Introduction 3

Welcome to your VCR owner's manual.

This manual has six sections: Setting Up Your VCR; Description of Controls; Basic Operations; Recording; Playing; and Information You May Need. The instructions explain all of the VCR's features, which are listed below. You cannot hurt your VCR by trying the features! So read on – and relax.

This VCR, equipped with a High Quality (HQ) system, is compatible with existing Video Home System (VHS) equipment. Philips Consumer Electronics Company recommends that you use only video cassette tapes that have been tested and inspected for use in two, four, six, and eight hour VCRs, and which are labeled with the **VHS** mark. The use of tapes that have not been inspected for use in two, four, six, and eight hour VCRs may result in poor picture quality and excessive deposits on the video heads, which may not be covered by the warranty if damage occurs.

Note to the Cable TV System Installer: This reminder is provided to call the Cable TV system installer's attention to Article 820-40 of the National Electrical Code, which provides guidelines for proper grounding – in particular, specifying that the cable ground shall be connected to the grounding system of the building, as close to the point of cable entry as possible.

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Helpful Hint

 Before doing anything else, record the VCR's model and serial numbers in the spaces provided on page two. These numbers will help us assist you if you ever call for help.

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Before Using Your VCR 5

Putting Batteries in the Remote Control

Remove the battery compartment lid on the bottom of the remote control by sliding the lid in the direction of the arrow.

Insert two AA batteries inside the battery compartment with their + and – ends aligned as indicated.

Replace the battery compartment lid.

Using the Remote Control

- Point the remote control at the VCR's remote sensor (see page 21) when using the remote control to operate the VCR.
- Do not put objects between the remote control and the VCR.

Erasure Prevention

Video cassette tapes have record tabs to ensure that recordings are not erased accidentally.

1

To prevent accidental erasure, break off the tab with a screwdriver.

2

To record again, cover the hole with cellophane tape.

VCR maintenance

- In this VCR, use only tapes with the VHS mark.
- Make sure any light adhesive stick-on notes are removed from the video cassette tape before putting the tape in the VCR. Removable labels like these can jam the VCR.
- Periodic maintenance is required to maintain your VCR's performance. The video heads will eventually require cleaning or replacement. Cleaning or replacement of the video heads should be performed by an authorized service center.







- The remote control and its batteries are supplied.
- Do not mix alkaline and manganese batteries.
- Do not mix old and new batteries.

6 Hookups Without a Cable Box/Direct Broadcast System

The basic VCR/TV connection – antenna/cable to VCR to TV – is shown below. If you have a Cable Box or Direct Broadcast System, please refer to pages eight - nine. If you have a Stereo TV, please go to page 10. After you hook up the VCR, please go to page 11 to turn on the VCR.

Disconnect the antenna or cable from your TV.



2 Connect the antenna or cable to the ANT(enna) IN jack of your VCR.



Hookups Without a Cable Box/Direct Broadcast System (cont'd) 7

3

Connect the RF coaxial cable (supplied) to the OUT jack on the back of the VCR and to the ANTENNA IN Jack on the TV. (You may use either a snap-on type or screw-on type of coaxial cable, whichever you prefer. A snap-on type is supplied.)



4 Plug in the TV and the VCR.

5

Set the CH3/CH4 switch on the back of the VCR to CH3 or CH4, whichever channel is not used or least used in your area. To operate your VCR with your TV, set the TV to the same channel. For example, when playing a tape, if the CH3/CH4 switch is set to CH3, the TV should be on channel 3.



You are ready to turn on the VCR. Please go to page 11 before turning on the VCR.

8 Hookups With a Cable Box

This connection allows you to view any channel. After you connect the Cable Box, VCR, and TV as shown below, the features described on this page will be available.

1. Connect a Cable signal to the IN Jack on the Cable Box.



3. Use a second RF coaxial cable to connect the OUT jack on the VCR to the TV's ANTENNA IN Jack.

1

With the VCR on and in VCR position (the VCR/TV light will appear), use the CHANNEL (Up/Down) buttons to set the VCR to the Cable Box output channel (channel 03 or 04).

2

Set the TV to the same channel to which you set the VCR.

3

Select the channel you want to watch or record at the Cable Box.

Watching TV With the VCR Off

Use the TV channel selector to set the TV to the Cable Box output channel (channel 03 or 04). Then, select the channel you want to watch at the Cable Box.

Timer Recordings

With this connection, you may set a timer recording as described on pages 26 - 29. However, remember the following:

- You can only program a timer recording for one channel at a time.
- Set the TV and the VCR to the Cable Box output channel (channel 03 or 04).
- When you enter the channel you want to record, select channel 03 or 04 (the Cable Box output channel). (This is step 7 on page 28.)
- Set your Cable Box to the channel you want to record.
- Leave the Cable Box on while you are recording.

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- With this hookup, channels cannot be changed using the VCR remote control. You must select channels at the Cable Box.
- You can not view a channel other than the one you are recording (the instructions on page 32 do not work with this hookup).
- You cannot program channels with this hookup (as discussed on page 12).

Hookups With a Cable Box (cont'd) 9

This connection allows you to program an unattended recording of more than one unscrambled channel and to watch one channel while recording another. After you connect the VCR, Cable Box, and TV as shown below, the features on this page will be available.



3. Use a second RF coaxial cable to connect the OUT Jack on the Cable Box to the Antenna In Jack on the back of the TV.

Recording One Channel/Watching Another

1

With the VCR on and in VCR position (the VCR/TV light will appear), use the CHANNEL (Up/Down) buttons to select the channel you want to record. Start the recording.

2

Press the VCR/TV button to put the VCR in TV position.

3

Use the TV channel selector to put the TV on the Cable Box output channel (channel 03 or 04).

4

Select the channel you want to watch at the Cable Box. Playing a Tape

1

Press the VCR/TV button to put the VCR in VCR position (the VCR/TV light will appear).

2

Make sure the Cable Box is on the same channel as the VCR's CH3/CH4 switch.

3

Use the TV channel selector to put the TV on the Cable Box output channel (channel 03 or 04).

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Helpful Hint

You cannot record scrambled channels with this connection.

Press the PLAY button to play the tape.

10 Hookups With a Stereo TV



• Audio and Video cables are not supplied.

Connect the antenna or cable to the ANT(enna) IN Jack on the back of the VCR.

2

Connect a video cable to the yellow VIDEO OUT Jack on the back of the VCR. Then, connect the other end of the video cable to the VIDEO IN Jack on your TV.

3

Connect an audio cable to the white AUDIO OUT Jack on the back of the VCR. Then, connect the other end of the audio cable to the AUDIO IN Jack on your TV. (If your TV has Right and Left AUDIO IN Jacks, you must use a "Y" splitter audio cable as illustrated to deliver audio to the TV's left and right channels.)

4

Turn on your TV, making sure it is in Line Input mode. Please refer to your TV owner's manual for details.

Helpful Hint

 This hookup will not give you stereo sound. To get stereo sound, use the connections on pages six - seven and select the channel to be viewed at the TV (with the VCR turned off).

- Before turning on your VCR, make sure there are batteries in the remote control and the VCR and TV are connected (see pages five - 10).
- You can not set up channels if you are using a Cable Box/DBS.
- The instructions on this page only work when you turn on the VCR for the first time. If there is a power failure or if the VCR is unplugged for more than one minute, you may need to repeat the instructions on this page.

1

Press the POWER button. The POWER light and the VCR/TV light will appear.



Turn on the TV. Set it to the same channel as the CH3/CH4 switch on the back of the VCR. The menu shown below will appear.



Press the PLAY button or the STOP button to select ENGLISH or ESPAÑOL. [ON] will appear beside your choice.

4

Press the F.FWD button or the MENU button. TUNER SET UP will appear on-screen.

TUNER SET UP

5

Press the MENU button, the F.FWD button, or the REWIND button to begin automatic channel setup. TUNER SET UP will flash on-screen. The VCR will memorize all available channels, so when you use the CHANNEL ▲/▼ buttons, you'll only scan through channels that you receive. When channels are set up, the TV will go to the lowest channel available. (If you try to set up channels when there is no antenna or cable connected to the VCR, programming will appear to take place. Eventually, TUNER SET UP will appear on-screen steadily, and channel programming will stop. Connect an antenna or cable to the VCR, then press the MENU button, the F.FWD button, or the REWIND button again. Channel programming will begin again.)

Turning on Your VCR 11

Turn on the TV.



Helpful Hints

If you do not see any on-screen displays when you turn on the VCR, check your hookups, then try again.
 If you still do not see any on-screen displays, follow the steps under "Automatic Channel Setup" on page 12 and "Language Selection" on page 16.

12 Automatic Channel Setup

Although your VCR may automatically set up the channels you receive when you turn it on for the first time, this function lets you set up channels again. Make sure:

 The VCR is on and is in VCR position. (The VCR/TV light will appear on the display panel. If it does not, press the VCR/TV button once.)



Press the MENU button repeatedly until the INITIALIZE menu appears.



2

Press the PLAY button or the STOP button repeatedly to select CHANNEL SET UP. Then, press the F.FWD button.



3

Press the PLAY button or the STOP button repeatedly to point to TV (if you have an antenna) or CATV (if you have a cable connection).

4

Press the F.FWD button once or twice. [ON] will appear beside your selection, then the VCR will memorize all available channels. When setup is complete, the lowest channel you receive will appear on-screen.



- Line Input mode will always be stored in the VCR's memory as channel 00. When you select channel 00 with the CHANNEL ▲/▼ buttons or the Number buttons, AUX will appear on-screen.
- You can not program channels if you are using a Cable Box/DBS.
 Details are on pages eight - nine.

Automatic Channel Setup (cont'd) 13

Adding/Deleting Channels

The channels you no longer receive or seldom watch can be deleted from the memory. You also may add new channels into the memory. Make sure:

• The VCR is on and in VCR position. (The VCR/TV light will appear. If it does not, press the VCR/TV button once.)

Press the MENU button repeatedly until the INITIALIZE menu appears.

2

Press the PLAY button or the STOP button repeatedly to select CHANNEL SET UP. Then, press the F.FWD button.



Press the PLAY button or the STOP button repeatedly to select ADD/DELETE CH. Then, press the F.FWD button.



4

Press the Number buttons, the PLAY button, or the STOP button repeatedly until your desired channel number appears.

5

Press the F.FWD button or the REWIND button so that ADD or DELETE flashes on-screen.

While your choice is flashing, press the COUNTER

RESET/EXIT button. The channel you added or deleted will appear. The channel will be added or deleted, whichever was flashing on-screen when you exited the menu.



14 Setting the Clock

Follow the steps below to set your VCR's clock. Make sure:
The VCR is on and in VCR position. (The VCR/TV light will

appear. If it does not, press the VCR/TV button once.)

Press the MENU button repeatedly until the INITIALIZE menu appears.

2

Press the PLAY button or the STOP button repeatedly to select SETTING CLOCK. Then, press the F.FWD button.



3

While the MONTH space is flashing, press the PLAY button or the STOP button repeatedly until the desired month appears. Then, press the F.FWD button.



4

While the DAY space is flashing, press the PLAY button or the STOP button repeatedly until the desired day appears. Then, press the F.FWD button.



While the YEAR space is flashing, press the PLAY button or the STOP button repeatedly until the desired year appears. Press the F.FWD button. The day of the week will appear automatically.





- To reset the clock, follow steps 1 -2 above. Select the information you want to change using the F.FWD button or the REWIND button.
 When the desired information is flashing, use the PLAY button or the STOP button to enter the correct information. Press the COUNTER RESET/EXIT button to exit.
- To display the time, press the DIS-PLAY button repeatedly until the time appears on-screen.
- Power failures that last for more than one minute can cause you to lose your clock setting.
- Press the REWIND button to go back one step from the current step during steps 4 - 8.

Setting the Clock (cont'd) 15

While the HOUR space is flashing, press the PLAY button or the STOP button repeatedly until the desired hour appears. Then, press the F.FWD button.



While the MINUTE space is flashing, press the PLAY button or the STOP button repeatedly until the desired minute appears. Then, press the F.FWD button.



While the AM or PM space is flashing, press the PLAY button or the STOP button repeatedly to point to AM or PM.



Press the COUNTER RESET/EXIT button or the F.FWD button to start the clock.



Helpful Hint

 If the clock has never been set, the SETTING CLOCK menu may appear immediately when you press the MENU button. If this happens, follow the instructions from step 3 on page 14.

16 Language Selection

Follow the steps below to change the language of the on-screen menus and displays. Make sure:

 The VCR is on and in VCR position. (The VCR/TV light will appear. If it does not, press the VCR/TV button once.)

Press the MENU button repeatedly until the INITIALIZE menu appears.



Press the PLAY button or the STOP button repeatedly to select LANGUAGE SELECT. Then, press the F.FWD button.



Press the PLAY button or the STOP button to select ENGLISH or ESPAÑOL. [ON] will appear beside your choice.

- If you accidentally select Spanish on-screen displays and need English on-screen displays:
- 1) Press the MENU button repeatedly until the PARA INICIAR menu appears.
- Press the PLAY button or the STOP button repeatedly to choose SELEC. IDIOMA, then press the F.FWD button.
- 3) Press the PLAY button or the STOP button to select ENGLISH.
- 4) Press the COUNTER RESET/EXIT button to exit.

On-Screen Status Displays 17

You may access on-screen status displays by pressing the DISPLAY button repeatedly. On-screen status displays may include the current time, channel, and other information.

- Press the DISPLAY button once. The COUNT on-screen status display will appear for five seconds. After five seconds, only the real-time counter will appear on-screen. This counter shows you the elapsed playing time of the tape (from the point at which the real-time counter was set to zero).
- Press the DISPLAY button once again. The CLOCK on-screen status display will appear for five seconds. After five seconds, only the current time will appear on-screen (the clock must be set). (If you are watching TV, the current channel number will also appear on-screen.)
- Press the DISPLAY button once again. The on-screen status display will disappear.



Helpful Hints
 If the channel you select has no broadcast, the screen will be solid blue. You may bring up a status display at any time by pressing the DIS-PLAY button. (The exception is when viewing a still picture or a slow motion picture, or when
 F.FWD or REWIND is pressed during playback.) Channel numbers (when tuned)
appear on-screen for a few seconds.

18 Remote Control Buttons



Press to play a tape. Also, press to release Slow, Search, or Still mode and to return to normal playback. *Details are on page 35.* Use to enter digits and information when programming a function in the on-screen menu (setting the clock, for example). Press to select an item in the on-screen menu.

When tape playback is stopped, press to fast forward the tape at high speed. During tape playback, press to fast forward the tape while the picture stays on-screen. *Details are on page 35.* Press to add or delete channel numbers. *Details are on page 13.*

Playing 23

Read and follow the steps below to play a tape.

1

Turn on the TV and set it to channel 3 or 4, whichever channel the CH3/CH4 switch on the back of the VCR is set to.

2

Insert a tape in the VCR. The POWER and CST.IN lights will appear. If the tape's record tab has been removed, the VCR/TV light will appear and playback will begin automatically.

3

If playback does not start automatically, press the VCR/TV button to put the VCR in VCR position (the VCR/TV light will appear). Then, press the PLAY button.

4

Press the STOP button to stop playback.

5

Press the REWIND button to rewind the tape.

6

When the tape has finished rewinding, press the EJECT button to remove the tape.



- If the tape you want to play is already in the VCR, make sure the VCR power is on and the VCR is in VCR position. (Press the VCR/TV button so that the VCR/TV light appears.) Then, press the PLAY button.
- Other playback options and features are on pages 34 - 41.

24 Recording

Read and follow the steps below to record a television program.

1

Turn on the TV; set it to channel 3 or 4, whichever the CH3/CH4 switch on the back of the VCR is set to.

2

Insert a tape with its record tab intact (see page five) in the VCR. The POWER and CST.IN lights will appear.

3

Press the VCR/TV button so that the VCR/TV light appears.

4

Press the SPEED button until the desired tape speed appears on-screen. The tape speed will disappear after about five seconds.

You can change the tape speed while the VCR is recording, but some distortion may appear on the tape. *Details about tape speed are on page 44.*

5

Use the CHANNEL $\blacktriangle/\checkmark$ buttons or the Number buttons to select the channel to be recorded.

6

Press the RECORD button once to start recording. The REC(ord) light will appear. If the tape is missing the record tab, the VCR will eject the tape.

7

To pause the recording (for example, during commercials), press the PAUSE/STILL button once. The REC(ord) light will flash.

To resume recording, press the RECORD button or the PAUSE/STILL button again. The REC(ord) light will appear.

8

Press the STOP button to stop recording.

2 Insert a tape.

Turn on the TV.



- Other recording options are on pages 25 33.
- The VCR will record in a preset volume.
- Pause mode will automatically switch to Stop mode after five minutes to protect the VCR and the tape from damage. When a recording is paused, you may review the time remaining with the ■ marks on-screen. Each ■ mark equals one minute remaining. During the last minute of paused recording, the ■ mark will flash.
- If any menu is activated on the TV screen, the RECORD button on the remote control does not function.
 Press the COUNTER RESET/EXIT button to remove the menu. Then, press the RECORD button.

The One-Touch Recording function allows you to program an immediate timed recording 30 minutes to eight hours long. Before you begin, make sure:

- Channels are set up.
- The desired recording speed (SP, LP, SLP) has been selected with the SPEED button.
- There is a tape in the VCR. Make sure the tape's record tab is intact and the tape is long enough to record the program(s).
- The VCR is in VCR position. (The VCR/TV light will appear. If it does not, press the VCR/TV button once.)

Starting an OTR

1

Use the CHANNEL (\blacktriangle/∇) buttons or the Number buttons to select the channel you want to record.

2

Press the REC(ord)/OTR button on the VCR repeatedly until the desired recording length (30 minutes to eight hours) appears in the upper left corner of the screen. Recording will begin immediately.

Stopping an OTR

To stop an OTR before recording is finished, press the STOP button on the remote control. To cancel the OTR but continue recording, press the REC(ord)/OTR button **on the VCR** repeatedly until REC appears in the upper left corner of the screen.

One-Touch Recording 25

Press the REC(ord)/OTR button on the VCR repeatedly.



- To change the recording length while an OTR is in progress, press the REC(ord)/OTR button on the VCR repeatedly until the desired length appears on-screen.
- You can not pause recording during an OTR.
- If the preset time for a timer recording comes up during an OTR, the OTR has priority. The timer recording will not occur.
- To show the time remaining for an OTR, press the DISPLAY button.

26 Timer Recording

Follow the steps below to program your VCR to record TV programs while you're away from home. You can program up to seven timer recordings. For each one, the VCR will turn itself on, record, and turn itself off automatically. Before you begin make sure:

- Channels are set up.
- The clock is set.
- There is a tape in the VCR. Make sure the tape's record tab is intact and the tape is long enough to record the program(s).
- The VCR is on and in VCR position. The VCR/TV light will appear. If it does not, press the VCR/TV button once. (When you finish programming the timer recording, you must turn off the VCR.)

1

Press the MENU button until the TIMER PROGRAM-MING menu appears. Program numbers that do not have a timer recording stored will flash.



2

Press the PLAY button or the STOP button repeatedly to select a program number. Then, press the F.FWD button. (If you select a program number that already has a timer recording stored, information about that program will appear. Press the PLAY button or the STOP button to select another program number.)



3

Press the PLAY button or the STOP button repeatedly to select a ONCE, DAILY, or WEEKLY recording. When the arrow is beside your choice, press the F.FWD button.

- ONCE The VCR will record a TV program on any day you choose, up to 12 months away.
- DAILY The VCR will record a TV program at the same time on the same channel every day, Monday through Sunday.
- WEEKLY The VCR will record a TV program at the same time on the same channel every week, for example, every Monday.





Timer Recording (cont'd) 27

Press the PLAY button or the STOP button repeatedly until the desired month appears. Then, press the F.FWD button.

Next, press the PLAY button or the STOP button repeatedly until the desired day appears. Then, press the F.FWD button.

The day of the week will appear automatically. You can not program the VCR to record more than one year in advance.

- The real-time counter memory is cancelled if AUTO REPEAT is set to [ON].

Forward and Reverse Searching (SP/LP/SLP)

During tape playback, press and release the F.FWD button or the REWIND button. A fast forward or reverse picture search will begin.

To return to playback, press the PLAY button.

Super High Speed Searching (LP/SLP)

During tape playback, press the F.FWD button or the REWIND button, then press again. The VCR will now search in super high speed.

To return to playback, press the PLAY button.

Viewing a Still Picture

To go to a tape location where the real-time counter was reset to zero, press the REWIND button or the F.FWD button when playback is stopped.

When the tape reaches the point at which the real-time counter was reset to zero, the tape will stop.

Press the PLAY button to watch the tape.

- You may only set the real-time counter memory at one location at a time. If you set the real-time counter to zero at a second location, the previous real-time counter to zero setting will be erased.
- To erase the real-time counter memory, press the COUNTER MEMORY button repeatedly so that the M disappears from the screen.
- The COUNTER MEMORY button does not function if AUTO REPEAT is set to [ON].

38 Index Search

When you make a recording, the VCR places an index mark at the beginning of the recording. Essentially, an index mark is a type of "bookmark" for your tape. This feature is useful if you have several different programs recorded on a single tape.

You may skip over programs by following the steps below. Before you begin, make sure:

 The VCR is on and is in VCR position. (The VCR/TV light will appear. If it does not, press the VCR/TV button once.)

• There is a tape in the VCR.

Press the MENU button repeatedly until the SEARCH SELECT menu appears.

SEARCH SELECT → QUICK-FIND INDEX SEARCH TIME SEARCH

2

Press the PLAY button or the STOP button repeatedly to select INDEX SEARCH. Then, press the F.FWD button.

3

Within 30 seconds, press the PLAY button or the STOP button repeatedly until the number of programs that you want to skip appears beneath INDEX SEARCH on-screen. (Example: 03 for three programs)

4

While the number of programs is flashing, press the REWIND button or the F.FWD button.

The VCR begins rewinding or fast forwarding to the beginning of the desired program. When the program is reached, the VCR will start playback automatically.



- You may also activate the Index Search by pressing the INDEX SEARCH button. Then, continue from step 3.
- Every time an index mark is passed, the number of programs beneath INDEX SEARCH on-screen decreases by one.
- Up to 20 index marks may be stored and searched.
- This function is not available during recording.
- Press the STOP button to stop the search.
- To exit Index Search mode, press the COUNTER RESET/EXIT button.
- The time gap between index marks should be greater than 1 minute for SP recording, 2 minutes for LP recording, and 3 minutes for SLP recording.

Time Search 39

The Time Search function allows you to go to a specific point on a tape. You will enter the exact amount of playback time that you wish to skip in order to reach the specified point. Make sure:

- The VCR is on and is in VCR position. (The VCR/TV light will appear. If it does not, press the VCR/TV button once.)
- There is a tape in the VCR.

Press the MENU button repeatedly until the SEARCH SELECT menu appears.



Press the PLAY button or the STOP button repeatedly to select TIME SEARCH. Then, press the F.FWD button.



Within 30 seconds, press the PLAY button or the STOP button repeatedly until your desired length of time appears. (Example: 2:50 for 2 hours 50 minutes) You may also press and hold the PLAY button or the STOP button until you reach the desired length of time.

Within 30 seconds, press the REWIND button or the

F.FWD button. The VCR begins rewinding or fast forwarding to the specified point. The time counts down on-screen beneath TIME SEARCH as the searching progresses. When 0:00 appears beneath TIME SEARCH, the VCR will start playback automatically.



- You may also activate the Time Search by pressing the TIME SEARCH button. Then, continue from step 3.
- You can set a Time Search for up to 9 hours, 59 minutes (9:59).
- Time Search is not available during recording.
- To exit Time Search mode, press the COUNTER RESET/EXIT button.
- To cancel a Time Search already in progress, press the STOP button.

40 Quick Find

The Quick Find feature locates the beginning of each recording on a tape, then plays the first portion of the recording at high speed for 30 seconds. After it plays the portion, the VCR fast forwards the tape to the next recording. This process is repeated until the end of the tape is reached, or until you stop the Quick Find. To start a Quick Find, press the QUICK-FIND button on the remote control, or follow the steps below.



Press the MENU button repeatedly until the SEARCH SELECT menu appears.

SEARCH SELECT → QUICK-FIND INDEX SEARCH TIME SEARCH

2

Press the PLAY button or the STOP button repeatedly to select QUICK-FIND, then press the F.FWD button. The VCR will fast forward the tape to the beginning of the next recording. The VCR will play the tape at high speed for 30 seconds, then go to the next recording.

To skip immediately to the beginning of the next recording on the tape, press the QUICK-FIND button on the remote control.

To resume normal tape playback, press the PLAY button.

- There must be a tape in the VCR.
- This function will not operate during a recording.
- To cancel a Quick Find that is in progress, press the STOP button.
- When the end of a tape is reached during a Quick Find, the VCR will rewind the tape to the beginning, eject the tape, and turn itself off. If a real-time counter memory is set, the VCR will rewind the tape to the point at which the real-time counter was set to zero, then stop.

Automatic Playback Features 41

Automatic Playback

When you put a tape in the VCR, the power will come on automatically. If the tape's record tab is missing, playback will begin. (If a timer recording is set, you may have to press the POWER button to turn on the VCR. Make sure you turn off the VCR for the timer recording later. If you insert a tape without a record tab when a timer recording is set, the VCR will eject the tape.)

Automatic Rewind, Eject, Off

When a tape is played, fast forwarded, or recorded to its end, the VCR will rewind the tape to the beginning, eject the tape, and turn itself off.

If the real-time counter memory is set, the VCR will only rewind the tape to the point at which the counter is set to zero, then stop. The VCR will not eject the tape or shut itself off.

Tape Eject

A tape can be ejected with the VCR power on or off (but the VCR must be plugged in). If a Timer Recording is programmed, a tape can only be ejected with the power on. Be sure to insert a tape for the Timer Recording, then turn off the VCR power.

Automatic Tracking Adjustment

The VCR automatically adjusts tracking to give you the best possible picture quality. With some recordings, however, you may get a better picture using the manual tracking controls (see below).

Manual Tracking

To adjust the tracking manually, press the CHANNEL (\checkmark / \checkmark) buttons on the VCR during playback.

NOTES:

- Tracking is returned to automatic tracking adjustment when a tape is inserted or when the STOP button is pressed to halt playback.
- Automatic tracking adjustment will not work during slow motion playback. Instead, use the CHANNEL (▲/▼) buttons on the VCR or on the remote control to reduce noise lines in slow motion playback.
- · Manual tracking will not operate when the VCR is in Still mode.
- Use the CHANNEL (▲/▼) buttons on the VCR or on the remote control to remove vertical jitter in a Still picture.

Also, please take a moment to identify the problem you are having, and be prepared to explain this to the representative. The VCR has no power.

- Make sure the power plug is completely connected to an AC (alternating current) outlet.
- Make sure the power is turned on.

A power failure occurred.

- Follow the steps on page 11 to select a language and set up channels, if necessary. Then, follow the steps on pages 14 15 to reset the clock.
- Timer recordings may be lost if the power fails for more than one minute. Reprogram the timer recordings. Details are on pages 26 29.

The remote control will not operate the VCR.

- Aim the remote control directly at the VCR's remote sensor. Details are on page 21.
- · Remove all obstacles between the remote control and the VCR.
- Inspect and/or replace the batteries in the remote control. Details are on page five.

The VCR does not respond normally to the remote control. (For example, the VCR may change channels multiple times when you press the CHANNEL ▲ button once.)

• Install new batteries (preferably alkaline) in the remote control.

The motor (cylinder) rotates even when the VCR is in Stop mode.

• To enable the quick play mechanism, the cylinder will rotate for about five minutes. This is normal. The quick play mechanism switches the tape mechanism from Stop to Play in just one second.

A TV program cannot be recorded.

- Check the connections between the VCR, TV, antenna/cable, and Cable Box/DBS, if applicable. Details are on pages six 10.
- Make sure the tape has a record tab. Details are on page five.

The VCR will not perform a timer recording.

- Make sure the recording start and stop times are set correctly. Details are on pages 26 29.
- Make sure a tape is in the VCR and the tape has a record tab. Details are on page five.
- Make sure the VCR power is off.
- Make sure the clock is set. Details are on pages 14 15.
- The VCR may not perform or continue a timer recording if a power interruption of more than one minute occurs before or during the timer recording, even if the power comes back on afterward. Set up channels and reset the clock before re-programming the timer recording(s).
- Finish programming a timer recording at least five minutes before the recording is scheduled to begin.
- If, after programming a timer recording, you turn off the VCR without inserting a tape, the TIMER light will blink. Insert a tape with the record tab intact.
- Noon is 12 p.m. Midnight is 12 a.m.
- If the tape runs out before the recording ends, the VCR will stop, eject the tape, and turn itself off. The TIMER light will blink.
- If a tape without a record tab is inserted, the VCR will eject the tape. The TIMER light will blink. Insert a tape that allows recording.
- If the preset time for a timer recording comes up during a One-Touch Recording, the OTR has priority.
- When two timer recordings overlap, the timer recording with the earliest start time will have priority. When the earliest program has finished recording, the next program number will begin recording.

Helpful Hints (cont'd) 43

Tape cannot be removed.

- Make sure the power plug is completely connected to an AC (alternating current) outlet.
- You have set a timer recording. Turn on the VCR power, then eject the tape. Be sure to insert a tape and turn off the VCR for your timer recording.

Tape cannot be inserted.

- Insert the tape, window side up, with the record tab facing you.
- Make sure a tape isn't already in the VCR by pressing the STOP/EJECT button on the VCR or the EJECT button on the remote control.
- Gently push on the center of the tape when putting it in the VCR. Never force the tape into the VCR.
- If a timer recording is set, the VCR will not accept a tape that does not have a record tab. You may only insert a tape with the record tab intact.

VCR ejects the tape when the RECORD button is pressed or when the VCR power is turned off to set a timer recording.

· Make sure the tape has a record tab. Details are on page five.

There is no playback picture, or the playback picture is noisy or contains streaks.

- Make sure the TV is on the same channel as the VCR's CH3/CH4 switch. Details are on page seven.
- Make sure the VCR is in VCR position. (The VCR/TV light will appear. If it does not, press the VCR/TV button once.)
- Make sure channel 3 or 4 is properly adjusted.
- Adjust the tracking. Details are on page 41.

TV programs cannot be watched normally.

- Press the VCR/TV button to put the VCR in TV position. (The VCR/TV light will disappear.)
- Check the connections between the VCR, TV, antenna/cable, and Cable Box/DBS (if applicable). Details are on pages six 10.

The reception on all channels is poor.

· You may need to tune your TV again.

Line Input

 If you accidentally enter Line Input mode (AUX will appear on your TV screen briefly), press the CHAN-NEL (▲/▼) buttons or use the Number buttons to select another channel.

44 Glossary

<u>AUDIO IN/OUT Jacks:</u> jacks located on the back of the VCR which are used to record audio from another source (IN) or to

send audio to another source (OUT).

<u>Automatic Channel Setup</u>: process in which the VCR scans all available channels and places the ones you receive in its memory. Then, when you push the CHANNEL (\checkmark) buttons, you only scan through channels you receive.

Bands: settings that allow you to tune channels.

- Antenna VHF (very high frequency; channels 2-13) and UHF (ultra high frequency; channels 14-69).
- Cable all standard channels can be received without a Cable Box/DBS.

Cable Box/DBS Output Channel: Channel 3 or 4.

Dubbing: copying a tape using a second VCR.

Frame: a single still picture.

<u>HO:</u> high quality; a feature in the VCR circuitry which provides enhanced picture detail.

Line Input: The channel to which you set your VCR during dubbing. The line input channel is always channel 00.

If you accidentally enter Line Input mode (AUX will appear on your TV screen briefly), press the CHANNEL (\checkmark/\checkmark) buttons or use the Number buttons to select another channel.

Mode: a VCR operation.

<u>OTR</u>: One-Touch Recording; programming a timed recording that starts immediately and records for 30 minutes to eight hours, whichever you specify.

<u>Remote Control</u>: the small electronic unit that came with your VCR; allows you to operate your VCR from a distance.

<u>RF</u> coaxial cable: The cable supplied with your VCR. Use it to connect your VCR to your TV (or Cable Box/DBS, if applicable). The supplied cable is a snap-on type. However, you may also use a screw-on type if you prefer.

Special Effects: forward and reverse searching; viewing a still picture; slow motion playback.

Tape Speeds: how fast the tape travels during a recording.

- SP (standard play) fastest tape speed (recording time for a T120 tape is approximately two hours); best picture quality.
- LP (long play) average tape speed (recording time for a T120 tape is approximately four hours).
- SLP (super long play) slowest tape speed (recording time for a T120 tape is approximately six hours).

VCR: video cassette recorder.
