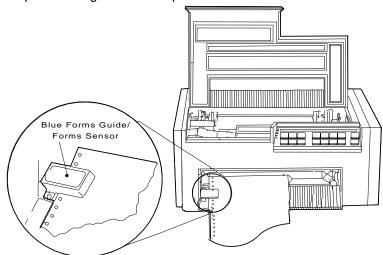


5. Get continuous forms paper that is at least 203.2 mm (8 in.) wide.

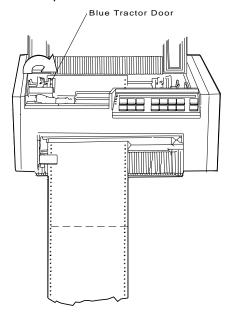
Loading Forms in the F1 Forms Device

To load forms in the F1 forms device, follow these steps:

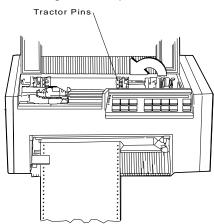
1. Feed the form into the bottom front of the printer. Be sure that the form goes under the blue forms guide/forms sensor and between the tension plates. See the figure on page 1-21 for help in locating the tension plates.



2. Align and put the **left paper holes** of the form over the *left tractor pins*. Close the left **blue tractor door**.

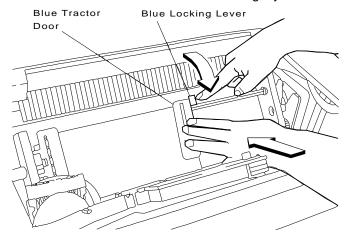


3. Move the *right tractor* until the **right paper holes** of the form fit on the *right tractor pins*. Be sure that the forms are straight.

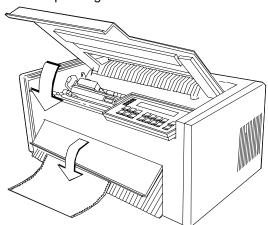


4. Close the right blue tractor door. Hold the tractor in place and lock the blue locking lever.

Note: If necessary, unlock the tractor and adjust it so that the forms are not buckled or stretched too tightly.



5. Close the access cover. Then close the paper door by pulling it out and pushing it down until it latches.



- 6. To align the top of form position, follow these steps:
 - a. Turn the power On (|) and wait for the power-on sequence to complete (see "Power-On Test" on page 3-4).
 - b. Press Stop.

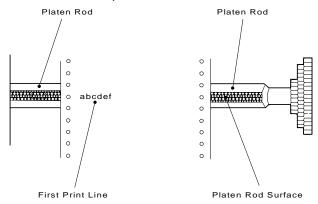

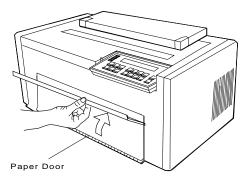


- d. If you pressed Micro , you might have slack in the forms. Pull lightly downward on the forms at the bottom of the printer to remove the slack.
- e. Press **Set Top of Form** to establish the first print line.

Note: The Set Top of Form key establishes the first line at which printing is to start on each form. The alarm beeps each time you press the **Set Top of Form** key, and the printer displays

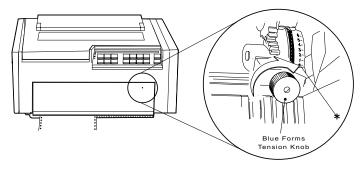

- 7. To adjust the forms tension:
 - a. Open the front paper door as follows:
 - 1) Pull the door up until it will not go any higher.
 - 2) Push the door back slightly to lock it in the open position.



b. Move the **blue forms tension knob** upward to the number of form copies you are using. Make sure you do not unlatch the forms device. For example, if you are using single-part forms, set the lever to **1**. If you are using two-part forms, set the lever to **2**.

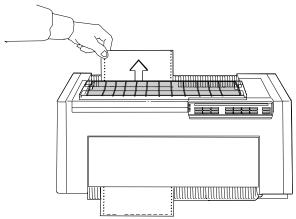

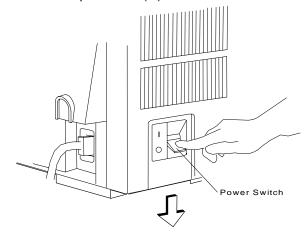

- d. Once you get a good printout, go to Step 10.
- 10. Turn the power Off (O).



Setup and Checkout Complete

Adjusting the Print Quality

After the printer prints a few lines, press **Stop** and verify that the print quality is satisfactory. Good print quality includes:

Clear, legible print Satisfactory darkness or lightness of output.

It is up to you to decide if the print quality is satisfactory. Adjustments you can make that affect print quality include:

Tractor Tension

Incorrect tension on the right tractor can cause the paper holes on the forms to tear, wrinkle, or jam in the printer. To adjust the tractor tension, see "Adjusting the Tractor Tension" on page 1-39.

Forms Thickness Setting

This setting can affect the darkness or lightness of output.

The printer will normally sense the forms thickness and adjust itself automatically. However, if this setting is not correct, it can be adjusted. To adjust the forms thickness, see "Adjusting the Forms Thickness Setting" on page 1-40.

Note: The Automatic Forms Thickness Adjustment (AFTA) mechanism automatically measures the forms thickness and adjusts the gap from the print head to the platen rod based on the measured value. See "Automatic Forms Thickness Adjustment (AFTA)" on page 3-8 for information on how the 4230 Printer sets the forms thickness.

Forms Tension

Incorrect tension on the forms can cause forms to tear, wrinkle, or buckle and can affect the appearance of the output. To adjust the forms tension, see "Adjusting the Forms Tension" on page 1-42.

Left Margin and Top of Form Position

The adjustment of the first print position can affect the appearance of the output, especially if you are using preprinted forms. To adjust the position of the first print character, see "Adjusting the Left Margin" on page 1-44. To adjust the position of the first print line, see "Adjusting the Top of Form Position" on page 1-46.

Print Alignment

This adjustment can affect the character formation and dot mixing on those characters that are printed with two passes of the print mechanism. To adjust the print alignment, see "Adjusting the Print Alignment" on page 1-48.

Adjusting the Tractor Tension

The tractor tension adjustment controls the amount of buckle the forms have when they are loaded in the printer. Since the left tractor does not move, you make this adjustment by moving the right tractor.

The ideal adjustment is to center the right and left paper holes of the forms on the tractor pins without stretching or tearing the holes.

To adjust the tractor tension on the F1 forms device, follow these steps:

- 1. Feed several forms through the printer.
- 2. Observe the left and right paper holes of the forms:

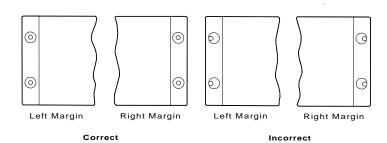
If the paper holes are stretched or torn on the outside edges, the tractor tension is too tight (not enough buckle in the forms).

If the forms twist or wrinkle as they move through the printer, the tractor tension is too loose (too much buckle in the forms).

Adjusting the Forms Thickness Setting

To adjust the lightness or darkness of the print, you must increase or decrease the gap between the print head and the platen rod. This distance is automatically set for you by the Automatic Forms Thickness Adjustment (AFTA), but you can make corrections to the distance if the print output is not as you desire. It is up to you to decide if the print is dark (or light) enough to meet your requirements.

To adjust the forms thickness setting with the F1 forms device, follow these steps:

1. The forms thickness setting must be adjusted when the printer is printing or has printed and is ready. Press Start, if needed, to have the printer display



2. To make the print darker, press **Darker**.

The printer displays



The print head moves closer to the paper, and the print becomes darker.

Note: The print may not get darker if the ribbon is worn or if there is a problem with the print head.

3. To make the print lighter, press Lighter.

The printer displays



The print head moves farther away from the paper, and the print becomes lighter.

4. When you release the key, the printer automatically saves the current value.

Note: The 's indicate the position of the print head relative to the limits.

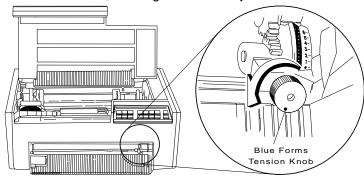
Adjusting the Forms Tension

The forms tension lever controls the tension on the forms. The blue forms tension knob lets you adjust the setting of the forms tension lever. The forms tensioner is a metal plate with a row of metal fingers that applies tension to the form according to the setting of the forms tension lever.

Settings range from * to 6. The * setting puts no tension on the form and allows forms to pass freely while loading. The 1 setting puts the least amount of tension on the form. Settings 2 through 6 vary the amount of tension on the form and approximately relate to the number of sheets in the form you use. Set the tension lever to the number of sheets in the form being used.

Note: Higher numbers are toward the top and lower numbers are toward the bottom of the printer.

When you adjust the forms tension, be sure that the forms are not held too tightly or too loosely. If too much tension is on the forms, the forms can tear, the paper holes of the form can stretch, and forms can jam. If too little tension is on the forms, the forms can wrinkle or buckle, causing the forms to jam.



Decreasing Forms Tension: To decrease tension on the forms, follow these steps:

- Loosen the blue forms tension knob by rotating the knob counterclockwise.
- 2. Move the knob to a lower number setting.

For example, if the knob was set at 3, move the knob to 2.

- Tighten the **blue forms tension knob** by rotating the knob clockwise. Be sure to avoid unlatching the F1 forms device when adjusting the forms tension.
- 4. Press Start to print.
- 5. Observe the forms.

If the form paper holes are still tearing or stretching, press **Stop** and repeat Steps 1 through 5 of this procedure.

If the forms are buckling, there is too little tension on the forms.

If the tension is satisfactory, continue to print.

Increasing Forms Tension: To increase tension on the forms, follow these steps:

- Loosen the blue forms tension knob by rotating the knob counterclockwise.
- 2. Move the knob to a higher number setting.

For example, if the knob was set at 2, move the knob to 3.

- Tighten the **blue forms tension knob** by rotating the knob clockwise. Be sure to avoid unlatching the F1 forms device when adjusting the forms tension.
- 4. Press Start to print.
- 5. Observe the forms.

If the forms are still buckling, press **Stop** and repeat Steps 1 through 5 of this procedure.

If the forms are tearing or jamming, there is too much tension on the forms.

If the tension is satisfactory, continue to print.

Adjusting the Left Margin

You can print a single line of text to help in setting the left margin position using the Left Margin Alignment Test. You can also change the current left margin position using this test.

You can set the left margin position from 1 to 66 units (where each unit is 0.686 mm [0.027 in.]). The factory default setting is 10. The margin is measured starting at 1.27 mm (0.05 in.) from the center of the tractor pins for continuous forms and the left edge of a cut form.

To align the left margin position, follow these steps:

1. If the printer is *ready*, press **Stop**.

2. Enter the Operator Print Tests by pressing Test.

3. Press Scroll or Scroll until the printer displays

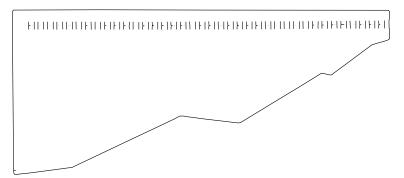

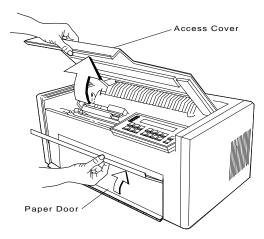

The Micro and Micro keys control fine vertical movement. Each time you press these keys, the printer moves the form in 0.355 mm (0.014 in.) increments.

- 2. Push the door back slightly to lock it in the open position.



Next load forms, if necessary (see "Loading Forms in the F1 Forms Device" on page 1-26 for more information). Complete the following steps to make fine vertical adjustments to the top of form position.

To set the top of form position, follow these steps:

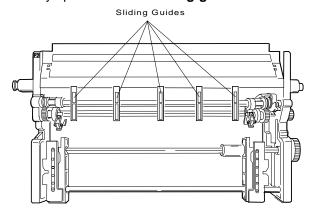
Right Tractor Assembly

The **Micro** and **Micro** keys control fine vertical movement. Each time you press these keys, the printer moves the form in 0.355 mm (0.014 in.) increments.

Note: If you use the **Micro**, **Micro**, or **Line Feed** keys to adjust the print position, you may need to reprint the page.

Open the access cover. Then open the front paper door as follows:

- 1. Pull the door up until it will not go any higher.
- 2. Push the door back slightly to lock it in the open position.



Next load forms, if necessary (see "Loading Forms in the F2 Forms Device" on page 1-60 for more information). Complete the following steps to make fine vertical adjustments to the top of form position.

To set the top of form position, follow these steps:

1. Press Stop.

2. If the first print line is not where you want it to be, press **Micro**, Micro , or Line Feed until it reaches the desired line.

Note: If you need to adjust the paper downward, adjust at least five steps beyond where you want the top of form position; then make your final adjustment in the up direction. You can also use the Top of Form Alignment Test (see "Top of Form Alignment" on page 5-4) to print a line of characters to determine more accurately where you have set the top of form position.

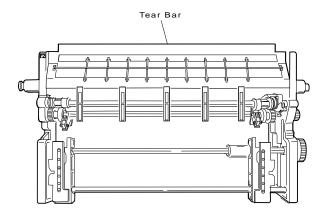
3. When the form is in the correct position, press **Set Top of Form**. The alarm beeps and the printer displays

Adjusting the Tear-off Position

The Dual Purpose Forms Device Document on Demand features allow you to tear off a form using the tear bar upon completing a print job. You can then prepare the printer to print the next print job.



To change the tear-off position of a form, follow these steps:

1. Make sure the printer is at the top of form position. Press **Load/Eject** once.

- 2. Open the acoustic cover.
- If the perforation on the form is not at the tear-off position, use the Micro , Micro , and Line Feed keys to adjust the form position until the perforation is exactly in line with the tear-off bar.

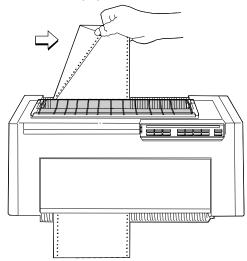
The limits for the Tear-off Position Adjustment from the default position is ±19.05 mm (0.75 in.).

Note: If the last page of the form feeds past the forms sensor, the printer displays

and pressing Load/Eject ejects the paper.

To remove the form, follow these steps:

1. Tear off the paper toward the front of the printer.

Adjusting the Load Position

Note: Press **Set Top of Form** to keep the load position consistent with the top of form position. Pressing **Set Top of Form** establishes the first print line at which printing is to start on each form. The alarm beeps and the printer displays



Adjusting the Print Alignment

You can adjust dot registration and print quality for characters created using bidirectional printing. The bidirectional alignment may need periodic adjustment to maintain print quality.

To change the bidirectional alignment, follow these steps:

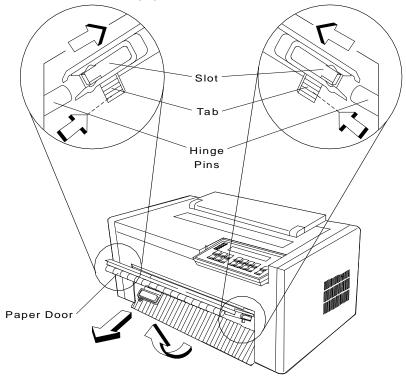


Changing the Paper Door

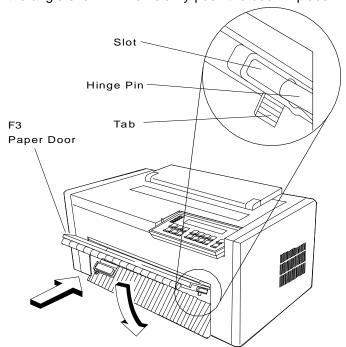
The printer must have a different paper door installed to be used with the F3 forms device. If you have ordered the F3 forms device, your shipment includes an F3 forms device paper door.

To change paper doors, follow these steps:

 Open the standard paper door to the position shown. Press the two tabs to release the door and slowly pull the door toward you. Remove the standard paper door.

Setup and Checkout Complete

You have completed a simple setup and checkout of the printer. IBM recommends that you print your power-on custom set (Custom Set A) factory defaults and save this printout for future reference. You are ready to attach the printer to your computer. Go to Chapter 2, "Attaching the 4230 Printer to Your Computer" on page 2-1.

Adjusting the Print Quality

After the printer prints a few lines, press **Stop** and verify that the print quality is satisfactory. Good print quality includes:

Clear, legible print Satisfactory darkness or lightness of output.

It is up to you to decide if the print quality is satisfactory. Adjustments you can make that affect print quality include:

Forms Thickness Setting

This setting can affect the darkness or lightness of output.

The printer will normally sense the forms thickness and adjust itself automatically. However, if this setting is not correct, it can be adjusted. To adjust the forms thickness, see "Adjusting the Forms Thickness Setting" on page 1-102.

Note: The Automatic Forms Thickness Adjustment (AFTA) mechanism automatically measures the forms thickness and adjusts the gap from the print head to the platen rod based on the measured value. See "Automatic Forms Thickness Adjustment (AFTA)" on page 3-8 for information on how the 4230 Printer sets the forms thickness.

Left Margin and Top of Form Position

The adjustment of the first print position can affect the appearance of the output, especially if you are using preprinted forms. To adjust the position of the first print character, see "Adjusting the Left Margin" on page 1-104. To adjust the position of the first print line, see "Adjusting the Top of Form Position" on page 1-107.

Print Alignment

This adjustment can affect the character formation and dot mixing on those characters that are printed with two passes of the print mechanism. To adjust the print alignment, see "Adjusting the Print Alignment" on page 1-109.

Adjusting the Forms Thickness Setting

To adjust the lightness or darkness of the print, you must increase or decrease the gap between the print head and the platen rod. This distance is automatically set for you by the Automatic Forms Thickness Adjustment (AFTA), but you can make corrections to the distance if the print output is not as you desire. It is up to you to decide if the print is dark (or light) enough to meet your requirements.

To adjust the forms thickness setting with the F3 forms device, follow these steps:

1. The forms thickness setting must be adjusted when the printer is printing or has printed and is ready. Press Start, if needed, to have the printer display



2. To make the print darker, press Darker.

The printer displays



The print head moves closer to the paper, and the print becomes darker.

Note: The print may not get darker if the ribbon is worn or if there is a problem with the print head.

3. To make the print lighter, press Lighter.

The printer displays



The print head moves farther away from the paper, and the print becomes lighter.

4. When you release the key, the printer automatically saves the current value.

Note: The 's indicates the position of the print head relative to the limits.

As long as you press Darker or Lighter, the printer displays an increasing amount of darkness or lightness until one of the limits of the gap is reached. The printer displays either

As you adjust the gap, you may also see the printer display

This message tells you that the forms thickness setting is at the automatically set value.

Adjusting the Left Margin

You can print a single line of text to help in setting the left margin position using the Left Margin Alignment Test. You can also change the current left margin position using this test.

You can set the left margin position from 1 to 66 units (where each unit is 0.686 mm [0.027 in.]). The factory default setting is 10. The margin is measured starting at 1.27 mm (0.05 in.) from the center of the tractor pins for continuous forms and from the left edge of a cut form.

To align the left margin position, follow these steps:

1. If the printer is *ready*, press **Stop**.

Chapter 2. Attaching the 4230 Printer to Your Computer

This chapter provides specific instructions on attaching the printer to your computer. *Models 102 and 111* can attach to a computer using a twinaxial connector. *Models 202 and 211* can attach to a computer using a coaxial connector. *Model 413* can attach to three computers simultaneously using the parallel, serial, and twinaxial connectors. *Model 513* can attach to three computers simultaneously using the parallel, serial, and coaxial connectors. For *Models 413* and 513, you may want to attach the printer to more than one computer. If so, you need to perform the steps in each appropriate section.

For Coaxial or Twinaxial, look at the bezel at the rear of the printer. If your printer has a feature card number or card name of:

Models 102, 111, and 4I3 Twinaxial, go to "Models 102, 111, and 4I3 Twinaxial Attachment" on page 2-2.

Models 202, 211, and 513 Coaxial, go to "Models 202, 211, and 513 Coaxial Attachment" on page 2-17.

For *Models 4I3 and 5I3* (when parallel or serial is the active interface), go to "Models 4I3 and 5I3 (when parallel or serial is the active interface)" on page 2-20.

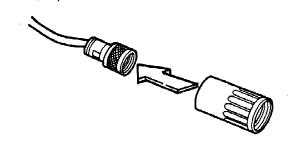

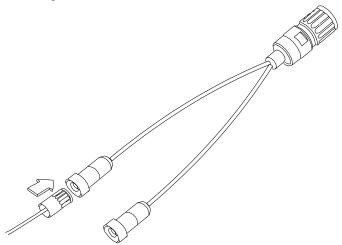

Before you connect the cable to the V-connector, slip a cable shield over the end of the cable. (If you are connecting two cables, slip a cable shield over the end of both cables.)

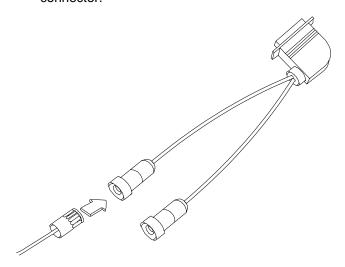

Your 4230 Printer can be configured either as a 4230 Printer (if your version of OS/400* supports the 4230 Printer), by setting 4224 Emulation Mode to No on Models 102, 111, 202, and 211 or Host Emulation Mode to 4230 on Models 413 and 513, or as an IBM 4224 Printer (if your version of OS/400 does not support the 4230 Printer) by setting 4224 Emulation Mode to Yes on Models 102, 111, 202, and 211 or Host Emulation Mode to 4224 on Models 413 and 513.

For Models 102, 111, 202, and 211, the printer is shipped with 4224 Emulation Mode set to Yes. To set your printer's 4224 Emulation Mode to No, see "Using Printer Setup Parameters" in IBM 4230 Printer Models 102, 111, 202, 211, 413, and 513 Operator Panel Instructions for information on configuring your printer.

For *Models 4I3 and 5I3*, the printer is shipped with Host Emulation Mode set to 4224. To set your printer's Host Emulation Mode to 4230, see "Using Printer Setup Parameters" in IBM 4230 Printer Models 102, 111, 202, 211, 413, and 513 Operator Panel Instructions for information on configuring your printer.

The 4230 printer (local or remote) is supported by OS/400 as follows:

4230 mode (AFP *Yes or *No): V2R2 or later 4224 mode (AFP *No): V1R1 or later 4224 mode (AFP *Yes): V2R1 or later

Note: The AFP* parameter is part of the printer's device description on the AS/400.

Connecting Your Printer to an IBM System/36

For additional information not found here, see your System/36 documentation.

To connect your printer to a System/36, follow these steps:

1. After your printer is set up:

Set the address and language values on your printer using the Configuration Menu. Set 4224 Emulation Mode to Yes for Models 102, 111, 202, and 211 or Host Emulation Mode to 4224 for Models 413 and 513. This will configure your 4230 Printer to emulate the IBM 4224 Printer. Your System/36 will control the 4230 Printer as if it were an IBM 4224 Printer. For instructions on how to set your printer to 4224 Emulation Mode or Host Emulation Mode, see "Checking and Changing Configuration Parameter Values" in IBM 4230 Printer Models 102, 111, 202, 211, 413, and 513 Operator Panel Instructions for information on configuring your printer.

The specific parameter values for this printer should have been determined by your system supervisor. If that information has not been provided, contact your system supervisor.

2. Load and line up forms.

See Chapter 1, "Setting Up the 4230 Printer" for instructions on loading and lining up forms in your printer.

3. Ask the system supervisor if the cable from the printer to the host computer is installed.

If the cable between the printer and host computer is installed, go to Step 4 on page 2-16.

CAUTION:

Make sure the machine is turned Off (O) before you connect or disconnect the power cord or other cables.

If the machine has cables other than the power cord, you must connect them before you plug the power cord into an outlet. You must first unplug the power cord from the outlet when you remove the other cables.

If the cable between the printer and host computer is not installed, find out when it will be installed. Connect the cables to the printer only when instructed to do so by your system supervisor.

4. Changing Your System/36 Configuration.

Auto Configuration will configure the printer as an IPDS* printer. Other parameters are automatically assigned by the system. Auto configuration is valid only for local printers. Remote printers must be manually configured.

To modify the System/36 configuration for the 4230 Printer, see "Adding or Deleting Local Display Stations and Printers" and "Adding or Deleting Remote Work Stations" in Changing Your System Configuration, SC21-9082.

The printer can be used as a local or remote IPDS printer. Use the **PH** device code (IPDS Printer Universal Device Code). There is no specific 4230 device code.

If the printer is to be used as a remote printer, it can be configured to an IBM 5394 or 5294 Remote Control Unit.

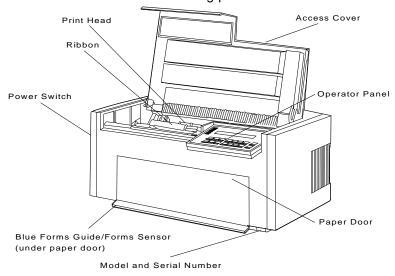

Chapter 3. Getting to Know Your Printer

This chapter introduces you to your IBM 4230 Printer. It describes the various parts of your printer and shows you their locations. This chapter also includes general information about the different forms devices that are available and instructions about caring for your new printer.

Parts of the Printer

The 4230 Printer has the following parts:



Model Identification

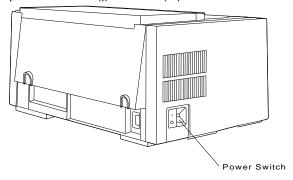


Figure 3-1. 4230 Printer Model Identification Plate

Figure 3-1 is an enlargement of a plate on the bottom-front area of the printer.

Record the model and serial numbers of your printer. You will need this information as you use this and other 4230 Printer manuals.

Power Switch

The power switch supplies electricity to the printer. It has two positions: On (|) and Off (O).



Notes:

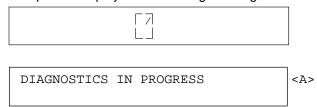
- 1. When you turn the power On (|), a power-on test runs. For the description of the power-on test, see "Power-On Test" on page 3-4.
- 2. Always **wait 10 seconds** after turning the power from Off (O) to On (|).
- 3. Anytime you turn the power On (|), you should verify the top of form position before running a job. See Chapter 1, "Setting Up the 4230 Printer" for adjusting the top of form position for your forms device.

Warning: If you turn the power Off (O) while data is in the printer *buffer* (a temporary storage area) or coming from the computer to the printer, you will lose data.

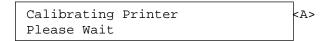
Power-On Test

Whenever you turn the power On (|), a power-on test runs. An error-free power-on test goes through these steps:

- 1. All indicators light briefly.
- 2. The alarm beeps.
- 3. Two rows of boxes fill the display.
- 4. The printer displays the following messages



5. The print head and ribbon move. You will hear some sounds from these movements. If no paper is loaded, the printer displays



Next, the printer displays



6. Finally, the printer displays the message



Note: If the power-on test stops at any point or the printer displays a three-digit code and error message before the test is complete, a power-on error has occurred. If you have not loaded any forms or the printer is not communicating with the host, the printer may

display an error. If an error appears, follow the instructions for "Using the Status Code and Problem Listings" on page B-2.

Acoustic Cover

The acoustic cover reduces the noise level of the printer while it is printing.

Notes:

- Do not open or close the access cover by holding only the acoustic cover. Open and close the acoustic cover separately from the access cover.
- 2. If you have installed the F2 forms device, you must open the acoustic cover to use the tear bar.

Access Cover

Opening the access cover:

Gives you access to the top of the printer for:

- Cleaning
- Changing ribbon cartridges
- Loading or changing forms devices

Causes printing and forms movement to slow down.

Note: The printer may also display status code 090. See "Status Codes" on page B-3 for more information.

Front Paper Door

Opening the front paper door:

Gives you access to the front area of the printer where paper is loaded

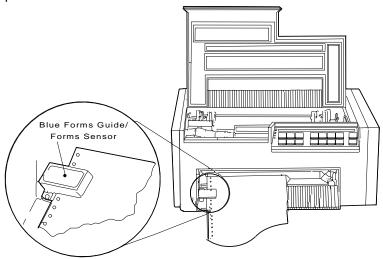
Provides access for loading forms devices

Causes printing and forms movement to slow down.

Note: The printer may also display status code 090. See "Status Codes" on page B-3 for more information.

Forms Guide/Forms Sensor

The blue forms guide/forms sensor works in several ways. The way it works depends on the type of forms device installed in the printer.



With a Continuous Forms Device (F1) or a Dual Purpose Forms Device (F2) installed, the sensor works as:

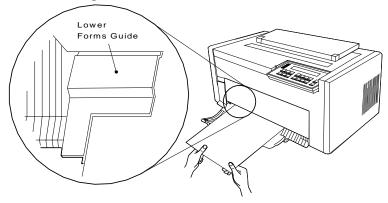
A forms guide for aligning the left edge of the form.

A forms sensor for detecting the last form fed past it. The printer stops printing after it prints the last line on the last form.

A forms sensor for detecting the presence of a form and activating the Load/Eject key for the Automatic Load feature with the Dual Purpose Forms Device (F2).

A paper jam detector.

The Document Insertion Device (F3) has an additional guide called a **lower forms guide** that fits over the sensor.



The lower forms guide works as:

A **guide** for aligning the cut sheet form.

The **sensor** works as:

A **sensor** for detecting the presence of a form and activating the **Load/Eject** key.

Automatic Forms Thickness Adjustment (AFTA)

The Automatic Forms Thickness Adjustment (AFTA) mechanism performs the following tasks:

Automatically measures the forms thickness and adjusts the gap from the print head to the platen rod based on the measured value.

Measures the form thickness whenever printing is to occur. When you replace the paper, the thickness is automatically remeasured.

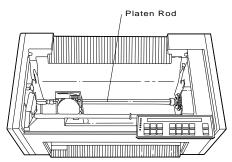
For the Document Insertion Device (F3), AFTA measures the first document after you turn the printer On (|) or after you press **Stop** and then **Start**.

For the Auto Sheet Feeder Device (F4), AFTA measures the first sheet of each bin after you turn the printer On (|) and after you press **Stop** and then **Start**.

The operator may adjust the AFTA by pressing **Darker** and **Lighter**. Locate the information on your forms device and follow the procedure for adjusting the print darkness in Chapter 1, "Setting Up the 4230 Printer."

Platen Rod

The platen rod is a metal bar with a flat surface. The platen rod is part of the base printer and is easy to identify when no forms device is installed. You need to know the location of the platen rod for installing the forms device, loading forms, and aligning the first print line.



Operator Panel

The operator panel includes a 2-line by 40-character display, 6 indicators, 16 keys, and an audible alarm.

Figure 3-2, Figure 3-3, Figure 3-4 on page 3-10, and Figure 3-5 on page 3-10 show the operator panels for each model.

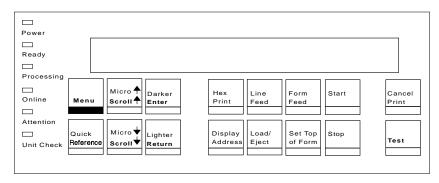


Figure 3-2. 4230 Printer Models 102 and 111 Operator Panel

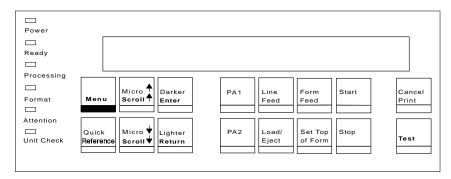


Figure 3-3. 4230 Printer Models 202 and 211 Operator Panel

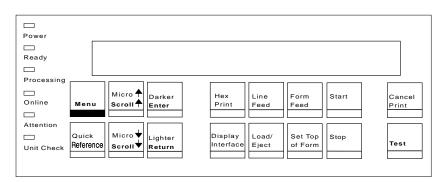


Figure 3-4. 4230 Printer Model 4I3 Operator Panel

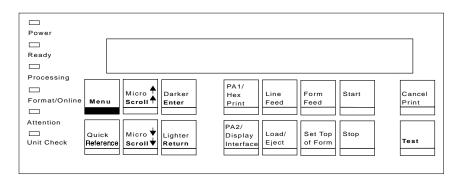


Figure 3-5. 4230 Printer Model 5l3 Operator Panel

This section describes each part of the operator panel. For a detailed description on using the operator panel, see IBM 4230 Printer Models 102, 111, 202, 211, 413, and 513 Operator Panel Instructions. IBM 4230 Printer Models 102, 111, and 413 Quick Reference Guide or IBM 4230 Printer Models 202, 211, and 513 Quick Reference Guide also provide a brief description of panel functions.

Alarm

The printer alarm beeps to let you know of a printer status condition or an error. Pressing Stop turns the alarm off.

You can set the alarm to beep at high or low volume or not to beep by following the procedure in "Using Printer Setup Parameters" in IBM 4230 Printer Models 102, 111, 202, 211, 413, and 513 Operator Panel Instructions.

Note: When you press Set Top of Form, the alarm beeps even if you have it disabled.

Display

The display is a liquid crystal display (LCD) of 2 lines of 40 characters. The display shows a number of different types of messages: status codes and information, error codes and messages, and Configuration and Operator Print Tests Menus. Status information helps you identify a problem or a normal condition that requires some action on your part.

Power Indicator

The **Power** indicator has two operating conditions:

On The printer is receiving power.

Off The printer is not receiving power.

Ready Indicator

The **Ready** indicator has two operating conditions:

On The printer is *ready* to print.

Off The printer is *not ready* to print.

Processing Indicator

The **Processing** indicator has three operating conditions:

On The printer is currently processing data.

Off There is no data to be processed and no data is buffered

in the printer.

The printer has data buffered, but it cannot currently be **Blinking**

printed.

Online Indicator (Models 102, 111, and 413)

The **Online** indicator has two operating conditions:

On The printer is communicating with the computer.

Off The printer is not communicating with the computer.

Format Indicator (Models 202 and 2l1)

The **Format** indicator has two operating conditions:

On The Cancel Print, PA1, and PA2 keys are available for

use (that is, you can press them in the printer's current

state).

Off The PA1 and PA2 keys are not currently available. The

Cancel Print key is only available when running an

Operator Print Test.

Use the PA1 and PA2 keys to send special operator requests. See "Understanding the Operator Panel" in the IBM 4230 Printer Models 102, 111, 202, 211, 413, and 513 Operator Panel Instructions for more information on these keys.

Format/Online Indicator (Model 513)

The indicator functions as a Format indicator when the coaxial attachment is active (see the below operating conditions for the Format indicator) or as an Online indicator when the parallel or serial attachment is active (see the above operating conditions for the Online indicator).

- On The Cancel Print, PA1, and PA2 keys are available for use (that is, you can press them in the printer's current state).
- Off The PA1 and PA2 keys are not currently available. The Cancel Print key is only available when running an Operator Print Test.

The PA1 and PA2 keys are used to send special operator requests. See "Understanding the Operator Panel" in the IBM 4230 Printer Models 102, 111, 202, 211, 413, and 513 Operator Panel Instructions for more information on these keys.

Attention Indicator

The **Attention** indicator has two operating conditions:

Off The printer has not detected any conditions requiring operator intervention.

Blinking The printer has detected a condition requiring immediate operator intervention. The alarm also beeps (if not disabled). If the printer also displays a status code, go to "Using the Status Code and Problem Listings" on page B-2.

Unit Check Indicator

The **Unit Check** indicator has two operating conditions:

Off The printer has not detected any printer errors.

Blinking

The printer has detected a printer error. The alarm beeps (if not disabled). If the printer also displays a status code, go to "Using the Status Code and Problem Listings" on page B-2.

Configuration Parameter Values

Parameter values are settings that the printer recognizes to do the following:

Format the printed page Set printing and performance options Set character sets for different languages Modify the alarm volume or disable the alarm.

The printer can use the parameter values set by the factory, or you can change them. The new values you set from the operator panel become the new parameter values.

Important

Changes to these values will not be saved when you turn the printer Off (O) unless you choose to save them in a Custom Default Set. In other words, all configuration changes are online—only changes until they are saved using the Save Current Values parameter in the Configuration Menu under Configuration Storage. For detailed information on saving configuration changes, see "Storing Configuration Parameters" in IBM 4230 Printer Models 102, 111, 202, 211, 413, and 513 Operator Panel Instructions.

Some of the values you can change from the Configuration Menu on the operator panel are:

Characters per inch (CPI)

Lines per inch (LPI)

Maximum print position (MPP)

Maximum page length (MPL)

Print language

Display language

Printer address (Models 102, 111, and 413)

System interface (Models 413 and 513 when parallel or serial is

the active interface)

Print quality

Alarm setting.

See *IBM 4230 Printer Models 102, 111, 202, 211, 413, and 513 Operator Panel Instructions* for the procedures to check or change each of the parameter values.

Operating States

Online – The printer is *online* when power is On (|), the power-on tests complete, and the printer is able to communicate with the computer. For the *Models 102, 111, and 4l3*, the **Online** indicator is On.

Offline – The printer is offline whenever power-on tests are running or whenever the printer is in test mode (Operator Print Tests). For the *Models 102, 111, and 413*, the Online indicator is Off.

Ready and Not Ready

Ready – The printer is *ready* when you press **Start** and there are no error conditions. The printer can be *ready* and online or offline.

Ready is indicated when the **Ready** indicator is On. See "Ready Indicator" on page 3-12 for more information.

The printer displays



unless an information message overrides *ready* or the printer is offline.

Not Ready – The printer is *not ready* when you press **Stop** or when an error or operator intervention condition occurs. The printer can be *not ready* and online or offline.

The printer displays



or a status code and message, and the Ready indicator is Off. See "Ready Indicator" on page 3-12 for more information.

Forms

You can use two types of forms (paper) in your printer:

Continuous forms (F1 and F2 forms devices) Cut forms (F3 and F4 forms devices).

The forms may be blank or preprinted. The forms may be single-part or multiple-part, with or without carbon paper.

Keep in mind the following as you work with forms:

Inspect all forms for damage.

Do not use stapled, torn, or wrinkled forms.

When you use forms directly from a box, remove the box tops; or, preferably, remove the forms from the box. Rough box-top edges can damage the forms or cause the forms to jam.

All multiple-part cut forms must be glued at the top edge.

A maximum of four-part forms is recommended for the best registration, feeding, and stacking. You might be able to use five- or six-part forms, but test them before ordering large quantities.

Humidity affects forms feeding and stacking. Keep all forms in a cool, dry place. If the forms are exposed to high humidity, allow them to adjust to the humidity level of the printer area for approximately 24 hours before you use them.

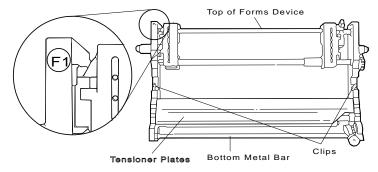

Continuous Forms Device (F1)



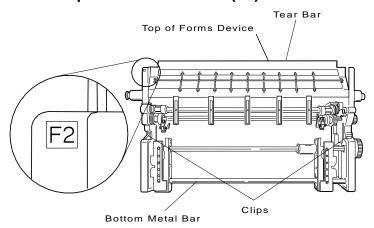
The Continuous Forms Device (F1) is available for all models.

The device has an *F1* surrounded by a circle in the upper left corner of the device.

Use this device when you are printing large volume work (especially with very thin forms) or work that requires minimum operator intervention.

See "Installing and Using the Continuous Forms Device (F1)" on page 1-21 for information on installing and removing the forms device, loading and unloading forms, and adjusting the device.

Dual Purpose Forms Device (F2)



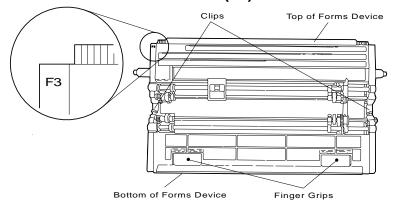
The Dual Purpose Forms Device (F2) is available for all models.

The device has an F2 surrounded by a square in the upper left corner of the device.

Use this device when printing work that requires you to separate the continuous forms between transactions and for most general printing requirements on continuous forms. Use the tear bar to separate the printed forms. Also, the automatic loading feature (autoload) is enabled for this device.

See "Installing and Using the Dual Purpose Forms Device (F2)" on page 1-55 for information on installing and removing the forms device, loading and unloading forms, and adjusting the device.

Document Insertion Device (F3)



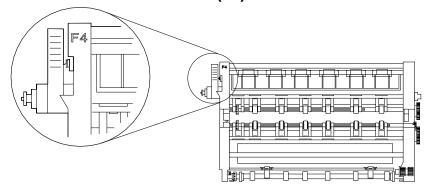
The Document Insertion Device (F3) is available for all models.

The device has an F3 by itself in the upper left corner of the device.

Use this device for printing cut forms for correspondence, individual invoice forms, and so on.

See "Installing and Using the Document Insertion Device (F3)" on page 1-88 for information on installing and removing the forms device, loading and unloading forms, and adjusting the device.

Auto Sheet Feeder Device (F4)



The Auto Sheet Feeder Device (F4) is available for all models of the 4230 Printer.

The device has an F4 by itself in the upper left corner of the device.

This device is used for automatic feeding and printing of cut forms. It can feed paper from one of three bins or a manual insertion slot.

The Auto Sheet Feeder Device (F4) consists of two parts: (1) a forms transport device (shown above) that mounts inside your printer, and (2) a sheet feeder that sits in front of the printer on the same table.

See "Setting Up Your 4230 Printer with ASF" in IBM 4230 Printer Auto Sheet Feeder General Information for information on setting up and operating this device.

Ribbons

Two ribbon cartridges are available for use in the 4230 Printer: one with a black multiple purpose ink (IBM part 1040580) with an average ribbon life of 15 million DP characters, and one with a black general purpose ink (IBM part 1040440) with an average ribbon life of 6 million DP characters. Call Lexmark** at 1-800-438-2468 to order ribbons.

See "Installing the Ribbon Cartridge and Guide" on page 1-6 and Chapter 4, "Replacing Your Ribbon" for more information.

Print Head

Your printer has a 9-wire print head. The print head is bidirectional (prints left to right and right to left).

If there is a problem with the print head, contact your IBM service representative.

Problem Determination

Appendix B, "Problem Solving" has codes and problem information. The most probable cause of a printer problem is listed first. There is also an inspection procedure for the forms devices to help you find and remove paper jams. If you cannot resolve the problem using this information, contact your service representative.

Relocation Instructions

Be sure that you tape or tie down the print head and use foam or some other material as padding. Reinstall the shipping brace if possible (see page 1-5).

Caring for Your Printer

Your printer requires very little care, but the following suggestions are helpful to prevent damage and to keep it clean.

Be sure that you use the correct IBM ribbon cartridge (IBM part 1040580 or IBM part 1040440).

Do not place liquid containers near the printer.

Keep the access cover closed except when replacing the ribbon or changing the forms.

Do not let objects (rubber bands, paper clips, and so on) drop into the printer.

Do not block the air vents on the printer sides. Obstructions could restrict airflow and cause the printer to overheat.

Clean or vacuum the printer as necessary to remove dust or lint from the forms feed path. Be sure that the power switch is turned Off (O).

Use a cloth dampened with mild soap and warm water to clean the printer exterior.

Stopping or Canceling a Print Job

To stop the current print job, follow these steps:

2. To continue printing the same print job, press Start.

To cancel the current print job, follow these steps:

Warning: Canceling a print job by using Cancel Print sends a message to the computer and will cause data in the printer to be cleared.

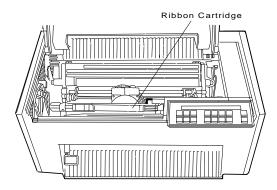

Chapter 4. Replacing Your Ribbon

This chapter describes how to remove and replace the ribbon cartridge and how to make ribbon adjustments.

Warning: Damage to the printer can occur if you do not use IBM ribbons (IBM part 1040580 or 1040440) especially designed for the 4230 Printer. Call Lexmark at 1-800-438-2468 to order ribbons.



Removing the Ribbon Cartridge

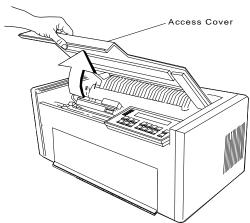
To remove an existing ribbon cartridge, follow these steps:

- 1. If the power is Off (O), go to Step 3.
- 2. If the power is On (|), press **Stop**.

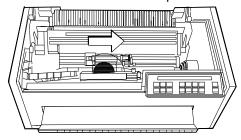

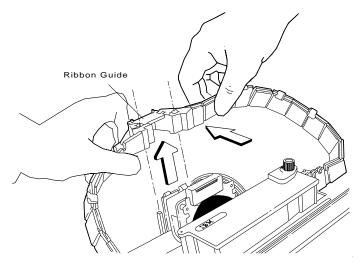


4. Slide the print head to the center of the printer.



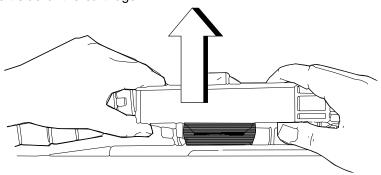
5. Push the ribbon guide toward the back of the printer and lift the ribbon guide up.

6. Pull the ribbon cartridge up until it snaps free. Remove the ribbon cartridge from the printer.

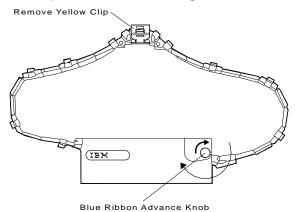

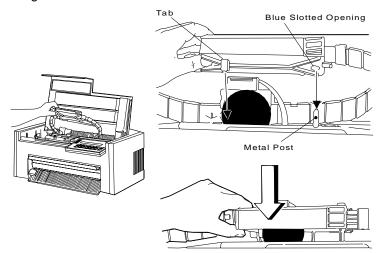
Installing the Ribbon Cartridge

To install a new ribbon cartridge, follow these steps:

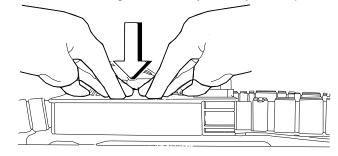
- 1. Get a new ribbon cartridge and remove it from the package.
- 2. Remove the yellow clip from the ribbon.
- 3. Turn the **blue ribbon advance knob** clockwise to take up slack in the ribbon. If the ribbon does not move, contact your place of purchase and replace the ribbon cartridge.



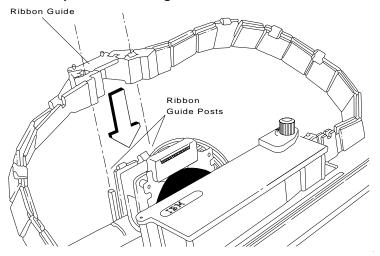
4. Align the **blue slotted opening** on the bottom of the ribbon cartridge with the metal post. You may have to turn the **blue ribbon advance knob** to align the slots. Lower the ribbon cartridge onto the metal post. Be sure that the plastic tab on the bottom of the ribbon cartridge aligns with the hole in the printer casting.



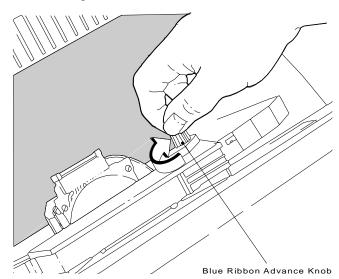
5. Press the cartridge down firmly to snap it into place.



6. Align the holes in the ribbon guide with the ribbon guide posts on the print head carrier. Press the guide all the way down on the ribbon guide posts until the tops of the posts are even with the top of the ribbon guide.



- 7. To be sure that you have installed the ribbon cartridge correctly, check that:
 - a. The left side of the ribbon cartridge is securely snapped onto the printer. The right side fits over the ribbon drive post but does not latch down.
 - b. There are no twists or folds in the ribbon.
 - c. The ribbon is not catching on the print head.
 - d. The ribbon moves when you turn the **blue ribbon advance knob** clockwise. If the ribbon does not move, replace the ribbon cartridge.



- 8. If necessary, load or reload forms (see the appropriate section in Chapter 1, "Setting Up the 4230 Printer," depending on your forms device).
- 9. Be sure that the power is On (|).
- 10. If there is data in the printer to be printed:
 - a. Leave the access cover open.
 - b. Press Start.
 - c. Observe the printer as it prints.

Note: If your printing results in partial characters, be sure that the ribbon guide is correctly in place on the print head and no folds are in the ribbon.

d. When printing is satisfactory, close the access cover and continue with your print jobs.

You have completed installing a ribbon cartridge. If you have any printing problems, see Appendix B, "Problem Solving" to determine the probable cause.

Chapter 5. Using the Operator Print Tests

This chapter describes the print tests you can perform to:

Demonstrate printing capabilities Adjust printer operations Check the printer configuration Check printer operation.

Any of these tests can be performed at anytime. However, all tests should be performed when there is no print data buffered in the printer processing. When you go into test mode, the printer goes offline. When you exit test mode, the printer performs a *partial reset* before going back online. This partial reset clears any buffered print data and anything stored in printer storage, such as downloaded fonts or overlays.

Entering the Operator Print Tests may cause the forms configuration settings to be adjusted. If the current settings are less than a maximum print position of 72 or a maximum page length of 66, the printer will adjust the settings to a standard 8.5 x 11 inch page. This is done to ensure correct formatting of all offline customer tests. The original settings will be reset when the printer returns to the online state. If the settings are larger than the required page dimensions, the settings are not changed.

General Test Instructions

To enter the Operator Print Tests menu, press **Test** when the printer is *not ready*. The printer displays

OPERATOR PRINT TESTS
Printer Demonstration

The Printer Demonstration test is the first test in the Operator Print Tests menu. From this display, press **Scroll** or **Scroll** to view the other tests.

When a test is not running, pressing Return or Cancel Print tells the printer to exit test mode and perform a partial reset. If you press Return, the printer goes to online not ready; if you press Cancel **Print**, the printer goes to online *ready*.

Pressing Enter or Start begins a test. Some of the tests print and then exit back to the Operator Print Tests menu automatically, while other tests require you to give input using the operator panel keys to complete the test. See the individual test descriptions on the following pages for specific instructions.

While a test is running, pressing **Stop** or **Cancel Print** halts the test. If you press Stop, the display returns to the Operator Print Tests menu. If you press Cancel Print, the printer exits test mode, performs a partial reset, and becomes online ready.

Printer Demonstration

You can print samples of all the available print qualities, representative charts, bar codes, and bit image graphics, by using the Printer Demonstration test. This test can also be used to verify parts of the printer mechanism.

Note: The 4230 Printer can perform this test without being connected to a computer.

To begin the printer demonstration:

1. Enter the Operator Print Tests (see "General Test Instructions" on page 5-1).

The printer displays

2. Press Enter or Start to begin the test.

The printer displays

```
OPERATOR PRINT TESTS
Please Wait
```

while the demonstration data is being loaded. After the data is loaded, the Ready indicator goes on and printing begins. The demonstration automatically repeats until Stop or Cancel Print is pressed.

3. Press Cancel Print to exit the test and make the printer ready (see "General Test Instructions" on page 5-1). Press Stop to exit the test and return to the Test Menu.

Top of Form Alignment

You can print a single line of text to help in setting the top of form position using the Top of Form Alignment test. The test prints a row of H's, and lets you adjust the top of form position and to print another row of H's until the top of form position is set where you want it.

To adjust top of form position, follow these steps:

1. Enter the Operator Print Tests (see "General Test Instructions" on page 5-1).

The printer displays

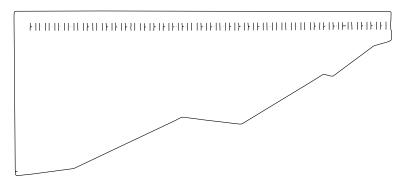
OPERATOR PRINT TESTS Printer Demonstration

2. Press **Scroll** or **Scroll** until the printer displays

OPERATOR PRINT TESTS Top of Form Alignment

3. Press Enter or Start to begin the test.

The printer prints a single line of H's.



The printer then displays

Top of Form Alignment Press ENTER to Reprint

4. If the H's do not print where you want your top of form position, you can adjust the setting with the following keys:

Line Feed Advance form 4.23 mm (0.17 in.)

Advance form 0.35 mm (0.0139 in.) Micro

Micro Move form backward 0.35 mm (0.0139 in.).

- 5. After you have made an adjustment, press **Enter** to print the *H*'s again on the same page, or press Form Feed (Load/Eject for the F3 or F4 forms devices) and then **Enter** to print the H's at the new top of form position on the next page.
- 6. Repeat Steps 4 and 5 until the top of form position is where you want it.
- 7. Press Set Top of Form to set the new top of form position. The alarm beeps and the printer displays

TOP OF FORM SET

8. Press **Cancel Print** to exit the test and make the printer *ready*. Press Stop to exit the test and return to the Test Menu (see "General Test Instructions" on page 5-1).

Note: The top of form position can be adjusted without printing the row of H's. See the appropriate section for your forms device on setting the top of form position.

Left Margin Alignment

You can print a single line of text to help in setting the left margin position using the Left Margin Alignment Test. You can also change the current left margin position using this test.

You can set the left margin position from 1 to 66 units (where each unit is 0.686 mm [0.027 in.]). The factory default setting is 10. The margin is measured starting at 1.27 mm (0.05 in.) from the center of the tractor pins for continuous forms and from the left edge of a cut form.

To align the left margin position, follow these steps:

1. Enter the Operator Print Tests (see "General Test Instructions" on page 5-1).

The printer displays

OPERATOR PRINT TESTS Printer Demonstration

2. Press Scroll or Scroll until the printer displays

OPERATOR PRINT TESTS Left Margin Alignment

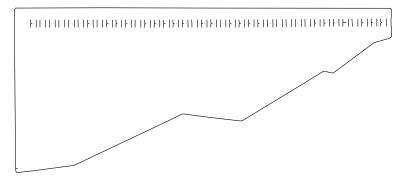
3. Press Enter or Start to begin the test.

The printer displays

Left Margin Position xxx

where xxx is the current value of the left margin position.

The printer also prints a single line of H's.



- 4. If the H's do not start where you want your left margin, press Scroll or Scroll until the printer displays the desired value for the left margin position. For each change in value, the left margin is changed 0.686 mm (0.027 in.).
- 5. Press Enter.

An asterisk (*) appears in front of the selected value. The forms advance one line and the row of Hs prints again. This value is now the current left margin position.

6. Repeat Steps 4 and 5 until the left margin is correctly aligned. (You can press Line Feed or Form Feed [Load/Eject for F3 or F4 forms devices] to move the forms between printing the rows of H's.)

7. Press Cancel Print to exit the test and make the printer ready. Press Stop to exit the test and return to the Test Menu (see "General Test Instructions" on page 5-1).

Note: If you want the new left margin position saved when you turn off the printer, you must save it in a Custom Set. See "Storing Configuration Parameters" in IBM 4230 Printer Models 102, 111, 202, 211, 413, and 513 Operator Panel Instructions for information on saving configurations.

> You may also adjust the left margin without printing the row of H's by changing the left margin position in the Configuration Menu. (See "Using Print Format and Quality Parameters" in IBM 4230 Printer Models 102, 111, 202, 211, 4/3, and 5/3 Operator Panel Instructions.)

Printer Configuration

You can print the current values for each parameter. Each parameter is shown with its corresponding value printed to the right. The category and parameter names are printed in the current Display Language used on the operator panel. The current custom set is noted at the top right column of the configuration printout. If you need to verify each custom set, the Operator Print Tests must be run for each custom set. The custom set must be changed in the configuration menu before running each configuration printout. See | Figure 5-1 on page 5-10, Figure 5-2 on page 5-11, Figure 5-3 on page 5-12, Figure 5-4 on page 5-13, Figure 5-5 on page 5-14, and | Figure 5-6 on page 5-15 for sample printouts.

Printer configurations can be checked by entering the configuration menus.

To print the printer configuration:

1. Enter the Operator Print Tests (see "General Test Instructions" on page 5-1).

The printer displays

OPERATOR PRINT TESTS Printer Demonstration

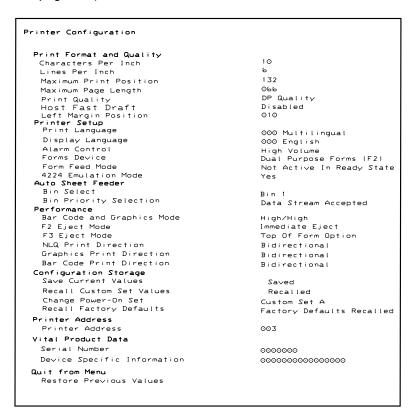
2. Press Scroll or Scroll until the printer displays

OPERATOR PRINT TESTS Printer Configuration

3. Press Enter or Start to begin the test.

The **Ready** indicator goes on and printing begins. The printout shows the current configuration. The configuration printout is complete when the Ready indicator goes off.

4. The printer returns to the Operator Print Tests menu automatically when the configuration printout is complete. 5. Press Cancel Print to make the printer ready or Return to make the printer not ready (see "General Test Instructions" on page 5-1).

Printer Verification

You can test general print quality and the wires in the print head by using the Printer Verification test. This test prints nine horizontal lines using each wire on the print head. After these nine lines have printed, several lines of data processing (DP) characters are printed followed by several lines of near letter quality (NLQ) characters.

To test print quality, follow these steps:

1. Enter the Operator Print Tests (see "General Test Instructions" on page 5-1).

The printer displays

OPERATOR PRINT TESTS Printer Demonstration

2. Press Scroll or Scroll until the printer displays

OPERATOR PRINT TESTS Printer Verification

3. Press Enter or Start to begin the test.

The Ready indicator goes on and printing begins. The verification printout is complete when the Ready indicator goes off.

The printout should look similar to:

Did the lines print and is the remainder of the printout clear and readable?

If YES, go to Step 5. If NO, do the following:

a. If any of the following items are not installed correctly, the printer can experience forms jamming, ribbon jamming, or an incorrect print verification printout:

> Forms device Ribbon cartridge Forms.

Repeat the setup instructions in Chapter 1, "Setting Up the 4230 Printer" if you suspect a ribbon, forms, or forms device installation problem.

- b. Be sure that enough forms are still loaded and press Enter to get another printout.
- c. If the second printout is not similar to the sample printout, go to Appendix B, "Problem Solving."
- d. Once you get a good printout, go to Step 5.
- 5. Press Cancel Print to make the printer ready or Return to make the printer not ready (see "General Test Instructions" on page 5-1).

Bidirectional Adjustment

You can adjust dot registration and print quality for characters created using bidirectional printing. The bidirectional alignment may need periodic adjustment to maintain print quality.

To change the bidirectional alignment, follow these steps:

1. Enter the Operator Print Tests (see "General Test Instructions" on page 5-1).

2. Press Scroll or Scroll until the printer displays

The **Ready** indicator goes on and printing begins. The test prints samples using alignment values higher and lower than the default value. The print sample using the default value is indicated with an asterisk (*). The alignment printout is complete when the Ready indicator goes off.

4. If the default value does not give the best print sample, press Scroll or Scroll until the printer displays the same number of arrows that were printed beside the best print sample line. Press Enter to set this as the new default value. The printer then prints another line to demonstrate the new default value, and the test is complete.

or

Press Stop to end the test without changing anything and return to the Operator Print Tests menu.

or

Press Cancel Print to end the test, exit test mode, perform a partial reset, and have the printer display



- 5. If you changed the value, check the last line printed for acceptable quality and alignment.
 - If the quality is not acceptable, return to Step 3 on page 5-19, otherwise, go to Step 6.
- 6. Press Cancel Print to make the printer ready or Return to make the printer not ready (see "General Test Instructions" on page 5-1).

To introduce a new operator to the printer, use the following steps as a guideline. Change the steps, as needed, to suit your working environment and the operator's level of responsibility.

- 2. Show the operator

and discuss the contents of each.

- 3. The power cord should be unplugged before connecting or disconnecting the signal cable. See Chapter 1, "Setting Up the 4230 Printer" for the proper sequence.
- 4. Show the operator how to install the forms device with emphasis on identifying the type of forms device (F1, F2, F3, or F4). Show the operator where the procedures are in Chapter 1, "Setting Up the 4230 Printer" or in IBM 4230 Printer Auto Sheet Feeder General Information (depending on the forms device installed).
- 5. Show the operator how to set the forms device number. Show the operator where the procedures are in Chapter 1, "Setting Up the 4230 Printer" or in IBM 4230 Printer Auto Sheet Feeder General Information (depending on the forms device installed).

6. Show the operator how to load forms with emphasis on:

Continuous Forms Device (F1):

- a. Location and function of the blue tractor locking lever and adjustment for width of form
- b. Forms tensioner location and location of forms tension knob and adjustment
- c. Platen rod location and use as a reference
- d. Top of form and left margin alignment
- e. Forms movement keys
- f. Unloading forms, with emphasis on unloading from top of printer.

See "Installing and Using the Continuous Forms Device (F1)" on page 1-21 for more information.

Dual Purpose Forms Device (F2):

- a. Location and function of tear bar
- b. Location of blue tractor locking lever and adjustment for width of form
- c. Platen rod location and use as a reference
- d. Auto load feature demonstration
- e. Top of form and left margin alignment
- f. Forms movement keys
- g. Readying the printer for the next transaction, with emphasis on the proper method for setting the tear off position and for tearing off the form at the tear bar toward the front of the printer
- h. Unloading forms, with emphasis on removing forms from the bottom of the printer.

Document Insertion Device (F3):

- a. Location and function of feed rollers
- b. Location and function of right roller assembly locking lever

- f. Loading a form, with emphasis on feeding forms straight
- g. Top of form and left margin alignment
- h. Unloading a form
- i. Removal of lower forms guide if another type of forms device is to be installed.

Auto Sheet Feeder (F4):

- 9. Show the operator how to adjust the forms thickness setting to adjust print quality. Emphasize obtaining a smudge-free top copy and legibility on back copies for multiple-part forms and smudge-free legibility single-part forms.
- 10. Show the operator how to run Operator Print Tests, and describe when and how to use them. See Chapter 5, "Using the Operator Print Tests" for more information.
- 11. Show the operator how to use the problem-solving information in "Using the Status Code and Problem Listings" on page B-2. Give examples of status code displays, such as

1 END OF FORMS LOAD FORMS

Describe how to call for service if you cannot solve the problem using the procedures.

- 12. Show the operator how to do the forms device inspection procedure. See "Forms Device Inspection" on page B-35 for more information.
- 13. Show the operator "Checking and Changing Configuration Parameter Values" in IBM 4230 Printer Models 102, 111, 202, 211, 4l3, and 5l3 Operator Panel Instructions on parameter values. Show how to check and change parameter values.

Customer Responsibility

Discuss the importance of the operator knowing what is and what is not customer responsibility. The customer is responsible for maintaining, removing, installing, and ordering the following:

Ribbon cartridges Paper.

Also, the customer is responsible for following the instructions in the problem solving sections of Appendix B, "Problem Solving" before calling for service. For example, if the characters in a printout have missing dots, the customer should look up the problem in this chapter.

Appendix B. Problem Solving

When the printer displays a status code, you need to know what action to take to recover from the displayed condition. This chapter lists the status codes and recovery actions and gives a list of problems, probable causes, and recovery actions for problems that do not display a status code.

Using the Status Code and Problem Listings

When a problem with the printer occurs, the printer displays a status code and message. The message on the display identifies the problem and gives a recommended action.

Status Code and Message Displays: Find the code listed in numeric order on the following pages and perform the steps to fix the problem. Only codes on which an operator can take action are included.

Note: If you get a code that you cannot find on this table, record the code and run the job or test again. If you get the same code, call for service.

If the recommended recovery action does not fix your problem, see "Problem List Index" on page B-34 and then go to the page identified. If you still cannot fix the problem, call for service.

No Status Code Displays: Scan the "Problem List Index" on page B-34 and go to the page listed beside the problem. Find your problem in the chart, read down the page to the "Solution," and do the recommended recovery action. If you still cannot fix the problem, call for service.

Note: A plus sign (+) in any error messages indicates that the printer has the Extended Memory feature installed.

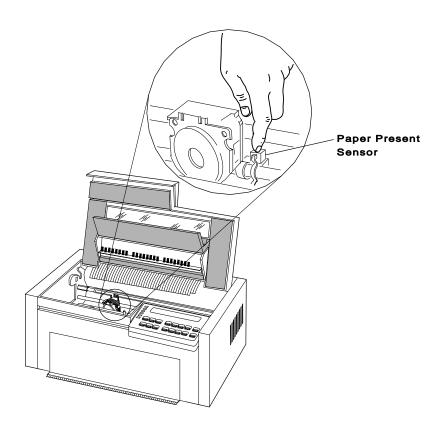

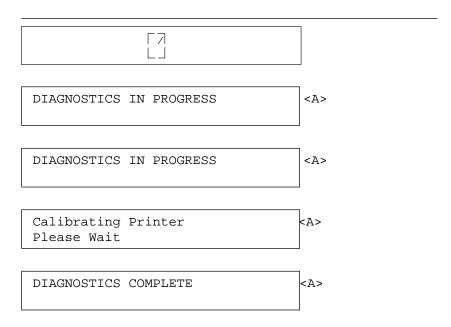

If you have form feeding problems and the printer does not display a status code, do the following procedure before calling for service.

To check the forms device, follow these steps:

1. Observe the way the forms are loaded. Be sure that they are loaded correctly. If necessary, review the forms loading procedures for the type of forms device you are using. If forms are loaded correctly and they are still jamming, go to the next step.

Note: The procedures for unloading forms and removing the forms device can be found in the appropriate forms device section in Chapter 1, "Setting Up the 4230 Printer."

2. Remove the device. Look for any obstacles such as torn pieces of paper or foam that could be jamming the device. On the F2, F3, or F4 forms devices, check the upper set of rollers on the device. Clear the jam. If clearing the jam does not fix the problem, go to the next step.

3. Locate the gears on the forms device and turn them while checking for noticeable binds.

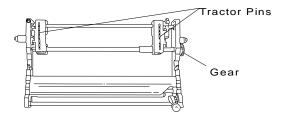
> For the F1 and F2 forms devices, check that the tractor pins move when you turn the gear.

For the F2, F3, and F4 forms devices, be sure that the feed rolls also move when you turn the gear.

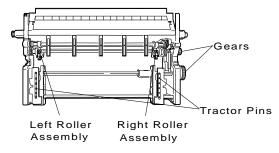
If manually turning the gears or rollers does not fix the problem, go to the next step.

4. If you see damage to the device, if the gears or rollers continue to bind, or if the device still does not operate properly, call for service.

Continuous Forms Device (F1)



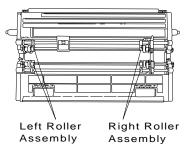
Dual Purpose Forms Device (F2) (All Models)

Auto Sheet Feeder (F4)

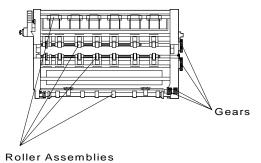


Figure B-2. F3 and F4 Forms Devices

Problem List

Warning: When using a Continuous Forms (F1) Device, never pull or unload forms in the downward direction, or you may damage the device. Always unload forms from the top of the printer.

Causes are listed for each problem in order of priority.

Problem: Forms do not advance or overprint occurs

1: The forms device is defective.

Solution: Inspect the forms device (see "Forms Device Inspection" on page B-35).

2: The forms device is not snapped in.

Solution: Check the installation of the forms device.

3: The ribbon is getting caught on a form.

Solution: Check the ribbon for twists or folds.

4: The printer is failing.

Solution: Turn the power Off (O), wait 10 seconds, and turn the power On (|). If you get a status code, go to "Status Codes" on page B-3. If no code displays, press Micro several times. If forms do not feed each time you press Micro, call for service.

Problem: Overprint occurs at top or bottom line of page

1: There is a problem with the application program. **Solution:** See your programmer.

Problem: Forms buckle, twist, jam, or paper holes tear

1: The right tractor is adjusted incorrectly.

Solution: Move the right tractor to obtain the correct form width. The tractor pins should be in the center of the paper holes. See Chapter 1, "Setting Up the 4230 Printer" for help on adjusting the tractor tension.

2: The forms device is installed incorrectly.

Solution: Check the forms device installation (see Chapter 1, "Setting Up the 4230 Printer").

3: The printer is not at the edge of the table.

Solution: Move the printer to the front edge of the table.

4: The forms tension (F1 only) is not set correctly.

Solution: Check the forms tension adjustment. See Chapter 1, "Setting Up the 4230 Printer" for help on adjusting the forms tension.

5: The forms supply is not aligned with the printer.

Solution: Reposition the forms supply so that the forms feed evenly. See the information on loading and unloading forms in Chapter 1, "Setting Up the 4230 Printer."

6: The forms are catching on the carton edge.

Solution: Remove the uneven carton edges, or remove the forms from the carton.

Note: As the forms reach the bottom of the box, this problem can occur more often.

7: The ribbon is twisted or folded.

Solution: Check the ribbon for folds or twists.

8: The forms contain excessive moisture.

Solution: Store the forms in a cool, dry place before using them, or store the forms in the printer area for 24 hours.

9: The forms are defective.

Solution: Try unloading the forms and then reloading forms (see the forms loading procedures in Chapter 1, "Setting Up the 4230 Printer"). Forms should meet the requirements specified in Appendix C, "Forms Information."

10: The forms device is defective.

Solution: See the "Forms Device Inspection" on page B-35.

Problem: Forms jam or do not feed into printer

1: The forms device is installed incorrectly.

Solution: Check the forms device installation (see Chapter 1, "Setting Up the 4230 Printer").

2: The ribbon is twisting or folding.

Solution: Check the ribbon for twists or folds.

3: The wrong forms device code is entered.

Solution: See Chapter 1, "Setting Up the 4230 Printer" for the correct forms device code and check the entry.

4: Continuous Forms Device (F1) only: the forms tension setting is at too high a number.

Solution: Move the forms tension lever to a lower number setting.

5: Dual Purpose Forms Device (F2): Forms jamming in feed roller assembly when using the Document on Demand feature.

Solution: Make sure the perforation of the form is aligned with the top of the tear bar when the Load/Eject is pressed. Also make sure that the forms are being torn off toward the front of the printer. This will assist in providing clean tear off. See pages 1-55 and 1-56 for location of the tear bar.

6: The forms device is defective.

Solution: See "Forms Device Inspection" on page B-35.

Problem: Forms do not feed past print head

1: The Automatic Forms Thickness Adjustment (AFTA) setting needs to be changed.

Solution: See the procedure for adjusting the forms thickness setting through the operator panel (based on your forms device) in Chapter 1, "Setting Up the 4230 Printer."

2: The forms device is not properly installed.

Solution: Check the forms device installation (see Chapter 1, "Setting Up the 4230 Printer").

3: The ribbon is twisting or folding.

Solution: Replace the ribbon.

4: The forms device is defective.

Solution: See "Forms Device Inspection" on page B-35.

5: The ribbon shield is damaged.

Solution: Replace the ribbon.

Problem: Forms do not stack correctly

1: The forms do not stack correctly on the table behind the printer. Solution: Use the recommended table (see IBM 4230 Printer Planning and Site Preparation Guide).

Note: Up to 101.6 mm (4 in.) of forms may stack on the table behind the printer without decreasing the ability of the forms to stack correctly.

- 2: The forms do not stack correctly in the output rack on the table. **Solution:** Check for obstructions to the paper path (cables, cords, or other items). If you find an obstruction, remove or relocate it.
- **3:** The forms are specified incorrectly.

Solution: The forms may be outside nominal specifications. See Appendix C, "Forms Information."

4: The forms contain excessive moisture.

Solution: Store the forms in a cool, dry place before using them or leave in the printer for 24 hours.

Note: Forms stack best when the forms are 203.2 to 304.8 mm (8 to 12 in.) long. If the forms length is outside this range, operator aid may be needed.

Problem: Erratic or intermittent forms movement

1: The forms device is defective or the printer is failing. Solution: See "Forms Device Inspection" on page B-35.

Problem: Printing off the form or out of the desired area with the Document Insertion Device (F3) only

- 1: The form is skewed or the vertical adjustments are not correct. Solution: Be sure that the forms are straight and making contact with both the right and left feed rollers.
- 2: The right roller assembly is adjusted incorrectly. Solution: Unlock and move the right tractor to obtain proper form width.
- 3: Incorrect characters per inch (CPI) or lines per inch (LPI) settings. incorrect.

Solution: Check with your system operator for the correct CPI and LPI settings.

4: The forms size is too small.

Solution: Use the correct size forms.

Problem: Characters are off registration

1: The first print position is adjusted incorrectly. Solution: Check your settings for the left margin and the top of form position. See Chapter 1, "Setting Up the 4230 Printer" for information on adjusting these settings.

If none of the previous problems apply to your forms problem, or if the solution does not solve your problem, be sure that you do the forms device inspection steps (see "Forms Device Inspection" on page B-35).

Print Quality and Ribbon Problems

Problem: Unreadable characters

1: The ribbon is dry or worn.

Solution: Check the ribbon and replace it if it is dry or worn.

2: The Automatic Forms Thickness Adjustment (AFTA) setting needs to be changed.

Solution: See the procedure for adjusting the forms thickness setting through the operator panel (based on your forms device) in Chapter 1, "Setting Up the 4230 Printer."

Problem: Missing dots or irregular characters

1: The Automatic Forms Thickness Adjustment (AFTA) setting needs to be changed.

Solution: See the procedure for adjusting the forms thickness setting through the operator panel (based on your forms device) in Chapter 1, "Setting Up the 4230 Printer."

2: The ribbon is worn.

Solution: Check the ribbon for wear; replace it if necessary.

3: The ribbon is twisted or folded.

Solution: Straighten the ribbon.

4: The forms device is not seated correctly.

Solution: Check the forms device installation. See Chapter 1, "Setting Up the 4230 Printer."

5: The print head or printer is failing.

Solution: Do the printer test. See Chapter 5, "Using the Operator Print Tests." If your print head is defective, call for service.

Problem: Ribbon smudging forms

1: The Automatic Forms Thickness Adjustment (AFTA) setting needs to be changed.

Solution: See the procedure for adjusting the forms thickness setting through the operator panel (based on your forms device) in Chapter 1, "Setting Up the 4230 Printer."

2: The ribbon cartridge is defective.

Solution: Replace the ribbon cartridge. See Chapter 4, "Replacing Your Ribbon."

3: The ribbon is twisted.

Solution: Remove the ribbon, straighten it, and reinstall it (see Chapter 4, "Replacing Your Ribbon").

4: The ribbon is over-inked.

Solution: Replace the ribbon. See Chapter 4, "Replacing Your Ribbon."

Problem: Printing is too light or partial characters print

1: The Automatic Forms Thickness Adjustment (AFTA) setting needs to be changed.

Solution: See the procedure for adjusting the forms thickness setting through the operator panel (based on your forms device) in Chapter 1, "Setting Up the 4230 Printer."

2: The ribbon guide is seated incorrectly.

Solution: Press down on the ribbon guide. See Chapter 4, "Replacing Your Ribbon."

3: The print head is defective.

Solution: Do the printer tests. If there is still a problem, call for service.

Problem: Wavy print lines

1: Continuous Forms Device (F1) only: the forms tension setting is incorrect.

Solution: Check the tension setting. See Chapter 1, "Setting Up the 4230 Printer" for more information.

2: The Automatic Forms Thickness Adjustment (AFTA) setting needs to be changed.

Solution: See the procedure for adjusting the forms thickness setting through the operator panel (based on your forms device) in Chapter 1, "Setting Up the 4230 Printer."

3: The forms are loaded incorrectly.

Solution: Check to see that the forms are properly loaded.

Problem: Ribbon snagging or tearing

1: The ribbon is worn.

Solution: Replace the ribbon cartridge. See Chapter 4, "Replacing Your Ribbon."

2: The Automatic Forms Thickness Adjustment (AFTA) setting needs to be changed.

Solution: See the procedure for adjusting the forms thickness setting through the operator panel (based on your forms device) in Chapter 1, "Setting Up the 4230 Printer."

3: The print head is catching on the ribbon.

Solution: Call for service.

Problem: Ribbon not moving

1: The ribbon cartridge is not properly installed.

Solution: Remove and then reinstall the same ribbon. See Chapter 4, "Replacing Your Ribbon." If the ribbon still does not move, replace the ribbon.

Problem: Ribbon moves continuously

1: The ribbon drive circuit is failing.

Solution: Call for service.

Miscellaneous Problems

Problem: Wrong language set

1: Wrong language set selected.

Solution: See "Using Printer Setup Parameters" in IBM 4230 Printer Models 102, 111, 202, 211, 413, and 513 Operator Panel Instructions for information on selecting language sets.

Problem: First print character in wrong place

1: Left margin or top of form is not properly aligned. **Solution:** Check the left margin and top of form position adjustments. See the appropriate forms device in Chapter 1, "Setting Up the 4230 Printer."

Appendix C. Forms Information

The following chapter describes the forms specifications, quality, and restrictions needed for use with the 4230 Printer.

Forms Specifications

The 4230 Printer operates with continuous forms and cut sheet forms. If your printer is equipped with either the F1 or F2 form feed device, you can use continuous forms. If your printer is equipped with either the F3 or F4 form feed device, you can use cut sheet forms. See the following information on the physical characteristics of forms for each type of device.

Continuous Forms — F1 or F2 **Dimensions**

Forms	Maximum	Minimum
Width	381 mm (15 in.)	76.2 mm (3 in.)
Length	355.6 mm (14 in.)	76.2 mm (3 in.)

Thickness

The thickness of all forms should be a minimum of 0.08 mm (0.003 in.) and a maximum of 0.64 mm (0.025 in.).

Acceptable print quality will be provided on up to four-part forms. Up to six-part forms can be used; however, for best feeding and stacking, a maximum of four parts is recommended. If you use forms having more than four parts, you should test them for forms handling, print registration, and print quality.

Weight

Minimum weight for single-part forms is 56 g/m (15 lb). Maximum weight for single-part forms is 150 g/m (40 lb). The best range is 60 to 90 g/m (16 to 24 lb). Paper weights outside the functional range should be tested by the user. For multiple-part forms, the paper weight of individual sheets can be as low as 45 g/m (12 lb). Individual sheets below this limit should be tested by the user.

Performance Considerations

For optimum performance, printing should be restricted to 6.4 mm (0.25 in.) from all edges, holes, or folds on the forms.

Forms are available from IBM or any forms supplier.

Thickness

The thickness of all forms should be a minimum of 0.08 mm (0.003 in.) and a maximum of 0.25 mm (0.010 in.).

Acceptable print quality will be provided when using single-part forms. If you use forms having more than one part, you should test them for forms handling, print registration, and print quality.

Weight

Minimum weight for single-part forms is 56 g/m (15 lb). Maximum weight for single-part forms is 150 g/m (40 lb). The best range is 75 to 90 g/m (20 to 24 lb). Paper weights outside the functional range should be tested by the user.

Performance Considerations

When using the F3 device, you can use a width of up to 381 mm (15 in.). However, for optimum feeding and print registration, a maximum width of 330 mm (13 in.) is recommended. For optimum performance, printing should be restricted to 127 mm (0.5 in.) from all edges of the form.

Forms are available from IBM or any forms supplier.

All paper used in the Auto Sheet Feeder should be new and without packaging damage. The papers defined below are considered acceptable for use in the F4 device. Any others should be operationally tested before regular use.

Dimensions

The paper sizes shown in the following table include both single-part and multiple-part cut sheets. Note that the term Length applies to the paper dimension parallel to the paper motion.

Thickness

Single sheet paper thickness should be a minimum of 0.086 mm (0.0034 in.) and a maximum of 0.177 mm (0.0046 in.).

Weight

The basis weight for the paper should be 60 to 100 g/m (16 to 27 lb).

Composition

Plain bond paper of one of the following compositions should be acceptable for regular use:

No. 1 sulphite (100% chemical wood pulp) 25% to 100% cotton content

Performance Considerations

For optimum performance:

Use 75 to 80 g/m (20 to 24 lb), 25% or 50% cotton content plain paper.

Restrict printing to 6.35 mm (0.25 in.) from the left and right margins and 6.35 mm (0.25 in.) from the top and bottom edges.

Keep at least three sheets in the selected input bin (paper load failure frequency increases otherwise).

All input bins are capable of handling multiple-part forms. Multiple-part forms present special considerations because of their complexity. There are many different types of multiple-part forms available. Use only snap-out or top-glued multiple-part forms on the ASF. Form sets should be operationally tested before regular use. For specific information about multiple-part forms, see IBM 4230 Printer Auto Sheet Feeder General Information.

Some forms such as highly embossed papers (many stock certificates), coated papers, and multiple-part forms that do not conform to specifications will not feed reliably by the ASF.

Forms are available from IBM or any forms supplier.

Additional Forms Restrictions

For best results when printing, the following forms restrictions apply:

Fastening recommendations:

- Form plies must not be fastened with any staples and must be fastened securely enough to prevent partial forms separation.
- For the F3 forms device, multiple-part forms must be glued only at the top edge and fastened securely enough to prevent forms separation.
- For the F4 forms device, only top-glued or snap-out multiple-part forms should be used.
- If crimp fasteners are used, you should consider the following:
 - Crimps should not project significantly above the surface of the first form to avoid ribbon interference.
 - Crimps should not add significantly to the total forms thickness.
 - The protruding tail of the crimp should be opposite the direction of forms motion so that the forms motion tends to compress and tighten the crimp. The crimp should also be away from the surface of the forms where printing is occurring to avoid ribbon interference.
 - Excessively hard or stiff crimps can interfere with proper ribbon and forms processing operation.

Forms stacking:

- For best stacking efficiency, the distance between folds should be 152.4 to 317.5 mm (6 to 12.5 in.).

Feed holes should be free of chads and crimps to avoid false form jam errors.

Forms should be strong enough to prevent tearing of feed holes.

Label forms should be tested for satisfactory forms handling, print registration, and print quality.

Do not use forms that have started to come apart.

For the F3 forms device:

- You should design forms so that no printing takes place within 12.7 mm (0.5 in.) of either the left edge or the right edge of the form. This makes certain that the feed rollers do not press on fresh print and cause smearing.
- Do not use forms with holes.

For the F4 forms device:

- Do not mix or interleave paper of different sizes or compositions in the same input bin.
- Do not use forms with holes, cut-outs, or windows.
- Do not use envelopes or card stock.

Positioning Forms

When you design the forms layout for your 4230 Printer, keep the physical dimensions and forms quality in mind. See Figure C-1 on page C-10, Figure C-2 on page C-11, Figure C-3 on page C-12, | and Figure C-4 on page C-13 and the following information to obtain best results when printing.

Maximum: 381 mm (15 in.) for F1, F2, or F3

356 mm (14 in.) for F4

Minimum: 76.2 mm (3 in.) for F1, F2, or F3

127 mm (4 in.) for F4

Maximum: 356 mm (14 in.)

The minimum distance between the left edge of the form and the start of the first print position used is 1.27 mm (0.05 in.).

The maximum distance between the left edge of the form and the start of the first print position used is 48.5 mm (1.91 in.).

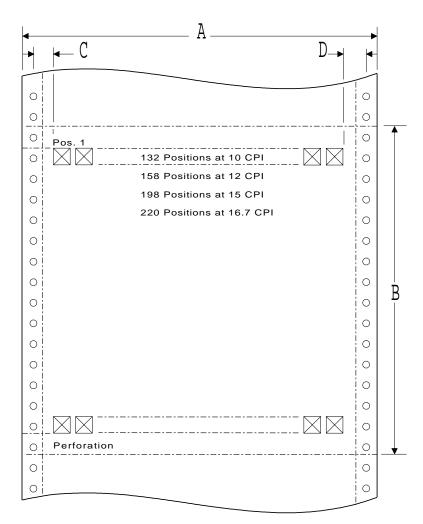

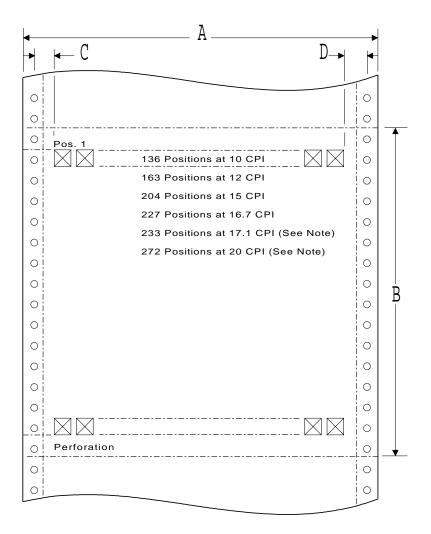

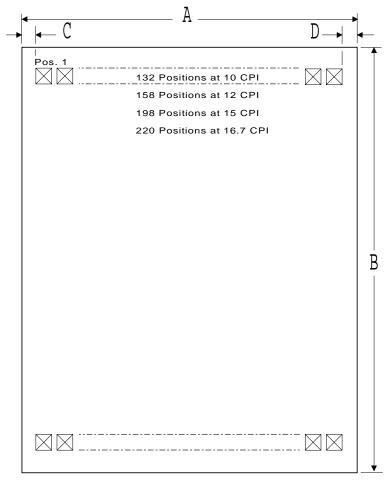


| Figure C-1. Form Design Considerations - Continuous Forms (Models 102, 111, 202, and 211)

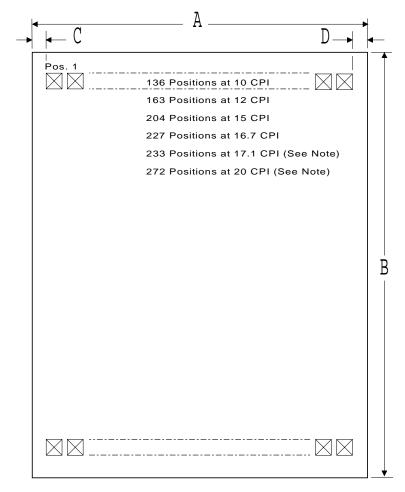

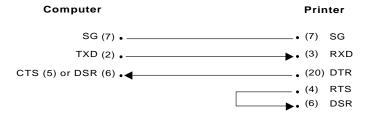

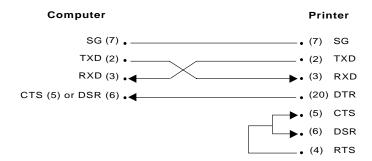

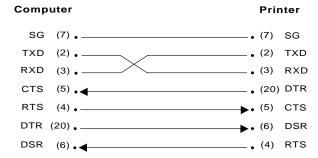
| Local Simplex — DTR Pacing, No Status Reporting



| Local Duplex — DTR or XON/XOFF Pacing, Status Reporting

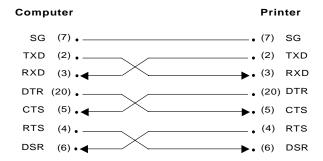


| Local Duplex — DTR or XON/XOFF Pacing, Status Reporting

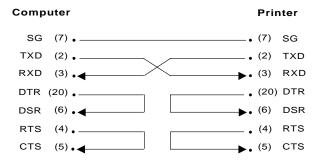

| Local Duplex — XON/XOFF Pacing, Status Reporting



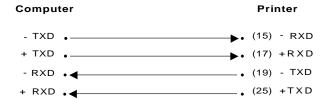

Glossary

This glossary defines important 4230 Printer abbreviations and terms. It includes information from the *IBM Dictionary of Computing*, SC20-1699.

The American National Dictionary for Information Processing Systems, copyright 1982 by the Computer and Business Equipment Manufacturers Association (CBEMA). Copies may be purchased from the American National Standards Institute, 1430 Broadway, New York, New York 10018. Definitions are identified by an asterisk (*).

The Information Technology Vocabulary, developed by Subcommittee 1, Joint Technical Committee 1, of the International Organization for Standardization and the International Electrotechnical Committee (ISO/IEC JTC1/SC1). Definitions from published segments of the vocabularies are identified by the symbol (ISO); definitions from draft international standards, draft proposals, and working papers in development by the ISO/IEC JTC1/SC1 vocabulary subcommittee are identified by the symbol (TC97), indicating final agreement has not yet been reached among participating members.

For abbreviations, the definition usually consists only of the words represented by the letters; for complete definitions, see the entries for the words.

This Glossary uses standard reference words for entries. They are:

Ref. Meaning

Deprecated term for

Indicates that the term should not be used. It refers to a preferred term, which is defined.

Synonymous with

Appears in the commentary of a preferred term and identifies less desirable or less specific terms that have the same meaning.

Synonym for

Appears in the commentary of a less desirable or less specific term and identifies the preferred term that has the same meaning.

Contrast with

Refers to a term that has an opposed or substantively different meaning.

See

Refers to multiple-word terms that have the same last word.

See also

Refers to related terms that have similar (but not synonymous) meanings.

access cover. Provides access to the top of the printer for cleaning, changing ribbon cartridges, and loading or changing forms devices.

acoustic cover. A cover bonded with a material that reduces operating noise from a machine.

audible alarm. An alarm that is activated when predetermined events occur that require operator attention or intervention for system operation.

autoload. The automatic forms loading feature on the F2 forms device.

automatic forms thickness adjustment (AFTA). A printer mechanism that measures the forms thickness and adjusts the gap from the print head to the platen rod accordingly.

Auto Sheet Feeder (ASF) (F4). A mechanically operated device, made up of two major components: the Auto Sheet Feeder mechanism, made up of three automatically operated input bins and a bin designed for manual sheet insertion, and an F4 forms device.

B

baud. The rate at which data is being sent to or from the computer through the serial interface, in bits per second (bps).

bezel. A surrounding or retaining part such as the cable connector support.

bidirectional. Printing in either direction, right to left or left to right.

blue forms guide/forms sensor. See forms guide/forms sensor.

blue forms tension knob. See forms tension knob.

blue ribbon advance knob. See ribbon advance knob.

blue slotted opening. See slotted opening.

blue tractor doors. See tractor doors.

buffer. A portion of storage used to hold input or output data temporarily.

C

Centronics parallel interface. A standard for connecting printers and other peripheral devices to a computer. It defines the plug, socket, and electrical signals that are used for controlling the transmission of data.

characters per inch (CPI). The number of alphanumeric characters that fit into one inch of printed text.

coaxial cable. A cable that consists of one conductor, usually a small copper tube or wire, within and insulated from another conductor of larger diameter, usually copper tubing or copper braid.

command. A request from a terminal for the performance of an operation or the execution of a particular program.

continuous forms. A series of connected paper forms that feed continuously through a printing device. The connection between the forms is perforated to allow the user to tear them apart.

Continuous Forms Device (F1). A forms feed device that allows printing of continuous forms in an unattended mode of operation.

cut forms. A single form, not connected to other forms. The form may have more than one part; that is, it may have an original and one or more copies.

ח

data bits. The number of data bits sent in each transmission frame using the serial interface.

data stream. Print data and control information flowing from host system (computer) to the printer, from beginning to end without interruption.

Document Insertion Device (F3).

A forms device used for most general printing requirements on continuous forms.

Document on Demand feature. A feature that moves continuous forms within the printer so that a blank form is not ejected when separating forms.

Dual Purpose Forms Device (F2).

A forms feeding option which, when selected, automatically stops continuous forms at the perforation. This enables the printed form to be torn off before the next sheet begins to be printed.

F

feature. A particular part of an IBM product that a customer can order separately.

feed roller. See right roller assembly.

form. The area between perforations on continuous printer paper.

form feed (FF). Paper movement used to bring an assigned part of a form to the printing position.

forms device. One of four mechanical paper handling devices that can be installed in the 4230 Printers.

forms guide/forms sensor. Blue guide used to align the left edge of a form, detecting the last form feed past it, and detecting paper jams.

forms tension knob. Blue knob used to adjust the setting on the forms tension lever on the F1 forms device.

forms tension lever. Used to control the tension on paper loaded in the F1 forms device. Settings range from * (no tension) to 6 (maximum tension).

- F1. See Continuous Forms Device.
- F2. See Dual Purpose Forms Device.
- F3. See Document Insertion Device.
- F4. See Auto Sheet Feeder.

Intelligent Printer Data Stream* (IPDS). An architected host-to-printer data stream that contains both data and controls defining how the data is to be presented.

interface. The connection between the computer and the printer.

left margin (LM). The area between the left edge of the display or paper and the leftmost character position.

lines per inch (LPI). The number

of lines of text or graphics that can be placed in one inch.

lower forms guide. Used with the F3 forms device and the forms guide/forms sensor to detect and align cut sheet forms and to activate the Load/Eject key.

M

Maintenance Analysis Procedures (MAP). A maintenance document that gives an IBM service representative a step-by-step procedure for tracing a symptom to the cause of the failure.

Maintenance Information Manual (MIM). A maintenance document that gives an IBM service representative a step-by-step procedure for installing, removing, and servicing components of the product.

maximum page length (MPL). The total number of print lines from one top margin line to the next.

maximum print position (MPP). The total number of horizontal positions that can be printed.

Ν

near letter quality (NLQ). One of the print modes available for the 4230 Printer. Provides printouts that are similar to laser printing output in quality.

not ready. A state where you have pressed Stop or an error or operator intervention condition is occurring. The printer can be not ready and online or offline. See also offline and online. Contrast with ready.

O

offline. Pertaining to equipment or devices not under control of a control unit or host processor. Contrast with online.

online. (1) Stored in a computer and accessible from a terminal. (2) Pertaining to equipment or devices under the direct control of a control unit or host processor. Contrast with offline.

operator panel. A functional unit containing switches used to control a printer or other data processing units, or a portion of these devices that may contain indicators giving information on the functioning of the system.

P

paper door. Used to provide access to the printer for loading paper and forms devices.

paper jam. A condition in which paper forms have not fed properly during printing and have become wedged in the feeding or printing mechanism, thus preventing the correct forward movement of the forms. A paper jam usually causes one line to be printed over one or more other printed lines.

parallel interface. An interface where data is exchanged between the computer and the printer one byte at a time.

partial reset. An action that returns the printer to the current configuration values.

platen. A backing, usually cylindrical, against which printing mechanisms strike or otherwise deposit ink to produce an image.

power cord. Cable that carries the main power supply between a room outlet and a machine.

power-on custom set. The custom set containing the values used to set the printer parameters when the printer is turned on.

power-on self test. A series of diagnostic tests that are run automatically by a device when the power is turned On (|).

power switch. A device that makes and breaks the contact between equipment and the main electricity supply.

print head. That part of the printer that prints data.

print head carrier. Used to hold the print head and ribbon guide posts as they slide along the platen.

print quality. The quality of printed output relative to existing standards

and in comparisons with jobs printed earlier.

print speed. The number of characters printed per unit of time.

problem determination. The process of identifying the source of a problem; for example, a program component, a machine failure, telecommunication facilities, user or contractor-installed programs or equipment, an environment failure such as a power loss, or a user error.

R

ready. A state where you press Start and there are no error conditions. The printer can be ready and online or offline. See also offline and online. Contrast with not ready.

remote. Concerning the peripheral parts of a network not centrally linked to the host processor and generally using telecommunication lines with public right-of-way. Synonymous with link-attached.

ribbon advance knob. Blue knob used to move the ribbon within the cartridge and around the print head to take up slack and improve print quality.

ribbon cartridge. The housing holding the ribbon and containing the ribbon advance knob.

ribbon guide. A device that positions the ribbon as it moves from a full spool to an empty one.

right roller assembly. Used to guide the right side of cut forms through the F3 forms device. Also known as feed roller.

S

serial interface. An interface where data is exchanged between the computer and the printer one bit at a time.

slotted opening. A space on the bottom of the ribbon cartridge used to align the cartridge with the metal post on the printer frame.

SPA. Serial or parallel attachment.

tear bar. A bar that has an edge used to separate continuous forms after they have printed.

tear off position. The location on continuous forms where they can be separated using the tear bar on the F2 forms device.

top of form. A horizontal print line, near the top of the paper, above which the printer will not print.

tractor. The mechanism that controls movement of continuous forms paper by using the paper holes in the margins.

tractor doors. Blue doors used to hold continuous forms against the tractor pins.

tractor pins. Used to move continuous forms up or down.

twinaxial cable. A cable that is made of two twisted wires in a shield, similar to two coaxial conductors in one shield. Contrast with coaxial cable.



V-Connector. Used to connect the 4230 Printer to the host computer. Named for its V-shape.

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
