

# XR4110 INSTALLATION/OWNER'S MANUAL

AM/FM/MP3/WMA Receiver with Auxiliary Input, USB Port and SD Card Input











## Preparation

Please read entire manual before installation.

### **Before You Start**

- Disconnect negative battery terminal. Consult a qualified technician for instructions.
- Avoid installing the unit where it would be subject to high temperatures, such as from direct sunlight, or where it would be subject to dust, dirt or excessive vibration.

#### **Getting Started**

- Insert the supplied keys into the slots as shown, and slide the unit out of the mounting sleeve.
- Install mounting sleeve into opening, bending tabs to secure.
- Connect wiring harness and antenna. Consult a qualified technician if you are unsure.
- Certain vehicles may require an installation kit and/or wiring harness adapter (sold separately).
- Test for correct operation and slide into the mounting sleeve to secure.
- Snap trim ring into place.

## **General Operation**

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Power On/Off	Press ${\bf 0}$ to turn the unit on. Press and hold ${\bf 0}$ for more than two seconds to turn the unit off.
Source	Press <b>SOURCE</b> to select between AM/FM, auxiliary input, USB or SD Card modes. Modes of operation are indicated in the display. SD and USB modes will not appear unless an SD Card or USB device is connected.
Loud	Press and hold <b>LOUD</b> for more than 2 seconds to activate and deactivate the loudness feature. Activating this feature will enhance the bass and treble frequencies when listening to music at low volumes.
Auxiliary Input	Insert a 3.5mm connector in the front panel AUX port. Connect the other end of the 3.5mm connector to the headphone output of an audio device, MP3 player, etc.
Volume	Adjust volume using the <b>volume knob</b> (00-42).
Select Audio	Press <b>AUDIO</b> to select between Bass, Treble, Balance and Fader.
	$\rightarrow$ BASS $\rightarrow$ TREBLE $\rightarrow$ BALANCE $\rightarrow$ FADER
Bass	Press <b>AUDIO</b> until <b>BASS</b> appears Rotate the <b>volume knob</b> left/right to adjust (-7 minimum / 7 maximum)
Treble	Press <b>AUDIO</b> until <b>TRE</b> appears Rotate the <b>volume knob</b> left/right to adjust (-7 minimum / 7 maximum)
Balance	Press <b>AUDIO</b> until <b>B 00</b> appears Rotate the <b>volume knob</b> left/right to adjust <b>BL 15</b> (left) to <b>BR 15</b> (right)
Fader	Press <b>AUDIO</b> until <b>F 00</b> appears Rotate the <b>volume knob</b> left/right to adjust <b>FR 15</b> (rear) to <b>FF 15</b> (front)
Preset EQ Curves	Press <b>EQ</b> for more than two seconds to activate the first preset EQ, then press and hold <b>EQ</b> again to select between POP, CLASSIC, ROCK and USER. Manual adjustments to the bass and treble settings are saved as USER.

## **Tuner Operation**

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Seek Tuning	Press <b>TUNE</b> $\triangleleft \triangleleft$ or <b>TUNE</b> $\blacktriangleright \triangleright$ for more than 2 seconds to seek the next strong station.
Manual Tuning	Press <b>TUNE I</b> or <b>TUNE I</b> momentarily to change one radio station at a time. Press and hold to advance quickly.
Band	Press <b>BAND</b> to select between FM1, FM2, FM3 and AM1, AM2 bands. Six presets can be saved in each band.
Storing and Recalling Station Presets	Up to 18 FM stations and 12 AM stations can be stored. To store a station, select the desired band and station. Press and hold the desired preset button for more than 2 seconds. When stored, the preset number will appear in the display. The station can be recalled anytime by pressing the corresponding preset button.
Automatically Store Stations	Press <b>AST</b> for more than 2 seconds to automatically store the six strongest stations in the current band.
	After the six strongest stations are set, a scan of each stored preset will begin. Press <b>AST</b> or <b>TRACK &gt;&gt;</b> to cancel.



## **USB/SD Card Operation**

Connecting a USB Device (sold separately)	Play MP3/WMA files from many mass storage devices by connecting them to the XR4110's USB port.
Inserting an SD Card (sold separately)	To play MP3/WMA files from an SD card, insert an SD card into the XR4110's SD card slot with the label facing left. It will click into place when properly inserted. To remove the card, press in until it clicks, then pull to remove.
Playing Music	When a USB or SD card device is first connected, playback will begin automatically. Depending on the number of files and folders, the device may take several seconds to begin playback. If no valid MP3/WMA files are detected, "USB" or "SD" will continually be displayed.
Track Select	Press <b>TRACK &gt;&gt;</b> to skip to the beginning of the next track. Press <b>TRACK &lt;=</b> to return to the beginning of the current track. Pressing <b>TRACK &lt;=</b> again skips to the beginning of the previous track.
	<b>Note:</b> Track numbers are specific to the current folder and will restart at 1 for each folder.
Fast Forward and Reverse	Press and hold <b>TRACK &gt;&gt;</b> or <b>TRACK &lt;</b> to fast forward or reverse a track.
Pause	Press ►/III to temporarily stop USB playback. Press ►/III again to resume playback.
Folder Access	Press 🖝 to select the previous folder. Press 🛣 to select the next folder.
	<b>Note:</b> Any files that are located on the root directory of the USB/SD card device will be accessed as folder 1 (F01).
Repeat	Press <b>RPT</b> to continuously repeat the current track. Press <b>RPT</b> again to cancel.
Random	Press <b>RDM</b> to play all the tracks in the current folder in random order. Press <b>RDM</b> again to cancel.

Playback Order	MP3/WMA playback sequence is based on order the files are copied to the USB/SD card device and begins in the root folder. ## Troubleshooting

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Problem	Cause	Action
Unit will not turn on (no power)	Yellow wire not connected or incorrect voltage Red wire not connected or incorrect voltage	Check connections for proper voltage (11~16VDC)
	Black wire not connected	Check connection to ground
	Fuse blown	Replace fuse
Unit has now on	Speaker wires not connected	Check connections at speakers
Unit has power (but no sound)	One or more speaker wires touching each other or touching chassis ground	Insulate all bare speaker wires from each other and chassis ground
Unit blows fuses	Yellow or red wire touching chassis ground	Check for pinched wire
	Speaker wires touching chassis ground	Check for pinched wire
	Incorrect fuse rating	Use fuse with correct rating
"ER" appears on display	USB or SD card compatibility issue	Device capacity must be less than 16GB.
		File system is incompatible - it must be FAT or FAT32.
