



- 2 VOL +*1/- button Adjusts the volume.
- Activates the Bass function to emphasize the low sound range.
- [4] ►II*1 button (ℱ pages 13, 19)
 Turns on/off the player (ℱ page 16).
 Starts/pauses song playback, or pauses/restarts
 recording. When a menu appears on the display,
 use this button to confirm the menu item.
- 5 I◄◄/►►I button (愛 pages 13, 23) Selects a song, album, artist, folder or menu item. You can also skip to the beginning of the song/album/artist/folder, fast-forward or fast-rewind.

6 Power Illuminator

Illuminated by LED (page 44). The pattern of the illumination varies according to the operation.

If you slide the HOLD switch to the opposite position, the HOLD function is released.

HOME menu



To operate the HOME menu

When menu items appear on the HOME menu, press the ◄◄/►► button to select an item, and then press the ►Ⅱ button to confirm.

For example, when you want to play back a song by selecting \prod (Music Library) on the HOME menu, the menu changes as follows.


Basic Operations

Before Connecting the Player

Before connecting the player to your computer, make sure that the OS is Windows XP (Service Pack 2 or later) or Windows Vista (Service Pack 1), and the installed Windows Media Player version on your computer is 11.

Charging the Battery

The player's battery is recharged while the player is connected to a running computer. Remove the USB cap and connect the USB connector to a USB port on your computer.



When the remaining battery indication of the display shows: **Full**, charging is complete. When you use the player for the first time, or if you have not used the player for a long time, recharge it fully until **Full** appears on the screen. For details on charging time or battery life, see ****** page 69.

Note

Be careful not to accidentally bump or put stress on the player when it is connected to your computer.
 It may be damaged.

On the remaining battery indication

The battery icon' in the display (page 22) changes as shown below. See page 69 for details on battery duration.

*1 If the "USB Bus Powered" setting is set to "Low-Power 100mA" (F page 45), L appears next to the battery icon.



The battery power decreases as shown by the battery icon. If "LOW BATTERY" appears, you cannot operate the player. In this case, charge the battery by connecting to your computer.

Notes

- Charge the battery in an ambient temperature of between 5 °C to 35 °C (41°F to 95°F).
- The number of times the battery can be recharged before it is used up is approximately 500 times. This number differs, depending on the conditions under which you use the player.
- The battery indicator on the display is only an estimate. For example, one section of black in the
 indicator will not always indicate exactly one-fourth of the battery's charge.
- "DATA ACCESS" appears in the display while the player accesses the computer. Do not disconnect
 the player while "DATA ACCESS" appears or the file being transferred may be destroyed.
- The control buttons on the player are all disabled while it is connected to a computer.
- Some USB devices connected to the computer may interfere with the proper operation of the player.
- We do not guarantee the recharge of the battery using personally assembled computers or modified computers.
- If you charge the player when it has not been used for a long period, your computer may not
 recognize the player or nothing may appear on the display. Charge the player for about 5 minutes, and
 it starts operating properly.

Turning the Player On and Off

To turn on the player

Press the ►II button to turn on the player. The player resumes the operation from the point where you last turned off.

To turn off the player

Press and hold the ▶II button to turn off the player. "POWER OFF" appears.

🌣 Hint

If there is no operation for a certain period of time while in stop mode, the display turns off
automatically and the player enters standby status to save the battery power. If there is no operation
for a while, the player turns off completely.

Transferring Music

Connect the player to your computer and transfer audio files to the player.



Searching for songs

The following lists appear.

- "Now Playing": Plays back the last file you listened to.
- · "Folder": Search for songs by folder.







- Press and hold the BACK/HOME button until the HOME menu appears.
- Press the I◀◀ /▶▶I button to select (FM), and then press the ▶II button to confirm.
- Check that "Manual" is selected, and then press the ►II button to confirm.

The player enters the manual tuning mode.

• The preset number is shown only when the current frequency is already preset (@ page 31).

When you use the FM tuner for the first time, or when you move to a new area, we recommend presetting receivable broadcast stations using the "FM Auto Preset" function.

Note

- The "FM Auto Preset" operation will delete previously preset broadcast stations.
- Press and hold the BACK/HOME button until the HOME menu appears.
- Press the I◀◀/▶▶I button to select 🖴 (Settings), and then press the ▶II button to confirm.
- Press the I◀◀/▶▶I button to select "FM Settings," and then press the ▶II button to confirm.
- Press the I◀◀ /▶▶I button to select "FM Auto Preset," and then press the ▶II button to confirm.

Press the I◀◀/▶►I button to select "OK," and then press the ►II button to confirm.

The receivable broadcast stations will be preset in order from low to high frequency. "COMPLETE" appears when presetting is completed, then the lowest frequency preset station is received.

🍟 Hint

• By pressing the ►II button during FM reception, the player pauses the FM reception. If you press the ►II button again, the player resumes FM reception.

To stop automatic presetting

Select "Cancel" in step 5 and press the ▶II button to confirm.

To return to the previous menu

Press the BACK/HOME button.

To preset broadcasting stations manually

- ¶ Select the desired frequency (@ page 29, 35).
- Press the BACK/HOME button to return to the FM menu, press the I◄ /▶►I button to select "Add Preset," and then press the ►II button to confirm.






