
Inserting the batteries into the Remote Control

Connect the supplied FM wire antenna to the FM 300 Ω terminal. Adjust the position of the FM antenna for the best reception.






Two-speaker system (without surround connection)





(E) Subwoofer Out (optional)



You can connect either an external active subwoofer (recommended model FB 201) to the SUBWOOFER OUT terminal. The subwoofer reproduces low bass sounds (e.g. explosions, the rumble of the spaceships, etc.). Be sure to follow the instructions supplied with the subwoofer .

(Ready)



There is a possibility of locating additional front active speakers away from the system (e.g. in another room). It reduces the inconvenience of running long speaker wires across rooms. You can place as many remote speakers as you like provided that they operate at the same radio frequency. Connect the wireless radio frequency transmitter to the LINE OUT terminal. Place the active speakers at your prefered location. Be sure to follow the instructions supplied with the speakers.







Demo mode



The system has a demonstration mode that shows the various features offered by the system. Whenever the system is connected to an AC power source, the demonstration mode will start automatically.

To stop demonstration mode

Press the DEMO, STANDBY - ON, CD, TUNER, TAPE 1-2, VIDEO/DVD, CD OPEN•CLOSE or 3 CD DIRECT PLAY button on the system (or (1), CD, TUNER, TAPE 1, TAPE 2, AUX, TV or VCR on the remote control) to stop the demonstration.

To switch on demonstration mode

Press **DEMO**.

→ The display will show "IEMD." then a demonstration of the various features will follow.

Important:

Before you begin operating the system, complete the preparation procedures.

Switching the system ON

Press STANDBY-ON, CD, TUNER, TAPE 1-2 or VIDEO/ DVD (or CD, TUNER, TAPE 1, TAPE 2 or AUX on the remote control).

You can also switch on the system by pressing the OPEN-CLOSE button or any one of the 3 CD DIRECT PLAY

Switching the system to standby mode


Press **STANDBY-ON** (or (1) on the remote control).

Volume Adjustment

Rotate **VOLUME** right or left (or press **VOLUME** + or - on the remote control) to increase or decrease the sound level.

For Personal Listening

Connect the headphones plug to the ni jack at the front of the set. The speakers will be muted.



Selecting the Sound Source

- Press the respective source selection button: CD, TUNER, TAPE 1-2 or VIDEO/DVD (or CD, TUNER, TAPE 1, TAPE 2 or AUX on the remote control).
 - → The display indicates the selected sound source.

Note:

For an external sound source, make sure that you have connected the audio left and right output jacks of the external equipment (TV, VCR, Laser Disc player, or DVD) to the AUX IN jacks.

Digital Sound Control (DSC)

The DSC feature creates a realistic atmosphere for the style of music you select using the latest digital sound technology.

- You can also press **DSC** on the remote control to select the sound setting.

Dynamic Bass Boost (DBB)

There are three DBB settings. You can press DBB on the set or remote control.

- Press DBB briefly to select the level of bass boost.
 - → The DBB button lights up.
 - → The message "BR55 1, 2 or 3" will scroll across the display.
 - → The display will be as follows:



To switch off DBB

 Press **DBB** briefly until the DBB button light disappears and "BRSS OFF" scrolls across the display.

Incredible Surround


There are three Incredible Surround Sound settings. You can press Incredible Surround on the set or Inc. Surr. on the remote control.

- Press INCREDIBLE SURROUND to select the level of surround sound.
 - → The INCREDIBLE SURROUND button lights up.
 - → The message "INEREDIBLE SURROUND 3, 2 or 1" will scroll across the display.
 - → The display will be as follows:



To switch off Incredible Surround


 Press INCREDIBLE SURROUND until the INCREDIBLE SURROUND button light disappears and "INCREDIBLE SURROUND OFF" scrolls across the display.



Tuning to radio stations

- Press TUNER on the unit or on the remote control to select TUNER mode.
 - → First 'TUNER' appears on the display. After a few seconds the current frequency or the station name, if available, will appear.

The available display button functions light up:



- 2 Press BAND to select the desired waveband: FM or AM.
- 3 Press TUNING → for more than one second, then release.
 - $\rightarrow\,$ The display will show 'SEARCH' until a station with sufficient signal strength is found.
- Repeat this procedure until the desired station is reached.
- To tune to a weak station, briefly press TUNING ◀◀ or ▶▶



If you briefly press TUNING \blacktriangleleft or $\blacktriangleright \blacktriangleright$ on the remote control), the frequency changes step by step.

Storing Preset Stations

You can store up to 20 stations in the memory. When a preset station is selected, the preset number appears next to the frequency on the display.

Automatic programming




- 1 Press **TUNER** on the unit or on the remote control.
- 2 Press BAND to select the desired waveband: FM or AM.
- 3 Press PROGRAM for more than one second.
 - → PROGRAM flashes and 'AUTO' is displayed.
 - → Every available station will be stored automatically. The frequency and preset number will be displayed briefly.
 - It will stop searching when all the available stations are stored or the memory for 20 preset stations is used.
 - → The set will remain tuned to the last stored preset number.
- You can cancel the automatic programming by pressing PROGRAM or ■.

Note:

If you want to reserve a section of preset numbers, for example preset numbers 1 to 9, select preset 10 before starting automatic programming. Now, only the preset numbers 10 to 20 will be programmed.


Manual programming

- 1 Press **TUNER** on the unit or on the remote control.
- 2 Press PROGRAM for less than one second.
 - → PROGRAM will flash on the display.



- 3 Press BAND to select the desired waveband: FM or AM.


Record Tape

- 1 As soon as you press RECORD, the current sound will be recorded on TAPE DECK 2, provided a cassette suitable for recording is loaded.
- 2 To stop recording, press (or **STOP** on the remote control).


General Information

- For recording, use only a cassette of IEC type I (normal cassette) or IEC type II (Chrome). The respective cassette type is selected automatically by the system.
- The tape in the cassette is secured at both ends with a leader tape. At the beginning and end of a cassette, nothing will be recorded for six to seven seconds.
- The recording level is set automatically, regardless of the position of VOLUME.
- Check and tighten slack tape with a pencil before use. Slack tape may get jammed or may burst in the mechanism.
- To prevent accidental recording, break out the tab on the left shoulder of the cassette side you want to protect.
- To re-record the cassette, cover each hole with cellophane tape. Do not cover the Chrome tape detection hole when covering the tab opening.






- C-120 tape is extremely thin and may be easily deformed or damaged. It is not recommended for use in this unit.
- Store the cassettes at room temperature and do not put them too close to a magnetic field (for example, transformers, TVs or speakers).




Loading a cassette

- Press OPEN.
- The cassette compartment door opens.
- Load the cassette with the open side downward and the full spool to the left.


Tape Playback

Fast Forwarding/Rewinding





Dubbing cassettes (from TAPE DECK 1 to TAPE DECK 2)

- 1 Press TAPE 1-2 to select tape deck 2.
- 2 Load the prerecorded cassette into tape deck 1 and a blank cassette into tape deck 2.
 - Make sure that both cassettes have their full spools to the left.
- 3 Press SIDE to select the FRONT side of the cassette in tape deck 2.



Loading the CD Changer



Shuffle

SHUFFLE – playing all the available discs and their tracks in random order. It can also be used when tracks are programmed.


To shuffle all the discs and tracks

Programming Tracks

- Use a cotton swab slightly moistened with cleaning fluid or alcohol.
- You can also clean the heads by playing a cleaning tape once.


