Note to the Cable TV System Installer: This reminder is provided to call the Cable TV system installer's attention to Article 820-40 of the National Electrical Code, which provides guidelines for proper grounding – in particular, specifying that the cable ground shall be connected to the grounding system of the building, as close to the point of cable entry as possible.

Before Using Your VCR 5

Putting Batteries in the Remote Control

Remove the battery compartment lid on the bottom of the remote control by pressing in the tab, then lifting the lid.

Place two AA batteries inside the battery compartment with their polarities (+ and – ends) aligned as indicated.

Replace the battery compartment lid.

Using the Remote Control

- O Point the remote control at the VCR's remote sensor (see page 27) when using the remote control to operate the VCR. Point the remote control at the TV when using the remote control to operate the TV. Point the remote control at the Cable Box or Digital Satellite System when using the remote control to operate the Cable Box or Satellite System.
- O Do not put objects between the remote control and the VCR.
- Before you use the remote control to operate your VCR, you must first press the VCR button.
- Before you use the remote control to operate your TV, you must first press the TV button.
- Before you use the remote control to operate your Cable Box or Digital Satellite System, you must first press the CBL/DSS button.

Erasure Prevention

Video cassette tapes have record tabs to ensure that recordings are not accidentally erased.

To prevent accidental erasure, break off the tab with a screwdriver.

To record again, cover the hole with cellophane tape.

VCR maintenance

- In this VCR, use only tapes with the **WHS** mark.
- Make sure any light adhesive stick-on notes are removed from the video cassette tape before putting the tape in the VCR. Removable labels like these can jam the VCR.
- Periodic maintenance is required to maintain your VCR's excellent performance. This VCR has an Automatic Head Cleaner. However, the video heads will eventually require replacement, which should be performed only by an authorized service center.







- The remote control and its batteries are supplied.
- Do not mix alkaline and manganese batteries.
- Do not mix old and new batteries.

6 Hookups Without a Cable Box

The basic VCR/TV connection – antenna/cable to VCR to TV – is shown below. If you have a Cable Box or a Digital Satellite System, please refer to pages eight-nine. If you have a Stereo TV, please go to page 10. After you hook up the VCR, please go to page 11 to turn on the VCR.

Disconnect the antenna or cable from your TV.

Connect the antenna or cable to the ANT(enna) IN Jack of your VCR.



Connect the RF coaxial cable (supplied) to the OUT Jack on the back of the VCR and to the ANTENNA IN Jack on the TV. (You may use either a snap-on type (supplied) or screw-on type of coaxial cable, whichever you prefer.)



Plug in the TV and the VCR.

Set the CH3/CH4 switch on the back of the VCR to CH3 or CH4, whichever channel is not used or least used in your area. To operate your VCR with your TV, set the TV to the same channel. For example, when playing a tape, if the CH3/CH4 switch is set to CH3, the TV should be on channel 3.



You are ready to turn on the VCR. Please go to page 11 before turning on the VCR.

8 Hookups With a Cable Box/Digital Satellite System

This connection allows you to view any channel. After you connect the Cable Box/Digital Satellite System, VCR, and TV as shown below, the features described on this page will be available.



Recording/Viewing Any Channel

With the VCR on and in VCR position (the VCR light will appear on the display panel), use the CHANNEL (Up/Down) buttons or the Number buttons to set the VCR to the Cable Box/DSS Receiver output channel (channel 03 or 04).





Select the channel you want to watch or record at the Cable Box/DSS Receiver.

Watching TV With the VCR Off

Use the TV channel selector to set the TV to the Cable Box/DSS Receiver output channel (channel 3 or 4).

Select the channel you want to watch at the Cable Box/DSS Receiver.

Timer Recordings

With this connection, you may set a timer recording as described on pages 34-37. However, you must remember the following:

- You can only program a timer recording for one channel at a time.
- Set the TV and the VCR to the Cable Box/DSS Receiver output channel (channel 03 or 04).
- When you are prompted to enter the channel you want to record, select channel 03 or 04 (the Cable Box/DSS Receiver output channel). (This is step 5 on page 35.)
- Set your Cable Box/DSS Receiver to the channel you want to record.
- Leave the Cable Box/DSS Receiver on while you are recording.

- With this hookup, channels cannot be changed at the VCR. You must select channels at the Cable Box/DSS Receiver.
- You can not view a channel other
 than the one you are recording (the instructions on page 32 do not work with this hookup).
- You cannot program channels with this hookup (as discussed on page 12).

Hookups With a Cable Box/Digital Satellite System (cont'd) 9

This connection allows you to program an unattended recording of more than one unscrambled channel and to watch one channel while recording another. After you connect the VCR, Cable Box/Digital Satellite System, and TV as shown below, the features on this page will be available.



3. Use a second RF coaxial cable to connect the OUT Jack on the Cable Box/DSS Receiver to the ANTENNA IN Jack on the back of the TV.

Recording One Channel/Watching Another

Put the Cable Box/DSS Receiver on the same channel as the VCR's CH3/CH4 switch. Put the TV on the same channel. With the VCR in VCR position (the VCR light will appear on the display panel), use the CHANNEL (Up/Down) buttons at the VCR to select the channel you want to record. **Start the recording.**

Press the VCR/TV button once to put the VCR in TV position. (The VCR light will disappear.)

Use the TV channel selector to put the TV on the Cable Box/DSS Receiver output channel (channel 03 or 04).

Select the channel you want to watch at the Cable Box/DSS Receiver.

Playing a Tape

Press the VCR/TV button to put the VCR in VCR position (the VCR light will appear on the display panel).

Make sure the Cable Box/DSS Receiver is on the same channel as the VCR's CH3/CH4 switch.

Use the TV channel selector to put the TV on the same channel.

Helpful Hint

You cannot record scrambled channels with this connection.

Press the PLAY button to play the tape.



O Audio and Video cables are not supplied.

Connect the antenna or cable to the ANT(enna) IN Jack on the back of the VCR.

Connect a video cable to the yellow VIDEO OUT Jack on the back of the VCR. Then, connect the other end of the video cable to the VIDEO IN Jack on your TV.

Connect an audio cable to the white AUDIO OUT Jack on the back of the VCR. Then, connect the other end of the audio cable to the AUDIO IN Jack on your TV.

Turn on your TV, making sure it is in Line Input mode. Please refer to your TV owner's manual for details.

Helpful Hint

 This hookup will not give you stereo sound. To get stereo sound, use the connections on pages six - seven and select the channel to be viewed at the TV (with the VCR turned off).

Turning on Your VCR 11

Before turning on your VCR, make sure there are batteries in the remote control and the VCR and TV are connected correctly.

- Follow the steps on this page only when you plug the VCR power cord into the wall outlet for the first time.
- You may not be able to program channels at step 5 if you are using a Cable Box.

Press the VCR button, then the POWER button. The VCR light and the PWR. (power) light will appear on the display panel.

Turn on the TV at the TV. Set it to the same channel as the CH3/CH4 switch on the back of the VCR. The language select display screen shown below will appear. (If the display does not appear, check your hookups, then follow the steps on page 12 to program channels and page 19 to select a language.)

Press the Number I button to select English on-screen displays. ON will appear to the right of ENGLISH on-screen. **Or**, **press the Number 2 button** for Spanish on-screen displays. SI will appear to the right of ESPAÑOL on-screen.

Press the MENU button. The channel program display shown below will appear. The display will disappear after about 60 seconds if you do not press any buttons.



Press the CHANNEL (Up) button to begin automatic channel programming. AUTO SET PROCEEDING PLEASE WAIT will appear on-screen. The VCR will place all of the channels you receive into its memory, so when you scan through channels using the CHANNEL (Up/Down) buttons, you'll only scan through channels that you receive. When all channels are programmed, CHANNELS ARE SET will appear on-screen briefly. Then the TV will go to the lowest channel programmed.



- To skip this feature and play a tape immediately, insert a tape with its record tab removed. Or, to skip step 3, press the MENU button. All onscreen displays will be in English. To skip step 5, press the STOP button. Channels will not be programmed, and CHANNELS NOT SET will appear on-screen.
- If you try to program channels when there is no antenna or cable connected to the VCR, programming will appear to take place, but eventually a NO TV SIGNALS message will appear on-screen. Connect an antenna or cable to the VCR's ANT(enna) IN Jack and try again. You may need to follow the steps on page 12.
- When the clock is not set, --:-will appear on the display panel.

12 Channel Memory

Programming Channels

Although your VCR may automatically memorize the channels you receive when you turn it on for the first time, this function lets you reprogram channels.

Press the VCR button.

Press the MENU button to bring up the main menu display.



Press the Number 3 button to select TUNER SET UP.



Press the Number I button to select TV (if you have an antenna) **or the Number 2 button** to select CABLE TV (if you have a cable connection). ON will appear to the right of your choice.

Press the Number 3 button to select AUTO PROGRAM-MING. MEMORIZED CHANNEL / PLEASE WAIT will appear onscreen. The VCR will place all the channels you receive into its memory.



Wait for a few minutes while the VCR programs channels. When programming is complete, CHANNELS ARE SET will appear on-screen. Then the programming of the lowest channel number placed in the VCR's memory will appear on-screen. Now when you press the CHANNEL (Up/Down) buttons, you will scan only through channels you receive.



- You can not enter the TUNER SET UP menu when you are in Line Input mode.
- Line Input mode will always be stored in the VCR's memory as channel 001 or 002. When you select channel 001 or 002 with the CHANNEL (Up/Down) buttons or the Number buttons, AV REAR or AV FRONT will appear on the screen briefly.
- You may not be able to program channels if you are using a Cable Box/DSS Receiver. See pages eightnine for details.
- To switch between TV and CABLE TV selection, repeat the steps on this page.

Press the Number 1 button to add that channel or the Number 2 button to delete that channel. Or, press the Number 3 button to leave that channel unchanged and select another channel. If you do not make a choice within five seconds, you will return to the previous menu display.

Press the STATUS/EXIT button to exit.

Reviewing Programmed Channels

- I. Press the VCR button.
- 2. Press the MENU button to bring up the main menu display.
- 3. Press the Number 3 button to select TUNER SET UP.
- 4. Press the Number 5 button to select CH MEMORY REVIEW. A list of programmed channels will appear on-screen.
 - If all the programmed channels don't fit on the screen, press the Number 1 button to see the remaining channels. Then press the Number 2 button to return to the first screen of channels.
- If you do not press any buttons within 10 seconds, you will either go to the next screen of channels or return to the previous menu display.
- 5. Press the STATUS/EXIT button once or twice to exit.

14 Setting the Clock

There are two ways to set the clock. With manual clock setting, you tell the VCR the current time. With automatic clock setting, the VCR gets the current time from your local PBS station. It keeps track of the time by constantly referring to the time broad-casted by your PBS station.

If you are using a Cable Box or Digital Satellite System, you must set the clock manually.

Follow the instructions under either manual clock setting or automatic clock setting (page 16) to set the VCR's clock. Before you begin, make sure:

- The VCR is hooked up and turned on, and channels are programmed into the VCR's memory (see pages six - 12).
- The VCR is in VCR position. (The VCR light will appear on the display panel. If it does not, press the VCR/TV button once.)
- You make each entry within 60 seconds of the previous entry. (If you do not, you may start again at step 1.)

Manual Clock Setting

Press the VCR button.



Press the MENU button to bring up the main menu display.

TO SELECT PUSH NO. SHOWN PROGRAM 2 VCR SET UP 3 TUNER SET UP 4 SET CLOCK TO END PUSH EXIT



Press the Number 4 button to select SET CLOCK.



Press the Number 2 button to select SET MANUAL CLOCK.





- To display the time on-screen, press the STATUS/EXIT button. A status display, which includes the time, will appear on the TV screen for about five seconds. For details, see "On-Screen Status Displays" on page 29.
- If you press the STATUS/EXIT button while you are setting the clock, the TV screen will return to the program you were watching. If this happens, start over.
- Power failures that last for more than one minute can cause you to lose your clock setting if you set the clock manually. If this happens, reset the clock.
- If the clock is not set, --:-- will appear on the display panel. The time will appear on the display panel when the clock is set.

Setting the Clock (cont'd) 15

Press two Number buttons for the hour(s) and two Number buttons for the minute(s). Then press 1 for AM or 2 for PM. For example, for 2:15 PM, press 02, 15, 2.

- \odot Enter a 0 before a single digit number.
- Entries that do not match the VCR's internal calendar will cause a question mark (?) to appear on-screen.
- To make corrections, press the CLEAR button until the space for the number you want to correct is flashing. Then enter the correct number.

TIME 02 : IS PM MONTH -- / -- /---TO CORRECT PUSH CLEAR TO END PUSH EXIT



Press two Number buttons for the month, two Number buttons for the day, and two Number buttons for the year. For example, for July 1, 1997, press 07, 01, 97. The day of the week will appear automatically.

TIME 02:15 PM DATE 07/01 / 97 TUE. TO CORRECT PUSH CLEAR TO END PUSH EXIT



Press the STATUS/EXIT button to start the clock. The screen will return to the program you were watching. The time will appear on the VCR display panel.



Automatic Clock Setting

Press the VCR button, then press the MENU button to bring up the main menu display.



Press the Number 4 button to select SET CLOCK.



If OFF appears to the right of AUTO CLOCK, press the Number I button once. A new display screen will appear. Go to step 4. Or, if ON appears to the right of AUTO CLOCK, press the Number I button twice. A new display screen will appear. Go to step 4.

If you want the VCR to locate a local PBS station from which to take the time, press the Number 1 button to select SET PBS CH. AUTO. When the current time appears on-screen, you're finished. Press the STATUS/EXIT button to exit. Or, you may be prompted to turn off the VCR. Press the STATUS/EXIT button, then go to step 5.

NOTE: CANNOT FIND PBS CLOCK. DATA may flash on-screen. In this case, tell the VCR the PBS station from which to take the time.

- If you want to tell the VCR the PBS station from which to take the time, press the Number 2 button to select SET PBS CH. MANUAL, then use the Number buttons to enter the channel number of the desired PBS station. When the current time appears on-screen, you're finished. Press
 - the STATUS/EXIT button to exit.

NOTE: CANNOT FIND PBS CLOCK DATA may flash on-screen. In this case, press the Number 1 button to choose SELECT NEW PBS CH., then use the Number buttons to enter the channel number of another PBS station. Or, press the Number 2 button to select SET PBS CH. AUTO. Press the STATUS/EXIT button, then go to step 5.



Turn off the VCR power, and leave it off for several minutes. When the current time appears on the VCR display panel, the clock is set. You may turn on the VCR again.



Helpful Hints

For Automatic Clock Setting

- If you enter an incorrect PBS channel number at step 4, press the CLEAR button, then enter the correct channel number.
- If you have an antenna, you may select channels 2 - 69 at step 4. If you have a cable connection, you may select channels 1 - 125.
- If you select SET PBS CH.AUTO at step 4, you cannot manually select the PBS channel from which you want the VCR to take the time.
- The clock cannot be set automatically if you don't receive a channel that carries a time signal in your area. Set the clock manually.
- If there are only a few channels in your area that carry time signals, setting the clock automatically may take several minutes. If nothing happens even after you wait several minutes, set the clock manually.
- You cannot select AUTO CLOCK at step 3 during tape playback.

Setting the Clock (cont'd) 17

Time Zone

When using the AUTO CLOCK function, you can specify a time zone in which a local PBS channel is located. That way, the VCR will update the clock according to your time zone.

Press the VCR button, then press the MENU button to bring up the main menu display.



Press the Number 4 button to select SET CLOCK.



Press the Number 4 button to select SET TIME ZONE.



Find your time zone, then press the Number button to select it. You will return to the previous menu. The time zone you selected will appear beneath SET TIME ZONE.

18 Daylight-Saving Time Selection

Daylight-Saving Time Selection

You may program the VCR so its clock will automatically move forward one hour in April and turn back one hour in October. Daylight-Saving Time is set to ON prior to shipment from the factory.

You may turn Daylight-Saving Time ON or OFF by following the steps below.

Press the VCR button.

With the clock set, press the MENU button to bring up the main menu display.

20 Setting the Remote to Operate a TV

Your VCR remote control may operate your TV. If the remote control doesn't operate your TV now, follow the steps below to program your remote control.

Point the remote control at your TV and **press the TV button**. **Then, press the POWER button.** If your TV turns on or off, try the other TV buttons (see pages 22 - 24). If your TV doesn't turn on or off, or if the other buttons don't work, go to step 2.

Find the brand of your TV on the list below, and remember the two-digit number to the right of it.

TO END PUSH EXIT

Press the Number I button so that ON appears to the right of REPEAT PLAY on-screen.



Press the STATUS/EXIT button to exit. Now, when a tape has finished playing, the VCR will rewind it and start playback again. (TV programming will appear while the tape is rewinding.)



- The VCR will stay in Repeat Play mode until you cancel Repeat Play mode. To do this, follow steps 1 - 3 above. At step 4, press the Number 1 button so that OFF appears to the right of REPEAT PLAY. Press the STATUS/EXIT button to exit.
- The real time counter memory does not function during Repeat Play mode.

44 Time Search

Time Search

Follow the steps below to program the VCR to search forward or backward a specific length of time.

Press the VCR button.

Press the TIME SEARCH button to bring up the time search display. There must be a tape in the VCR.



Within 10 seconds, use the Number buttons to enter the desired length of time you want to skip forward or backward. For example, for 1 hour, 25 minutes, press Number buttons 1, 2, 5. Or, for five minutes, press Number buttons 0, 0, 5. (Make an entry within 10 seconds of pressing the TIME SEARCH button. Otherwise, the VCR will exit Time Search mode.)



Within 10 seconds, press the F.FWD button or the **REW(ind)** button to skip forward or backward. The VCR will skip over the specified length of time, then begin playback. (The time counts down on-screen as the searching progresses.)



- If you want to search for more than 59 minutes, you must enter the length of time in hours and minutes. For example, to search forward 70 minutes, press 1,1,0 at step 3.
- You can not enter the TIME SEARCH menu when you are in Recording mode.
- You can remove the Time Search display by pressing the TIME SEARCH button again.
- To cancel the Time Search when the VCR is fast forwarding or rewinding, press the STOP button once or the TIME SEARCH button twice.

Real Time Counter Memory

Follow the steps below to reset the real time counter to zero at a tape location you want to refer to later.

Play, fast forward, or rewind a tape to the location that you would like to refer to later. Press the STOP button to stop the tape.

Press the STATUS/EXIT button. The status display will appear on-screen for about five seconds.



While the status display is still on-screen, press the CLEAR button to reset the real time counter to zero.



While the real time counter is still on-screen, press the MEMORY button so that M appears to the left of the real time counter on-screen.



To go to a tape location where the real time counter was reset to zero, press the REW(ind) button or the F.FWD button when playback is stopped. When the tape reaches the point at which the real time counter was reset to zero, the tape will stop. Press the PLAY button to watch the tape.



- The MEMORY button does not function when REPEAT PLAY is set to ON.To turn REPEAT PLAY OFF, see the Helpful Hints on page 43.
- To erase a Real Time Counter Memory, press the MEMORY button until the M disappears from the screen.
- You may only set the real time counter to zero at one location at a time. If you try to set the real time counter to zero at a second location, the previous real time counter to zero setting will be erased.

Forward and Reverse Searching (SP/LP/SLP)

When in Play mode, press and release the F.FWD button or the REW(ind) button. A fast forward or reverse picture search will begin.

To return to playback, press the PLAY button.

Super High Speed Searching (LP/SLP)

When in Play mode, press the F.FWD button or the REW (ind) button, then press again. The VCR will now search in super high speed.

To return to normal playback, press the PLAY button.

Viewing a Still Picture

When in Play mode, press the PAUSE/STILL button. A still picture (frozen image) will appear on-screen.

To release the still picture and return to normal playback, press the PLAY button or press the PAUSE/STILL button again.



- Slow and Still modes will automatically switch to Stop mode after five minutes to protect the VCR and the tape from damage.
- SP/LP/SLP means this feature will work with tapes recorded in Standard Play, Long Play, or Super Long Play.
- LP/SLP means this feature will work with tapes recorded in Long Play or Super Long Play. For details about tape speed, see pages 36 and 52.
- To reduce vertical jitter in a Still picture, press the CHANNEL (Up/Down) buttons on the VCR.

Special Effects Playback (cont'd) 47

Viewing a Slow Motion Picture

When in Play mode, **press the SLOW button**. The tape will play in slow motion.

NOTE: You can control the speed of slow motion playback by pressing the VAR(iable). SLOW buttons.

To release Slow mode and return to normal playback, press the PLAY button or press the SLOW button again.

Viewing a Picture in Slow to Fast Motion

Press the JOG & SHUTTLE button while in the Play or Still mode. The Jog & Shuttle Light comes on. If you do not operate the Jog Dial or Shuttle Ring within 30 seconds, the Jog & Shuttle light will go off.



Turn the Shuttle Ring in either direction and hold it. The more the ring is rotated, the faster the search speed will be. Releasing the ring stops the picture in the Still mode.

48 Automatic Operation Features

The following playback features will always operate:

Automatic Playback

When you put a tape in the VCR, the power will come on automatically. If the tape's record tab is missing, playback will begin. If a timer recording is set, the power will not come on automatically when you insert a tape with the record tab intact. If a timer recording is set and the VCR power is off, the VCR will eject the tape if the record tab is missing.

Automatic Rewind, Eject, Off

When a tape is played, fast forwarded, or recorded to its end, the VCR will rewind the tape, go into the Stop mode, eject the tape, then turn itself off.

If the real time counter memory is set, the VCR will only rewind to the point at which the counter is set to zero, then stop. The VCR will not eject the tape automatically or shut itself off.

Tape Eject

A tape can be ejected with the VCR power on or off (but the VCR must be plugged in). If a Timer Recording is programmed, a tape can only be ejected with the power on. Make sure you insert a tape and turn off the VCR power for the Timer Recording.

Automatic Tracking Adjustment

The VCR continually adjusts tracking automatically to give you the best possible picture quality. With some recordings, however, you may get a better picture using the manual tracking controls (see page 49).

Manual Tracking

To adjust the tracking manually, press the CHANNEL (Up/Down) buttons **on the VCR** during tape playback. NOTES:

- This function is controlled only by the CHANNEL (Up/Down) buttons on the VCR. The CHANNEL (Up/Down) buttons on the remote control will not adjust tracking.
- To return tracking to the position it was in when the VCR was shipped from the factory, press the CHANNEL (Up) and CHANNEL (Down) buttons on the VCR at the same time.
- Tracking is returned to auto tracking when a tape is inserted, or when the STOP button is pressed to halt playback.
- When the VCR is in Slow mode, auto tracking will not work. Instead, use the CHANNEL (Up/Down) buttons on the VCR to reduce noise lines in slow motion playback.
- Manual tracking will not operate when the VCR is in Still mode. If you
 want to reduce noise lines in a still picture, place the VCR in Slow
 mode. Use the CHANNEL (Up/Down) buttons on the VCR to
 remove the noise lines. Then return to Still mode.

50 Helpful Hints

If you are having problems with your VCR, check the following list of problems and possible solutions before requesting service. You may be able to solve the problem yourself.

No power

- Make sure the power plug is completely connected to an AC (alternating current) outlet.
- Make sure the power is turned on.

Power Failure

• Timer recordings and the clock setting may be lost if the power fails for more than one minute. See pages 14-17 to reset your clock. See pages 34 - 41 to reprogram your timer recordings.

ATV program cannot be recorded.

- Check the connections between the VCR, TV, antenna/cable, and Cable Box/Digital Satellite System (if applicable) (pages six-10).
- Make sure the tape has a record tab (page five).
- Check the TV/VCR position (page 27).
- Check the CH3/CH4 switch (pages six-nine).

The VCR will not perform a timer recording.

- Make sure the recording start and stop times are set correctly (pages 34 41).
- Make sure a tape is in the VCR and the tape has a record tab (page five). If, after programming a timer recording, you turn off the VCR power without putting a tape in the VCR, the Timer light will blink.
- If the record tab on a tape is missing, the VCR will eject the tape. The Timer light will blink.
- Make sure the VCR power is off.
- Make sure the clock is set (pages 14-17).
- The VCR may not perform or continue a timer recording if a power interruption of more than one minute occurs during the timer recording, even if the power comes back on afterward.
- If you have a Cable Box, timer recordings are programmed differently. (See page eight for details.)
- It is best to finish programming a timer recording at least five minutes before the recording is scheduled to begin.
- 12 PM is noon; 12 AM is midnight.

There is no playback picture or the playback picture is noisy or contains streaks.

- Make sure the TV and the Cable Box, if applicable, are on the same channel as the VCR's CH3/CH4 switch (pages six-nine).
- Make sure the VCR is in VCR position (page 27). The VCR light will appear on the display panel of the VCR when the VCR is in VCR position.
- Make sure channel 3 or 4 is properly adjusted at the TV.
- Adjust the tracking (pages 48 49).

The VCR cannot be controlled with the remote control.

- Make sure the VCR light appears on the VCR display panel. If it does not, press the VCR/TV button once.
- Aim the remote control directly at the VCR's remote sensor (page 27).
- · Remove all obstacles between the remote control and the VCR.
- Inspect and/or replace the batteries in the remote control (page five).

's -

• Press the VCR button, then try the other VCR function buttons.

The Number buttons won't work for channels above 69.

• Select CABLE TV at the TUNER SET UP menu (page 12), then let the VCR program the channels.

TV programs cannot be watched normally.

- Put the VCR in TV position. (Press the VCR/TV button so that the VCR light disappears from the display panel. For details see pages 22 and 27.)
- Check the connections between the VCR, TV, antenna/cable, and Cable Box/Digital Satellite System (if applicable). (See pages six-10 for details.)

Tape cannot be inserted.

- Insert the tape, window side up, with the record tab facing you.
- Make sure a tape isn't already in the VCR by pressing the STOP/EJECT button on the VCR.
- Gently push on the center of the tape when putting it in the VCR. Never force the tape into the VCR.
- If a timer recording is programmed and the VCR power is off, you can not insert a tape without a record tab.

Tape cannot be removed.

- Make sure the power plug is completely connected to an AC (alternating current) outlet.
- You have set a timer recording. Turn the VCR power on, then eject the tape. Be sure to insert a tape and turn off the power for your timer recording.

VCR ejects the tape when the REC(ord)/OTR button is pressed or when the VCR power is turned off to set a timer recording.

Make sure the tape has a record tab (page five).

Channels above 13 cannot be received.

Select CABLE TV at the TUNER SET UP menu (page 12), then let the VCR program the channels.

Poor reception

You may need to tune your TV again.

The motor (cylinder) rotates even when the VCR is in Stop mode.

• To enable the quick play mechanism, the cylinder will rotate for about five minutes. This is normal.

Satellite Hookups

- Watching one TV channel while recording another may not be possible if you have a satellite hookup. You may have to set your TV to channel 3 or 4, then make your channel selections at the satellite converter box.
- With many satellite hookups, if you use accessory audio and video cables to connect your VCR to your TV, you will have to put your VCR in Line Input mode. To enter Line Input mode, press 0, 0, 1 or 0, 0, 2 on the VCR's remote control. AV REAR or AV FRONT will appear on your TV screen briefly.

Line Input mode

 If you accidentally enter Line Input mode (AV FRONT or AV REAR will appear on your TV screen briefly), press the CHANNEL (Up/Down) buttons or use the Number buttons to select another channel.

Daylight-Saving Time

- When automatic Daylight-Saving Time is set, the clock time will change automatically as follows: on the first Sunday in April, from 2 AM to 3 AM; on the last Sunday in October, from 2 AM to 1 AM.
- During the April time change, a timer recording programmed to start between 2 AM and 3 AM will not record. A timer recording programmed to end between 2 AM and 3 AM will end when the clock moves forward (2 AM).
- · During the October time change, a recording cannot be started between the second I AM and I:59 AM.

52 Glossary

AUDIO IN/OUT Jacks: jacks located on the front and back of the VCR which are used to record audio from another source (IN) or to send audio to another source (OUT).

<u>Automatic Channel Programming</u>: process in which the VCR scans all available channels and places the ones you receive in its memory. Then, when you push the CHANNEL (Up/Down) buttons, you only scan through channels you receive.

Bands: settings that allow you to tune channels.

- Antenna VHF (very high frequency; channels 2 13) and UHF (ultra high frequency; channels 14 - 69).
- Cable all standard channels can be received without a Cable Box.

<u>Cable Box/DSS Receiver Output Channel:</u> Channel 03 or 04.

Dubbing: copying a tape using a second VCR.

Frame: a single still picture.

HQ: high quality; a feature in the VCR circuitry which provides enhanced picture detail.

<u>Line Input:</u> The channel to which you set your VCR during dubbing. The line input channel is always channel 001 (AV REAR) or 002 (AV FRONT).

If you accidentally enter Line Input mode (AV REAR or AV FRONT will appear on your TV screen briefly), press the CHAN-NEL (Up/Down) buttons or use the Number buttons to select another channel.

Mode: a VCR operation.

<u>OTR</u>: one touch recording; programming a timed recording that starts immediately and records for 30 minutes to eight hours, whichever you specify.

<u>Remote Control</u>: the small electronic unit that came with your VCR; allows you to operate your VCR from a distance. You may be able to operate your TV, Cable Box or Digital Satellite System with the remote control.

<u>RF</u> coaxial cable: The cable supplied with your VCR. Use it to connect your VCR to your TV (or Cable Box/DSS Receiver, if applicable). The supplied cable is a snap-on type. However, you may also use a screw-on type if you prefer.

<u>Special Effects:</u> forward and reverse searching; viewing a still picture; slow motion.

<u>Tape Speeds:</u> how fast the tape travels during a recording.

- SP (standard play) fastest tape speed (recording time for a T120 tape is approximately two hours); best picture quality.
- LP (long play) average tape speed (recording time for a T120 tape is approximately four hours).
- **SLP** (super long play) slowest tape speed (recording time for a T120 tape is approximately six hours).

VCR: video cassette recorder.
